#### **PREFACE**

This report provides a detailed picture of the boys detained or committed to the Rhode Island Training School during the period July 1, 1976 through June 30, 1977. These studies are done on an annual basis and the information reported is used by planners, administrators, and other criminal justice personnel for the purposes of short term and long range policy, program, and facility development. Information includes: race, length of stay, prior incarceration, charge, residence, child welfare history, and ages at first commitment, current commitment, and release.

#### INTRODUCTION

This report, as the title suggests, is an inventory of the characteristics of the boys detained at the Rhode Island Training School, for those persons whose detention occurred during the period July 1, 1976 through June 30, 1977. A total of 387 boys served 470 separate detentions. Of these 387 boys, 329 at least once, were sentenced directly from Family Court to the Training School for Boys or the Youth Correctional Center. In this report a detention is attributed to the Youth Correctional Center if any portion of that detention was served at the Youth Correctional Center; thus the category Regular Court Detentions refers to detentions in which the entire duration of the detention was spent at the Training School, and no part of this detention was spent at the Youth Correctional Center.

During this twelve (12) month period, 39 boys were sentenced to the Diagnostic Center, but were held at the Training School while awaiting placement at the Diagnostic Center. Fifty-two (52) boys were held by State or Local Police Departments or a judge while awaiting an appearance at the Family Court, but were not detained at the Training School or Youth Correctional Center following that court appearance.

In this report ten (10) variables are considered:

- 1. Classification of detainee (Regular Court Detainee, Youth Correctional Center Detainee, Diagnostic Center hold or Other hold).
- 2. Race.
- 3. Age at first commitment.
- 4. Age of current commitment.
- 5. Age of release.
- 6. Number of previous detentions.
- 7. Length of detention.

- 8. Type of offense.
- 9. Residence.
- 10. Child Welfare Service intervention.

Each of these variables and their interrelationships are explained in the proceeding text and in the tables following the text.

#### CLASSIFICATION OF DETAINEE

The Rhode Island Training School for Boys served mainly as a facility for detaining boys who had appeared in Family Court and had been detained by a Family Court Judge as a result of that appearance. Sometimes, part or all of this detention was served at the Youth Correctional Center, which is really a more secure cottage of the Training School. In this support a detention is classified as a Youth Correctional Center detention if any part of that detention was spent at the Youth Correctional Center. If no part of the court detention was spent at the Youth Correctional Center, it is classified as a Regular Court Detention.

The Training School also served as a facility for holding boys, who were awaiting placement at the Juvenile Diagnostic Center. These detentions are classified in this report as <u>Diagnostic Center Holds</u>. The Training School also served as a facility for holding boys for State and Local Police Departments prior to the boy's arraignment at Family Court. Boys in this category were often detained by a verbal order of a judge. These detentions were classified in this report as <u>Other Holds</u> if the detainee was released by the Court immediately following his appearance at the Court. If the Court detained the boy, the time spent as a hold was considered to be a part of his <u>Regular Court Detention</u>, <u>Youth Correctional Center Detention</u>, or <u>Diagnostic Center Hold</u> (whichever applies to that case). It is possible, however, that a boy, who was detained as a result of a court appearance, was classified as an <u>Other Hold</u> on another occasion.

During the period of this study (July 1, 1976 through June 30. 1977). 387 different individuals passed through the Training School during 470 separate detentions (some boys were detained more than The variable Classification of Detainee is cross-tabulated with Race in Table 1; with Age of First Commitment in Table 2; with Number of Previous Detentions in Table 3; with Number of Previous Detentions and Race in Table 4; with Length of Detention in Tables 5 and 6; with Age of Current Commitment in Table 7; with Age of Release in Table 8; with Type of Offense in Table 9; with Census Tract of Residence in Table 10; with Number of Previous Detentions and Age of First Detention in Table 13; with Age of Commitment and Length of Detention in Table 14; with Length of Detention and Number of Previous Detentions in Table 15; with Type of Offense and Length of Detention in Table 16; with Age of Commitment and Offense in Table 17; with Race and Child Welfare Services History in Table 18; with Number of Previous Detentions and Child Welfare History in Table 19; and Child Welfare Services History and Age of First Commitment in Table 20.

During this 12 month period, 208 different boys were detained as a result of a Family Court appearance, in which the judge ordered that the boy be detained at the Training School. In each of these, no part of this detention was spent at the Youth Correctional Center. Of these 208 persons, 196 served one regular court detention, 11 served two such detentions, and one boy served four such detentions. A total of 138 individuals served at least part of one detention at the Youth Correctional Center. Of these 138 boys, 123 served one such detention, 13 served two such detentions and two served three such detentions. In addition 20 of the 123 boys who served one YCC detention, served other

detentions during the 76-77 fiscal year. Furthermore, 57 of the 88 remaining YCC detainees who served only one detention during this fiscal year, had served other detentions in previous years. only 46 of the 138 YCC detainees were recidivists neither before nor after their current detention. Each of the 39 persons who were held at the Training School while awaiting placement at the Juvenile Diagnostic Center were held under that status once, although 15 of these boys were at the Training School under another status during the 12 month period this study covers. All but two of the 52 boys who were detained under the category "other holds" were detained under the status once (two were held twice), although 18 of these persons were detained under another status during the period of study. The interrelationships between type of detention and each of the other nine variables is discussed in the sections of the text that relate to those variables. A further breakdown of Regular Court Detentions and YCC Detentions according to intent of the court is given in the table below:

#### RACE

Data with respect to race occur frequently throughout the report. Table 1 shows the racial breakdown according to classification of detainee. Of the 387 boys who passed through the Training School during July 1, 1976 through June 30, 1977, 76.2 per cent were white; 18.1 per cent were black, 2.8 per cent were either black or white with Spanish surnames; 0.5 per cent were of other races, and 2.3 per cent were of unknown race. Each of the nine persons whose race was unknown were holds who were released by the court and were never detained by the Court. (Referred to in this report as "other holds").

Among the <u>regular court detainees</u>, 84.6 per cent were white; 13.0 per cent were black, 1.9 per cent were of Hispanic origin, and 0.5 per cent were Syrian. Similarly, whites accounted for 84.7 per cent of the detentions; blacks accounted for 13.1 per cent of the detentions; Spanish inmates accounted for 1.8 per cent of the detentions; and the lone Syrian accounted for 0.5 per cent of the detentions.

Among the <u>Youth Correctional Center</u> detainees 65.9 per cent were white, 31.2 per cent were black, 2.2 per cent were Spanish and 0.7 per cent were American Indians. The racial distribution according to the number of detentions was: 63.9 per cent white, 33.5 per cent black, 1.9 per cent Spanish and 0.6 per cent American Indian.

Among the <u>Diagnostic Center</u> holds 89.7 per cent were white and 10.3 per cent were black. Among the <u>Other Holds</u> 65.4 per cent were white; 9.6 per cent were black, 7.7 per cent were Hispanic, and 17.3 per cent were of unknown race.

Table 4 cross-tabulates race, type of detention, and number of previous detentions. Among the regular court detentions involving whites, 60.6 per cent were first detentions; 27.1 per cent were second detentions; 5.3 per cent were third detentions, 4.8 per cent were fourth detentions, and 2.1 per cent were fifth or subsequent detentions. In tabulating the data for this table, previous detentions under the category other holds were not included. Among the regular court detentions involving blacks, 58.6 per cent were first detentions, 17.2 per cent were second detentions, 10.3 per cent were third detentions, 6.9 per cent were fourth detentions, and 6.9 per cent were fifth or subsequent detentions.

Among the Youth Correctional Center detentions involving whites, only 38.4 per cent were first detentions, 37.4 per cent were second detentions, 14.1 per cent were third detentions, 8.1 per cent were fourth detentions, and 2.0 per cent were fifth or subsequent detentions. Among Youth Correctional Center detentions involving blacks, only 25.0 per cent were first detentions, 17.3 per cent were second detentions, 25.0 per cent were third detentions, 9.6 per cent were fourth detentions, and 23.1 per cent were fifth or subsequent detentions. Thirty-two (32) of 35 white Diagnostic Center holds and all four of the black Diagnostic Center holds were first detentions. First detentions accounted for 79.6 per cent of the "Other holds".

Table 7 cross-tabulates race with type of detention and age of current commitment. There was very little difference in the median age of commitment between the races. Among the <u>regular court detentions</u>, the median age was 16.5 for both blacks and whites. Similarly, at the

Youth Correctional Center, the median age of commitment was 16.6 for whites and 16.7 for blacks. The median for the <u>Diagnostic Center</u> holds was 15.9 for whites and 16.0 for blacks. The corresponding figures for Other holds were 16.7 and 16.8 for whites and blacks respectively.

Table 11 cross-tabulates race with length of detention. The legal length of detention refers to the entire length of time in which the boy was placed under the administrative control of the Training School. This includes time spent on the Training School or Youth Correctional Center grounds as well as time spent on both authorized absences (such as Temporary Community Placement, IMH, ACI, etc.) and unauthorized absences (runaway). The median legal length of detention for blacks (120.5 days) was 141 per cent longer than the median for whites (49.9 days). Similarly the median on-grounds length of detention (time spent in the Training School cottages or YCC cottage only) was 68 days for blacks and only 30 days for whites. Indeed 36 per cent of the ongrounds detentions of over 180 days involved blacks. On the other hand, blacks accounted for only 18 per cent of the on-grounds detentions that were less than 180 days long.

Table 12 cross-tabulates race and type of offense. For both blacks and whites, the five leading offenses were breaking and entering, robbery, assault, stolen motor vehicles, and violation of probation. The table on the following page summarizes the differences in offense type by race.

Table 18 cross-tabulates race and intervention of Child Welfare Services. Just over half (50.5 per cent) of the white detainees, 61.4 per cent of the black detainees, and 18.2 per cent of the Spanish detainees were active or inactive Child Welfare Services cases.

#### AGE AT FIRST COMMITMENT

Data with regard to age at which the boy was committed to the Training School for the first time are contained in Table 2, Table 13, and Table 20. For the purpose of determining age of first commitment only regular court detentions, Youth Correctional Center Detentions, and Diagnostic Center holds were considered. The reason for omitting the "Other Holds" from the data on first commitment is that the Training School keeps no record of these detentions in the boys' folders. The only evidence of the existence of these holds is on the Daily Traffic Report Sheets.

Table 2 cross-tabulates type of detention and age of first commitment. The median age of first detention was 16.0 for Regular Court detainees. 15.6 for Youth Correctional Center detainees, and 15.7 for Diagnostic Center detainees. The mean ages did not differ from the median to any great extent. The mean age was 15.8 for Regular Court detainees, 15.5 for Youth Correctional Center detainees and 15.7 for Diagnostic Center holds. No measures of central tendency were calculated for other holds because 30 of these 52 boys were released by the Court and never were detained by the Court. The other 22 boys, although also released from a hold without being detained at that time, were however detained at the Training School at another time. Some of the boys in the 1976-77 cohort were detained for the first time at an early age. One of the Youth Correctional Center detainees first came into contact with Training School at the age of 11. Twelve boys who are in this cohort were detained for the first time at age 12. It should be noted that during the period of this study (July 1, 1976-June 30, 1977) the youngest boy admitted was 12 years old.

Table 13 is a cross-tabulation of age at first detention and number of previous detentions. Only three of the 19 detentions (16 per cent) of persons whose first detention was at age 11 or 12 were first detentions. Similarly only 25 per cent of the detentions involving persons whose first detention was at age 13 were first detentions. A summary of the data from table 13 is given in the table below.

Table 20 is a cross-tabulation of age at first commitment and intervention of Child Welfare Services. The table shows that the boys who had been Child Welfare Services clients were first admitted to the Training School at earlier ages. The median age of first commitment was 15.2 for Child Welfare cases and 16.4 for non-Child Welfare cases.

#### AGE OF CURRENT COMMITMENT

Data with regard to age of current commitment appear in Tables 7, 14, and 17. Table 7 cross-tabulates age of commitment with type of detention and race. No significant difference was noted between the average age of current commitment for white detainees and the corresponding averages for black detainees. The median age of commitment for regular court detentions was 16.5 for detentions involving white boys and 16.6 for detentions involving black boys. The median age of commitment at the Youth Correctional Center was 16.6 for whites and 16.7 for blacks. The median age of commitment for the Diagnostic Center was 15.9 for whites and 16.0 for blacks. The corresponding figures for Other holds were 16.7 for whites and 16.8 for blacks.

Table 14 cross-tabulates age of current commitment and length of detention. Among the <u>regular court</u> detainees, the legal length of stay was much longer for younger boys than for older boys. Juvenile committed at age 13 had a median legal detention of 240 days. The corresponding figures for ages 14-17 were 107.0, 62.0, 50.0, and 35.5 days respectively. The on-grounds length of detention did not, however, vary as widely. Boys aged 13-15 stayed from 35 to 40 days and boys aged 16 and 17 stayed about 25 days. Data for <u>Youth Correctional Center</u> detainees also showed that younger inmates stayed longer. This was true for both the legal and on-grounds lengths of detention. There was no significant relationship between age and length of detention for <u>Diagnostic Center</u> holds and Other holds.

Table 17 cross-tabulates age of current commitment and type of offense. The median ages for the 25 categories of crime ranged from

15.5 to 17.2. A summary of the prominent types of offender and the median ages of commitment for these offenses is given in the table below.

#### AGE OF RELEASE

Table 8 is a cross-tabulation of age of release and type of detention. The median age of release for Regular Court detainees was 16.8 years. The median age of commitment was 16.5 years. This difference reflects the average length of detention. The median age of release for Youth Correctional Center detainees was 17.3 - a figure seven-tenths of one year higher than the age of commitment. The chief value in age of release data is in formulating recidivism studies.

## NUMBER OF PREVIOUS DETENTIONS

Data on number of previous detentions are contained in Tables 3, 4, 13, 15 and 19. Previous detentions refer only to detentions ordered by the Family Court either to the Training School or the Youth Correctional Center. Detentions at the Training School while awaiting Diagnostic Center placement are considered as previous detentions in this report, but previous holds for the Family Court or any of the state's police departments are not considered if the Court disposed of the case without detaining the boy at the Training School at that time. The reason for not considering these other holds is that the Training School does not routinely collect data on this part of the population.

Table 3 shows the number of previous detentions according to type of detention. Among the regular court detentions, 60.4 per cent were first detentions, 25.7 per cent were second detentions, 6.3 per cent were third detentions, 5.0 per cent were fourth detentions and 2.7 per cent were fifth or subsequent detentions. Differences in number of previous detentions according to race are shown in Table 4. An extensive analysis of this data is presented in a previous section under the variable Race. It is worth repeating that blacks were more likely to have been

recidivists than whites. Of the regular court detentions, 60.6 per cent of the whites were serving their first detention while 58.6 per cent of the blacks were serving their first detention. Among the Youth Correctional Center detentions, only 38.4 per cent of the detentions involving whites and 25.0 per cent of the detentions involving blacks were first detentions.

Table 13 is a cross-tabulation of number of previous detentions and age at first detention. An extensive analysis of this table is contained in the section on the variable Age at First Commitment.

The most significant finding was that the boys who were first committed to the Training School at an early age were much more likely to have been recidivists. Only 22 per cent of the boys whose first detention was at age 13 or younger had served only one detention.

Table 15 is a cross-tabulation of number of previous detentions and length of detention. In general first detentions were much shorter than second or subsequent detentions. A summary of the median lengths of stay is given in the table below.

Table 19 is a cross-tabulation of number of previous detentions and intervention of Child Welfare Services. Among the regular court detainees serving their first detention, 44 per cent had been Child Welfare Services clients. Among regular court detainees serving their second or subsequent detention, 67 per cent had been Child Welfare Services Clients. Among the Youth Correctional Center detainees, 56 per cent of those serving their first detention were active or inactive Child Welfare Services cases. Seventy-three(73) per cent of the second or subsequent detainees at the YCC were current or inactive CWS cases.

#### LENGTH OF DETENTION

Data with regard to length of detention can be found in Tables 5, 6, 11, 14, 15 and 16. In this report, length of detention is defined in two ways: 1) Legal Length of Detention refers to the entire length of time in which the boy was placed under the administrative control of the Training School. This includes time spent on the Training School or YCC grounds, time spent on authorized absences (Temporary Community Placements, ACI, IMH, other hospitals, etc.) and time spent on unauthorized absences (runaway). 2) The On-grounds Length of Detention refers to the number of days in which the boy was housed in one of the Training School cottages or the YCC cottage.

Table 5 is a cross-tabulation of legal length of detention and type of detention. The mean length of detention was longer than the median for all types of detention except "other holds." This is due to the fact that the mean is influenced by extreme values whereas the median reflects only the values at the center of the distribution.

Although half of the combined regular and YCC detentions were 84 days or shorter (median) these 313 boys stayed an aggregate of 4623 days, hence the mean is 4623 ÷ 313 = 147.7 days. It should be noted that as of November 22, 1977, 64 detentions were still in progress. As of May 21, 1978 we have these data on the 64 detentions excluded from Table 5:

Table 6 is a cross-tabulation of on-grounds length of detention and type of detention. For reasons described in the preceding paragraph, the mean length of stay was considerably longer than the median length of stay. It should be noted that as of November 22, 1977, 64 detentions were still in progress. As of May 21, 1977 we have these data on the 64 detainees excluded from the Table 6:

Table 11 is a cross-tabulation of length of detention, type of detention and race. An analysis of this table is contained in the previous section on race. The table shows that the median legal length of detention for blacks (120.5 days) was 141 per cent longer than the corresponding median for whites (49.9 days). The median on grounds length of detention for blacks (68 days) was 127 per cent longer than the corresponding median for whites (30 days). Blacks accounted for 36 per cent of the on-grounds detentions of 180 days or longer, but only 18 per cent of the detentions that were less than 180 days long.

Table 14 is cross-tabulation of length of detention, type of detention, and age of current commitment. An analysis of this table is presented in a preceding section under Age of Current Commitment. The legal length of detention tended to be longer for younger boys, although the same relationship did not exist for the on-grounds length of detention. The table below summarizes these data:

Table 15 is a cross-tabulation of length of detention, type of detention, and number of previous detentions. An analysis of this table is presented in the preceding section Number of Previous Detentions. The outstanding finding in that analysis was that the length of detention was much shorter for first detentions than for second or subsequent detentions. The median legal length of detention was 21 days for first detentions and 124 days for second or subsequent detentions. The median on-grounds length of detention was 17 days for first detentions and 66 days for second or subsequent detentions.

Table 16 is a complete list of all the types of offense and their corresponding lengths of detention. This table deals only with detentions that were completed as of November 22, 1977. The length of detention

for the same or similar offenses varied widely. The major offense types and the mean and median lengths of detention are shown in the table below:

# Type of Offense

Data on type of offense appear in Tables 9, 12, 16 and 17. Table 9 lists the type of offense according to type of detention. The offenses have been divided into four (4) categories: crimes of violence, crimes against property, other non-status offenses and status offenses. The five leading types of offense for the four categories of detainees are given below:

Table 12 is a cross-tabulation of type of offense and race. The major differences between the races with regard to type of offense are discussed in a preceding section of the text under the variable Race. Over three-fourths (75.7 per cent) of all detentions involved whites. Blacks accounted for 19.6 per cent; Hispanics accounted for 2.3 per cent; other races accounted for 0.4 per cent; and persons whose race was unknown accounted for 1.9 per cent. A text table in the Race section summarizes the important findings. More than half (52.2 per cent) of all black detentions were a result of crimes against person, while only 29.8 per cent of the white detentions, and 18.2 per cent of the Spanish detentions resulted from violent crimes (See Table 9 for definitions).

The five leading offenses for both the black and white races were:

- 1) Breaking and entering or burglary
- 2) Assault (rank 3 for blacks)
- 3) Robbery (rank 2 for blacks)
- 4) Stolen motor vehicle
- 5) Violation of Probation.

Table 16 is a complete list of all the types of offenses and their corresponding lengths of detention. This table deals only with detentions completed as of November 22, 1977. The table is partly analyzed in the previous section under <u>Length of Detention</u>. In addition, the table below gives the maximum and minimum legal and on ground lengths of stay for 15 different types of offense. This text table includes only <u>regular</u> court detentions and YCC detentions.

Table 17 is a cross-tabulation of age of current commitment and type of offense. A summary of the prominent types of offense and the corresponding median age of current commitment is presented in a text table in the section on Age of Current Commitment. Status Offenders and Arson/Statuatory Burning had the youngest median age (15.5); while larceny from person had the oldest median age (17.2).

#### RESIDENCE

Table 10 presents the 387 detainees and 470 detentions according to city or town and census tract of residence. Providence, which has 18.8 per cent of the state's population, accounted for 34 per cent of the detainees and 35 per cent of the detentions. The Inner City of Providence as defined by the Office of Economic Opportunity (Tracts 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 19, 25, 26, 31 and 37) accounted for 64 per cent of all the Providence detainees and 66 per cent of all The Model City area (tracts 4-7) alone accounted Providence detentions. for 30 detainees and 40 detentions. Warwick, the state's second largest city had the second highest number of detainees - (31) and the second highest number of detentions - (35). The city of Woonsocket accounted for 28 detainees and 30 detentions. Pawtucket accounted for 26 detainees and 30 detentions. Newport accounted for 20 detainees and 24 detentions. Cranston accounted for 19 detainees and 24 detentions. city of East Providence had 13 detainees and 16 detentions. All other cities or towns had less than 10 detainees. There were 18 residents of other states or foreign places and two boys whose residence was unknown. Thus 95 per cent of the detainees were known to be Rhode Island residents.

#### INTERVENTION OF CHILD WELFARE SERVICES

Data comparing Child Welfare Services clients (or former clients) with boys who were never Child Welfare Services clients appear in Tables 18, 19 and 20. The relationship between Child Welfare Services intervention and the nine (9) other variables studied in this report is discussed in the appropriate sections of the preceding text. Child Welfare Services clients accounted for 51.4 per cent of all detainees and 53.4 per cent of all detentions. Over 60 per cent (61.4 per cent) of all black detainees and 50.5 per cent of all white detainees were Child Welfare Services clients or former clients. The racial breakdown of Child Welfare Services clients was 75 per cent white, 22 per cent black, one per cent Spanish ½ per cent other races, and two per cent unknown. The breakdown for non-CWS cases was 78 per cent white, 14 per cent black, five per cent Spanish, one-half per cent other races and three per cent unknown.

Table 19 is a cross-tabulation of Child Welfare Services history, type of detention, and number of previous detentions. A complete analysis of this data is presented in a preceding section. The most important finding in this section was that as the number of previous detentions increases, the probability of the boy having been a Child Welfare Services case also increased. The text table below summarizes these data:

Table 20 is a cross-tabulation of age at first commitment and intervention of Child Welfare Services. The analysis of this data is contained in the section of the text Age of First Commitment. This table shows that Child Welfare Services clients were admitted to the Training School at an earlier age than the non-CWS clients. The median age of first commitment was 15.2 for CWS cases and 16.4 for non-CWS cases.

#### SUMMARY OF FINDINGS

- 1. 387 boys were detained or committed to the Training School or Youth Correctional Center during the period of study.

  Because some of the boys served two or more separate detentions, a total of 470 detentions were served.
- 2. In this report, detentions were divided into four categories:

  Regular Court detentions (committed to Training School after appearing in court) YCC detentions (following court appearance)

  Diagnostic Center holds and Other holds (released upon first appearance in court). Of the 222 regular court detentions, 160 occurred after adjudication (122 sentenced, 4 for study and evaluation, and 34 awaiting further placement). Of the 155 YCC detentions, 119 detentions followed an adjudication.
- 3. Over three fourths (76.2 per cent) of the detainees were white.

  About 18 per cent (18.1) were black, three per cent were Spanish, one half per cent were Syrian or American Indian and two per cent were of unknown race. Just over one-third (33.5 per cent) of the Youth Correctional Center detentions involved blacks.
- 4. Whites were more likely to be serving their first detention than blacks. The proportion of first detentions among the Regular Court detention was 60.6 per cent among the whites and 58.6 per cent among the blacks. The percentages of first detentions for the YCC were 38.4 and 37.4 for white and black detentions respectively.

- 5. The median legal length of detention for blacks was 141 per cent longer than the corresponding white figure. Similarly, the on-grounds median length of detention for blacks exceeds the corresponding white median by 127 per cent.
- 6. Blacks were more likely to commit crimes against person than were either the whites or the Hispanic. Fifty-two (52) per cent of all black detentions resulted from violent crimes; while only 24 per cent of the white detentions and just 18 per cent of the Hispanic detentions resulted from crimes of violence. Whites were more likely to commit property offenses. Property offenses accounted for 61 per cent of the white detentions, 41 per cent of the black detentions, and 46 per cent of the Spanish detentions.
- 7. The median age at first commitment was 15.8. Boys whose <u>first</u> commitment was at an early age were more likely to be recidivists than boys whose first detention was at a later age.
- 8. Child Welfare Services clients had a median age of <u>first</u> commitment (15.2) more than one year younger than the corresponding median for non-CWS cases (16.4).
- 9. The median age of current commitment was 16.5. There was no significant variation in this age between the races.
- 10. The median <u>legal</u> length of detention was considerably longer for boys committed at younger ages. This relationship also held up for the <u>on-grounds</u> length of detention at the YCC, but did not hold up for the on-grounds length of detention at the Training School.

- 11. The types of offender with the youngest median age of commitment were status offenders and arsonists. The oldest offender types were detained for larceny, larceny from person, and robbery.
- 12. The median age of release was 16.8 for regular court detentions, 17.3 for YCC detentions, 15.9 for Diagnostic Center holds, and 16.7 for other holds.
- 13. More than half (56.8 per cent) of the detentions involved boys never previously committed. About 24 per cent had one previous commitment, and 19 per cent had more than one previous commitment.
- 14. First detentions were considerably shorter than second or subsequent detentions. The median <u>legal</u> length of first detention was 21 days and the median <u>on-grounds</u> length of first detention was 17 days. In contrast, the median legal and on-grounds length of detention were 124 days and 66 days respectively for second or subsequent detentions.
- 15. Child Welfare Services clients accounted for 56 per cent of the first detentions and 73 per cent of the second or subsequent detentions.
- 16. The median lengths of <u>completed detentions</u> were: 36 days for the legal length of stay and 28 days for the on-grounds length of stay. If the incomplete detentions are added in, the median legal length of stay becomes 68.6 days and the median on-grounds length of stay becomes 36.6 days.

- 17. The length of detention for the same or similar offenses varied widely. Status offenders had the shortest median length of stay (3 days). The boys committed for larceny against person stayed the longest. (median 111 days).
- 18. The five leading offenses were: 1) Breaking and entering,
  2) Assault,3) Robbery, 4) Stolen Motor Vehicle and 5) Violation
  of Probation. This was true of both regular and YCC detentions.
  Breaking and entering, assault and stolen motor vehicles also
  ranked among the five leading offenses for both Diagnostic
  Center holds and other holds. The above listed offenses are
  the top five for both white detainees and black detainees.
- 19. Most of the boys detained during the period of this study resided in urbanized areas. Providence alone accounted for 35 per cent of the detainees. The cities of Warwick, Woonsocket, Pawtucket, Cranston, Newport, and East Providence accounted for a combined total of 35 per cent. Thus, 30 per cent resided in the remaining 33 cities or towns or out of state.
