; ACQUISITIONS Services, Department Sof The Bureau of Detention Standards and Corrections, establishes minimum standards for the physical condition of county jails, municipal jails, and county juvenile detention facilities, for the treatment of inmates with respect to their health and safety and security of the community, and makes recommendations to such institutions to assure compliance with the requirements of the minimum standards. The Bureau provides consultation services for the design, construction, and administration of detention facilities, makes studies and surveys of programs and administration of such facilities, inspects each institution at least once annually, and gives notice to the county board and sheriff or to corporate authorities of the municipality, of any noncompliance with minimum standards. In addition to the sheriff and county clerk, a copy of the county detention facility inspection report is forwarded to the county board chairman, chief circuit judge, county resident judge, state's attorney, and the regional director of the Illinois Law Enforcement Commission (ILEC). Municipal jail inspection reports are forwarded to the chief of police, mayor, city clerk, and ILEC regional director.

The legal authority which governs the Bureau's activities is contained in the Illinois Revised Statutes, Chapter 38 - Criminal Law and Procedure, Section 1003-15-2.

The Bureau has a continuing function to monitor the administration of the U. S. Bureau of Prisons correspondence courses on "Jail Operations" and "Jail Administration" for jail officers. The tests are graded at the National Institute of Corrections Jail Center, Boulder, Colorado, and certificates issued to those attaining passing scores.

Appendix I reflects noncompliances with the Illinois County Jail Standards. Of the 102 counties, four do not operate a jail. One hundred and five county jail inspections were conducted (including three separate county work release centers), identifying 2010 noncompliances and offering 1202 recommendations to improve jail operations. Three county jails and one county work release center had no noncompliances. The increase in noncompliances (396 in FY1977) is attributable to new Standards requirements that became effective July 1, 1977.

The 2010 noncompliances identified during the inspection of county jails were grouped into three categories: administration (991); operations, including support services, (389); and building and equipment (630). The 1202 recommendations cover the full spectrum of facility operations.

A continuing improvement in county jail operation is the availability of programs for detainees. Seventy counties have a work release program; 87 have an educational program that offers vocational and/or academic instruction; 78 have counseling services that include family, religion, and/or employment problems; 77 provide counseling treatment for drug abuse; 80 provide counseling treatment for drug abuse; 77 have recreational programs that provide out-of-cell activity, either indoor or outdoor; and 80 offer structured religious services. In two of the counties operating a work release program, housing accommodations are separate geographically from the jail complex and three of the counties rent bed space to Department of Corrections work releases.

Appendix II reflects population statistical data of county jails, including those in the sentenced category. It is noted that Cook County figures include all four divisions and the Maywood Branch facility. Cook County had 50,068 inmates for FY1978, totaling 1,412,185 inmate days; 3,869 average daily population; and 28 average jail days per inmate. The remainder of the county jails had 93,841 inmates for 731,980 jail days; 2,005 average daily population; and 8 average jail days per inmate.

Appendix III depicts both the noncompliances with the Municipal Jail and Lockup Standards and the population statistical data. As in county jail inspections, the 540 noncompliances identified were grouped into three categories: administration (200); operations (51); and building and equipment (289). One hundred and four cities had no noncompliances. A total of 497 recommendations were offered with a view toward improving jail operation. Again, the increase in noncompliances (286 in FY1977) is attributable to new Standards requirements that became effective November 15, 1977.

The number of active municipal jails and lockups fluctuated throughout the year. At the end of the reporting period, there were 267 active facilities. Two hundred sixty-three inspections were conducted. There were 352,673 persons (adults and juveniles) processed through Illinois municipal jails or lockups during this reporting period.

Appendix IV depicts the noncompliances noted during inspections of 12 independent county juvenile detention facilities. An independent facility is one which is not part of the county jail or municipal lockup operation. The 122 noncompliances with the County Juvenile Detention Standards were grouped into four categories: administration (25); operations (8); building and equipment (76); and programs (13).

Appendix V-A reflects population statistical data for the county juvenile detention facilities for the first two quarters of FY1978 (July - December, 1977). Appendix V-B reflects the population statistical data for the last two quarters of FY1978 (January - June, 1978). Reporting requirements were changed effective January, 1978. There were 12,385 juveniles held in the twelve county detention centers with an average daily detainee population of 323. Additionally, 71 county jails processed 2,958 juveniles and municipal jails processed 8,014 juveniles during the reporting period.

In addition to inspecting county and municipal detention facilities, the Bureau is required to inspect all State operated adult correctional centers, youth centers, and community correctional centers.

In FY1978, Bureau personnel conducted 422 inspections; 22 special investigations; 99 unusual occurrence investigations; 1,003 consultations and assistance visits, as well as 2,915 telephone consultations; expended 45 days for on-site training for county and municipal jail officers, which includes 58 on-site training workshop sessions; and reviewed 57 blueprints on new jail construction or remodeling of existing facilities.

During FY1978, the Bureau issued six month notices to eleven county jails (of which two pertained only to juvenile detention) and two city jails for failure to comply with minimum standards. Also, the Attorney General was requested to reinstate a closing petition on another city for failure to correct violations within six months after receiving notice. The latter city subsequently let bids for the construction of a new municipal jail. Three of the eleven county jails and one of the two city jails corrected the violations during the six month period subsequent to the follow-up inspection, and one county jail has let bids for construction to correct violations. Action is still pending against seven county jails and one city jail. Four cities voluntarily closed their jails as a result of adverse inspection reports.

During this period, the Bureau of Detention Standards and Services revised the Illinois Municipal Jail and Lockup Standards, the municipal jail inspection report checklist, the Illinois County Juvenile Detention Standards, the county juvenile inspection checklist, the county work release inspection checklist, and the adult correctional center and community correctional center inspection checklists. Also, the revised Illinois County Jail Standards became effective.
