#### Introduction

This bibliography has been compiled to identify reference sources for criminal justice scholars and practitioners. The comprehensive nature of the subject matter included and the resources this publication represents enable it to make a unique contribution to the growing literature in criminal justice.

More than 200 publications are described in this compilation, which has been selected from the collection of the National Criminal Justice Reference Service. The citations are presented in alphabetical order by author and issuing agency, and a subject index is provided to aid researchers. Any bibliography is dated as soon as it is published. Researchers may find the following annually revised reference tools helpful:
