OVERVIEW

During 1978, the Criminal Division continued the operation of the specially organized units, working together to try individual type cases. The unit handling rape and other crimes of violence involving women and children was again extremely successful obtaining 28 rape convictions in 1978, another record for Pierce County. In 1978 a total of 1,852 felony criminal charges, 2,803 misdemeanor charges and 36,903 traffic charges were filed.

The new Juvenile Justice Act took effect on July 1, 1978, and this imposed a greater statutory burden on the prosecutor's office, and the entire criminal justice system. By the end of the year it was necessary to increase the staff at Remann Hall from one deputy prosecuting attorney to a total of three deputy prosecuting attorneys, two secretaries, and two legal interns. It is anticipated that the workload will continue to increase until such time as the Juvenile Act is significantly amended by the legislature.

The Family Support Division, which performs the Prosecuting Attorney's statutory duties in paternity and child support enforcement proceedings, entered into another cooperative agreement during 1978 with the Office of Support Enforcement of the State Department of Social and Health Services in accordance with the Federal Family Support Act. As a result of this agreement, Pierce County received a total of \$124,664.00 from the state and federal government for work performed by the Prosecutor's Office in the Family Support and Paternity field.

The Business Fraud — Stolen Property Division was again evaluated by the Pierce County Law and Justice Office as one of the most successful and professional law enforcement units in Pierce County. Using specialized lawyer and investigator skills to develop prosecutions in the area of economic crime, aggravated consumer fraud, and fraud against governmental entities, the Business Fraud Division handled a tatal of 605 complaints in 1978, representing a total economic loss of \$23,091,362.42.


Project EL CID (Precharge Intervention Program) continued its successful operation in 1978. The project handled a total of 638 cases, 393 of which were misdemeanor offenses and 245 were felony offenses. Project EL CID has resulted in a significant cost

savings for the people of Pierce County by diverting qualified candidates out of the criminal justice system, and also has done a fine job in deterring further criminal behavior by its clients through the securing of employment and by close supervision. Financing for EL CID in 1978 was achieved through funds from the federal government, Pierce County and the City of Tacoma. The federal funding will expire in 1979, but legislation is being proposed to the State legislature regarding diversion programs throughout the state to alleviate the crowded court and prison conditions.

A Victim/Witness Assistance Service was formally established within the Pierce County Prosecutor's Office, through financing received from the City of Tacoma. The program finally turns the attention of the criminal justice system to a long forgotten and integral part of the proceedings: the victim/witness. The program instituted by this office is designed to alleviate the burden and trauma of crime against victims and witnesses. Recognizing the importance of the victim's role in the criminal justice process, this service has taken great strides in revitalizing the communication link between the victim/witness community and the criminal justice system by keeping nearly 1,400 victims/witnesses apprised of the status of their particular case as it progresses through the system. In addition to the case status notification service, the Victim/Witness Assistance Service aided nearly 1,000 City of Tacoma victims through the application of various services such as crisis intervention, agency referral, counseling, comfort, transportation, court escort, property return and restitution assistance. The service was also responsible for assisting over 100 victims of assault in applying for State Victim Compensation, and also established a restitution service that resulted in nearly \$23,000 of Municipal and Superior Court ordered restitution. It is our intent to continue to expand the scope of our victim/witness service to the victim community fully realizing that victim cooperation is an essential element of the prosecutorial function.

The Civil Division continued to act as legal counsel to the county commissioners, the county elected officials, the superior court, independent boards and commissions of county government, numerous school districts, and other political subdivisions of Pierce County. The wide-ranging activities of county government are reflected in the work of the civil division. Legal counsel is

provided in diverse areas, including planning, land and shoreline development, grant administration, personnel, parks and recreation, facilities management, risk management and insurance, tort claims and lawsuits, involuntary mental commitments, etc. Acting as legal counsel entails primarily the preparation of formal legal opinions in response to specific departmental inquiries and representation of the county officials in formal litigation.
