
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

ACQUISITIONS

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Tables 1-8 of this bulletin contain information concerning 3,097 males and 135 females residing in Wisconsin adult correctional institutions on December 31, 1977. Adult males were housed in the Wisconsin State Prison, Wisconsin State Reformatory, Wisconsin Correctional Institution at Fox Lake, Kettle Moraine Correctional Institution, Wisconsin Correctional Institution-Oakhill, Taycheedah Correctional Institution, and nine camps of the Wisconsin Correctional Camp System. Wisconsin Correctional Institution-Oakhill was part of the Wisconsin Correctional Camp System until July 1, 1977. Adult females resided in Taycheedah Correctional Institution (which is coeducational) and one camp facility, Women's Community Center.

Tables 9-15 present characteristics of the 96 male youthful offenders who resided in Wisconsin Correctional Institution at Fox Lake and Black River Camp. These two facilities house both youthful offenders and adults. There was one female youthful offender housed at Taycheedah Correctional Institution during the period of this report.

Eighteen males who were youthful offenders were assigned to serve in adult correctional institutions. The characteristics of these men are included in adult institution tables.

Tables 16-23 present characteristics of the 18 male adults who resided in the Community Correctional Residential Center. On July 29, 1977 the Bureau of Community Corrections opened Baker House as a Community Residential Center.

The end-of-year adult male population decreased by 0.7 percent from a year ago and females showed a decrease of 2.9 percent. Residents convicted of felonies comprised 98.7 percent of the population.

The admission status of residents remains virtually unchanged for both males and females. New admissions for males are 83.0 percent of their population. Newly admitted females are 94.6 percent of their population. White males, including those of Mexican origin, decreased by 2.3 percentage points from 1976, to 56.3 percent of the male population. Black males increased 1.9 percentage points. White females, including those of Mexican origin, increased by 6.3 percentage points, to 45.1 percent.

Median age of adult males is currently 25.6 years; a year ago it was 25.0 years. Age of adult females also increased, to 27.1 from 25.7 years. Seventy percent of all residents are under age 30, about a 3 percentage point decrease from a year ago. Currently 46.1 percent of all residents are under 25 years, which is a 3.9 percentage point decrease from 1976 figures.

The median length of sentence, excluding life, indeterminate (sex deviate) sentences, and those on temporary hold, is 5.5 years for males and 5.0 years for females. Due to a change in the method of calculating medians it is difficult to make exact comparisons with a year ago; however, length of sentence appears to be increasing.

Adult males resident in Wisconsin institutions less than one year represent 41.3 percent of the male population, a decrease of 4.5 percentage points from one year ago. Those males resident 1 year, less than 2 years, showed a decrease of 0.6 percentage points, to 27.6. Median months residence in institution since last admission rose from 13.5 to 15.5 for males.

Adult females resident less than one year declined from 54.7 percent in 1976 to a current 48.9 percent of the female population. Those resident 1 year, less than 2 years, decreased from 33.8 percent to 25.9 percent. The median months in institution since last admission reflects this change, rising from 11.0 months to 12.5 months for female residents.

Robbery, armed and unarmed, continues to increase for males, representing 27.0 percent of the current residents. Burglary, however, declined somewhat, to 24.5 percent. Other sex offenses and drug violations also declined, while assault and theft, except auto, increased slightly. Auto theft remains unchanged since last year. Wisconsin statutes relating to rape and intercourse with a child were revised July 1, 1976. The current law provides for four degrees of sexual assault which are not directly comparable to any previous categories.

As it was last year, the same eight of Wisconsin's 72 counties were responsible for committing 74.4 percent of the male residents. Within those eight, however, there were changing proportions. All counties fluctuated less than one percentage point. Top twelve counties committed nearly 80 percent of the residents.

Females committed by Milwaukee County represent 55.6 percent of their population, a decrease of 7.7 percentage points from a year ago. Females were committed by only 26 of the 72 counties.

Residents in Youthful Offender Institutions

- 7 -

The Youthful Offender Act, Chapter 54 of the Wisconsin Statutes, became effective July 1, 1976. It was intended to serve persons who were under 21 at the time of commission of the offense for which they have been found guilty and for which the penalty would have been imprisonment for less than life. It is a designation at the discretion of the court. Only one female has been committed to an institution as a youthful offender at this time.

Tables 9-15 contain characteristics of the 96 males resident in youthful offender facilities on December 31, 1977. Almost 88 percent of these males were white. Not quite one-half (48.0 percent) of the residents were committed for burglary. Milwaukee County committed 25.0 percent of these males. The median length of sentence was under 3 years.

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Male Residents in Community Correctional Residential Centers

Tables 16-23 contain characteristics of the 18 males resident in Baker House, a community correctional residential center, on December 31, 1977.

This facility is administered by the Bureau of Community Corrections of the Wisconsin Division of Corrections and is intended for persons who will soon be re-entering the surrounding community. Less than one-fourth of these males were white (16.7 percent). Almost 95 percent were committed for felonies. All except one were from Milwaukee County. The median length of sentence was exactly 5 years.
