With Five-Year Trends for 1974-1978 ACQUISITIONS

This bulletin describes the residents in Wisconsin juvenile correctional institutions on December 31, 1978. Male juveniles were housed at Ethan Allen School, Lincoln Hills School, and Flambeau Camp. Following the closing of Goodland Camp on January 19, 1978, all female juveniles were housed at Lincoln Hills School, the only coeducational institution.

The number of juvenile residents declined 11.5 percent from 749 in 1977 to 672 at year-end 1978. (This was the lowest December 31 total since 1973, when there were 655 juvenile residents.) The number of boys dropped 11.5 percent, from 690 to 619, while the number of girls dropped 11.3 percent, from 59 to 53.

Whites, including 2.3 percent of Mexican origin, comprised 74.6 percent of the male juvenile population, up from 69.6 percent a year ago. The proportion of Blacks declined from 25.7 percent to 19.9 percent, and the proportion of Native Americans (Indian) rose from 4.8 percent to 5.3 percent.

Although percentage comparisons for female juveniles are inappropriate because of the small number of residents, the total proportion of Whites and Native Americans increased over last year, while the proportion of Blacks declined. At year-end 1978, 36 of the 53 female residents were White, 11 were Black, and 6 were Native American. Of 59 in residence a year ago, 35 were White, 19 were Black, and 5 were Native American.

Median age for boys decreased from 16.6 years in 1977 to 16.4 years in 1978. The median age for girls dropped from 16.4 years to 16.0 years.

Boys who had been in institutions "less than 3 months" as of December 31 increased by 1.8 percentage points from last year, to 37.7 percent. Those "3 months, less than 6" rose from 20.9 percent to 25.7 percent. The proportion of boys with lengths of stay of "6 months or more" decreased by 6.6 percentage points, to 36.6 percent. Girls with "less than 3 months" time in the institution comprised about two-fifths of the female juvenile population, a decrease of 13 percentage points from 1977. Those females with "3 months, less than 6" rose sharply, from 22.0 percent to 37.7 percent, and those "6 months or more" declined 2.7 percentage points, to 22.7 percent.

New commitments represented 70.3 percent of the juvenile male population as of December 31, a decrease of 4.1 percentage points from 1977. Those who were second or subsequent returns from aftercare rose to a five-year high of 4.7 percent of the juvenile males. The proportion of newly-committed girls comprised 79.3 percent after remaining below 70 percent for the four previous years. For the second successive year, there were no second or subsequent returns from aftercare among the girls resident on December 31. The percentage of boys and girls who had returned pending revocation hearings was substantially higher than in previous years.

County of Commitment for 619 Boys Resident December 31, 1978 Selected Counties Ranked by Number of Commitments

Juvenile residents on December 31, 1978, were committed by 61 of Wisconsin's 72 counties. Milwaukee County committed 30.3 percent of the juvenile male residents and 22.6 percent of the female residents. A year ago Milwaukee County commitments represented 39.7 percent of the boys and 37.3 percent of the girls.

Juvenile girls were committed by 25 of the 72 counties. Milwaukee County committed 13 of the 53 residents, while Kenosha County committed 7, Oconto County, 4, and Marathon and Racine Counties, 3 each. No other county committed more than 2 of the female residents.
