ADULT AND YOUTHFUL OFFENDER CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTIONS ON JUNE 30, 1977 WITH FIVE YEAR TRENDS FOR 1973-1977


Tables 1-8 of this bulletin contain information concerning 3,120 males and 149 females residing in Wisconsin adult correctional institutions on June 30, 1977. Adult males were housed in the Wisconsin State Prison, Wisconsin State Reformatory, Wisconsin Correctional Institution, Kettle Moraine Correctional Institution, Taycheedah Correctional Institution, and ten camps of the Wisconsin Correctional Camp System. Abode was opened as a tenth camp facility for males on April 1, 1977. Adult females resided in Taycheedah Correctional Institution (which is coeducational) and one camp facility, Women's Community Center.

Tables 9-15 present characteristics of the 68 male youthful offenders who resided in Wisconsin Correctional Institution at Fox Lake and Black River Camp. These two facilities house both youthful offenders and adults. There were no females institutionalized as youthful offenders during the period of this report.

Two males who were designated youthful offenders were assigned by court order to serve in the Wisconsin State Reformatory. The characteristics of these two men are included in adult institution tables.

#### **RESIDENTS IN ADULT INSTITUTIONS**

Adult Correctional institution populations increased in the last year by 0.7 percent for men and 7.2 percent for women. If it could be assumed that all 68 male youthful offenders would have resided in adult insitutions had there been no Youthful Offender Act, the total adult male institutionalized population would have increased by 2.9 percent. Although the number of residents of each sex reached a five year high for this report, the percent of increase was the lowest in this last year. Wisconsin Correctional Institution populations appear to be leveling off.

As the adult resident population levels out, the proportion of residents institutionalized for less than a year has declined to a current 40.6 percent. The percentages of males who have stayed longer than one year has reached a five-year high in each length of stay category except "10 years or more." Median length of time in institutions on current stay has increased for males to 15.0 months, 2.2 months longer than a year ago.

Length of time in correctional institutions has also shifted upward for adult female residents. Females who have resided in institutions less than one year represent 53.0 percent of their population. This shows a steady decline in percentage from the 1973 high of 72.6 percent. Median time in institutions has increased for females to 11.1 months, which is 2.3 months longer than last year.

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The percent of amle and female institution populations which had entered as new admissions continues to increase steadily over the last five years. Newly-admitted males now represent 84 percent of their population; female new admissions represent 95.3 percent.

The proportion of non-whites has also increased. Currently, 43.6 percent of the males and 58.3 percent of the female residents are non-white.

Median age of male residents is relatively stable at 25.4 years. Median age of adult female residents is at a five year high of 26.5 years.

Milwaukee County committed 49.5 percent of the adult men and 57 percent of the women. Fluctuations over the last five years are not particularly significant.

The proportion of residents whose major offense for which they were committed has changed somewhat over time. Males committed for first degree murder represented 4.6 percent last year and 5.2 percent of the population this year. Females in this category represented 5.8 percent a year ago compated with 6.0 percent June 30, 1977. Murder (2nd, 3rd, and attempt) decreased by one-tenth of a percentage point for males and increased by 1.4 percentage point for female residents. Manslaughter increased by one-tenth of a percentage point for men and 1.1 percentage points for women. Armed robbery increased by four-tenths of a percentage point for males, while decreasing by seven-tenths of a percentage point for women. It appears that the proportion of violent offenders is increasing, which is reflected in increasing median lenght of sentence for each sex.

Median length of sentence for females has steadily increased over the last five years to a current 4.2 years. For males, the median length of sentence has actually increased; however, due to changes in the intervals upon which the median was calculated, it may be apparent. Had median been calculated in 1977 as it was in past years it would be 6.1 years. New calculations on one-year intervals show 5.4 years, which is a more accurate figure. Last year's median calculated in the new manner would have been 5.3 years.

#### RESIDENTS IN YOUTHFUL OFFENDER INSTITUTIONS

The Youthful Offender Act, Chapter 54 of the Wisconsin Statutes, became effective July 1, 1976. It was intended to serve persons who were under 21 at the time of commission of the offense for which they have been found guilty and for which the penalty would have been imprisonment for less than life. It is a designation at the discretion of the court. No females had been committed to institutions as youthful offenders during the first year of this law.

There was 68 males resident in youthful offender facilities on June 30, 1977. Slightly over three-quarters of these males were white. Over one-half of the residents were committed for burglary. Less than one-sixth of the residents had committed crimes against property. Milwaukee County committed 27.9 percent of these males. The median length of sentence was just under 3 years.
