RE: √Statistical Report On Inmates At The Indiana Reformatory Who Are Serving A Life Sentence

This report is the second of four which are being prepared by the Division of Research and Statistics concerning inmates in our Department who are serving a Life sentence. The first report disseminated presents data on the Lifers at the Indiana State Prison. The next report will present combined data on the inmates at the Indiana Reformatory and the Indiana State Prison, as well as those few who are at our other institutions and facilities. The fourth report will be on females in Indiana serving Life sentences.

The purpose of these reports is two-fold. First, they are to provide a profile of this portion of our inmate population and second, they are source documents making basic information on these inmates readily available.

> Executive Summary Of Data Collected On Inmates At The Indiana Reformatory Who

> > Are Serving A Life Sentence

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The average (mean) age of subjects at the time the instant offense(s) occurred was 23 years and 2 months with a standard deviation of 7 years and 8 months. The youngest subject was 14 years and 9 months old and the oldest was 48 years and 11 months old at the time of the instant offense(s).

As of June 1, 1978, the average (mean) age of the Lifers at the Indiana Reformatory was 28 years and 4 months with a standard deviation of 9 years and 9 months. The youngest subject was 15 years and 7 months old and the oldest was 56 years and 5 months. Gordon H. Faulkner Page No. 2 August 29, 1978

As of July 5, 1978, 61.7% of the subjects had been admitted to the Indiana Department of Correction on their instant offense(s) during the past five calendar years (January 1, 1974, to July 5, 1978). An additional 28.3% have been admitted since January 1, 1968. Therefore, 90.0% of the subjects have served approximately 10 years or less.

The average (mean) time in the Indiana Department of Correction as of June 1, 1978, was 4 years and 5 months with a standard deviation of 4 years and 5 months.

The average (mean) amount of time in the Indiana Department of Correction before being transferred to the Indiana Reformatory was 2 years and 2 months with a standard deviation of 3 years and 6 months.

Approximately 65% of the subjects are White (not Hispanic) and 35% Black (not Hispanic).

Almost 18% of the subjects had an initial plea of guilty to the instant offense(s) and approximately 82% had a plea of not guilty.

Sixty-seven per cent of the subjects were committed with a single offense; however, some did have multiple counts. The remaining 33% of the subjects were committed with multiple offenses (these were not necessarily Life sentences).

Approximately 36% of the subjects were committed for the single offense of 1st Degree Murder. Some of these subjects had more than one count. An additional 9.6% were committed for 1st Degree Murder plus at least one other offense. Included in this last statistic are 2.4% of the subjects who were also convicted of 2nd Degree Murder.

Slightly over 18% of the subjects were committed for the single offense of 2nd Degree Murder (some subjects had multiple counts). An additional 6% were committed for 2nd Degree Murder plus at least one other offense (not necessarily a Life sentence). This last statistic does not include those subjects also convicted of 1st Degree Murder.

Approximately 51% of the subjects had no accomplice for their instant offense(s). Slightly over 25% of the subjects had one accomplice.

Just over 41% of the subjects committed for murder used a handgun as the death weapon. The second highest method of causing death was by shotgun. This was slightly over 21%.

Approximately 55% of the subjects committed for murder killed a stranger. Slightly over 39% killed a friend or acquaintence. None of the subjects were committed for killing either a spouse or ex-spouse. Gordon H. Faulkner Page No. 3 August 29, 1978

Slightly under 15% of the subjects were reported to be intoxicated at the time the instant offense occured. Approximately 12% were under the influence of drug/narcotic when the instant offense was committed. The main source of data for these statistics was statements of the subjects.

Just over 25% of the subjects were committed from Marion County. Lake County had the second highest percent of commitments with just over 8%. The third highest percent of commitments was from Vanderburgh County with 6.0%.

In approximately 80% of the cases the instant offense occurred in the same county in which the subject lived.

Slightly over 56% of the subjects were not employed at the time the instant offense occurred. Forty percent of the subjects were employed full-time. The remaining subjects were employed on a part-time basis.

Approximately 28% of the subjects were living with a friend or friends when the instant offense occurred. Just over 22% were living with a parent or parents. The remaining subjects were living with a spouse, alone, other relatives, etc.

Just over 62% of the subjects were single and approximately 26% were married at the time the instant offense was committed.

Almost 67% of the subjects are serving their first felony commitment. When using the number of prior felony commitments served anywhere as the criteria, the recidivism rate for these subjects is approximately 33%.

When all commitments and all offenses are considered for the subjects who have served one or more prior felony commitments, 2nd Degree Burglary was the most common offense. Forgery and Armed Robbery tied for the second most common offense for prior commitments. None of the subjects had previously been committed for murder.

Slightly over 64% of the subjects had received one or more disciplinary write-ups during the first two years of their present incarceration. This statistic includes subject who had served two years or less of their sentence.

Out-of-place was the most frequent offense for those subjects receiving disciplinary write-ups during their first two years. Being in an unauthorized area and insolence ranked second and third, respectively.

Approximately 48% of the subjects had received disciplinary write-ups during the past two years of their present commitment. This statistic does not include subjects who have served two years or less.

The most common offense resulting in a disciplinary write-up for the past two years of incarceration was refusing an order, Out-of-place and insolence tied as the second most common offense.

A supplementary report will be prepared in the near future presenting data on the following three areas: (1) lenght of time since last institutional physical examination, (2) percent of subjects under a medical doctor's care at the time the initial data was collected, and (3) ailments of those subjects being treated by medical staff. This information was unavailable at the time of data collection.

A statistically created model of the "typical" Lifer at the Indiana Reformatory in July of this year gives us an individual with these characteristics:

The inmate is a white, 28 year old male from Marion County, Indiana. He was single and unemployed at the time the instant offense was committed. He entered a plea of not guilty but was convicted of 1st Degree Murder and subsequently sentenced from Marion County.

This conviction for 1st Degree Murder came as a result of his killing a stranger with a handgun. This occurred in Marion County. He had no accomplices and was not under the influence of drugs or alcohol at the time the murder occurred.

This inmate is serving his first felony commitment and has been in the Indiana Department of Correction approximately four years. Two years of this time have been served at the Indiana Reformatory.

During his first two years of incarceration he received three disciplinary write-ups. These were for being out of place, being in an unauthorized area and insolence:

During the last two years of incarceration he has received one disciplinary write-up. This was for refusing an order.
