

In accordance with the provisions of Section 351-70, Hawaii Revised Statutes, we respectfully submit the Annual Report of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Commission for the calendar year 1980. This is the Thirteenth Report and covers the activities of the Commission for the period December 16, 1979 through December 15, 1980.

Many States have developed special Crime Victim Compensation programs to respond to some of the financial consequences of victimization. These programs compensate innocent victims injured as a result of the crime, and in cases of death, compensate the surviving dependents of the victim. Funds are provided for unreimbursed medical costs, loss of earnings, loss of support, and funeral expenses.

Although compensation programs may be justified on humanitarian grounds alone, they also (1) demonstrate the State's concern for the victim of violent crime, (2) reduce the financial impact of criminal injuries, (3) increase reporting of crime, (4) increase victim cooperation, (5) deliver effective assistance to victims, and (6) improve victim services throughout the State.

To date, twenty nine (29) States have enacted some form of compensation legislation. Besides Hawaii, the other American jurisdictions are: Alaska, California, Connecticut, Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Indiana, Kansas, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Massachusetts, Michigan, Minnesota, Montana, Nebraska, Nevada, New Jersey, New York, North Dakota, Ohio, Oregon, Pennsylvania, Texas, Tennessee, Virginia, Washington, and Wisconsin.

Since the inception of the Hawaii program in 1967, the State has disbursed a total of \$2,250,817.07 to 1,544 persons. The 1981 Legislature will be asked to appropriate \$598,535.24 to pay four hundred and fifty (450) victims who were awarded compensation in 1980.

Because of a deficiency in the Compensation Fund, two hundred and sixty six (266) persons who were awarded compensation in 1980 will have to wait until August 1981 before any payment can be expected. The awards total \$323,826.26. To the clients who were awarded compensation, the failure to pay them after an award is made is both frustrating and unjustified. A Revolving Fund of \$500,000 must be established if victims are to be paid without undue delay.

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ACQUISITIONS

In the 1980 legislative session, a bill (H.B. No. 1762-80) was introduced to have the Legislature appropriate \$223,396.45 based on awards made to 241 persons in 1979. The bill was later amended to include \$46,556.53 for other awards made in 1979, and \$49,859.69 for awards made to fifty (50) victims in early 1980. An additional \$100,000 was also requested by the Commission to be used in compensating other victims. However, the \$100,000 amount was deleted from the bill because Legislators felt that it is desirable to maintain legislative scrutiny of payments under the Criminal Injuries Compensation Act instead of allowing unilateral awards by the Commission.

The Commission continued the regular business of investigating applications, holding hearings, answering inquiries about the Hawaii program, and informing the public of our activities.

The first priority established by the Commission in 1980 was the scheduling of hearings for as many cases as possible to reduce the backlog of over 400 pending claims carried over from the previous year. Because of the heavy caseload, the Commission was compelled to meet twice weekly in Honolulu. In addition to the meetings held on Oahu, one meeting was held in Maui, one meeting on Kauai, and four days of hearings were held on the Big Island. Every attempt is being made to give each applicant a prompt and thorough hearing and decision.

The work of the Commission was accomplished at 55 formal meetings called for the purpose of holding hearings on applications preparatory to issuing its decisions and orders. In addition to the formal hearings, the Commission held several administrative meetings to discuss legislation, operating procedures, and to consider decisions in difficult cases. One meeting was held with the Director, Department of Social Services & Housing, to discuss administrative problems, and one meeting was held with officials of the Hilo Police Department to establish guidelines for the release of police reports by that agency.

The number of applications received in 1980 increased substantially. With increased public awareness of the Criminal Injuries Compensation program, further increases are anticipated in 1981. Notwithstanding the increase in applications submitted to us, only 14% of the eligibles filed claims. We will continue to discharge our responsibility to advise the public concerning the benefits available under the statutes.

During the period December 16, 1979 through December 15, 1980, the Commission received 459 new applications and disposed of 626 claims. As of December 16, 1980, there were 248 applications still pending. Summaries of the awards, denials, and withdrawals are contained in Appendixes A, B, and C of this report. Details of the number of applications and orders are summarized in Table 1 of this part.

Applications received from the Big Island continues to increase. The Commission held several days of hearings on the islands of Maui, Kauai, and Hawaii and disposed of 147 cases. Every application from these islands which was ready for a hearing at the time was acted upon. Sixty (60) outside island applications are still pending. The majority of the claims are of recent vintage.

The awards in 1980 total \$598,535.24. While Appendix A of this report sets forth in great detail a financial analysis of each award, Table 2 indicates the "average" of the awards. Statistical data for the period 1968-1980 may be found under Appendix C.

64 applicants were represented by attorneys. 25 of the attorneys were given awards; 6 attorneys waived their legal fees; and, 33 attorneys received no compensation. Attorneys' fees amounted to \$1,850.00 and are included in the aggregate total of the awards. The average of the attorneys' fees awarded amounted to \$74.00.

The Commission is required by law to review each application and to make a thorough investigation for payments made by collateral source. As a result of investigations conducted by the Commission staff, we were able to save \$455,978.38 in awards in 1980. Table 3 below indicates the amounts of compensation which would have been awarded had it not been for checks made by the Commission staff.

The Operating Budget for the Commission for FY 1979-80 totals \$75,962.00. The figure covers salaries for three employees, per diem for three Commissioners who serve on a fee basis, office rental, travel, materials and supplies, and maintenance costs. The budget is inadequate in light of the rapidly expanding caseload and the resultant demands upon the staff and the Commission members. At present, the Commission is staffed by three persons - the Administrator, one Investigator and a Secretary. Between the three of them, approximately nine hundred (900) applications must be investigated, processed, prepared for hearings, heard, documented, and awards paid. The workload of the Commission justifies the hiring of a Clerk-Stenographer to alleviate the heavy workload of the Secretary.

## HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR

A major accomplishment of the Commission was the disposition of 134 applications which have been pending for more than a year on Oahu, and 147 neighbor island claims.

Because the police will not release reports for many of the sensitive cases, the Commission exercised its subpoena powers. As a result of the Commission action, an officer from the Criminal Investigation Division, Honolulu Police Department, testified and twenty-one (21) cases were closed. Thirteen (13) cases resulted in awards while eight (8) claims were denied.

During the year, 18 requests for reconsideration were received by the Commission. Of the total, 12 were given favorable consideration by the Commission while 6 requests were denied.

One case involved a tourist who was knocked down by a purse snatcher in Waikiki on July 16, 1978. The victim, a 76 year old female from Jersey City, suffered contusions and abrasions of the right knee, right forearm, and right facial area. She was treated at Straub Clinic & Hospital, Inc. and released because the doctor did not find anything seriously wrong. While enroute home, victim stopped over in Las Vegas and became violently ill. She returned home and was hospitalized. On January 11, 1979, victim died from broncho pneumonia. The application came up for a hearing on January 18, 1980, and a decision was rendered. The Commission determined that victim did not die from injuries sustained in the assault incident. An award of \$39.79 was made to Applicant (daughter of victim) for out-of-pocket medical expenses. Applicant violently disagreed with the Findings of the Commission and filed protests with Senator Bill Bradley of New Jersey; Senator Daniel Inouye; Governor George Ariyoshi; and others. On April 25, 1980, the Commission Chairman wrote applicant a letter informing her that the Commission reviewed the files and still finds that there is no medical evidence to indicate that victim's death was directly caused by the purse snatching incident. In the same letter, the Commission requested that applicant submit additional reports from doctors who treated victim in New Jersey. To date, no report has been received.

\* \* \*

Two members of the Commission attended a Workshop for Program Administrators, Legislators, Representatives of Victim/Witness Advocacy Programs, Planners, and Criminal Justice Executives. Commissioner Sophie Sheather and Administrator Wilfred S. Pang were

invited to participate in the "Compensating Victims of Crime Workshop" held in Los Angeles, California, January 23-25, 1980.

The Workshop was the first of a series of seven sponsored by the National Institute of Law Enforcement & Criminal Justice, U.S. Department of Justice, and conducted by the National Criminal Justice Research Utilization Program. Other workshops were held in San Francisco, California; Baltimore, Maryland; Oklahoma City, Oklahoma; Madison, Wisconsin; Atlanta, Georgia; and, Providence, Rhode Island.

Through these workshops, policy makers investigate the types of compensation available and the range of existing methods for providing compensation. Those in attendance were given every opportunity to design a victim compensation program, or change their existing program based on the issues raised at the Workshop.

The wealth of practical knowledge gained from the Workshop by our representatives will be useful in improving and strengthening the Hawaii Criminal Injuries Compensation program.

## CONCLUSION

1980 was a very productive year for the Commission when measured by the number of hearings held and the number of Orders issued. Much time and thought was also directed to the consideration of several very important areas affecting the administration of the Criminal Injuries Compensation Program.

Hawaii continues to be recognized as one of the leading States in the crime victims compensation field. If the Hawaii program is deficient in any respect, it would be in the fact that the program is inadequately funded.

Victim is a 32 year old male who was killed when he chased after three men who robbed his store. He was shot in the neck. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses. Victim was the owner of a Chinese restaurant and contributed to the support of his parents. Reasonable funeral and burial expenses totaled \$2,500. Applicant, father of the deceased victim, is awarded \$2,500 for funeral and burial expenses, and \$2,500 for partial dependency for a total award of \$5,000.

78-200

Victim is a 15 year old boy who was injured when he was hit on the head with a rock thrown by other students who attended a football game at the Aloha Stadium. He was a member of the Kaiser High School Band and was sitting in the school bus when the attack occurred. Victim suffered a skull fracture. Medical expenses totaling \$5,499.37 were paid under the Workers' Compensation program. Victim is awarded \$5,000 for pain and suffering.

78-208

Victim is a 28 year old female who was assaulted and raped by an unidentified male in her apartment. Medical expenses totaled \$104. There is no evidence to indicate that victim lost earnings because of the incident. She is awarded \$104 for medical expenses, and \$750 for pain, suffering, nervous and mental shock for a total award of \$854.

78-210

Victim is a 19 year old male who was assaulted by four men when he tried to stop a fight. He was punched and suffered contusions and abrasions of the right arm and elbow. Medical expenses totaled \$123.99. Victim is unemployed. He is awarded \$123.99 for medical expenses, and \$100 for pain and suffering for a total award of \$223.99. Of the \$223.99 awarded, \$97.50 shall be paid to St. Francis Hospital and \$26.49 to The Radiology Group.

78-231 (Hilo)

Victim is a 27 year old female whose body was discovered in a coconut grove in Kalapana, Hawaii. She was strangled to death. There are no medical expenses. Victim was employed by the California State Park Service at the time of her death. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$3,956.27. Applicant, father of the deceased victim, is awarded \$3,956.27 for funeral and burial expenses.

78-245

Victim is a 19 year old male who was stabbed to death. The police is unable to determine the motive for the killing. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses, and victim was not employed. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$832. Applicant, father of the deceased victim, is awarded \$832 for funeral and burial expenses.

78-249

Victim is a 22 year old male who was shot as the result of an argument arising out of a motor vehicle incident. Medical expenses totaled \$1,005.47 of which \$411.88 was paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Victim did not work for a month and lost approximately \$800 in wages. He is awarded \$593.59 for medical expenses, \$800 for loss of earning power, and \$400 for pain and suffering for a total award of \$1,793.59. Of the \$1,793.59 awarded, \$275.60 shall be paid to Dr. Worldster Lee, \$164.58 to Dr. Francis Oda, \$77.24 to The Emergency Group, and \$76.17 to Queen's Medical Center.

Victim is a 32 year old male who was assaulted by six men as the result of an argument. He was struck in the face and kicked in the body, and suffered a fractured nose, dislocated left shoulder, and contusions of the face and left eye. Medical expenses totaling \$1,303.92 were covered by insurance. Victim, a salesman, did not lose any earnings because of the incident. He is awarded \$500 for pain and suffering.

78-256

Victim is a 69 year old female who was assaulted and robbed while enroute home. She was knocked to the ground and when she fell she fractured her left hip, left hand, and suffered abrasions of the left forearm and knee. Medical expenses totaled \$4,648.30 of which \$3,039.23 was paid by Medicare, and \$705.44 discounted by the hospital. Victim is unemployed. She is awarded \$903.63 for medical expenses, and \$800 for pain and suffering for a total award of \$1,703.63.

78-258

Victim is a 30 year old female who was assaulted and robbed by two burglars who broke into her home. She was struck in the face and suffered contusions of the face, upper lip, and eyes. Medical expenses totaled \$256.66 of which \$217.82 was paid by HMSA. Victim did not work for six days because of her injury and would have lost \$213.28 in wages except that she used sick leave during her convalescence. Victim is awarded \$38.83 for medical expenses, and \$500 for pain and suffering for a total award of \$538.84.

78-259

Victim is a 30 year old male who rescued his wife from two burglars who broke into his home. When he fought off the assailants he was struck in the face and suffered a fracture of the nose and lacerations of the face. Medical expenses totaled \$827.51 of which \$617.95 was paid by HMSA. Victim did not work for five days because of his injury and would have lost \$311.52 in wages except that he used sick leave during his convalescence. Victim is awarded \$209.56 for medical expenses, and \$500 for pain and suffering for a total award of \$709.56.

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78-260

Victim is a 48 year old female who was assaulted by her boyfriend. They were both living together at the time of the incident. Victim suffered a fracture of the ribs, lacerations of the face and upper lip, and contusions of the body. Medical expenses totaled \$1,142.75 of which \$893.56 was paid by HMSA. Victim is a 25 year old female who was injured when she went to the assistance of her cousin who was being assaulted. She suffered contusions of the right eye, shoulder and knees. No medical bills were submitted and victim is unemployed. She is awarded \$25 for pain and suffering.

78-270

Victim is a 31 year old male who was injured in a fight. The more credible evidence indicates that victim refused to allow a patron in a Bar and an argument ensued. When victim struck the first blow he was punched and, as he fell his head hit the concrete. He subsequently died from the injury. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses. Victim was employed as a waiter at the time of his death. However, he was not dependent upon Applicant for support and was not supporting Applicant. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$2,497.10. Applicant, mother of the deceased victim, is awarded \$2,497.10 for funeral and burial expenses. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the award of \$2,497.10 is reduced by 50% (\$1,248.55), making a final award of \$1,248.55.

78-272

Victim is a 20 year old male who was murdered by the person he befriended in a Bar in Waikiki. There are no medical expenses. Victim was a seaman employed by Kentron Hawaii, Ltd. Cremation and related expenses totaled \$560.99. Applicant, mother of the deceased victim, is awarded \$560.99 to cover the above expenses.

78-278

Victim is a 72 year old female who was assaulted, raped, and sodomized by two men who entered her apartment. Medical expenses totaling \$22.76 were paid by Medicare. Victim is unemployed. She is awarded \$750 for pain, suffering, nervous and mental shock.

78-280

Victim is a 16 year old male who was assaulted as the result of an argument. He was struck in the right eye and suffered contusions of the right eyebrow. Medical expenses totaled \$51.00. Victim is awarded \$51.00 for medical expenses, and \$50.00 for pain and suffering for a total award of \$101.00.

78-282

Victim is a 23 year old female who was raped in her home by a juvenile. No medical bills were submitted, and victim is unemployed. She is awarded \$750 for pain, suffering, nervous and mental shock.

78-284

Victim is a 23 year old female who was assaulted by two men who offered her a ride. She was taken to a pineapple field where she was raped. Medical expenses totaled \$1,435.20 of which \$792.80 was paid by insurance, and \$344 discounted. Victim is unemployed. She is awarded \$500 for pain, suffering, nervous and mental shock.

78-287

Victim is a 76 year old female who was knocked down by a purse snatcher in Waikiki. She suffered abrasions and contusions of the right knee, right forearm, and facial area. Victim was treated at Straub Clinic and Hospital, Inc. and medical expenses totaled \$65.36 of which \$25.57 was paid by Medicare. Victim was not gainfully employed at the time of the incident. Victim is a 29 year old female who was raped and sodomized at gunpoint in a hospital parking garage. The assailant was subsequently arrested and sentenced to 20 years in prison. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses. Victim did not work for 8 days and would have lost \$340 in wages except that she used sick leave during her convalescence. She is awarded \$1,500 for pain, suffering, nervous and mental shock.

78-291

Victim is a 20 year old male who was injured in a fight. He suffered contusions of the face and lacerations of the right eye and right ear. Medical expenses totaling \$327.08 were paid by HMSA. Victim did not work for 10 days and would have lost \$360 in wages except that he used two days vacation and eight days sick leave during his convalescence. Victim is awarded \$100 for pain and suffering.

Victim is a 27 year old male who was assaulted by six men at Ala Moana Park. He suffered lacerations of the head and left ear, and abrasions of the face, shoulders and back. Medical expenses totaling \$792.56 were written off by Straub Clinic & Hospital, Inc. There is no evidence to indicate that victim lost earnings because of the incident. He is awarded \$100 for pain and suffering.

78-296

Victim is a 19 year old male who was injured in a fight. He was punched and kicked and suffered a fracture of the nose and right cheek bone, contusions of the face, and lacerations of the lower lip and right eye. Medical expenses totaled \$2,124.15 of which \$2,060.61 was paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Victim is unemployed. He is awarded \$63.54 for out-of-pocket medical expenses and \$100 for pain and suffering for a total award of \$163.54.

78-298 (Hilo)

Victim is a 23 year old male who was assaulted and robbed in his home. He suffered a fracture of the left jaw. Medical expenses totaled \$206.75 of which \$78.18 was paid by HMSA. There is no evidence to indicate that victim lost earnings because of the incident. Victim is awarded \$130.57 for medical expenses, and \$500 for pain and suffering for a total award of \$630.57.

78-299

Victim is a 24 year old female who was struck by a car while jogging. The assailant kidnapped her and took her to Kawela Bay where she was raped and sodomized. Medical expenses totaled \$189.83 of which \$93.95 was paid by HMSA. Victim, a part-time student helper, did not work for six months and lost \$150.45 in wages. She is awarded \$95.98 for out-of-pocket medical expenses, \$150.45 for loss of earnings, and \$1,000 for pain, suffering, nervous and mental shock, for a total award of \$1,246.43.

78-302

Victim is a 15 year old girl who was sexually abused by her neighbor. There are no medical expenses. Victim is awarded \$500 for pain, suffering, nervous and mental shock.

78-307

Victim is a 30 year old female who was assaulted, sodomized and raped at a public beach park. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses, and victim is unemployed. She is awarded \$750 for pain, suffering, nervous and mental shock.

78-309

Victim is a 21 year old male who was assaulted and robbed by three men while he was using a public telephone. He was struck in the face and suffered contusions of the right jaw. Medical expenses totaled \$223.38. There is no evidence to indicate that victim lost earnings because of the incident. He is awarded \$223.38 for medical expenses, and \$250 for pain and suffering for a total award of \$473.38.

78-312 (Kauai)

Victim is a 21 year old female whose badly decomposed body was discovered on the island of Kauai. There are no medical expenses, and there is no evidence to indicate that victim was employed at the time of her death. Funeral expenses totaled \$364.94 of which \$255 was paid by Social Security. Applicant, mother of the deceased victim, is awarded \$109.94 for funeral expenses, and \$182.90 for other pecuniary loss for a total award of \$292.84.

Victim is a 28 year old female who was kidnapped at a public beach park and taken to a camp site where she was raped. Medical expenses totaling \$68.25 were paid by the Sex Abuse Treatment Center. There is no evidence to indicate that victim lost earnings because of the incident. She is awarded \$750 for pain, suffering, nervous and mental shock.

78-317

Victim is a 62 year old female who was assaulted by a man who tried to enter her home. She was punched in the face and suffered contusions of the right eye. Medical expenses totaled \$127.77. Victim is unemployed. She is awarded \$127.77 for medical expenses, and \$25 for pain and suffering for a total award of \$152.77. Of the \$152.77 awarded, \$127.77 shall be paid to Straub Clinic & Hospital, Inc.

78-318 (Hilo)

Victim is a 27 year old female who was raped by a man who entered her home. There are no medical expenses, and victim is unemployed. She is awarded \$750 for pain, suffering, nervous and mental shock.

78-329

Victim is a 21 year old male who was assaulted as the result of an argument arising out of a motor vehicle incident. He was struck in the face and suffered a fracture of the nose, contusions of the left cheek and jaw, and abrasions of the neck and right arm. Medical expenses totaled \$89.44 of which \$65.24 was paid by HMSA and \$1.70 discounted by the doctor. Victim did not work for two weeks and would have lost \$416 in wages except that he received \$143.50 in TDI benefits. Victim is awarded \$22.50 for out-of-pocket medical expenses, \$272.50 for loss of earning power, and \$100 for pain and suffering for a total award of \$395.

Victim is a 65 year old female who was assaulted and robbed at her place of business. She was knocked down and suffered contusions and abrasions of the head. Medical expenses were covered by the Kaiser Health Plan. There is no evidence to indicate that victim lost earnings because of the incident. She is awarded \$150 for pain and suffering.

Victim is a 25 year old male who was shot as the result of an argument arising out of a motor vehicle incident. He subsequently died from injuries sustained. Medical expenses totaled \$3,335.86. Victim was employed as a Roofer Helper at the time of his death. However, he was not supporting Applicant. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$2,500. Applicant, mother of the deceased victim, is awarded \$3,335.86 for medical expenses, and \$2,500 for funeral and burial expenses for a total award of \$5,835.86. Of the \$5,835.86 awarded, \$3,269.30 shall be paid to Queen's Medical Center and \$66.56 to The Emergency Group, Inc.

78-351

Victim is a 72 year old female who was knocked down by a purse snatcher. She suffered a fracture of the 12th thoracic vertebral body when she fell. Medical expenses totaled \$292.61 of which \$151.87 was paid by HMSA and \$140.74 by Medicare. Victim is unemployed. She is awarded \$350 for pain and suffering.

78-356 (Hilo)

Victim is a 30 year old female who was assaulted at her place of work by a mentally deranged person. She suffered contusions and abrasions of the neck. No medical bills were submitted, and there is no evidence to indicate that victim lost earnings because of the incident. Victim is awarded \$100 for pain and suffering.

78-359

Victim is a 23 year old male who was murdered. He sustained gunshot wounds of the head and neck. No medical bills were submitted, and there is insufficient evidence to support Applicant's claim for dependency. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$1,311.64. Applicant, wife of the deceased victim, is awarded \$1,311.64 for funeral and burial expenses.

79-6

Victim is a 19 year old female who was beaten, raped and sodomized by two men who offered her a ride. She suffered lacerations of the mouth and contusions of the chest and back. Medical expenses totaling \$118.55 were absorbed by the Sex Abuse Treatment Center. There is no evidence to indicate that victim lost earnings because of the incident. She is awarded \$1,000 for pain, suffering, nervous and mental shock. An award of \$35 is made to Michael J.Y. Wong for attorney's fees.

79-8

Victim is a 40 year old male who was assaulted in a restaurant parking lot. He was struck in the face and suffered lacerations of the left ear lobe and contusions of the face. Medical expenses totaled \$1,226.96 of which \$1,129.01 was paid by HMSA. Victim did not work for 62 days and would have lost \$3,501 in earnings except that he used 34 days sick leave valued at \$1,458.75 and received \$1,320 in TDI benefits. Victim is awarded \$107.95 for medical expenses, \$722.25 for loss of earnings, and \$750 for pain and suffering for a total award of \$1,580.20.

Victim is an 18 year old male who was injured in an altercation. He was struck on the head and suffered contusions. No medical bills were submitted, and there is no evidence to indicate that victim lost earnings because of the incident. He is awarded \$25 for pain and suffering.

Victim is a 28 year old male who was assaulted in a robbery attempt. He was knocked down and suffered a mild fracture of the right knee. Medical expenses totaling \$267.12 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Victim is unemployed. He is awarded \$200 for pain and suffering.

Victim is a 24 year old male who was injured when he tried to stop a fight. He sustained a laceration of the right forearm and contusions of the neck and left buttock. Victim is an 13 year old male who was assaulted at a Drive Inn parking lot. He was punched in the face and suffered contusions of the nose. Medical expenses totaling \$55 were covered by the Kaiser Health Plan. Victim is unemployed. He is awarded \$50 for pain and suffering.

79-22 (Hilo)

Victim is an 18 year old female who was assaulted by an unidentified male. She suffered contusions and abrasions of the scalp and lacerations of the middle finger of her left hand. Medical expenses totaling \$128.23 were covered by insurance. Victim is unemployed. She is awarded \$400 for pain and suffering.

79-29

Victim is a 29 year old male who was assaulted. He was struck in the facial area and suffered a nondisplaced fracture of the right cheek. Medical expenses totaled \$498.10 of which \$355.22 was paid by insurance. Victim lost \$86.44 in wages because of his injury. Victim is a 16 year old female who was raped by a family acquaintance. No medical bills were submitted. Victim is awarded \$1,000 for pain, suffering, nervous and mental shock.

Victim is a 23 year old female who was accosted and raped by a burglar who entered the dress shop where she worked. Medical expenses were covered under the Workers' Compensation program. Victim did not work for three months because of the incident and would have lost \$1,852.50 in earnings except that she received \$1,233.77 in disability payments under the Workers' Compensation program. Victim is awarded \$618.73 for loss of earnings, and \$2,000 for pain, suffering, nervous and mental shock for a total award of \$2,618.73.

Victim is a 35 year old male who was killed while in the act of preventing a crime. He was stabbed in the chest. Medical expenses totaled \$17,308.99 of which \$17,185.78 was paid by HMSA. Victim was employed as a Vault Puller by MTL, Inc. at the time of his death. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$3,599.30 of which \$255 was paid by Social Security. Victim is a 13 year old girl who was injured in a fight. She suffered contusions of the face. No medical bills were submitted and victim is unemployed. Victim is awarded \$100 for pain and suffering.

80-71 (Hilo)

Victim is a 15 year old boy who was injured in a fight. He suffered a fractured right jaw. Medical expenses totaled \$94.14. Victim is unemployed. He is awarded \$94.14 for medical expenses, and \$25 for pain and suffering for a total award of \$119.14.

Victim is a 41 year old male who was assaulted at a Diner. The more credible evidence indicates that he was intoxicated. He also refused to identify the suspect for the police. He suffered lacerations of the upper lip and a fracture of the clavicle. Medical expenses totaling \$171.06 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Victim is unemployed. He is awarded \$500 for pain and suffering. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the \$500 award is reduced by 50% making a final award of \$250.

Victim is a 53 year old female who was assaulted as the result of an argument. She suffered contusions and abrasions of the head. Medical expenses totaled \$796.20 of which \$315.83 was paid by HMSA. There is no evidence to indicate that victim lost earnings because of the incident. She is awarded \$453.37 for medical expenses, and \$50 for pain and suffering for a total award of \$503.37.

Victim is a 23 year old female who was assaulted by a neighbor. Medical bills were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Victim is unemployed. She is awarded \$100 for pain and suffering.

80-234

Victim is a 23 year old female who was assaulted by a neighbor. She suffered contusions of the right eye. Medical expenses totaled \$58.58 of which \$38.51 was paid by HMSA. Victim did not work for 3 days because of the incident. However, she used sick leave during her convalescence. Medical expenses totaled \$70.67 of which \$55.08 was paid by HMSA. Victim was unable to work because of the incident and lost \$90.55 in wages. She is awarded \$13.77 for medical expenses, \$90.55 for loss of earnings, and \$50 for pain and suffering for a total award of \$154.32.

Applicant is a 23 year old male who was injured in a motor vehicle accident. He suffered multiple fractures to both legs. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant had been arrested for shooting at a police officer. He was handcuffed, and placed in the rear seat of a police car. While being transported to the police station Applicant kicked out the rear window of the car and escaped. As he fled on the H-1 Freeway he was struck by a passing vehicle. Medical expenses totaled more than \$5,000. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant is not a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

76-215

Applicant is a 12 year old girl who was frightened by a burglar who broke into her home. She was not injured by the burglar. Because Applicant is not a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

76-285

Victim is a 24 year old male who was shot to death. The more credible evidence indicates that victim was involved in criminal activities and was killed in a confrontation with one of his associates. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses, and victim was unemployed. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$812.54. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

77-7

Applicant is a 38 year old male who was severely beaten by several men. An attempt was also made to run him over with a car. Applicant was in the company of a man who had an extensive criminal background at the time of the incident. He suffered a fracture of the right arm and ribs, lacerations of the cheek and eye, and abrasions of both knees and elbows. Medical expenses totaling \$1,597.50 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant failed to report for his scheduled hearing to tell the Commissioners what really happened, the Commission is unable to determine whether he is an innocent victim. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

77-23

Victim is a 26 year old male who was severely beaten by several men. The assailants also ran their car over him and killed him. There are no medical expenses, and victim was not employed. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$3,363.40. Because victim had an extensive criminal background and the killing was deliberately planned, and because the person who was with him at the time of the incident failed to report for his scheduled hearing to tell the Commission what really happened, the Commission is unable to determine whether the decedent is an innocent victim. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

77-60

Victim is a 29 year old female who was shot and killed at a public beach park. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses. Victim was employed at Lanakila Crafts. Funeral and burial expenses totaling \$780.94 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Because Applicant, mother of the deceased victim, did not have any out-of-pocket expenses, and was not dependent upon the victim for support, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation. The claim is denied.

77-71

Victim is a 53 year old female who was strangled to death in her home. The more credible evidence indicates that victim was killed because she was involved in illicit affairs. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses. Victim was employed as a Nurses' Aide at the time of her death. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$3,014.90. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused her death, the claim is denied.

77-78

Applicant is a 29 year old male who was injured in a gang fight. He suffered stab wounds of the chest and stomach. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant and several of his friends engaged in fistfights with a group of construction workers at the Westgate Shopping Center. Applicant and his friends were drinking in the bar prior to the incident. No medical bills were submitted, and there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

77-161

Victim is a 51 year old male who was found beaten and strangled to death. The more credible evidence indicates that he was a homosexual, and was picked up by the suspect for sexual activity. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses. Victim was employed as a Special Representative by Pacific Fruit Express Company, San Francisco, California. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$2,716.60. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

77-174

Victim is a 44 year old male who was shot to death. The more credible evidence indicates that victim was killed because he was involved in criminal activities. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses. Victim was President of Mitsui Tours of Hawaii at the time of his death. No funeral and burial bills were submitted. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

77-186 (Hilo)

Victim is a 40 year old male whose decomposed body was discovered near a Puna Sugar Company cane field. The more credible evidence indicates that victim was killed in a dispute between two underworld factions fighting over control of Big Island gambling operations. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses, and there is no evidence to indicate that victim was gainfully employed at the time of the incident. No funeral and burial expenses were submitted. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

77-278

Victim is a 47 year old male who was killed in a fight in a Bar. He had been drinking heavily and was loud, boisterous, and intoxicated. Medical bills totaling \$10,097.33 were paid by HMSA. Victim was General Sales Manager of Pflueger Lincoln-Mercury, Inc. at the time of his death. Funeral expenses totaled \$1,866.24 of which \$255 was paid by Social Security and \$250 by the Veterans Administration. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

77-283

Applicant is a 50 year old male who was attacked and assaulted while he was making a deposit in a bank night depository. He was struck on the head with a pipe and suffered a fractured skull. Medical expenses totaling \$3,000 were covered by Workers' Compensation. Applicant has not been able to return to work because of injuries sustained. However, he received \$9,515.48 in disability payments under the Workers' Compensation Program, and will continue to receive benefits as long as he is incapacitated. Because collateral benefits received by Applicant exceeded the amount of award he would have received from the Commission, the claim is denied.

77-286

Victim is a 26 year old female who was accosted and assaulted in a public parking area. She was struck in the face and suffered a fracture of the right orbital wall, and had a tooth knocked out. Medical expenses totaled \$283.60. Victim did not work for 3 weeks and lost \$264.60 in earning power. Because victim did not report the crime to police, the claim is denied.

78-7

Victim is a 26 year old male who was stabbed and killed in a fight with a female. The more credible evidence indicates that victim was stabbed by the offender when he attempted to force his way into her apartment. There are no medical expenses, and victim was not employed. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$1,759.98. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

78-17

Victim is a 25 year old male whose body was found in the back seat of a parked car. He was shot in the head. Victim was a member of Organized Crime and was killed in a dispute over the control of the syndicate. There are no medical expenses, and there is no evidence to indicate that victim was gainfully employed. Funeral and burial expenses totaling \$812.14 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

78-23

Applicant is an 18 year old male who was shot by an unidentified assailant. He suffered a gunshot wound of the right chest. Medical expenses totaled \$695.30 of which part of the bills were covered by HMSA. Applicant did not work for one week because of his injury and lost \$53 in earnings. Because Applicant received \$700 (an amount greater than what the Commission would have awarded him) in restitution from the criminal, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation. The claim is denied.

78-30

Victim is a 33 year old male who was found shot to death near a public golf course. He was a known drug dealer, and was killed in a dispute with his associates. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses, and victim was not employed. Funeral and burial expenses totaling \$1,571.52 were paid by Eunice Santana, former wife of the deceased victim. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

78-58

Victim is a 33 year old male who was found shot to death near a public golf course. He was a known drug dealer and was killed in a dispute with his associates. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses, and victim was not employed. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$1,571.52. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

78-68

Victim is a 29 year old male who was killed as the result of injuries sustained in a fight. The more credible evidence indicates that victim, a Navy enlisted man, had an argument with the bouncer of the bar and was asked to leave. He was intoxicated. No medical bills or funeral and burial expenses were submitted by Applicant. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

78-95

Applicant is a 47 year old male who was injured in a fight. He was struck with a trophy and suffered lacerations of the scalp. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant and the offender were drinking alcohol and smoking marijuana at home when an argument erupted into a fight. Both men were intoxicated. Medical expenses totaling \$176.25 were paid by Medicare. Applicant is unemployed. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

78-123

Applicant is a 23 year old male who was shot in the abdomen while he was seated in his car. Applicant refused to tell the police or doctors what happened when questioned at the time he was admitted to the hospital. Medical expenses totaling \$9,470.63 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Applicant did not work for 4½ months because of his injury and lost \$1,980 in wages. The Commission feels that Applicant knows more than he cares to divulge. Because there is insufficient evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

78-127

Applicant is a 25 year old male who was injured in a fight. He was stabbed in the left upper quadrant and back. The more credible evidence indicates that victim was smoking marijuana and drinking with three men when a fight erupted which led to the stabbing incident. Applicant was intoxicated. Medical expenses totaling \$2,361.75 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Applicant, a maintenanceman, did not work for two weeks and lost \$127.20 in wages. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

78-132

Applicant is an 18 year old male who was injured in a fight. He sustained a stab wound in the chest, and contusions and abrasions of the face and body. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant had a confrontation with his neighbor. Medical expenses totaled \$123.50. Applicant is unemployed. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

78-154

Applicant is a 26 year old male who was injured in a fight. He was struck in the face and suffered lacerations of the right cheek. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant was assaulted because he removed sleeping bags from the accused's residence without authorization. Medical expenses totaled \$255.55. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

78-168

Victim is a 38 year old male who was shot and stabbed by his houseguest. The more credible evidence indicates that victim had taken in the suspect as his houseguest. While they were living together, victim constantly harassed and abused the suspect. On the date of the incident, both men had an argument and victim assaulted his houseguest which led to the shooting and stabbing incident. There are no medical expenses. Victim is a self-employed contractor. Mortuary expenses totaled \$514.80 of which \$255 was paid by Social Security. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

78-190

Victim is a 34 year old male who was killed in a fight. The more credible evidence indicates that victim was shot in a confrontation with the ex-husband of his girlfriend. There are no medical expenses. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$6,493.23 of which \$250 was paid by the Veterans Administration and \$255 by Social Security. Victim was a bus driver employed by MTL. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

78-215

Victim is a 49 year old male who was killed in a fight in Waikiki. He died from a fractured skull. The more credible evidence indicates that he was intoxicated and provoked the fight. Medical expenses totaled \$9,573.24. Victim was not employed. Funeral expenses totaled \$1,259.20. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

78-220

Applicant is a 32 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted on July 22, 1978. However, the crime was not reported to police. Medical expenses totaled \$2,742.70. Because Applicant failed to report the crime to police as required under the law, the claim is denied.

78-223

Victim is a 34 year old male who was killed in a fight. The more credible evidence indicates that victim was shot in a confrontation with the ex-husband of his girlfriend. There are no medical expenses. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$6,493.23 of which \$250 was paid by the Veterans Administration and \$255 by Social Security. Victim was a bus driver employed by MTL. Because victim share in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

78-234 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 28 year old female who was assaulted by her husband as the result of an argument. She suffered contusions of the mouth. No medical bills were submitted, and there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant is a relative of the offender and did not have any expenses as a result of her injury, the claim is denied.

78-252

Applicant is an 18 year old male who fractured his jaw in a fight. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant had an argument with the suspect in school and engaged in fisticuffs. Medical expenses totaled \$1,807.14. Most of the bills were paid by HMSA. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

78-265

Applicant is a 23 year old male who claims he was assaulted and robbed by 3 men who came to his home. When questioned by police, he refused to reveal the identity of the suspects even though he knew who they were, and refused to take a polygraph test. Applicant is known to have an extensive record involving narcotics. There are no medical reports to support Applicant's claim. Applicant is unemployed. Because the Commission is not convinced that Applicant is an innocent victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

78-275

Victim is a 39 year old male who was killed in a fight. He was stabbed in the chest with a steak knife. The more credible evidence indicates that victim provoked the incident when he became belligerent and swore at the assailants. He had been drinking and was intoxicated. Medical bills totaled \$3,419.29. Victim was employed as a Roofer. There is no evidence of dependency. Funeral and burial expenses totaling \$2,107.60 were paid by the victim's estate. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

78-277

Applicant is a 53 year old male who was assaulted as the result of an argument. He suffered lacerations of the right eyelid and lower lip. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant was beaten because of an argument arising out of cock fight betting. Medical expenses totaled \$510.60 of which \$486.28 was paid by HMSA and \$3.40 discounted by doctors. Applicant did not work for about a month because of his injury and would have lost \$608.40 in wages except that \$202.80 was charged to sick leave. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

78-283

Applicant is a 23 year old female who alleges that she was raped in the back seat of a Volkswagen. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant accepted a ride with the suspect whom she had befriended, and popped some pills with him prior to the alleged sexual assault. There are no medical bills, and Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused her injury, the claim is denied.

78-285

Applicant is a 20 year old male who claims that he was injured when arrested by police. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant harassed the owner of a Pawn Shop, and when asked by a policeman to lower his voice and refrain from causing a public disturbance he pushed the policeman off the sidewalk. Victim was arrested for harassment. There are no medical bills, and Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant is not a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, and because he shared in the responsibility for the incident that happened, the claim is denied.

78-286

Applicant is a 20 year old male who claims that he was burned while incarcerated at the Halawa Correctional Facility. There is nothing in the Halawa Correctional Facility Report to support Applicant's allegations. No medical bills were submitted, and Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant is not a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

78-289

Applicant is an 18 year old male who was stabbed in the chest and stomach in a fight. The more credible evidence indicates that he and 6 of his friends had a confrontation with 3 men which led to a fight and the stabbing incident. All of them had been drinking. Medical expenses totaled \$6,400 of which \$5,300 was paid by HMSA. Applicant did not work for about a month because of his injury and would have lost \$528.11 in wages except that he received \$351 in TDI benefits. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

78-301

Applicant is a 25 year old male who was assaulted and robbed at his place of employment. He was shot in the upper left arm. Medical expenses totaling \$415.74 were paid by Workers' Compensation. Applicant, a Cook with Ezogiku, Inc., did not work for one month. However, he received \$647.28 in TDI benefits under the Workers' Compensation program. Because Applicant received collateral benefits totaling \$1,063.02, and will continue to receive medical and other benefits under the Workers' Compensation program the claim is denied.

78-304

Applicant is a 32 year old male who was beaten by several unidentified men at a public beach park. He suffered contusions of the chest and bruised ribs. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant is a transient who did not have a place to stay. He was assaulted when he entered the suspect's camp site uninvited. Medical expenses totaled \$52.50. Applicant is unemployed. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

78-308

Applicant is a 42 year old female who was assaulted in the store where she works. She was punched in the face and suffered lacerations and contusions of the left cheek. Medical expenses totaling \$441.38 were paid by an insurance company under the Workers' Compensation program. Applicant did not work for about a month and would have lost \$440 in wages except that she received \$303.80 in disability payments under the Workers' Compensation program. In addition, she received \$500 for disfigurement. Because Applicant received collateral benefits far in excess of what the Commission would have awarded her, the claim is denied.

78-314

Applicant is a 62 year old male who was injured in a fight and suffered facial lacerations. The more credible evidence indicates that he provoked the incident when he tried to hit several of the guests with a chair. Medical expenses totaling \$582.70 were paid by the Kaiser Health Plan. Applicant is unemployed. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

78-316

Applicant is a 43 year old male who alleges that he was sodomized by a man he met in a bar. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant met 3 men in a bar in Haleiwa and went "bar hopping". He was drunk when interviewed by the police. Medical expenses totaling \$111.50 were covered by the Kaiser Hospital Plan. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the alleged incident. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

78-321 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 21 year old prisoner who was injured in a shoot-out between two rival gangs at Kulani Honor Camp on the Big Island. He suffered gunshot wounds to the head. The more credible evidence indicates that he was shot in a confrontation with the assailant. Medical expenses were paid by the Corrections Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Applicant is unemployed. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

78-322

Applicant is a 23 year old male who was injured in a fight. He suffered a fracture of the left cheekbone. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant was involved in a traffic incident and had some harsh words with the assailant which led to the assault. Medical expenses totaled \$839.70. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

78-325

Applicant is a 22 year old male who was injured in a fight. He sustained a fracture of the left jaw. The more credible evidence indicates that he was assaulted because of an argument arising out of the sale of drugs. Medical expenses totaled \$1,201.20. Applicant is unemployed. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

78-327

Victim is a 25 year old serviceman (Royal Australian Navy) who was killed in a fight. The more credible evidence indicates that he and three of his comrades had been drinking in several downtown bars and were intoxicated. When they exited one of the bars they crossed the street illegally (not in a crosswalk) which infuriated several motorists. In the verbal exchange with 4 men in a car, victim and his friends made obscene gestures and yelled obscenities which led to a confrontation and fight. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses. Cremation and related expenses totaled \$674. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

78-328

Victim is a 20 year old female who was murdered by her stepfather. She was killed with a machete. There are no medical bills and victim was not employed at the time of the incident. Funeral and burial expenses totaling \$780.94 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Because victim was related to the offender, and because Applicant did not suffer any out-of-pocket medical loss, the claim is denied.

78-330

Victim is a 19 year old male who was injured in a fight. He was struck in the face and suffered contusions of the left eye and abrasions of the right hand. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant was assaulted as the result of an argument arising out of a motor vehicle incident. He was intoxicated. Medical expenses totaled \$433.10. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

78-331

Applicant is a 34 year old male who was attacked and beaten by a tenant in the building where he worked. He was struck in the face with a wooden cane and suffered lacerations of the upper lip and a finger on the right hand, and abrasions of the knees. Medical expenses totaling \$203 were paid by Workers' Compensation. Applicant, a Security Guard, did not work for 4 days. However, he received \$90 from Workers' Compensation. Because Applicant was compensated by the Workers' Compensation program, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

78-334

Victim is a 42 year old female who was murdered by her former husband. She was cut with a machete. There are no medical expenses, and victim was not employed. Funeral and burial expenses totaling \$780.94 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Because Applicant does not fall within any of the categories of persons eligible for compensation, the claim is denied.

78-352

Applicant is a 49 year old male who was injured in a fight. The more credible evidence indicates that he slipped and fell, and injured his right hip. Medical expenses totaling \$1,418.20 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. There is no evidence to support Applicant's claim for loss of earning power. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

78-357

Applicant is a 44 year old male who was found by police (in an empty lot) with only a shirt around his waist. Applicant could not recall what actually happened, or how he was injured. When he was admitted to Castle Memorial Hospital, he was extremely intoxicated. Applicant told the doctor that he fell. Medical expenses totaling \$1,206.91 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Applicant is unemployed. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-7

Victim is a 34 year old female who was killed at her place of work. She was shot in the head. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$1,138.90 of which \$255 was paid by Social Security and \$885.90 by the decedent's father. At the time of the incident, victim had worked only 4 days. Her employment record was sporadic. She had been a welfare recipient ever since 1975. There is no credible evidence to indicate that victim supported her 6 year old daughter. Because Applicant is not responsible for the maintenance of the victim, and since the child was not dependent on victim for support, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

79-11

Applicant is a 34 year old female who alleges that she was punched in the face by a woman as she came out of the restroom of a restaurant. Applicant did not report for her scheduled hearing. There are no medical expenses, and there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant refuses to cooperate with the Commission, the Commission is unable to determine whether she is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. The claim is denied.

79-24 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 32 year old female who claims she was assaulted by the suspect. The more credible evidence indicates that she was intoxicated and disorderly, and when she tried to enter the suspect's home she was prevented to do so. No medical bills were submitted and Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused her injury, the claim is denied.

79-30

Victim is a 13 year old girl who was raped by the accused who was living in the same household. She became pregnant and had an abortion. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses. Because victim was living with the offender at the time of the incident and did not have any out-of-pocket expenses, the claim is denied.

79-32 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 25 year old male who alleges that he was injured by the act of another person. However, there is insufficient evidence to support his claim. No medical bills were submitted, and Applicant is unemployed. Because the whereabouts of Applicant is not known, and because of insufficient evidence, the Commission is unable to determine whether he is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

79-37

Applicant is a 20 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted and suffered a broken jaw. However, it is questionable whether Applicant is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, because he gave conflicting statements to both the examining physician and the policeman who interviewed him. Medical expenses totaled \$1,246.55. Applicant is unemployed. Because of conflicting statements made by Applicant, the Commission is not satisfied that he is an innocent victim. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

79-39 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 42 year old male who claims he was struck on the head by a bottle thrown from a passing car. The more credible evidence indicates that he was found lying on the side of a roadway in a very intoxicated state. Medical expenses totaled \$140.40. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-57

Applicant is a 50 year old male who alleges that he was a victim of a criminal act. However, the crime was not reported to the police as required by law. Medical expenses totaling \$1,743.72 were paid by the Veterans Administration. Applicant is a disabled veteran who has a history of alcoholism. Because the crime was not reported to the police as required by law, and because Applicant did not suffer any out-of-pocket loss, the claim is denied.

79-62

Applicant is a 23 year old female who was one of five persons who was shopping in a store when it was robbed. She was not injured and there are no medical expenses. Because Applicant is not a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

79-64

Applicant is a 25 year old male who was one of five persons who was shopping in a store when it was robbed. Applicant was not injured, and there are no medical expenses. Because Applicant is not a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

79-65

Victim is a 24 year old female who was injured when he fought off a rapist at her place of work. She suffered contusions of the head and jaw. Medical expenses totaling \$947.17 were paid by Workers' Compensation. Victim, a hotel room-maid, did not work for 76 days because of her injury. However, she received \$1,213.06 in disability payments and will continue to receive benefits under the Workers' Compensation program. Because victim received, or will receive collateral benefits far in excess of what she would have been awarded by the Commission, the claim is denied.

79-73

Applicant is a 23 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted in the restroom at Thomas Square Park. However, there is no credible evidence to support his claim. Medical bills totaled \$949.96 of which \$811.37 was paid by insurance. Applicant did not work for 3 days and lost \$66 in earnings. Because there is insufficient evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

79-77

Victim is a 23 year old male who was brought to Queen's Medical Center by a friend. He was in a comatose condition. The following day he died of sub-arachnoid hemorrhage due to rupture of cerebral aneurysm. Medical expenses totaling \$2,180.25 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Victim was not gainfully employed at the time of his death. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$2,418. Because there is no credible evidence to indicate that the decedent is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, and because Applicant did not pay for any of the medical and funeral-burial costs, the claim is denied.

79-85

Applicant is a 32 year old male who was stabbed in the abdomen as the result of a fight. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant had a confrontation with the accused. When he struck the first blow, a fight erupted which led to the stabbing incident. Medical expenses totaled more than \$6,000. Most of the bills were covered by HMSA and Insurance. Applicant did not work for 7 months and would have lost \$8,400 in wages except that he received \$3,276 in TDI benefits during the 7 months period. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-112

Applicant is a 19 year old male who was injured in a fight. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant has an argument with the offender which precipitated the assault. Medical expenses totaled \$54.75. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-114

Applicant is a 19 year old female who alleges that she is the victim of a criminal act. The more credible evidence indicates that she had a confrontation with another woman and a fight ensued. Applicant refused medical treatment. There are no medical expenses, and Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused her injury, the claim is denied.

79-118

Applicant is a 21 year old female who was assaulted by her male companion. She suffered a blow-out fracture of the left orbital bone. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant went for a ride with the offender willingly, consumed a bottle of wine while they were enroute from Ft. Shafter to Schofield, and accompanied the offender to his apartment where the assault took place. Applicant has a history of drug abuse and drug dependency. No medical bills were submitted, and there is no credible evidence to indicate that Applicant was gainfully employed at the time of the incident. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused her injury, the claim is denied.

79-129

Applicant is a 31 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted. However, there is no evidence to indicate that the crime was reported to police. Medical expenses totaled \$127.26. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because the alleged crime was not reported to the police as required by law, the claim is denied.

79-136

Applicant is a 19 year old female who alleges that she was the victim of a criminal act. The more credible evidence indicates that she had a confrontation with another woman and a fight ensued. Medical expenses totaled \$806.42. Applicant is unemployed. Her present whereabouts is unknown. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused her injury, the claim is denied.

79-137

Victim is a 5 year old boy who was beaten by his mother's boyfriend. They were all living in the same household. Medical expenses totaling \$6,486.06 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Because victim was living with the offender at the time of the incident and did not have any out-of-pocket expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation. The claim is denied.

79-142 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 32 year old Apartment Manager who was assaulted by a tenant. He suffered contusions of the head and abrasions of the arms and back. Medical and related expenses totaling \$6,068.39 were paid by insurance under the Workers' Compensation program. Applicant received more than \$11,000 in TTD payments under the Workers' Compensation program, and will continue to receive \$263.44 every two weeks as long as he is incapacitated. Because Applicant received collateral benefits far in excess of what he would have been awarded by the the Commission, the claim is denied.

79-151

Victim is a 21 year old male who was murdered in prison. He was severely beaten and stabbed to death because of his participation in a "power struggle" between two gangs. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses, and victim was not gainfully employed at the time of his death. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$3,328. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

79-152

Victim is a 27 year old female who was injured in a motor vehicle accident. Her car was struck by another motor vehicle. Medical expenses totaled \$446.89. Medical expenses totaled \$446.89. Because motor vehicle accident is not one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

79-155 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 31 year old male who alleges that he was injured by the act of another person. However, there is no evidence to indicate that he reported the crime to police. Medical expenses totaled \$461.40. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant did not report the crime to police as required by law, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

79-158 (Hilo)

Victim is a 44 year old female who was killed in an automobile accident when her car collided with another vehicle. Negligent Homicide is not one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. Medical expenses totaled \$755.02. Victim was a Real Estate Salesperson at the time of her death. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$3,713.39. Because the decedent is not a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

79-159

Applicant is a 31 year old female who was injured in a fight. She suffered contusions and lacerations of the left eye, face, and legs. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant started the fight when she stabbed the accused in the wrist with an unidentified object. Medical expenses totaling \$132.50 were covered by the Kaiser Health Plan. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings. Because she shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused her injury, the claim is denied.

79-161

Applicant is a 37 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted on May 25, 1979, and suffered multiple facial contusions. Medical expenses totaled \$156. Applicant is not employed. There is no record of the alleged incident having been reported to the police. Because the alleged crime was not reported to police as required by law, the claim is denied.

79-163

Applicant is a 24 year old male who was injured in a fight. He suffered lacerations of the neck, chest, and a fractured jaw. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant and a friend were drinking and sniffing paint at his apartment when Applicant made sexual advances towards his friend. A fight erupted and Applicant was slashed with a beer bottle. Medical expenses totaling \$24,058.58 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-166

Applicant is a 33 year old male who was assaulted as the result of an argument arising out of a motor vehicle incident. The more credible evidence indicates that victim was driving along Puuloa Road on his moped and exchanged obscene gestures with the offender. The exchange resulted in a fist fight. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses, and there is no evidence to indicate that victim lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-170

Applicant is a 34 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted in the Waikiki Natatorium Parking Lot. However, the incident was not reported to police until two days later and the case was classified Miscellaneous Public. There is no credible evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. Medical expenses totaled \$458.97. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant was gainfully employed at the time of the incident. Because of insufficient evidence, the Commission is unable to determine whether Applicant is an innocent victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

79-176

Applicant is a 32 year old female who alleges that she was sexually assaulted. However, there is no credible evidence to support her claim. Applicant met the suspect in a bar and became friendly with him. There is no medical information, and there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because of insufficient evidence, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation.

79-181

Applicant is a 71 year old male who was assaulted and robbed by two prostitutes. He suffered lacerations of the left hand and arm. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant met the two prostitutes in a bar and accompanied them to a building where he was assaulted and robbed. Medical bills were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-182

Victim is a 19 year old Marine who was shot and killed near the Pali Golf Course. There are no medical bills. Funeral-burial expenses totaled \$40. Applicant was not dependent upon the decedent for support. As a result of his son's death, Applicant received \$2,900 in Death Gratuity and \$20,000 in life insurance proceeds from the U.S. Government. Because Applicant received collateral benefits (\$2,900) which exceeded the amount of out-of-pocket expenses (\$540), the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

79-190

Applicant is an 18 year old student who alleges that he was assaulted in school. However, there is insufficient evidence to support his claim. No medical bills were submitted, and Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant did not report for his scheduled hearing to tell the Commissioners what really happened, the Commission is unable to determine whether he is an innocent victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. The claim is denied.

79-206 (Hilo)

Applicant alleges that he was injured by the act of another person. However, there is nothing to substantiate his claim. Because Applicant did not submit information requested by the Commission, the Commission is unable to determine whether he is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

79-208 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 30 year old male who alleges that he was injured by the act of another person. However, Applicant did not furnish the Commission with information requested, and did not report for his scheduled hearing to tell the Commissioners what really happened. Because Applicant refuses to cooperate with the Commission, the claim is denied.

79-216

Applicant is a 21 year old male who claims that he was assaulted in his home. However, there is insufficient evidence to support his claim. His whereabouts is unknown. Because the Commission does not have sufficient facts to determine eligibility, and because Applicant cannot be found to substantiate his claim, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

79-219

Victim is a 24 year old female who was killed in an automobile accident. The more credible evidence indicates that she was driving a sports car at a very high rate of speed when she lost control of the car and crashed. Victim was intoxicated. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses, and there is no evidence to indicate that victim was gainfully employed at the time of her death. Funeral expenses totaled \$449.51. Because the decedent is not a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

79-220

Applicant is a 22 year old male who was injured in a fight. He sustained a fractured jaw, comminuted fracture of the nasal bone and damage to his right eye. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant stole marijuana plants from his neighbor and when he was confronted by his neighbor, provoked a fight. No medical bills were submitted, and Applicant is unemployed. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-230

Applicant is a 35 year old male who was assaulted and robbed by 4 men. The more credible evidence indicates that he was picked up by the men because he was in a drunken condition. Applicant was intoxicated and gave the police conflicting stories. Medical expenses totaling \$967.10 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-232

Applicant is a 27 year old male who was stabbed by his female companion. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant had an argument with the woman over sex. They were both sniffing paint. No medical bills were submitted, and Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-239

Applicant is a 47 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted as the result of an argument over money matters. However, there is insufficient evidence to support his claim. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses, and Applicant was not gainfully employed. Because there is insufficient evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

79-240 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 26 year old female who alleges that she was sexually assaulted. The more credible evidence indicates that she accompanied the accused into Waipio Valley and they both smoked marijuana. Medical expenses totaled \$299.01. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused her injury, the claim is denied.

79-241

Applicant is a 29 year old male who was assaulted and robbed by two men. The more credible evidence indicates that he had been drinking with a group of men for six hours and then was assaulted by two of them. Applicant refused to cooperate with the police in their investigation. Medical expenses totaling \$57.70 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-246 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 17 year old male who was injured in a fight. He suffered a fracture of the right collar bone and abrasions of the right knee. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant provoked the fight when he yelled profanities at the suspect. Medical expenses totaled \$231.33. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-248 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 33 year old female who alleges that she was assaulted by her ex-husband. However, there is insufficient evidence to support her claim. No medical bills were submitted, and Applicant is unemployed. Because the whereabouts of Applicant is not known, and because of insufficient evidence, the Commission is unable to determine whether she is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

79-255

Victim is a 22 year old Security Guard who was assaulted at the airport. She suffered contusions of the face and strained her lower back. Medical expenses totaling \$413.25 were paid by Workers' Compensation. Victim did not work for three days because of her injury. However, she received \$41.73 in disability payments under the Workers' Compensation program. Because victim received collateral benefits under the Workers' Compensation program, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

79-262

Applicant is a 20 year old male who was stabbed in the abdomen in a fight with a serviceman. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant and a friend assaulted the serviceman who was in the act of apprehending a criminal who had stolen a purse from a parked car. The serviceman stabbed Applicant in self-defense. Medical expenses were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because he was receiving Workers' Compensation benefits at the time of the incident. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-268

Applicant is a 26 year old male who was injured in a fight with 5 men. He suffered a fracture of the jaw and nose. Medical expenses totaling \$2,422.89 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant was gainfully employed at the time of the incident. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-275

Applicant is a 23 year old male who was injured in a fight. However, the incident was not reported to the police. Applicant suffered a fracture of the jaw. Medical expenses totaling \$1,767.02 were paid by HMSA. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because the alleged crime was not reported to police as required by law, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation. The claim is denied.

79-280

Victim is an 18 year old male who was assaulted by 4 men at his place of work. He was struck in the face and head, and suffered a skull fracture and lacerations of the scalp and face. Medical expenses totaling \$5,883.01 were covered by Workers' Compensation. In addition, victim received \$822.87 in disability payments under the Workers' Compensation program, and \$15,000 settlement with Island Insurance Company for other liability. Because collateral benefits received by Applicant (victim) exceeded the amount he would have received under the Criminal Injuries Compensation Act, the claim is denied.

79-283

Victim is an 18 year old male who was stabbed in the abdomen in a fight with two men. The more credible evidence indicates that he and a friend provoked the fight which led to the stabbing incident. Both victim and his friend had been drinking. Medical expenses totaled \$10,312.79 of which \$9,448.34 was paid by HMSA. Victim did not work for 5 days because of the incident and lost \$116 in wages. His employment was subsequently terminated. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-288

Applicant is an 18 year old male who was assaulted as the result of an argument. He was struck in the face and suffered contusions of the left cheek and jaw. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant's car struck a parked vehicle, and when one of the witnesses approached him, he swore at the man and was punched in the jaw. Applicant was intoxicated. Medical expenses totaled \$86.40. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-299 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 30 year old male who was injured in a fight. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant provoked the fight with the suspect. Medical expenses totaled \$57.80. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-302

Victim is a 51 year old male who was assaulted by his sister's boyfriend. As a result of the beating, he suffered a concussion and brain damage. Victim was living in the same household with the offender. Medical expenses totaling \$72,997.86 were paid by Medicaid and private insurance. Victim is unemployed. Because victim was living with the offender at the time of the incident, and because Applicant did not incur any out-of-pocket expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation. The claim is denied.

79-305

Victim is a 29 year old male who died in prison from a self-injected overdose of toxic drugs. Medical expenses totaling \$2,413.25 were paid by the Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. No funeral and burial expenses were submitted. Because the decedent is not a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

79-309

Victim is a year old girl who was shot by her father. She suffered gunshot wounds of the abdomen and left buttock. Medical expenses totaling \$79.04 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Because victim is a relative of the offender, and because there are no out-of-pocket expenses, the claim is denied.

79-310

Victim is a 4 year old girl who was shot by her father. She suffered gunshot wounds of the right flank. Medical expenses totaling \$2,745.60 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Because victim is a relative of the offender and because there are no out-of-pocket expenses, the claim is denied.

79-316

Victim is a 34 year old Security Guard who was assaulted by an unidentified male. He was punched in the face and stomach, and suffered superficial abrasions. Medical expenses totaling \$1,038.72 were paid by Workers' Compensation. Victim did not work for three weeks because of his injury. However, he received \$994.39 in disability payments under the Workers' Compensation program. Because victim received collateral benefits which exceeded the amount the Commission would have awarded, the claim is denied.

79-334 (Kauai)

Applicant is a 52 year old male who was injured in a fight with his uncle. He sustained abrasions to the forehead and right arm. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant was assaulted by his uncle because of a family feud. Medical expenses totaled \$20. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-335

Applicant is a 51 year old male who claims that he was assaulted by his boss. No medical bills and/or receipts were submitted by Applicant, and there is no evidence to indicate that he lost earnings because of the incident. The whereabouts of Applicant is not known, and he cannot be located to verify his claim. Because there is insufficient evidence to indicate that Applicant is an innocent victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

79-336

Applicant is a 27 year old female who was injured in a fight. When she kicked the man who was fighting with her boyfriend she was assaulted. Medical expenses totaled \$144.67. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because she shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused her injury, the claim is denied.

79-337

Applicant is a 25 year old male who was injured in a fight. He suffered contusions of the left eye. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant provoked the incident when he made a nuisance of himself at a nightclub, and challenged two of the employees to a fight. Medical expenses totaled \$302.87. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-341

Applicant is a 25 year old female who was injured in a fight. She suffered contusions of the face. The more credible evidence indicates that she provoked the fight. No medical bills were submitted, and there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because she shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused her injury, the claim is denied.

79-342

Victim is a 17 year old male who was stabbed in the stomach as the result of an argument with a juvenile. The more credible evidence indicates that he provoked the incident. He and his gang had beaten the suspect on previous encounters. Medical expenses totaling \$6,085.60 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Victim is unemployed. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

79-345 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 19 year old female who was injured in an automobile accident. All medical bills relating to the incident were covered by no fault automobile insurance. Applicant is unemployed. Because the application was filed late and, because automobile accident is not one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the Commission is unable to order an award of compensation. The claim is denied.

79-350 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 37 year old male who claims that he was assaulted and suffered a fracture of the right cheek. However, he did not report the crime to police. Medical expenses totaled \$2,343.75. Applicant is unemployed. Because he did not report the crime to police as required under the law, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation. The claim is denied.

79-352 (Kauai)

Applicant is a 17 year old girl who was involved in a fight. No injuries were sustained, and there are no medical expenses. Applicant is unemployed. Because there is insufficient evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

80-11

Applicant is a 26 year old male who was shot as the result of an argument. He suffered gunshot wounds of the chest, abdomen, and arms. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant was shot because he had sexual relations with the suspect's wife. Medical expenses totaled \$19,111.75 of which \$18,430.99 was paid by HMSA, and \$665.86 by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Applicant, a laborer, has not returned to work because of his injury. His loss of earnings to date total more than \$6,000. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-15

Applicant is a 33 year old male who was shot in a bar. He sustained 3 gunshot wounds to the abdomen. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant provoked an argument when he went to look for the suspect and was shot in the confrontation. Medical expenses totaling \$7,248.90 were paid by HMSA and the Veterans Administration. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-17

Applicant is a 52 year old male who was injured in a fight. He suffered a blow-out fracture of the left eye socket bone and contusions of the body. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant had an argument with his neighbor and provoked the fight. Medical expenses totaled \$1,326. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant was gainfully employed at the time of the incident. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-25

Applicant is a 21 year old cab driver who was assaulted and robbed by a customer. He suffered lacerations of the left eye. No medical bills were submitted, and there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. The application was filed 8 months beyond the statute of limitations. Because of late filing, the claim is denied.

80-28

Applicant is a 35 year old male whose home was set on fire by suspected extortionists. Because Applicant did not suffer actual bodily harm, and because arson is not one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

80-29

Applicant is a 5 month old female who was injured when her father dropped her to the floor. Her father was involved in a fight. Medical bills totaling \$194.52 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Because Applicant is not a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

80-34 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 24 year old male who alleges that he was injured by the act of another person. However, Applicant has not cooperated with the Commission and his whereabouts is unknown. Because Applicant refuses to cooperate with the Commission, the claim is denied.

80-41 (Hilo)

Victim is a 42 year old male who was killed by the woman he had assaulted. He was shot in the head. There are no medical bills, and victim did not have any dependents. Funeral and burial expenses totaling \$963.20 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, and because claimant is not a proper applicant, the claim is denied.

80-47

Applicant is a 24 year old female who alleges that she was injured by another person. The more credible evidence indicates that she solicited sexual favors from two men who assaulted and robbed her. Medical expenses totaled \$7,236.90. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused her injury, the claim is denied.

80-49 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 49 year old male who was injured in a fight. He suffered a laceration of the right thumb. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant started an argument with his landlord which led to a fight. He was injured when he attempted to disarm the landlord who had a kitchen knife. Medical expenses totaling \$38.60 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Applicant is unemployed. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-55 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 27 year old male who claims he was injured by the act of another person and suffered a fracture of the ribs. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant was assaulted because he was dealing with marijuana. When questioned by police, he refused to cooperate with the authorities. No medical bills were submitted, and Applicant is unemployed. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-56 (Kauai)

Victim is a 24 year old male who was involved in a fight with his supervisor at his place of work. He suffered contusions and abrasions of the facial area. Medical expenses totaling \$5,207.63 were paid by Workers' compensation. Applicant did not work for 4 months because of his injury. However, he received \$4,946.76 in disability payments under the Workers' Compensation program. Because collateral benefits received by Applicant exceeded what he would have received from the Commission, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation. The claim is denied.

80-60 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 24 year old male who alleges that he was injured by the act of another person. However, there is insufficient evidence to support his claim. No medical bills were submitted, and there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant was gainfully employed at the time of the alleged crime. Because Applicant did not report for his scheduled hearing to tell the Commissioners what really happened, the Commission is unable to determine whether he is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. The claim is denied.

80-64 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 21 year old male who alleges that he was injured by the act of another person. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant suffered multiple stab wounds of the body when he engaged in fistcuffs with the suspect at a party. Applicant was intoxicated. He would not identify the assailant and refused to cooperate with the police. No medical bills were submitted, and there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant was gainfully employed at the time of the incident. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-86 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 20 year old male who alleges that he was injured by the act of another person. However, there is no evidence to support his claim. No medical bills were submitted, and there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant was gainfully employed. Because of insufficient evidence, the Commission is unable to determine whether Applicant is an innocent victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

80-89

Victim is a 55 year old female who was found dead in her home. She was beaten and slashed with a knife. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses, and victim was not gainfully employed at the time of her death. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$2,673.40. Because the person who filed the application is not a proper applicant, the claim is denied.

80-92

Victim is a 21 year old male whose body was found in a pond at Ala Moana Park. The more credible evidence indicates that victim was drinking and smoking marijuana with 3 men. After an argument over cocaine, victim was beaten, strangled and then dumped into a pond. There are no related medical expenses. Victim was a Landscaper employed by Clary's Services in Anchorage, Alaska. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$3,786.53. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

80-93

Applicant is a 27 year old Disco Club Bouncer who was stabbed in the stomach by a patron. Medical expenses totaling \$1,149.96 were paid by Workers' Compensation. Applicant also received \$274.34 in Temporary Total Disability payments. Because he received collateral benefits far in excess of what the Commission would have awarded, the claim is denied.

80-94

Applicant is a 41 year old male who was assaulted as the result of an argument. He was struck in the face and suffered a fracture of the jaw. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant was beaten by his ex-wife's boyfriend because he harassed them both with nuisance telephone calls. Applicant was intoxicated when admitted to the hospital. Medical expenses totaling \$1,446.40 were paid by the Veterans Administration. Applicant is unemployed. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-99

Applicant is a 27 year old male who claims he was assaulted at a public beach park. However, there is no evidence that the crime was reported to the police as required by law. Medical expenses totaling \$217.72 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Applicant is unemployed. Because the crime was not reported to police as required by law, the claim is denied.

80-100

Applicant is a 26 year old male who claims that he was assaulted by the person he picked up. The more credible evidence indicates that he picked up a hitchhiker. An argument ensued and Applicant was struck in the jaw. Applicant did not wish to file a complaint and refused to cooperate with the police. He was inebriated when examined by the doctor at the hospital. No medical bills were submitted, and Applicant is unemployed. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-102

Applicant is a 44 year old male who was injured in a fight. The more credible evidence indicates that he had an argument with two men, and when he punched one of the men he was shot in the right thigh. Most of his medical expenses were paid by HMSA. Applicant did not work for 9 weeks because of the incident, and would have lost \$3,128 except that he received \$765.70 in TDI benefits and used 10 days vacation and 12 days sick leave during his convalescence. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-103

Victim is a 43 year old male who was shot and killed by his former girlfriend as the result of an argument. The more credible evidence indicates that victim harassed and threatened the suspect at her home, and when asked to leave refused to do so. He had been drinking. No medical bills were submitted and there is no evidence to indicate that victim was gainfully employed at the time of the incident. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$2,897.40. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, and because the person who filed the claim is not a proper Applicant, the claim is denied.

80-105

Victim is a 40 year old male who was assaulted as the result of an argument. He suffered a fracture of the left cheekbone and a puncture wound of the left temple. The more credible evidence indicates that victim was driving recklessly on Nimitz Highway, and when the driver of another car tooted his horn victim became irritated and angry and pursued the motorist to engage in fistcuffs. A fight ensued and victim was struck in the facial area. Victim was intoxicated at the time of the incident. Medical expenses totaled \$7,317.61 of which \$5,683.31 was paid by insurance. Victim did not work because of his injury. He used sick leave and received TDI benefits during his convalescence. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-109 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 21 year old male who was shot in the chest and stomach. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant was shot because he and a friend had beaten the suspect's brother. Medical expenses totaling \$1,656 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Applicant is unemployed. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-115

Applicant is a 27 year old male who was injured in a fight. He suffered facial abrasions and a fractured jaw. Medical expenses were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Applicant is unemployed. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-122

Applicant is a 29 year old male who was shot by his brother as the result of an argument. The bullet hit his spine and he is paralyzed. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant punched the accused and that provoked the shooting incident. Both men are known drug users. Medical expenses totaled more than \$26,000. Most of the bills were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-130

Applicant is the mother-in-law of a 26 year old male who was shot to death. Because she does not fall within any of the categories of persons eligible for compensation, the claim is denied.

80-131

Applicant is the common-law wife of a 26 year old male who was shot to death. Because she does not fall within any of the categories of persons eligible for compensation, the claim is denied.

80-137

Applicant is a 21 year old male who was assaulted at a public beach park. He was shot in the left leg. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant was shot as the result of an argument over the sale of marijuana. Applicant also refused to cooperate with the police. Medical expenses totaled \$122.28. Applicant did not work for one month and lost \$360 in wages. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-138

Victim is a 31 year old male who was murdered. He was killed by associates involved in the drug and gun business. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses, and victim was not employed at the time of the incident. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$1,297. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

80-151 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 26 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted and suffered abrasions of the face, chest and back. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant was intoxicated and disorderly at the time of the incident. He also refused to tell the police what really happened. Medical expenses totaled \$1,445 of which \$301 was paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Applicant is unemployed. Because he refused to cooperate with the police, and because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-169 (Maui)

Victim is a 42 year old male who was beaten by a friend who was drinking with him at a public beach park. The assailant smashed victim's head against a car bumper. As a result of injuries sustained, victim expired. There are no medical expenses and victim was not employed at the time of the incident. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$3,472.75. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant, brother of the deceased victim, was supporting the victim at the time of the victim's death. Because Applicant does not fall within any of the categories of persons eligible for compensation, the claim is denied.

80-170

Applicant is a 23 year old female who alleges that she was sexually assaulted by a serviceman. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant picked up the suspect on Nimitz Highway and took him to his quarters at Pearl Harbor where the alleged crime took place. Applicant was intoxicated. Medical bills totaling \$861.12 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused her injury, the claim is denied.

80-177 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 23 year old male who was assaulted and stabbed in a bar. He was drinking in the bar when the incident happened. Applicant refused to tell police why he was stabbed and who stabbed him. No medical bills were submitted, and there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant was employed at the time of the incident. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-178

Applicant is a 23 year old male who was injured in a fight. He sustained a fractured jaw, and contusions and abrasions of the forehead. Medical expenses totaled \$1,663.75. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant was injured in a fight over the purchase of marijuana. He was intoxicated at the time. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant was gainfully employed at the time of the incident. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-200

Victim is an 11 year old girl who alleges that she was sexually assaulted by a family acquaintance. The more credible evidence indicates that victim had sexual intercourse with the suspect on numerous occasions and was paid for her sexual favors. There are no medical expenses, and victim is not employed. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused her injury, the claim is denied.

80-238

Applicant is a 33 year old female who was injured in a fight. The more credible evidence indicates that she provoked the fight when she moved the suspect's car without his permission. No medical bills were submitted. Applicant did not work for one day and lost \$31.68 in wages. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused her injury, the claim is denied.

80-253 (Hilo)

Victim is an elderly man who was found gagged, tied, and burned to death in an apartment building. The fire was deliberately set. There are no medical expenses, and victim is unemployed. Funeral and burial expenses totaling \$1,200.64 were paid by victim's nephew. Because Applicant (nephew of victim) does not fall within any of the categories of persons eligible for compensation, the claim is denied.

80-262

Applicant is a 27 year old female who was assaulted and stabbed by her husband. She sustained injuries of the right breast, left arm, and fingers on the left hand. Medical expenses were covered by the Kaiser Health Plan. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant is a relative of the offender and did not have out-of-pocket expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

80-264

Applicant is a 56 year old male who was shot at when he chased a burglar. He was not injured. There are no medical bills, and there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant is not a victim is one of the enumerated crimes in the Statutes, the claim is denied.

80-266 (Hilo)

Applicant is an 18 year old male who alleges that he was assaulted in school. However, he did not seek medical treatment and there are no reports to support his claim. Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant did not seek medical treatment, the Commission is unable to determine whether he is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes. Accordingly, the claim is denied.

80-268

Applicant is a 44 year old male who was injured in a fight. He suffered cerebral contusions. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant provoked the incident when he assaulted a 16 year old boy. Medical expenses totaled \$11,178.41 of which \$10,291.76 was paid by HMSA. Applicant is employed as a Working Foreman by Healy Tibbitts Construction Company. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-279

Applicant is a 49 year old male who was injured in a fight. He suffered lacerations of the nose and contusions of the left eye. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant provoked a fight when he made disparaging remarks at two men. Medical expenses totaled \$1,597.60 of which \$165 was paid by insurance. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-281

Victim is a 25 year old female who was shot to death by her lover even though she was married and had 3 children. The more credible evidence indicates that she was killed because of clandestine activities. No bills were submitted for reimbursement, and there is no evidence to indicate that victim was employed at the time of her death. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused her death, the claim is denied.

80-292

Applicant is a 27 year old female who was injured in a fight. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant and her male companion broke into the suspect's apartment and, as a result, was assaulted. No medical bills were submitted, and there is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused her injury, the claim is denied.

80-293 (Hilo)

Victim is a 25 year old male who was assaulted as the result of an argument involving a woman. As a result of the beating he died. The more credible evidence indicates that the deceased victim had been drinking heavily and provoked the fight. No medical bills were submitted, and there is no evidence to indicate that the deceased victim was employed at the time of his death. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$2,673.41. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

80-312 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 33 year old female who was injured in a fight. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant had an argument with another woman in a Bowling Alley and a fight ensued. It is not clear who started the fight. Medical expenses totaling \$65 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant lost earnings because of the incident. Because there is insufficient evidence to indicate that Applicant is a victim of one of the enumerated crimes in the statutes, the claim is denied.

80-313

Applicant is a 33 year old female who was injured in a fight. She suffered contusions of the left eyebrow, left cheek, and bridge of her nose. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant had a confrontation with the driver of a car at the Pearlridge Shopping Center parking lot. When she struck the suspect's car with the handle of a hammer, she was assaulted. Medical expenses totaling \$203.18 were paid by the Public Welfare Division, Department of Social Services & Housing, State of Hawaii. There is no evidence to indicate that Applicant is gainfully employed. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused her injury, the claim is denied.

80-315 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 27 year old male who was injured in a fight. He suffered lacerations of the scalp. The more credible evidence indicates that Applicant provoked the incident when he threw a beer bottle at the suspect's car causing damages. Medical expenses totaled \$401.32 of which \$332.13 was paid by HMSA. Applicant did not work for 5 weeks and would have lost \$1,072 in wages except that he used 10 days vacation and 15 days sick leave. Because Applicant shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.

80-330

Applicant is a 26 year old female who was shot in the head by her husband. There are no out-of-pocket medical expenses, and Applicant is unemployed. Because Applicant is a relative of the offender and did not incur any out-of-pocket expenses, the Commission is unable to order an award for compensation. The claim is denied.

80-352

Victim is a 15 year old boy who was struck by a car. He suffered multiple abrasions of the back, fractured right ribs, and is paralyzed from the waist down because his spinal cord was severed. Medical expenses totaling more than \$15,000 were paid by the Kaiser Health Plan and insurance. Because collateral benefits received by victim exceeded what the Commission would have awarded, the claim is denied.

80-356

Victim is a 54 year old male who was murdered. The more credible evidence indicates that victim was stabbed to death when he was caught sleeping with the suspect's wife. There are no medical bills. Victim was employed as a Janitor at Kuhio Park Terrace. Funeral and burial expenses totaled \$3,820.88 of which \$255 was paid by Social Security. Because victim shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his death, the claim is denied.

80-396 (Hilo)

Applicant is a 24 year old male who alleges that he was injured by the act of another person. The more credible evidence indicates that he and a friend sneaked into a Disco and, when confronted by the Doorman, a fight ensued. Medical expenses totaling \$102.50 were paid by HMSA. Applicant is unemployed. Because he shared in the responsibility for the crime that caused his injury, the claim is denied.
