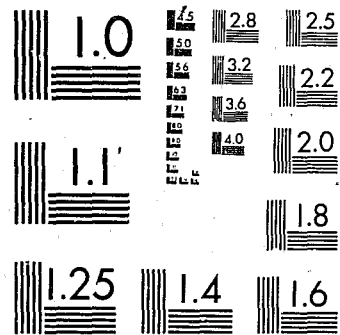


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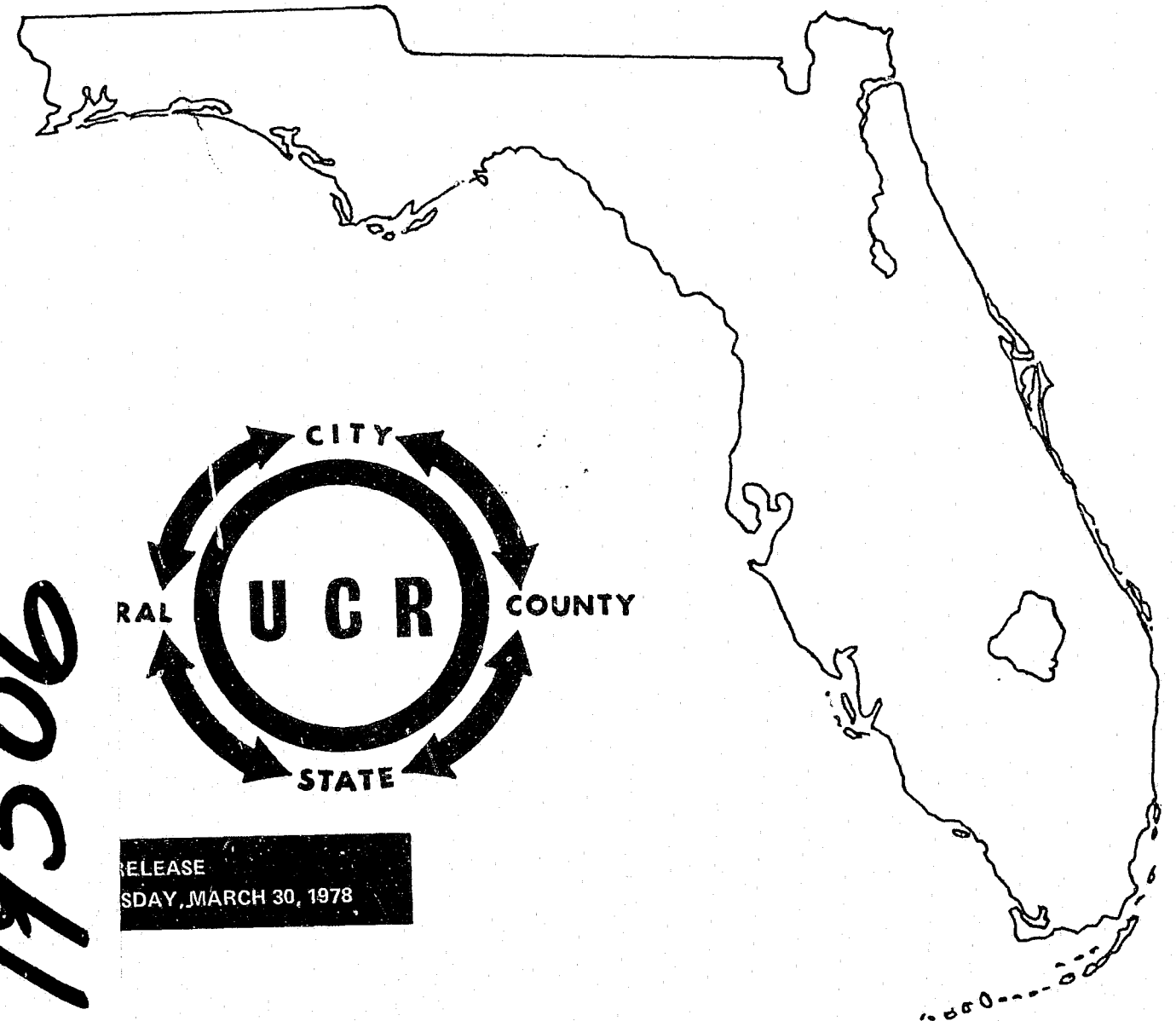

Crime in Florida 1977 ANNUAL REPORT

Dear Governor and Gentlemen of the Cabinet:

As called for by Section 943.05 of the Florida Statutes, the 1977 Annual Report, *Crime In Florida*, is hereby forwarded for your review. This report has been compiled from the Uniform Crime Reports (UCR) data submitted by Florida's law enforcement agencies. As such, it represents an assessment of crime statistics relating to all areas of Florida.

Recently much discussion has been generated regarding the uses of UCR data and increasingly these data are being used in court systems and planning and research functions. However, *Crime In Florida* should not be used to judge the performance of a law enforcement agency since these compiled data neither include all law enforcement activity nor measure factors that have an impact on crime in various locations.

This publication is enhanced by and can be directly attributed to the efforts of Florida's law enforcement community. It is through their continued cooperation and adherence to UCR reporting guidelines that publication of *Crime in Florida* is possible.



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THE FLORIDA UNIFORM CRIME REPORTING PROGRAM

INTRODUCTION

The Federal Bureau of Investigation has been actively assisting individual states in the development of statewide programs of law enforcement statistics compatible with the national Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program. These statistical programs have been given impetus by development of statewide computerized law enforcement information systems, of which UCR is an integral part. Florida, in concert with the development of the Florida Crime Information Center (FCIC), has become one of the first states to develop its own statewide program of law enforcement statistics, the Florida Uniform Crime Reports Program.

In January 1971, the Uniform Crime Reports and Statistics Bureau of the Department of Criminal Law Enforcement, initially began the collection of monthly uniform crime reports from county and municipal law enforcement agencies. As mandated by the Florida Legislature, twelve publications entitled *Crime In Florida* have previously been disseminated. This document is the seventh annual report, presenting statistical information collected and compiled through the year 1977.

FLORIDA UCR PROGRAM

The Florida Legislature, in establishing the Uniform Crime Reports (UCR) statute, mandated the responsibility and authority for UCR data collection and dissemination to the Florida Department of Criminal Law Enforcement (FDCLE) as follows:

FLORIDA STATUTES, CHAPTER 943

Section 5. Division of criminal justice information systems.—

- (1) The division shall:
 - (c) Establish a system of uniform crime reports and statistical analysis.
 1. All state, county and municipal law enforcement agencies shall submit to the department uniform crime reports setting forth their activities in connection with law enforcement.

2. It shall be the duty of the division, under the supervision of the executive director, to adopt and promulgate rules and regulations prescribing the form, general content, time and manner of submission of such uniform crime reports required pursuant to chapter 120, and shall have the force and effect of law. Willful or repeated failure by any state, county or municipal law enforcement official to submit the uniform crime reports required by this act shall constitute neglect of duty in public office.
3. The division shall correlate the reports submitted to it pursuant to subparagraph 1 and shall compile and submit to the governor and the legislature semiannual reports based on such reports. A copy of said reports shall be furnished to all prosecuting authorities and law enforcement agencies.

PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES

The quantitative statistical data derived from the UCR Program will provide assistance in determining the overall scope of the reported criminal activity in Florida and will aid in making effective management studies possible.

The fundamental objectives of the Florida UCR Program are:

- (1) Inform the governor, legislature, other governmental officials, and the public as to the nature of the crime problem in Florida, its magnitude, and its trends.
- (2) Provide law enforcement administrators with criminal statistics for administrative and operational use.
- (3) Determine who commits crimes by age, sex, race, whether resident or nonresident, and other social attributes in order to find the proper focus for crime prevention and enforcement.

- (4) Provide base data and statistics to measure the effectiveness of Florida's criminal justice system.
- (5) Provide base data and statistics to measure the effects of prevention and deterrence programs.
- (6) Provide base data and statistics for research to improve the efficiency, effectiveness and performance of criminal justice agencies.
- (7) Provide data to assist in the assessment of societal and other causes of crime for the development of theories of criminal behavior.
- (8) Provide the FBI with complete UCR data to be included in the national crime reports.

REPORTING PROCEDURE

Crime data and information submitted by municipal and county law enforcement agencies is collected on a daily, weekly, monthly, and annual basis. Fingerprints of all adult arrests for felony and misdemeanor (nontraffic) offenses are collected daily. Finally, employee data for law enforcement agencies is collected and published annually.

Starting in January 1972, several minor modifications in reporting procedures were made in response to requests from local agencies and the FBI. Arrests for worthless checks and for narcotics paraphernalia are indicated separately. In January 1973, larceny under \$50 (including attempts) was added as an index offense. A program modification in 1975 involved the expansion of drug classifications and new, expanded property breakdowns. In January 1976, a new category under motor vehicle theft was added to classify motorcycles separately.

Commencing on January 1, 1976, the traditional method of collecting UCR data on a monthly basis was enhanced to a sophisticated offense-by-offense program in Florida. The collection process involves one of three submission methods for an agency: daily through terminal entries, weekly from paper code forms, or monthly by computer tapes. With the capability of collecting more detailed data the utility of Florida's UCR program is enhanced from the contributor and state viewpoint for manage-

ment, operational and crime trend analysis purposes. By virtue of this enhancement to Florida's UCR program a more accurate assessment of reported criminal activity can be made. Municipal police and county sheriff departments report the individual offense data known to them in the following crime categories: murder, non-traffic manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, assault, breaking and entering—burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft. Offense data is taken from the records of complaints received by law enforcement agencies from victims, witnesses, or other sources, or discovered by agencies during their own operations. Complaints determined by subsequent investigations to be unfounded are eliminated from the count. The resulting data on individual "offenses known to law enforcement officials" in these crime categories is reported without regard to whether anyone is arrested, stolen property is recovered, local prosecutive policy, or any other consideration. Municipal and county agencies also report supplemental offense information such as the number of victims, the value of property stolen and recovered, circumstances surrounding homicides and other pertinent data. Additionally, reports of persons arrested are submitted. These reports provide information concerning the age, sex, race and residency of all persons arrested by each individual law enforcement agency. Reports of persons arrested are separated as to adults and juveniles.

VERIFICATION

An obvious concern in the collection of crime statistics for law enforcement agencies throughout the state is the uniformity and accuracy of data received. Program aids such as guides and instructions do not necessarily guarantee the accuracy and correctness of the reports submitted by the contributors. Additional controls therefore are necessary.

Each individual offense report received by the Department is recorded, examined and verified for accuracy and for reasonableness. The verification process includes numerous checks to ensure the validity of information. The elimination of duplication of reporting by individual contributors receives particular attention. Minor errors are corrected by telephone or FCIC terminal contact between UCR Field Representative and the re-

porting agency. Substantial variation and errors are adjusted through personal contacts with individual contributing agencies. The personal contacts are invaluable to the accuracy and quality of reporting. Field Representatives are engaged in a constant educational effort and provide a vital link between the UCR Program and the contributor.

INCIDENT REPORTING AND RECORDS MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

As an adjunct to the UCR program, Field Representatives assist Florida law enforcement agencies, as requested, in the development of an Incident Reporting and Records Management System (IRRMS). This system can enhance or replace a law enforcement agency's records system in its method of collecting, storing, and retrieving all police service information pertaining to a particular criminal case or police activity. IRRMS can provide small and medium size law enforcement agencies a source of complete information that can be utilized by the entire criminal justice system and by administrators as a tool in decision-making policies.

CONTRIBUTING AGENCIES AND POPULATION

There are currently 347 law enforcement agencies throughout the state contributing directly to the Florida UCR Program—66 county law enforcement agencies and 281 municipal agencies. In addition, 5 state law enforcement agencies and 9 campus police departments submit data to the program. Daily, weekly, monthly and annual uniform crime reports received from these agencies represent statistical data covering approximately 100 percent of the estimated Florida population.

The 1977 population figures for the State of Florida, county and municipalities were provided by the Division of Population Studies, Bureau of Economic and Business Research, University of Florida. These population estimates, as of July 1, 1977, were produced under contract for the Department of Administration, for incorporation into the 1977-78 Revenue Sharing Program.

The relative statewide estimates reflect populations of 8,717,334 for the year 1977, and 8,551,814 for the year 1976.

SMSA CONCEPTS

The Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA) have been designated for data uniformity between and among government agencies and between these agencies and the public to include industry and state and local governments. The general concept of SMSA is one of an integrated economic and social unit with a recognized population nucleus. To be more specific, in designating any county as belonging to SMSA, the National Bureau of Standards applies certain prescribed criteria when making this determination.

A standard metropolitan statistical area always includes a city (cities) of specific population which constitutes the central city and the county (counties) in which it is located. A standard metropolitan statistical area also includes contiguous counties when the economic and social relationships between the central and contiguous counties meet specified criteria of metropolitan character and integration.

1. Each standard metropolitan statistical area must include at least:
 - (a) One city with 50,000 or more inhabitants, or
 - (b) A city having a population of at least 25,000 which, with the addition of the population of contiguous places, incorporated or unincorporated, which have a population density of at least 1,000 persons per square mile, and which together constituted for general economic and social purposes, a single community with a combined population of at least 50,000, provided that the county or counties in which the city and contiguous places are located has a total population of at least 75,000.
2. A contiguous county will be included in a standard metropolitan statistical area if:
 - (a) At least 75.00% of the resident labor force in the county is in the nonagricultural labor force, and
 - (b) At least 30.00% of the employed workers living in the county work in the central county or counties of the area.

3. A contiguous county which does not meet the requirements of Criterion 2 will be included in a standard metropolitan statistical area if at least 75.00% of the resident labor force is in the nonagricultural labor force and it meets two of the following additional criteria of metropolitan character and one of the following criteria of integration.

(a) Criteria of Metropolitan Character.

- (1) At least 25.00% of the population is urban.
- (2) The county had an increase of at least 15.00% in total population during the period covered by the two most recent Census of Population.
- (3) The county has a population density of at least 50 persons per square mile.

(b) Criteria of Integration

- (1) At least 15.00% of the employed workers living in the county work in the central county or counties of the area, or
- (2) The number of people working in the county who live in the central county or counties of the area is at least 15.00% of the employed workers living in the county, or
- (3) The sum of workers commuting to and from the central county or counties is equal to 20.00% of the employed workers living in the county.

From this the following all-inclusive and non-overlapping groupings of the entire state population were established. These groups, referred to as Community Types, are as follows:

1. Metropolitan—Municipalities of over 250,000 population.
2. Cities—Municipalities of 50,000 to 250,000 population.
3. Suburban—Municipalities under 50,000, and unincorporated jurisdictions in SMSA counties.

4. Non-Suburban—Incorporated jurisdictions under 50,000 in non-SMSA counties.

5. Rural—Unincorporated jurisdictions in non-SMSA counties.

These five major Community Types can be compared directly, one against the other, or further reduced to their lowest common denominator, population grouping, to compare each Community Type internally. This method of grouping population entities fits well with the system used by the FBI in dividing the population types in the United States, and provides a common base for development of all future statistics on crime information. Although the primary emphasis of all future crime analysis will be made on the basis of the five Community Types, there will be occasions when other population groupings will more readily fit the analysis criteria. Generally speaking, these additional needs can be met by dividing the state into zones, based on a social and economic likeness of individuals within, and then splitting these groups into Community Types or counties for the final analysis. It is felt that additional research may reveal additional or more precise grouping patterns.

Set forth below are some additional conditions which will, by type and volume, affect the crime that occurs from place to place. These same conditions will also affect the amount of crime actually reported.

1. Density and size of the community population and the metropolitan area of which it is a part.
2. Composition of the population with reference particularly to age, sex, and race.
3. Economic status and mores of the population.
4. Relative stability of population including commuters, seasonal, and other transient types.
5. Climate, including seasonal weather conditions.
6. Educational, recreational, and religious characteristics.
7. Effective strength of the police force.

8. Standards governing appointment to the police force.

9. Policies of the prosecuting officials and the courts.

10. Attitude of the public towards law and enforcement problems.

11. The administrative and investigative efficiency of the local law enforcement agency including the degree of adherence to crime reporting standards.

CLASSIFICATION AND LISTING OF UCR OFFENSES

Offense data consists of information that has been extracted from reports of Part I crimes that have come to the attention of Florida law enforcement agencies. They consist of the following offenses:

- 1A. Murder—The willful (nonnegligent) killing of a human being.
- 1B. Manslaughter—The killing of a human being by the act, procurement or culpable negligence of another.
2. Forcible Rape—The carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will.
3. Robbery—The felonious and forcible taking of the property of another, against his will, by violence and/or putting him in fear.
4. Aggravated Assault—An attempt or offer, with unlawful force or violence, to do physical injury to another.
5. Breaking and Entering—Burglary—An unlawful entry or attempted forcible entry of any structure to commit a felony or larceny.
6. Larceny (Except Motor Vehicle Theft)—The unlawful taking of the property of another with intent to permanently deprive him of ownership.
7. Motor Vehicle Theft—The larceny or attempted larceny of a motor vehicle.

Part II offenses are made up of all other crimes not classified as Part I crimes. Information on Part II offenses is reported only when an arrest has been made. Part II crimes for UCR purposes are as follows:

8. Other Assaults—Not Aggravated—Assaults and attempted assaults which are simple and minor in nature.
9. Arson—Willful or malicious burning with or without intent to defraud. Includes attempts.
10. Forgery and Counterfeiting—Making, altering, uttering, or possessing or attempts to make, alter, utter or possess with intent to defraud. Anything false which is made to appear true.
- 11A. Fraud—Fraudulent conversion of another's money or property by false pretenses.
- 11B. Worthless Checks—Fraudulent conversion through bad checks—excludes forgery and counterfeiting.
12. Embezzlement—Misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody or control.
13. Stolen Property—All offenses of buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, as well as all attempts to commit any of these offenses.
14. Vandalism—Willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of property without consent of the owner or persons having custody or control.
15. Weapons: Carrying, Possessing, etc.—All violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers and all attempts to commit any of the offenses.
16. Prostitution and Commercialized Vice—Sex offenses of a commercialized nature, such as prostitution, keeping a bawdy house, procuring or transporting women for immoral purposes, and all attempts to commit any of these offenses.

17. **Sex Offenses (Except Forcible Rape, Prostitution and Commercialized Vice)**—Statutory rape, offenses against chastity, common decency, morals and the like. Includes attempts.
18. **Narcotic Drug Laws**—Includes all arrests for violations of State and Local Ordinances specifically those relating to the unlawful possession and sale of narcotic drugs.
19. **Gambling**—Promoting, permitting, or engaging in gambling.
20. **Offenses Against the Family and Children**—Nonsupport, neglect, desertion, or abuse of family and children.
21. **Driving Under the Influence**—Driving or operating any motor vehicle while drunk or under the influence of liquor or drugs.
22. **Liquor Laws**—State or local liquor law violations, except "drunkenness" and "driving under the influence."
23. **Disorderly Intoxication**—Drunk and disorderly.
24. **Disorderly Conduct**—Breach of peace. (Disorderly persons.)
25. **Vagrancy**—Vagabondage, begging, loitering, etc.
26. **All Other Offenses**—All violations of state and local laws except classes 1-25 and 28-29.
27. **Suspicion**—Not reported in Florida.
28. **Curfew and Loitering Laws (Juveniles)**—Offenses relating to local curfew or loitering ordinances, where such laws exist.
29. **Runaway (Juveniles)**—Limited to juveniles taken into protective custody who have run away from the reporting jurisdiction.

UCR USAGE

There are inherent limitations in current crime reporting practices. Of primary importance is the question of how much crime is being reported. Law enforcement agencies are only capable of reporting crimes known to them. In many instances, citizens do not report crimes directly to these agencies but may report them to the prosecuting authorities. A considerable volume of crime is not reported to law enforcement agencies because the victims may consider the offenses against them to be of very little consequence; they believe there is nothing the police can do about them; they fear retaliation from offenders or have shared willingly in such offenses as illegal sex acts, gambling or drug usage. Consequently, information concerning some offenses is never entered in the present statistical reporting system.

Further, only arrest data is submitted on Part II crimes, therefore, current UCR statistics do not necessarily measure the true incidence of crimes or the actual economic loss incurred by victims.

Crimes and arrests should not be compared on a one-to-one basis, as a crime is an event and an arrest relates to an individual. For example, several crimes may be solved by one arrest or many persons can be arrested for committing one crime.

Crime clearances, the value of property stolen and recovered and arrests reflect the current year's activity and will include data related to crimes reported in prior years.

The information collected for this report portrays the most accurate and realistic assessment available of the crime situation in Florida. UCR statistics are not designed as an indicator of agency activity for use in direct comparisons but pertain to a specific geographic area. A causal relationship exists between crime and a great many socio-economic factors, although presently no definite theories exist. However, reported crime activity is a measurable quantity and, as such, should be used to present the clearest possible picture of the dimensions, fluctuations and impact of crime in the State of Florida.

Florida Offense Data Index Crime Analysis

**1977 FLORIDA CRIME SUMMARY
AND PRESS RELEASE**

On March 30, 1978, Commissioner William A. Troelstrup released the Florida Department of Criminal Law Enforcement's Seventh Annual Florida Uniform Crime Report, reflecting a general overview of reported crime and related data during 1977.

CRIME VOLUME

The volume of reported index crimes (Violent: Murder, Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault; Nonviolent: Breaking and Entering, Larceny and Motor Vehicle Theft) decreased 3.6 percent from 1976.

- Total Volume 568,878 Index Crimes
- Time Frequency 1 Index Crime every 55 Seconds
- Population Frequency 1 Index Crime for every 15 Residents
- Highest Violent Index Crime increase 9.5 percent increase in Forcible Rape
- Highest Nonviolent Index Crime increase 3.9 percent increase in Motor Vehicle Theft

CRIME RATE

The 1977 crime rate decreased to 65.3 index crimes for every 1,000 residents.

- Violent Crime Rate increased to 6.6 index crimes/1,000 residents
- Nonviolent Crime Rate decrease to 58.6 index crimes/1,000 residents

STANDARD METROPOLITAN STATISTICAL AREAS (SMSA) (see page 3 for definition)

Index Crimes decreased 3.8 percent in the SMSA during 1977.

POPULATION

Florida's population increased 1.9 percent in 1977. This reflected a population density of nearly 161 people per square mile.

- SMSA Population 1.7 percent increase
- Non SMSA Population 3.1 percent increase

VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN

The dollar loss of reported property stolen reveals a 2.8 percent increase to a total of \$196,970,116. Law enforcement agencies recovered approximately 25 percent of the loss, or \$48,632,523.

ARREST AND CLEARANCE RATE

Criminal arrests in Florida decreased 9.9 percent.

ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES

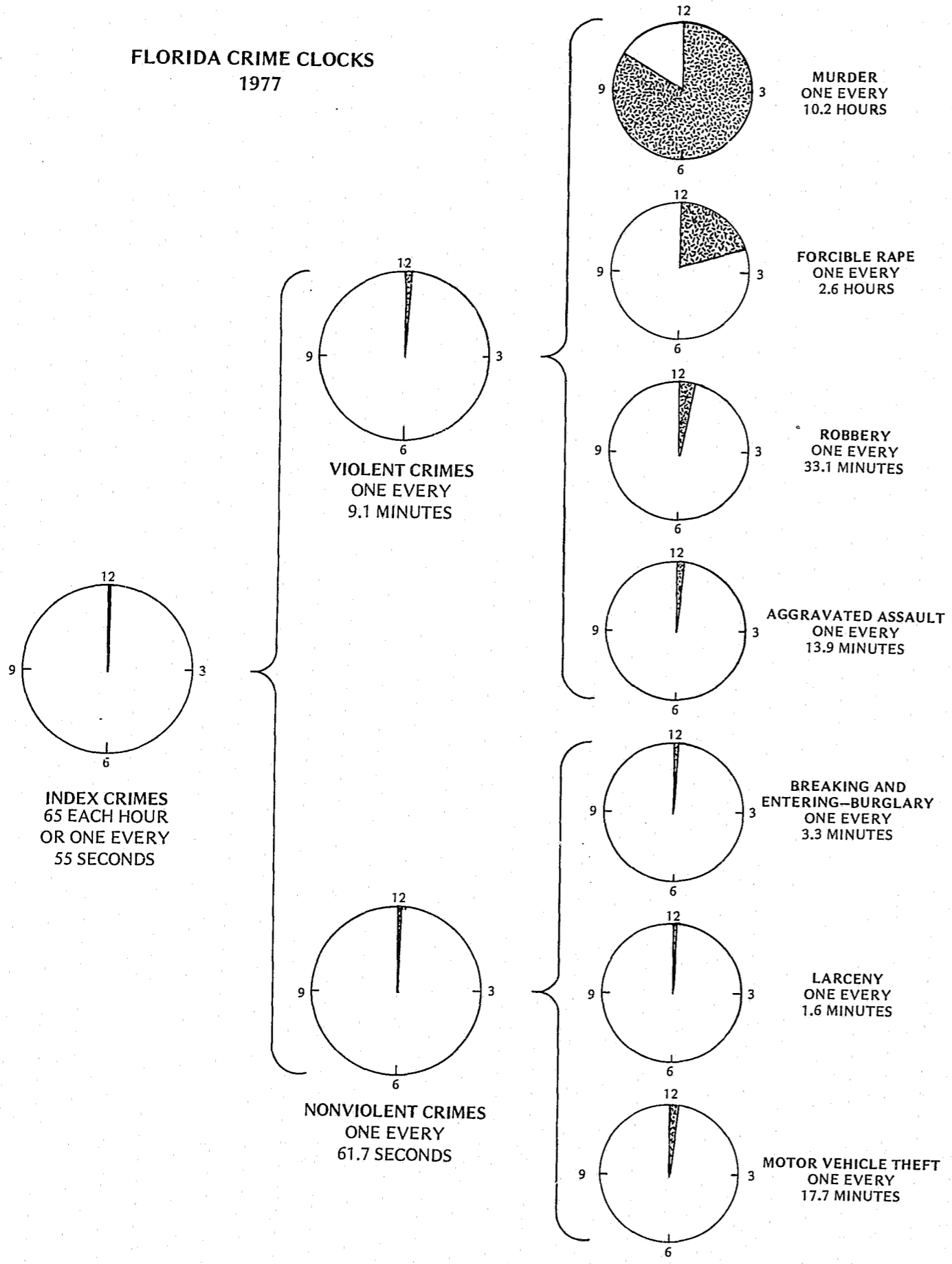
As of October 31, 1977, the number of full-time law enforcement employees (sworn and civilian) in Florida increased 3.9 percent over 1976 to 24,404. In 1977, there were 17,790 sworn officers in Florida; the rate per 1,000 residents was 2.0 sworn officers, reflecting a decrease from the rate of 2.1 in 1976. This does not include state law enforcement or campus police employees.

SUMMARY

During 1977 a slight decrease in crime was observed. To some, this may reflect a more optimistic view of the crime situation in Florida. However, it should be recognized that there are no clear-cut indicators which allow law enforcement to conclude that crime will continue to decrease. The seriousness of the crime problem still exists as the law enforcement community attempts to offset the tremendous surge in crime experienced over the past years.

The most important crime deterrent available is the public's confidence and assistance to its law enforcement agencies. Crime cannot be controlled or reduced by law enforcement alone; it will require a full commitment by the entire criminal justice system as well as by the public it serves.

1977



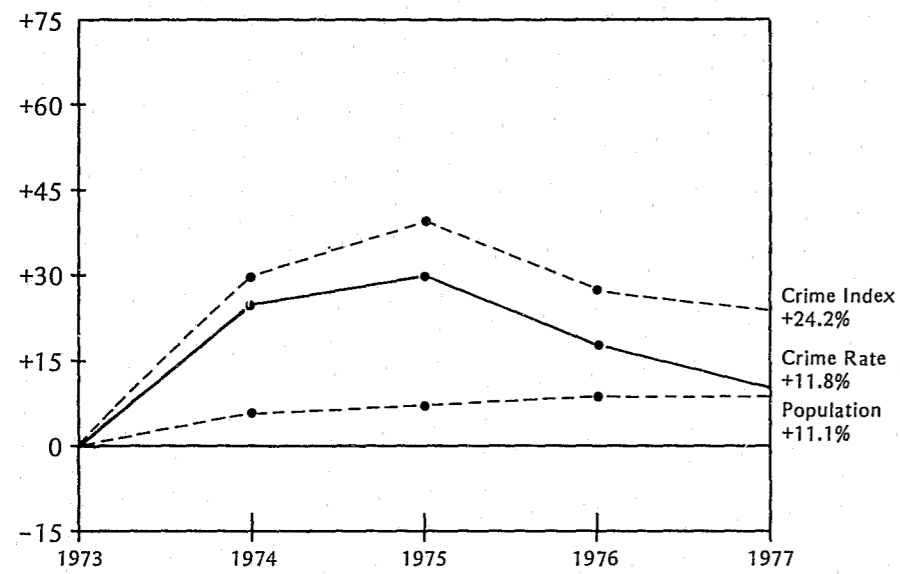
FDCLE CHART 1

1973-1977

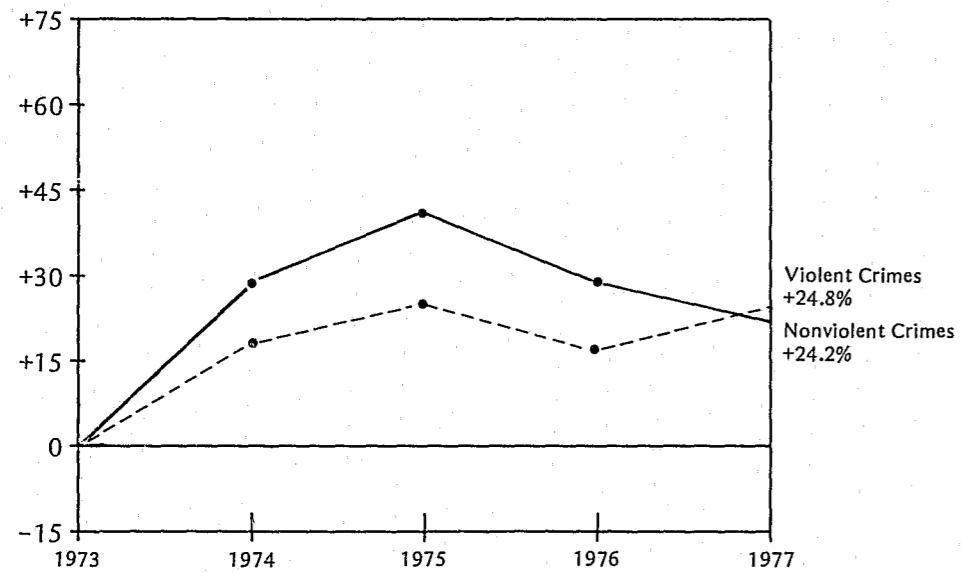

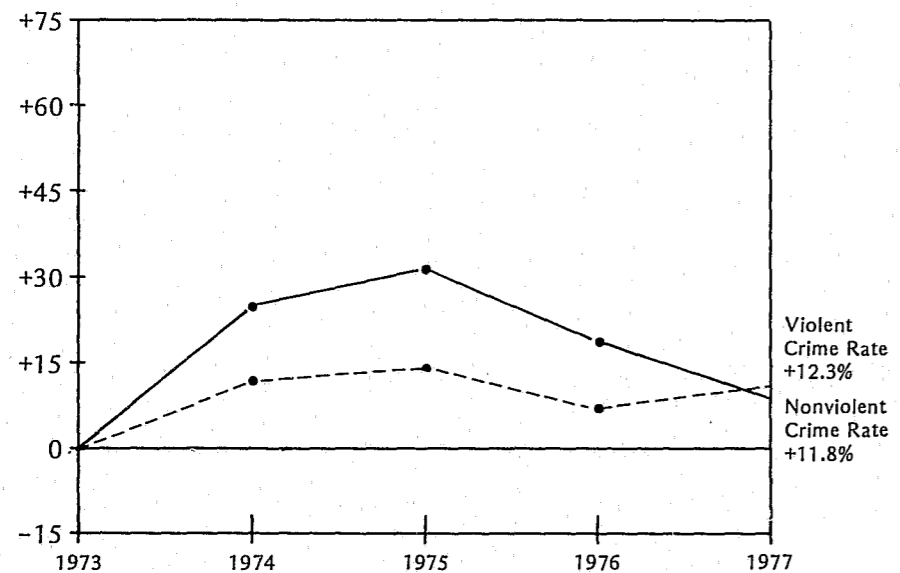

Percent Change over 1973



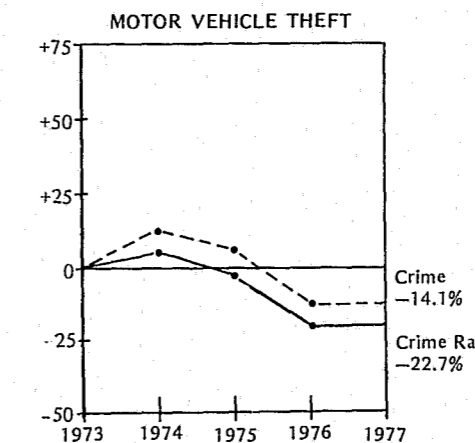
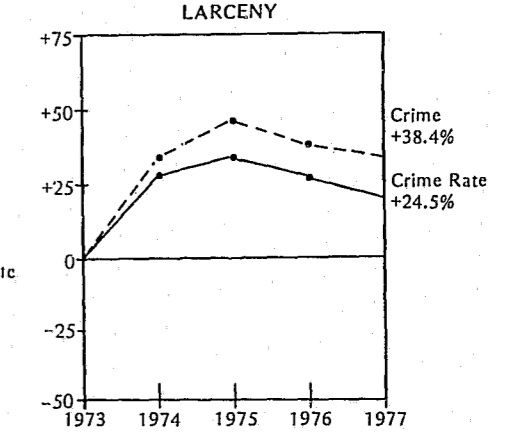
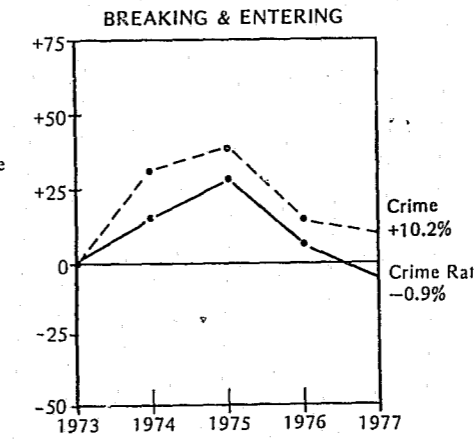
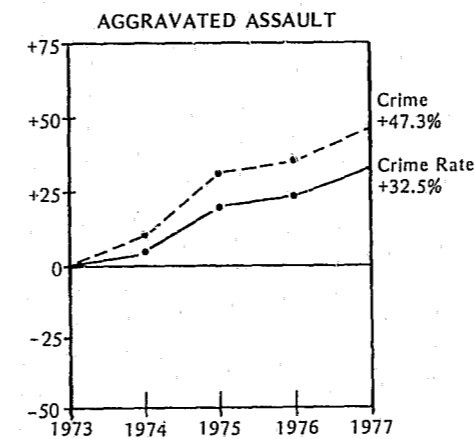
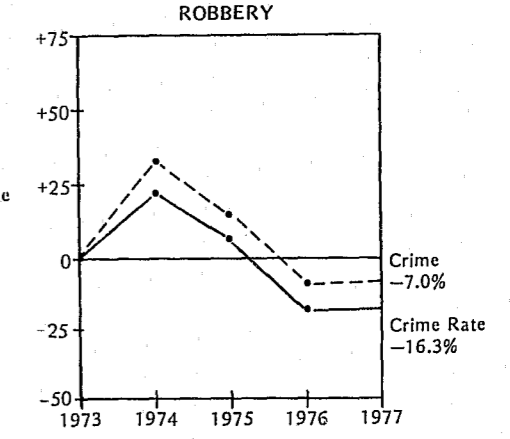
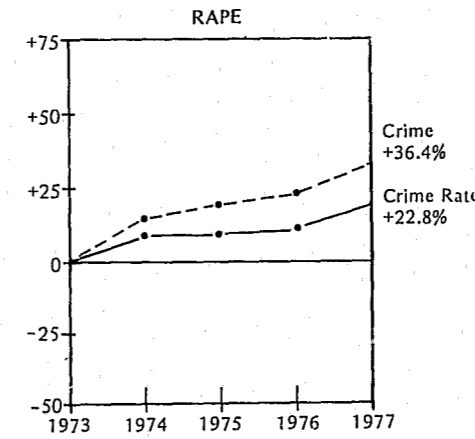
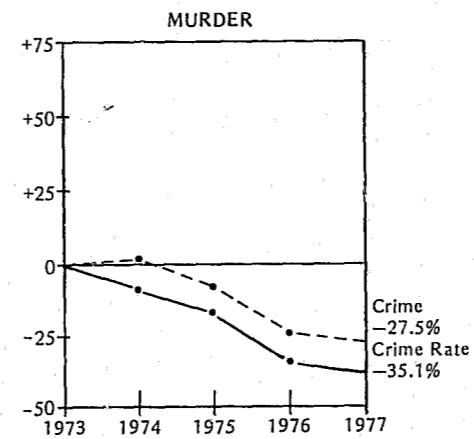

FLORIDA CRIME INDEX

The figures presented in the tables, graphs, and charts in this publication indicate the volume, fluctuation, and distribution of crime in Florida on the basis of a crime index. These crime figures are categorized by municipal, county, statewide, SMSA and Judicial Circuit totals. The seven offenses comprising the Index Crimes are:

- Murder
- Forcible Rape
- Robbery
- Aggravated Assault
- Breaking and Entering—Burglary
- Larceny
- Motor Vehicle Theft.

These crimes were selected for use as an Index on the basis of their serious nature, their frequency of occurrence and the reliability of reporting from citizens to law enforcement agencies. The Crime Index is used as a basic measure of crime. The Crime Index is the total number of Index Crimes that come to the attention of law enforcement agencies. During the year 1977, a total of 568,878 index offenses were reported. This represents a decrease of 21,226 offenses, or a 3.6 percent decrease from 1976.

In reviewing crime index figures the reader should keep in mind that there is currently no way of determining the total number of actual crimes committed. The Crime Index has been established to measure only the instances of crime which come to the attention of law enforcement agencies. However, to be a true index, its relationship to total crime reported or unreported must be known. This relationship unfortunately has never been conclusively established and, therefore, fluctuations in the Crime Index may or may not adequately reflect changes in the total crime picture. It is important to remember in reviewing the tables and graphs in this report that the volume of crime in a given area or municipality is directly related to the crime factors previously listed in this report.

VOLUME AND DISTRIBUTION OF CRIME INDEX OFFENSES

The Crime Index merely identifies the number of actual incidents known to law enforcement agencies, not the number of criminals who committed

them or the number of injuries they caused. The seven Crime Index offenses are grouped into two categories—violent crimes and nonviolent crimes.

Violent Crime

Crimes of violence include murder, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault. Violent crimes involve the element of personal confrontation between perpetrator and victim and because of their very nature, are more serious than nonviolent crimes. These offenses for the year 1977 made up 10.2 percent of all reported index offenses. For the year 1977 violent crimes as a group rose 6.3 percent from 1976.

Nonviolent Crime

For Uniform Crime Reports purposes, nonviolent crimes include the offenses of breaking and entering—burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft. The number of nonviolent crimes reported for 1977 was more than 8 times the number of violent crimes, amounting to 89.8 percent of all Index Crimes reported. Nonviolent crimes as a group recorded a decrease of 4.6 percent from the number reported for the year 1976.

VALUE OF PROPERTY STOLEN AND RECOVERED

Supplementary data relating to the crimes of murder, forcible rape, robbery, breaking and entering—burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft is collected and analyzed. The resultant figures provide information concerning the value of property stolen and recovered by type of property. The total value of property stolen in Florida during 1977 was \$196,970,116. This amounts to an increase of \$5,326,646, or an increase of 2.8 percent from the year 1976. Law enforcement agencies were successful in recovering 24.7 percent of the loss or \$48,632,523. Stolen motor vehicles accounted for the highest dollar loss, amounting to \$59,843,029 for 1977. This figure represents an increase of 12.0 percent from 1976.

CRIME RATES

The crime rate equals the number of Index Crimes per unit of population, generally per 100,000. It should be noted that the crime rate only takes into consideration the numerical factor of population

and does not incorporate any of the other elements which contribute to the amount of crime in a given community. The effect of changes in population on rates should be kept in mind when attempting to make a comparison of crime rates.

The Crime Index rate for Florida for the year 1977 is 6,525.8 offenses per 100,000 inhabitants, a 5.4 percent decrease from the year 1976.

For the year 1977, violent crimes accounted for 664.8 offenses per 100,000 population, while the nonviolent crime rate amounted to 5,861.0 offenses per 100,000 population, reflecting a rate increase of 4.2 percent for violent crimes and a 6.4 percent decrease for nonviolent crimes.

CLEARANCE RATES

For crime reporting purposes, a crime index offense is cleared when a law enforcement agency has identified the offender, there is enough evidence to charge him and he is actually taken into custody. The arrest of one person can clear several crimes or several persons may be arrested in the process of clearing one crime.

Crime solutions are also recorded in exceptional circumstances when some element beyond law

enforcement control precludes formal charges against the offender.

For 1977, 23.6 percent of all Index Crimes were cleared. The percentage of violent crimes cleared was 56.8 percent, while the clearance rate for nonviolent crimes was 19.8 percent. This compares with a 1976 total clearance rate of 21.6 percent and violent crime and nonviolent crime clearance rates of 53.6 and 18.4 percent, respectively.

NON-INDEX OFFENSES

Two offense classifications of reported crime do not fall into the makeup of the Index Crimes. These offenses are manslaughter by negligence and non-aggravated assault. In 1977 there were 13 non-traffic manslaughters by negligence. Ten of the total non-traffic manslaughters were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared.

There were 51,901 non-aggravated assaults reported for the year 1977 in Florida. 31,053 or 59.8 percent of these offenses were cleared by arrest or by exception. Of these 31,053 total clearances, 87.4 percent were cleared through the involvement of persons aged 18 and above, while the other 12.6 percent involved persons aged 17 and under.

MURDER

Murder is defined as the willful (nonnegligent) killing of a human being. Any death due to a fight, argument, quarrel, assault or commission of a crime is included. This index offense is scored by law enforcement officials on the basis of their investigation without regard to findings of a court or jury or the decision of a prosecutor. Attempts to kill and assaults to kill are scored as assaults and not as murder. Suicides, accidental deaths, and justifiable or excusable homicides are also excluded.

1975—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 1,132 murders were reported by law enforcement agencies in Florida for the year 1975.

Murders accounted for 2.0 percent of all violent crimes and 0.2 percent of all index offenses reported.

The murder rate for the reporting period was 13.3 per 100,000 population.

A total of 925 murders were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared, amounting to an 81.7 percent clearance rate statewide.

The age group 25-29 accounted for 15.2 percent of persons arrested for murder. Males accounted for 80.1 percent of all persons arrested for murder.

43.4 percent of all persons arrested for murder were white, 56.1 percent were Negro and 0.5 were of other races.

50.9 percent of all murder victims were white, 49.1 percent were Negro and 0.0 percent of other races were murdered. 73.7 percent of all murder victims were male.

Firearms were employed in 66.0 percent of all reported murders. The use of a knife or other cutting device was involved in 13.4 percent of the murders.

The murder of one family member by another accounted for 262 or 23.1 percent of all murders. Of these, 186 murders or 71.0 percent resulted from one spouse killing the other.

Altercations or quarrels between the victim and perpetrator, including money quarrels, lovers quarrels and drinking quarrels, accounted for 18.3 percent of all murders reported during the year 1975. Drinking quarrels recorded the highest involvement, accounting for 5.9 percent of the total murders.

1976—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 902 murders were reported by law enforcement agencies in Florida for the year 1976.

Murders accounted for 1.7 percent of all violent crimes and 0.2 percent of all index offenses reported.

The murder rate for the reporting period was 10.5 per 100,000 population.

A total of 727 murders were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared, amounting to an 80.6 percent clearance rate statewide.

The age group 25-29 accounted for 17.5 percent of persons arrested for murder. Males accounted for 83.1 percent of all persons arrested for murder.

47.0 percent of all persons arrested for murder were white, 52.1 percent were Negro and 0.9 were of other races.

51.6 percent of all murder victims were white, 48.1 percent were Negro and 0.3 percent of other races were murdered. 72.7 percent of all murder victims were male.

Firearms were employed in 63.7 percent of all reported murders. The use of a knife or other cutting device was involved in 15.2 percent of the murders.

The murder of one family member by another accounted for 173 or 19.2 percent of all murders. Of these, 118 murders or 68.2 percent resulted from one spouse killing the other.

Altercations or quarrels between the victim and perpetrator, including money quarrels, lovers quarrels and drinking quarrels, accounted for 12.6 percent of all murders reported during the year 1976. Lovers quarrels recorded the highest involvement, accounting for 5.2 percent of the total murders.

1977—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 857 murders were reported by law enforcement agencies in Florida for the year 1977.

Murders accounted for 1.5 percent of all violent crimes and 0.2 percent of all index offenses reported.

The murder rate for the reporting period was 9.8 per 100,000 population.

A total of 686 murders were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared, amounting to an 80.0 percent clearance rate statewide.

The age group 25-29 accounted for 16.3 percent of persons arrested for murder. Males accounted for 81.1 percent of all persons arrested for murder.

45.7 percent of all persons arrested for murder were white, 53.2 percent were Negro and 1.1 were of other races.

54.4 percent of all murder victims were white, 44.9 percent were Negro and 0.7 percent of other races were murdered. 75.6 percent of all murder victims were male.

Firearms were employed in 59.2 percent of all reported murders. The use of a knife or other cutting device was involved in 17.6 percent of the murders.

The murder of one family member by another accounted for 129 or 15.1 percent of all murders. Of these, 73 murders or 56.6 percent resulted from one spouse killing the other.

Altercations or quarrels between the victim and perpetrator, including money quarrels, lovers quarrels and drinking quarrels, accounted for 27.7 percent of all murders reported during the year 1977. Lovers quarrels recorded the highest involvement, accounting for 11.4 percent of the total murders.

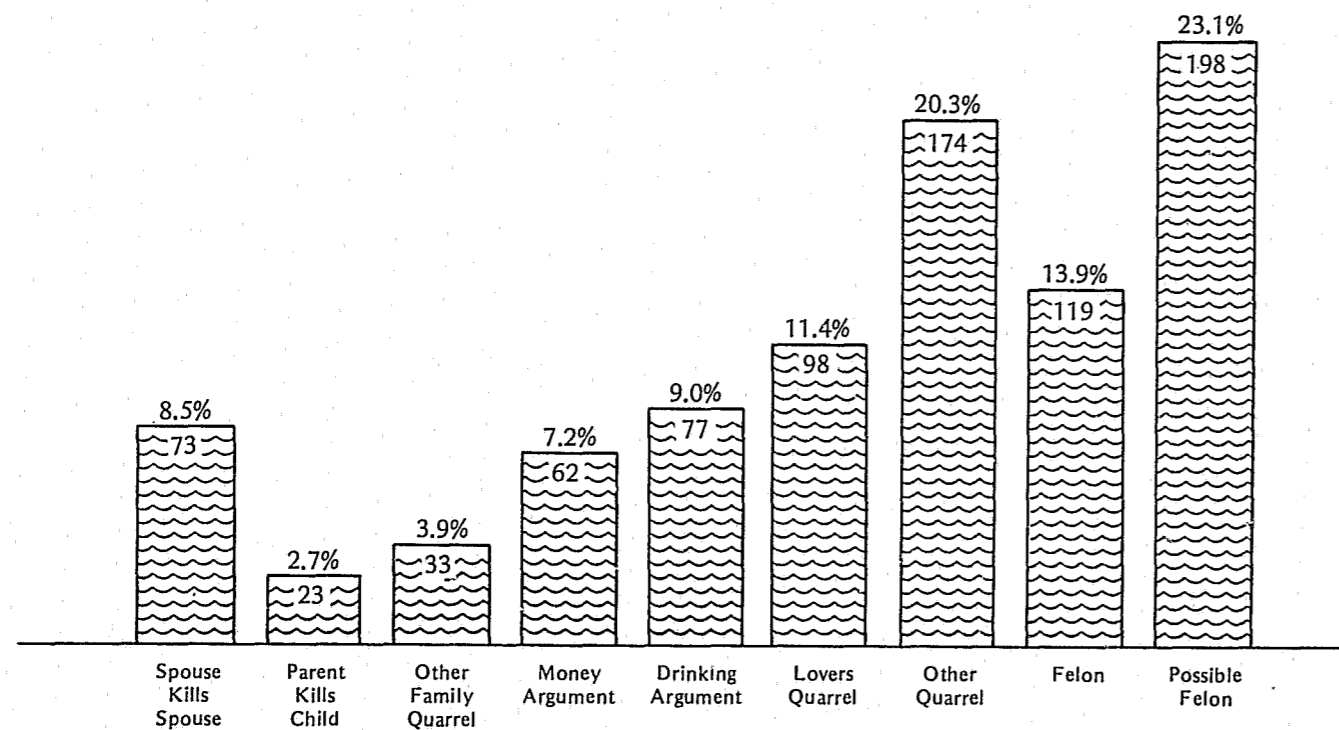
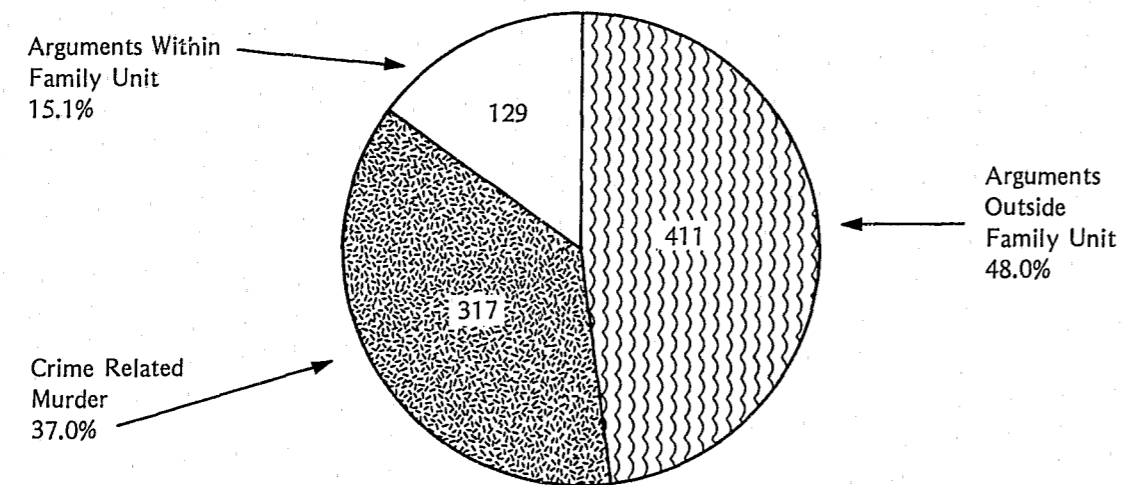

FORCIBLE RAPE

Forcible rape is the carnal knowledge of a female forcibly and against her will. For the purposes of Uniform Crime Reports rape is divided into two categories: (1) rape by force; and (2) attempted rapes. Carnal abuse without force (statutory rape), and other sex offenses are not counted.

1975—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 2,985 forcible rapes (including attempts) were reported by law enforcement agencies in Florida for the year 1975. 2,158 were rapes by force and 827 were attempted rapes.

Forcible rapes accounted for 5.2 percent of all violent crimes and 0.5 percent of all index offenses reported.

The forcible rape rate for the year 1975 amounted to 35.2 rapes for every 100,000 persons in the state.

A total of 1,704 forcible rapes were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared, amounting to a 57.1 percent clearance rate statewide.

54.4 percent of the reported arrests for forcible rape during the year 1975 were of persons under the age of 25.

50.6 percent of all persons arrested for forcible rape during the year 1975 were white, 48.6 percent were Negro and 0.8 percent were of other races.

1976—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 3,051 forcible rapes (including attempts) were reported by law enforcement agencies in Florida for the year 1976. 2,255 were rapes by force and 796 were attempted rapes.

Forcible rapes accounted for 5.6 percent of all violent crimes and 0.5 percent of all index offenses reported.

The forcible rape rate for the year 1976 amounted to 35.7 rapes for every 100,000 persons in the state.

A total of 1,623 forcible rapes were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared, amounting to 53.2 percent clearance rate statewide.

53.1 percent of the reported arrests for forcible rape during the year 1976 were of persons under the age of 25.

50.5 percent of all persons arrested for forcible rape during the year 1976 were white, 48.5 percent were Negro and 1.0 percent were of other races.

1977—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 3,342 forcible rapes (including attempts) were reported by law enforcement agencies in Florida for the year 1977. 2,532 were rapes by force and 810 were attempted rapes.

Forcible rapes accounted for 5.8 percent of all violent crimes and 0.6 percent of all index offenses reported.

The forcible rape rate for the year 1977 amounted to 38.3 rapes for every 100,000 persons in the state.

A total of 1,851 forcible rapes were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared, amounting to 55.4 percent clearance rate statewide.

54.7 percent of the reported arrests for forcible rape during the year 1977 were of persons under the age of 25.

48.2 percent of all persons arrested for forcible rape during the year 1977 were white, 50.9 percent were Negro and 0.9 percent were of other races.

ROBBERY

Robbery is the felonious and forcible taking of the property of another, against his will, by violence or putting the person in fear. For a crime of robbery to take place, the victim must be present. Robbery is further separated into two categories: (1) Armed Robbery—any weapon. Any object which is so employed as to constitute force or threat of force is considered a weapon; and (2) Strong-arm—no weapon (includes muggings and similar offenses where no weapon is used and strong-arm tactics are employed to deprive the victim of his property. This is limited to hands, feet, arms, fists, etc.).

1975—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 20,036 robberies were reported by law enforcement agencies in the State of Florida for the year 1975.

Robberies accounted for 34.7 percent of all violent crimes as a group and 3.1 percent of the total crime index.

The robbery rate amounted to approximately 236.1 robberies for every 100,000 persons in the state.

A total of 6,504 robberies were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared, representing a clearance rate of 33.4 percent statewide.

The age group 25-29 accounted for 12.9 percent of persons arrested for robbery. Males accounted for 92.5 percent of all persons arrested for robbery.

40.0 percent of all persons arrested for robbery were white, 59.7 percent were Negro and 0.4 percent were of other races.

The largest number of actual offenses of robbery, 8,962 in number, occurred under the Highway category, which represents 44.7 percent of all offenses of robbery reported during 1975. The armed robber was responsible for over 63.6 percent of the reported offenses.

The value of property stolen in actual offenses of robbery totaled \$8,696,977 or 3.8 percent of the total value of property stolen during the year. The highest average loss, amounting to \$3,985, occurred in bank robberies. The lowest average loss, \$237, occurred in gas or service station robberies.

1976—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 15,684 robberies were reported by law enforcement agencies in the State of Florida for the year 1976.

Robberies accounted for 28.8 percent of all violent crimes as a group and 2.7 percent of the total crime index.

The robbery rate amounted to approximately 183.4 robberies for every 100,000 persons in the state.

A total of 4,595 robberies were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared, representing a clearance rate of 29.3 percent statewide.

The age group 25-29 accounted for 13.5 percent of persons arrested for robbery. Males accounted for 91.8 percent of all persons arrested for robbery.

42.4 percent of all persons arrested for robbery were white, 56.5 percent were Negro and 1.1 percent were of other races.

The largest number of actual offenses of robbery, 6,486 in number, occurred under the Highway category, which represents 41.4 percent of all offenses of robbery reported during 1976. The armed robber was responsible for over 58.3 percent of the reported offenses.

The value of property stolen in actual offenses of robbery totaled \$5,940,534 or 3.1 percent of the total value of property stolen during the year. The highest average loss, amounting to \$3,562 occurred in bank robberies. The lowest average loss, \$156, occurred in convenience store robberies.

1977—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 15,881 robberies were reported by law enforcement agencies in the State of Florida for the year 1977.

Robberies accounted for 27.4 percent of all violent crimes as a group and 2.8 percent of the total crime index.

The robbery rate amounted to approximately 182.2 robberies for every 100,000 persons in the state.

A total of 5,365 robberies were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared, representing a clearance rate of 33.8 percent statewide.

The age group 25-29 accounted for 14.4 percent of persons arrested for robbery. Males accounted for 91.7 percent of all persons arrested for robbery.

45.1 percent of all persons arrested for robbery were white, 53.8 percent were Negro and 1.1 percent were of other races.

The largest number of actual offenses of robbery, 6,310 in number, occurred under the Highway category, which represents 39.7 percent of all offenses of robbery reported during 1977. The armed robber was responsible for over 56.3 percent of the reported offenses.

The value of property stolen in actual offenses of robbery totaled \$6,434,188 or 3.3 percent of the total value of property stolen during the year. The highest average loss, amounting to \$4,436, occurred in bank robberies. The lowest average loss, \$158, occurred in convenience store robberies.

AGGRAVATED ASSAULT

Assault is defined as an attempt or offer with unlawful force or violence, to do physical injury to another. An aggravated assault may be committed by a gun, knife, or other cutting instrument, other dangerous weapons such as clubs, or through the aggravated use of hands, fists, or feet. Assault with intent to commit a murder is also reported as aggravated assault.

All assaults, where no weapon is used, which result in minor injuries are classified as non-aggravated assaults and are not counted in the Crime Index totals.

1975—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 33,510 aggravated assaults were reported by law enforcement agencies for the year 1975.

Aggravated assaults accounted for 58.1 percent of all violent crimes and 5.2 percent of all index crimes reported.

The rate of aggravated assaults amounted to 394.9 assaults for each 100,000 persons.

A total of 22,758 aggravated assaults were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared which represents a clearance rate of 67.9 percent statewide.

Persons under the age of 30 accounted for 59.9 percent of the arrests for aggravated assault. Arrests of males for aggravated assault outnumbered females by a 5 to 1 margin.

Analysis of aggravated assault arrests by race indicates that 48.6 percent of all persons arrested were white, 51.0 percent were Negro, and 0.4 percent were of other races.

The use of firearms represented 10,247 offenses and comprised 30.6 percent of all aggravated assaults.

1976—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 34,906 aggravated assaults were reported by law enforcement agencies for the year 1976.

Aggravated assaults accounted for 64.0 percent of all violent crimes and 5.9 percent of all index crimes reported.

The rate of aggravated assaults amounted to 408.2 assaults for each 100,000 persons.

A total of 22,284 aggravated assaults were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared which represents a clearance rate of 63.8 percent statewide.

Persons under the age of 30 accounted for 60.4 percent of the arrests for aggravated assault. Arrests of males for aggravated assault outnumbered females by a 5 to 1 margin.

Analysis of aggravated assault arrests by race indicates that 48.5 percent of all persons arrested were white, 50.6 percent were Negro, and 0.9 percent were of other races.

The use of firearms represented 8,904 offenses and comprised 25.5 percent of all aggravated assaults.

1977—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 37,877 aggravated assaults were reported by law enforcement agencies for the year 1977.

Aggravated assaults accounted for 65.4 percent of all violent crimes and 6.7 percent of all index crimes reported.

The rate of aggravated assaults amounted to 434.5 assaults for each 100,000 persons.

A total of 25,020 aggravated assaults were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared which represents a clearance rate of 66.1 percent statewide.

Persons under the age of 30 accounted for 59.5 percent of the arrests for aggravated assault. Arrests of males for aggravated assault outnumbered females by a 5 to 1 margin.

Analysis of aggravated assault arrests by race indicates that 51.8 percent of all persons arrested were white, 47.3 percent were Negro, and 0.9 percent were of other races.

The use of firearms represented 9,115 offenses and comprised 24.1 percent of all aggravated assaults.

BREAKING AND ENTERING—BURGLARY

Breaking and Entering—Burglary is any unlawful entry or attempted forcible entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft, even though force may not be used to gain entrance.

Breaking and Entering—Burglary is divided into three categories: (1) Forcible entry, (2) Unlawful entry—no force, and (3) Attempted forcible entry.

1975—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 196,446 burglaries were reported by law enforcement agencies for the year 1975.

Burglaries accounted for 33.4 percent of all nonviolent crimes and 30.4 percent of all index offenses reported.

The burglary rate for the reporting period was 2,315.2 per 100,000 population.

A total of 39,816 burglaries were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared. This amounts to a clearance rate of 20.3 percent statewide.

The age group accounting for the highest percentage of persons arrested for burglary, 11.8 percent, occurred in the age 16 category. Males accounted for 94.4 percent of persons arrested for burglary.

65.3 percent of all persons arrested for Breaking and Entering were white, 34.4 percent were Negro, and 0.3 percent were of other races.

Of the three categories of burglary, forcible entry was the most prevalent, with 156,526 offenses. This figure represents 79.7 percent of the total burglaries committed. 12.4 percent were unlawful entry (no force), while 7.9 percent were attempts.

The value of property stolen in actual offenses of burglary totaled \$85,620,063 or 37.9 percent of the total value of property stolen during the year.

Residential burglaries accounted for 64.5 percent of the total offenses reported, with a total dollar loss of \$59,401,087. Where time could be determined, 48.5 percent of residential burglaries occurred during the night hours.

1976—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 164,413 burglaries were reported by law enforcement agencies for the year 1976.

Burglaries accounted for 30.7 percent of all nonviolent crimes and 27.9 percent of all index offenses reported.

The burglary rate for the reporting period was 1,922.6 per 100,000 population.

A total of 30,613 burglaries were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared. This amounts to a clearance rate of 18.6 percent statewide.

The age group accounting for the highest percentage of persons arrested for burglary, 11.3 percent, occurred in the age 16 category. Males accounted for 94.1 percent of persons arrested for burglary.

66.4 percent of all persons arrested for Breaking and Entering were white, 33.0 percent were Negro, and 0.6 percent were of other races.

Of the three categories of burglary, forcible entry was the most prevalent, with 127,998 offenses. This figure represents 77.9 percent of the total burglaries committed. 13.7 percent were unlawful entry (no force), while 8.5 percent were attempts.

The value of property stolen in actual offenses of burglary totaled \$67,527,239 or 35.2 percent of the total value of property stolen during the year.

Residential burglaries accounted for 63.3 percent of the total offenses reported, with a total dollar loss of \$43,876,050. Where time could be determined, 47.4 percent of residential burglaries occurred during the night hours.

1977—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 157,120 burglaries were reported by law enforcement agencies for the year 1977.

Burglaries accounted for 30.8 percent of all nonviolent crimes and 27.6 percent of all index offenses reported.

The burglary rate for the reporting period was 1,802.4 per 100,000 population.

A total of 32,571 burglaries were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared. This amounts to a clearance rate of 20.7 percent statewide.

The age group accounting for the highest percentage of persons arrested for burglary, 10.9 percent, occurred in the age 16 category. Males accounted for 93.6 percent of persons arrested for burglary.

68.4 percent of all persons arrested for Breaking and Entering were white, 31.0 percent were Negro, and 0.5 percent were of other races.

Of the three categories of burglary, forcible entry was the most prevalent, with 121,625 offenses. This figure represents 77.4 percent of the total burglaries committed. 14.0 percent were unlawful entry (no force), while 8.6 percent were attempts.

The value of property stolen in actual offenses of burglary totaled \$68,576,975 or 34.8 percent of the total value of property stolen during the year.

Residential burglaries accounted for 62.0 percent of the total offenses reported, with a total dollar loss of \$41,837,712. Where time could be determined, 47.2 percent of residential burglaries occurred during the night hours.

LARCENY

Larceny is the taking of the personal property of another with intent to permanently deprive him of ownership.

All larcenies and thefts resulting from pocket picking, purse snatching, shoplifting, larceny from a motor vehicle, larceny of motor vehicle parts and accessories, theft of bicycle, larceny from buildings and from any coin operated machines are included in this category. Embezzlements, illegal conversions, larceny by a bailee, frauds or bad check cases are not included.

Starting in 1973, larcenies under \$50 in value were considered an Index Crime.

1975—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 354,256 larcenies were reported by law enforcement agencies for the year 1975.

Reported larcenies accounted for 60.3 percent of nonviolent crimes and 54.9 percent of all index offenses reported.

The larceny rate for Florida for the year amounted to 4,175.0 per 100,000 population.

There were 69,624 larcenies cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared. This represents a clearance rate of 19.7 percent statewide.

The age group responsible for the highest percentage of persons arrested for larceny, 8.2 percent, occurred in the 16 year old age category. Males accounted for 67.5 percent of persons arrested for all categories of larceny.

63.4 percent of all persons arrested for larceny were white, 36.3 percent were Negro, and 0.3 percent were of other races.

During the year 1975, the value of property stolen in actual offenses of larceny totaled \$68,597,490. This constitutes 30.3 percent of the total value of property stolen.

1976—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 342,570 larcenies were reported by law enforcement agencies for the year 1976.

Reported larcenies accounted for 64.0 percent of nonviolent crimes and 58.1 percent of all index offenses reported.

The larceny rate for Florida for the year amounted to 4,005.8 per 100,000 population.

There were 62,017 larcenies cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared. This represents a clearance rate of 18.1 percent statewide.

The age group of 25 to 29 years was responsible for 9.7 percent of persons arrested for larceny. Males accounted for 67.5 percent of persons arrested for all categories of larceny.

62.1 percent of all persons arrested for larceny were white, 37.0 percent were Negro, and 0.9 percent were of other races.

During the year 1976, the value of property stolen in actual offenses of larceny totaled \$65,984,003. This constitutes 34.4 percent of the total value of property stolen.

1977—SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 324,121 larcenies were reported by law enforcement agencies for the year 1977.

Reported larcenies accounted for 63.4 percent of nonviolent crimes and 57.0 percent of all index offenses reported.

The larceny rate for Florida for the year amounted to 3,718.1 per 100,000 population.

There were 61,939 larcenies cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared. This represents a clearance rate of 19.1 percent statewide.

The age group of 25 to 29 years was responsible for 9.5 percent of persons arrested for larceny. Males accounted for 66.3 percent of persons arrested for all categories of larceny.

63.8 percent of all persons arrested for larceny were white, 35.5 percent were Negro, and 0.7 percent were of other races.

During the year 1977, the value of property stolen in actual offenses of larceny totaled \$63,845,443. This constitutes 32.4 percent of the total value of property stolen.

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

Motor vehicle theft is the larceny or attempted larceny of a motor vehicle. This includes all vehicles which can be registered as such in the state. "Joyriding" thefts are included under this category.

1975-SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 36,973 motor vehicle thefts were reported by law enforcement agencies in Florida during 1975.

Motor vehicle thefts made up 6.3 percent of all nonviolent crime and 5.7 percent of all index offenses reported.

The statewide motor vehicle theft rate for the year amounted to 435.7 per 100,000 population.

A total of 8,069 motor vehicle thefts were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared, representing a clearance rate of 21.8 percent statewide.

The age group responsible for the highest percentage of persons arrested for motor vehicle theft, 13.5 percent, occurred in the 17

year old age category. 92.6 percent of all persons arrested for motor vehicle theft were males.

78.3 percent of all persons arrested for motor vehicle theft were white, 21.4 percent were Negro, and 0.2 percent were of other races.

Of the \$63,964,740 reported stolen in the locally stolen motor vehicle category, \$40,298,969 was recovered, constituting a 63.0 percent recovery rate in value.

The average value of motor vehicles stolen during the reporting period was \$1,706.

75.6 percent of the total number of motor vehicles recovered had originally been stolen from the same jurisdiction.

1976-SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 28,578 motor vehicle thefts were reported by law enforcement agencies in Florida during 1976.

Motor vehicle thefts made up 5.3 percent of all nonviolent crime and 4.8 percent of all index offenses reported.

The statewide motor vehicle theft rate for the year amounted to 334.2 per 100,000 population.

A total of 5,823 motor vehicle thefts were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared, representing a clearance rate of 20.4 percent statewide.

The age group responsible for the highest percentage of persons arrested for motor vehicle theft, 14.0 percent, occurred in the 16

year old age category. 92.0 percent of all persons arrested for motor vehicle theft were males.

78.2 percent of all persons arrested for motor vehicle theft were white, 21.3 percent were Negro, and 0.5 percent were of other races.

Of the \$53,426,017 reported stolen in the locally stolen motor vehicle category, \$29,304,702 was recovered, constituting a 54.9 percent recovery rate in value.

The average value of motor vehicles stolen during the reporting period was \$1,823.

68.1 percent of the total number of motor vehicles recovered had originally been stolen from the same jurisdiction.

1977-SUMMARY ANALYSIS

A total of 29,680 motor vehicle thefts were reported by law enforcement agencies in Florida during 1977.

Motor vehicle thefts made up 5.8 percent of all nonviolent crime and 5.2 percent of all index offenses reported.

The statewide motor vehicle theft rate for the year amounted to 340.5 per 100,000 population.

A total of 6,573 motor vehicle thefts were cleared by arrest or exceptionally cleared, representing a clearance rate of 22.1 percent statewide.

The age group responsible for the highest percentage of persons arrested for motor vehicle theft, 15.3 percent, occurred in the 16

year old age category. 91.4 percent of all persons arrested for motor vehicle theft were males.

79.4 percent of all persons arrested for motor vehicle theft were white, 19.9 percent were Negro, and 0.7 percent were of other races.

Of the \$59,843,029 reported stolen in the locally stolen motor vehicle category, \$34,120,268 was recovered, constituting a 57.0 percent recovery rate in value.

The average value of motor vehicles stolen during the reporting period was \$1,956.

71.2 percent of the total number of motor vehicles recovered had originally been stolen from the same jurisdiction.

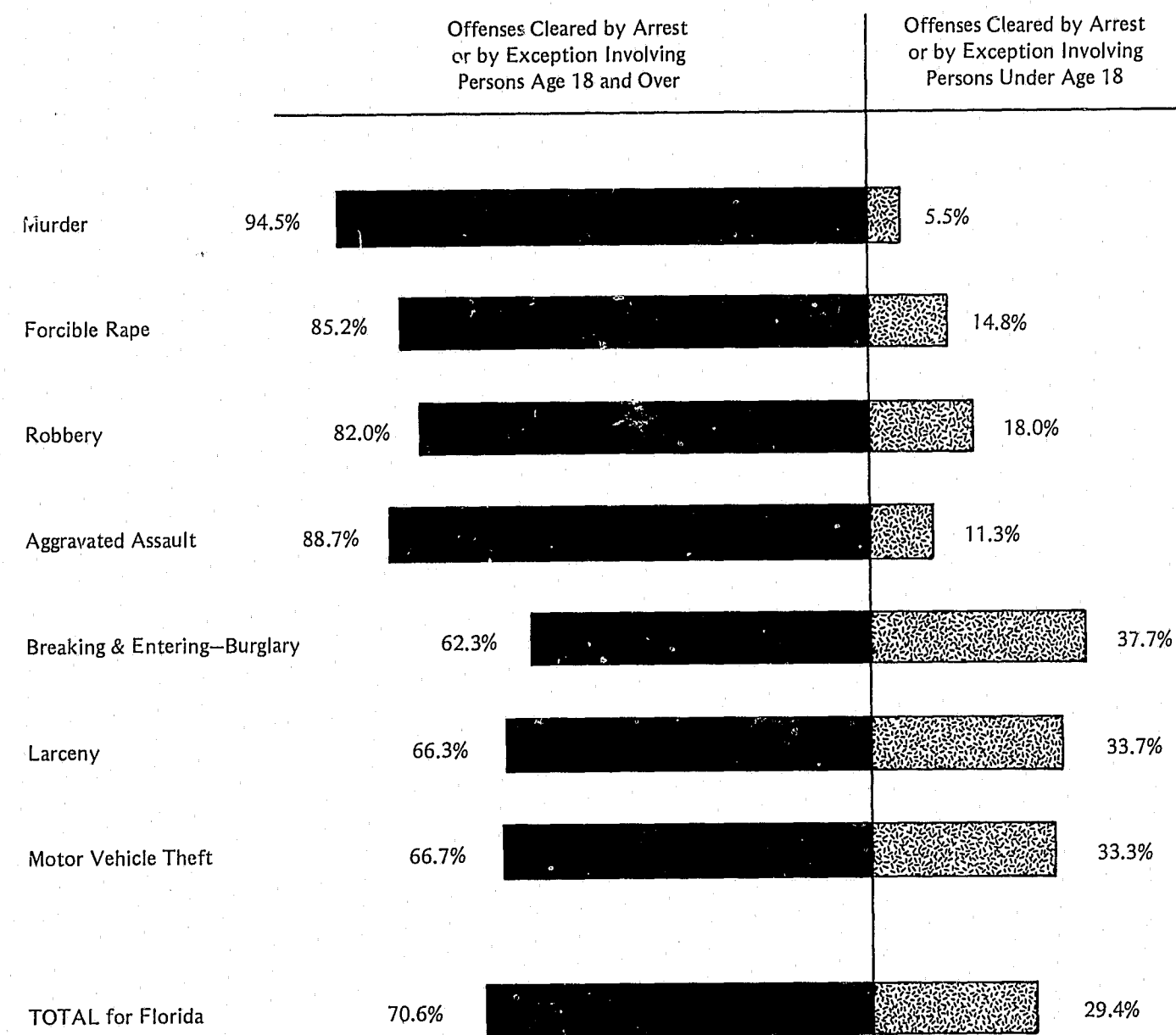

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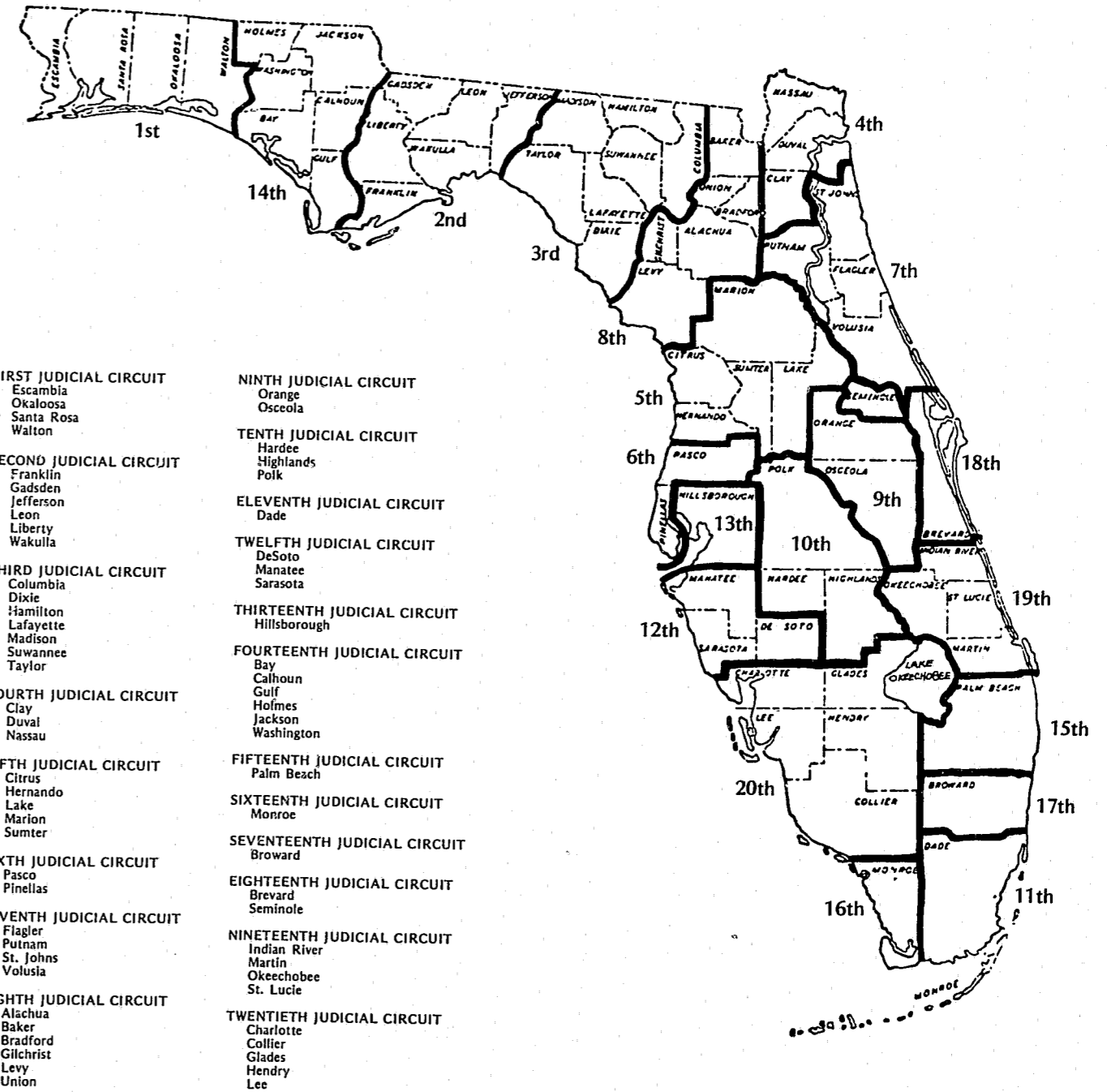

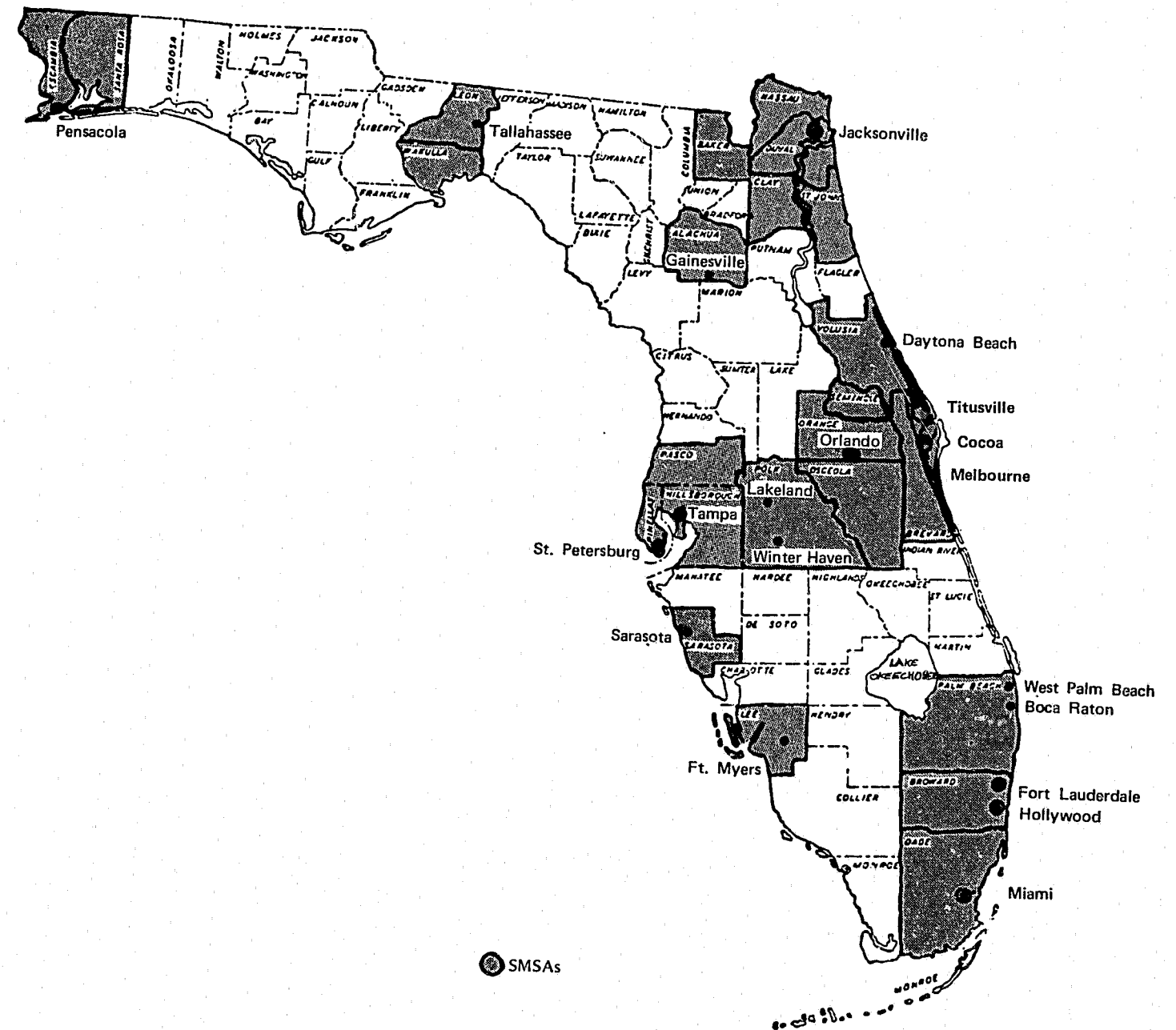

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Florida Arrest Data

FLORIDA ARREST INFORMATION

The Florida Uniform Crime Reports Program requires the periodic reporting of data concerning persons arrested in the state. A record of total arrest activity for criminal acts in both Part I and Part II crime classes is received from 347 county and municipal law enforcement agencies in Florida and is analyzed and arranged according to age, sex, race and residency of persons arrested. Traffic arrests, except Driving Under the Influence, are not reported. A total of 364,238 arrests for Part I and Part II criminal acts were reported during the year 1977, down 9.9 percent from the 404,451 arrests reported for the year 1976. Based on 1977 population estimates, this amounts to a statewide arrest rate for the year 1977 of 4,178.3 arrests for each 100,000 persons in Florida.

A person is counted each time he is arrested or summoned. It should be kept in mind that the volume of arrests may vary from time to time due to differences in local arrest procedures and policies. A juvenile is counted as "arrested" when the circumstances are such that if he or she were an adult, an arrest would be counted or when law enforcement or other official action beyond a mere interview, warning or admonishment is taken.

When reviewing arrest figures it should be remembered that arrest counts do not reflect the specific number of persons arrested since one individual person may be arrested several times during any given year for the same or different offenses. This occurs frequently for such crimes as disorderly intoxication, disorderly conduct, and similar violations. However, arrest data is useful in measuring the extent of law enforcement activity in a given geographical area as well as providing an index for measuring involvement in criminal acts by the age, sex, race and residence of the perpetrators.

Analysis of reported arrests for the year 1977 indicates that 27.8 percent of all arrests during the year were for Part I offenses (murder, manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, breaking and entering—burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft). Arrests for larceny comprised the highest percentage of arrests for Part I crimes, amounting to 52.1 percent. The highest percentage of arrests for Part II offenses, excluding the all other category, was driving under the influence which constituted 17.8 percent

VIOLENT CRIME ARRESTS

During the year 20,828 arrests for crimes of violence (murder, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault) on a statewide basis amounted to 20.6 percent of all arrests for the Part I offenses and 5.7 percent of the total arrests for all offenses. Arrests for aggravated assault were the most frequent, representing 68.3 percent of the total arrests for violent crimes. During 1976, violent crime arrests amounted to 19.9 percent of all Part I arrests and 5.2 percent of all arrests.

NONVIOLENT CRIME ARRESTS

Nonviolent crime arrests (breaking and entering—burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft) comprised 79.3 percent of all Part I arrests and 22.1 percent of all arrests reported during the year 1977. The highest percentage of nonviolent crime arrests, 65.7 percent, occurred in the larceny category. During 1976, nonviolent crime arrests amounted to 79.9 percent of all Part I arrests and 20.9 percent of all arrests.

NONRESIDENT ARRESTS

Upon arresting an offender for a criminal violation committed within a community, the responsible law enforcement agency may find that the perpetrator's residence is in another community or even another state. The Florida Uniform Crime Reports Program provides for the collection of residency data to those arrested in order to measure the criminal mobility factor in Florida.

It was found that during 1977, of the total arrests reported by county and municipal law enforcement agencies for their respective jurisdictions, 6.9 percent of those arrested resided outside the state of Florida and 8.1 percent resided in a county (within Florida) other than the one in which the offense was committed.

The total volume of out of state resident arrests for the year 1977 decreased by 14.9 percent, while out of county resident arrests increased by 1.7 percent over the year 1976.

The highest percentage of nonresident arrests reported during the year occurred in the motor vehicle theft category for Part I offenses and the liquor law category for Part II offenses, amounting to 21.6 percent and 43.2 percent respectively.

AGE ANALYSIS

The distribution of those persons arrested by age categories during the year 1977 continues to illustrate the involvement in criminal activity by the youth of Florida. Nearly 9.4 percent of all persons arrested for the year were under the age of 15, 24.6 percent were under 18 and 40.4 percent of all persons arrested were under the age of 21.

An evaluation of reported Part I arrests indicates that 39.7 percent of persons arrested for such crimes were under the age of 18. The most frequent Part I juvenile arrests during the year were for larceny, amounting to 53.9 percent of the total reported Part I juvenile arrests.

Total juvenile arrests for all offenses decreased by 4.9 percent from the reported figure for the year 1976. Adult arrests showed a decrease of 11.5 percent from the figures for the year 1976.

Arrests of persons age 18 and over amounted to 75.4 percent of the total number of Part I and Part II arrests reported. Of the total adult arrests, 17.5 percent occurred in the 25 to 29 age group.

SEX AND RACE ANALYSIS

A percentage distribution by sex of all reported arrests for the year 1977, reveals that 81.8 percent of all persons arrested were male. Males were involved in 77.8 percent of all arrests for Part I offenses, with primary involvement in the crime of larceny. Total male arrests decreased by 10.6 percent over the year 1976. The largest increase in male arrests for Part I offenses was registered in the aggravated assault category, up 1.4 percent from the year 1976.

Female arrests amounted to 18.2 percent of the total arrests reported and 22.2 percent of all arrests

for Part I offenses. Further evaluation of arrest data for Part I offenses discloses that females were primarily involved in arrests for larceny, accounting for 33.7 percent of the total arrests for this offense. Total female arrests decreased by 6.7 percent over the year 1976. Part I female arrests in the breaking and entering—burglary category increased 5.7 percent over the year 1976.

An analysis of arrests for violent and nonviolent crime classes for the reporting period shows that 86.5 percent of all reported arrests for the violent crimes of murder, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault involved males. Females accounted for 13.5 percent of total violent crime arrests. Female arrests comprised 24.5 percent of the nonviolent crimes of breaking and entering—burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft, while 75.5 percent of the nonviolent crime arrests for the year involved males.

A distribution analysis of total arrests by race for the year 1977 indicates that 71.4 percent of all arrested persons were white, 27.9 percent were Negro, with the remaining 0.7 percent of other races.

With regard to violent crimes within the Part I offenses (murder, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault), 49.8 percent of those arrested were white, 49.2 percent were Negro and the remaining 1.0 percent of other races.

A comparison of arrest data for the nonviolent crimes of breaking and entering—burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft indicates that 65.8 percent of those arrested were white, 33.5 percent were Negro, with the remaining 0.7 percent of other races.

DISPOSITION OF JUVENILES

The Florida UCR Program requires that contributing agencies provide specific disposition information on all juveniles arrested. The UCR Program specifies five basic information categories for use by law enforcement agencies in reporting juvenile arrest dispositions. Juveniles may be (1) *handled within the department and released*, (2) *referred to juvenile court, juvenile authorities or probation department*, (3) *referred to a welfare*

agency, (4) referred to another law enforcement agency, or (5) referred to criminal or adult court.

During the year 1977, on a statewide basis, approximately 70.9 percent of all juveniles arrested were referred to juvenile court or probation depart-

ment, 24.5 percent were handled directly by law enforcement agencies and released, 2.1 percent were referred to welfare agencies, 1.9 percent were referred to criminal or adult court, and the remaining 0.5 percent were referred to other law enforcement agencies for disposition.

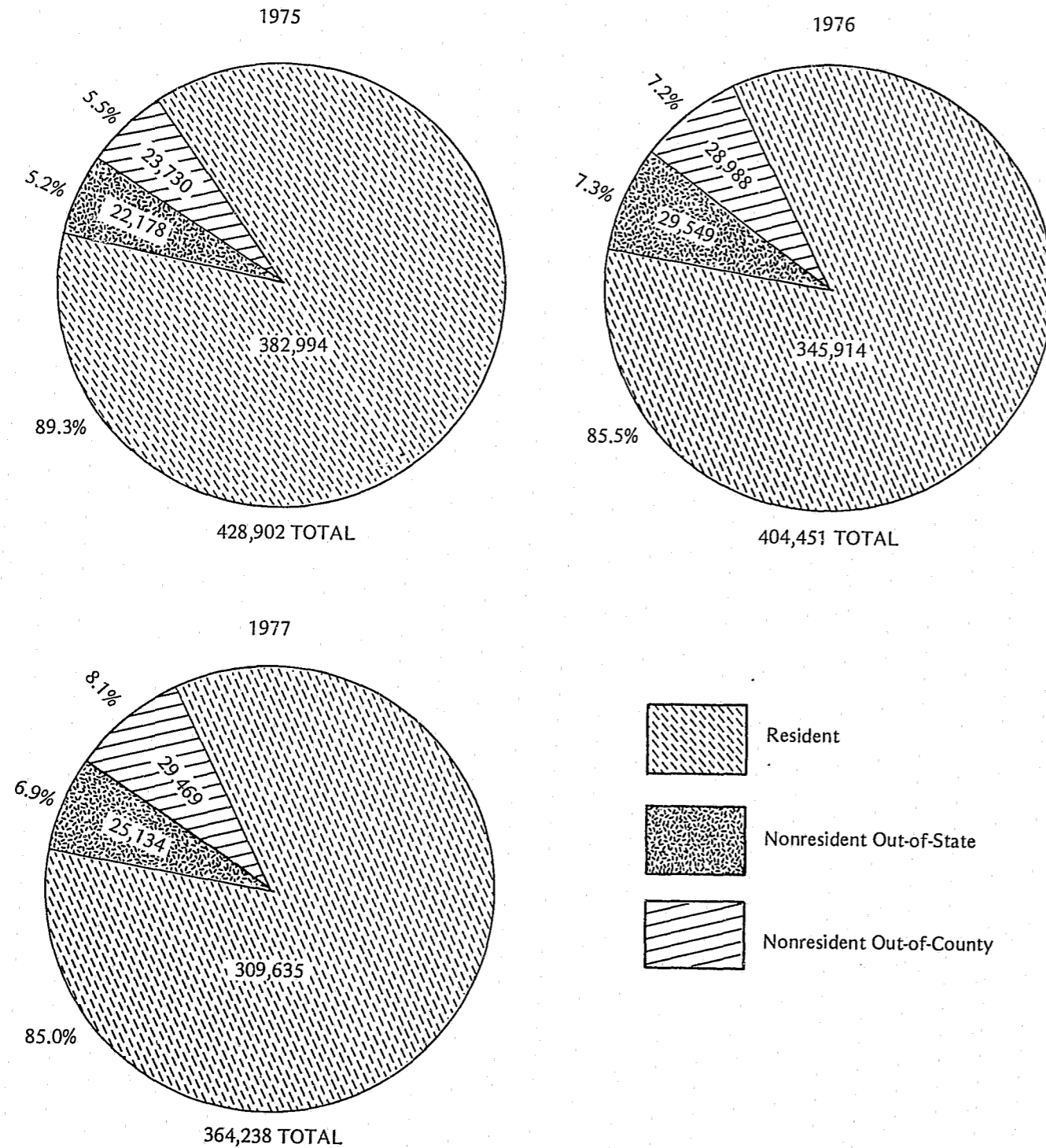

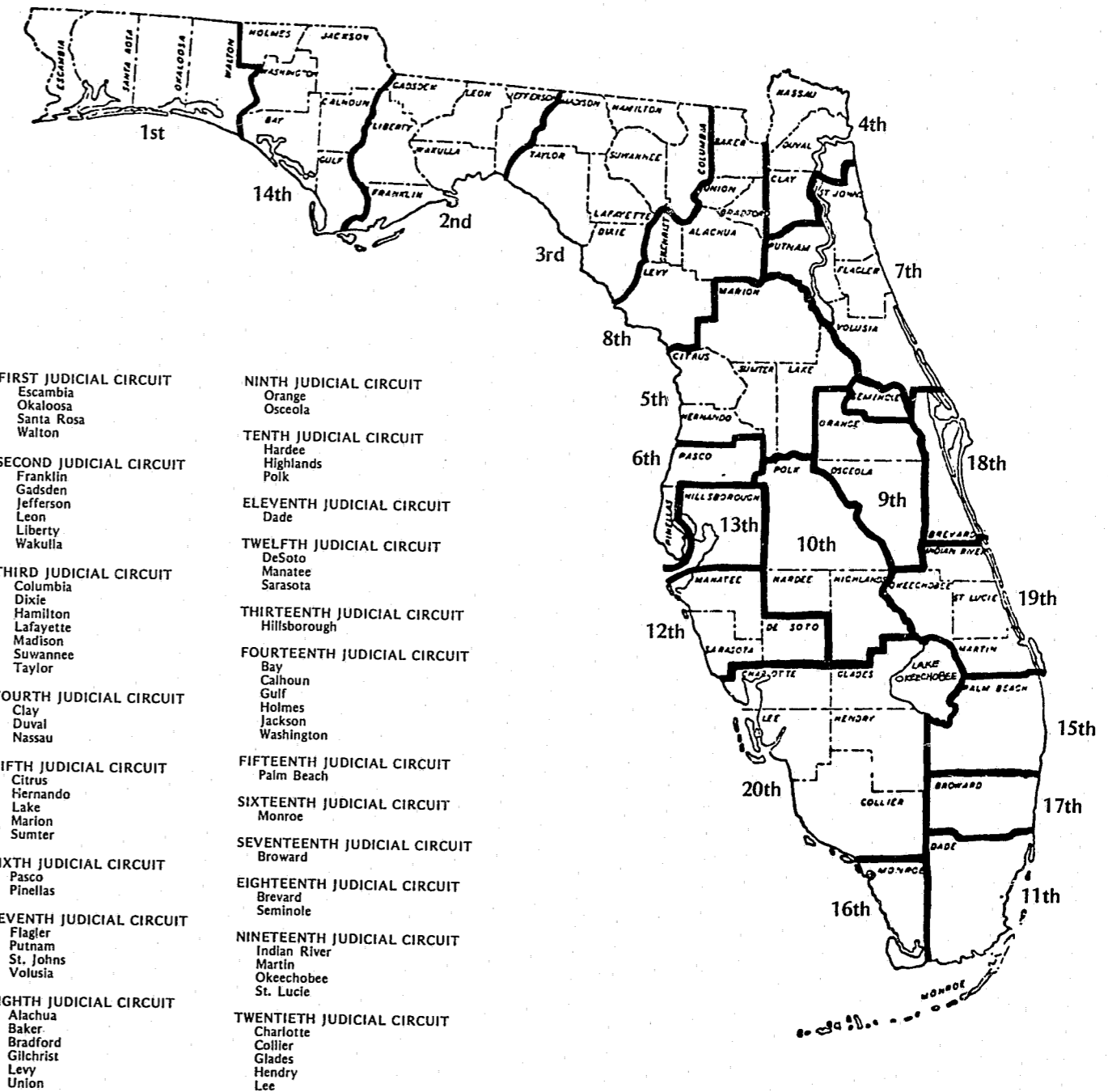

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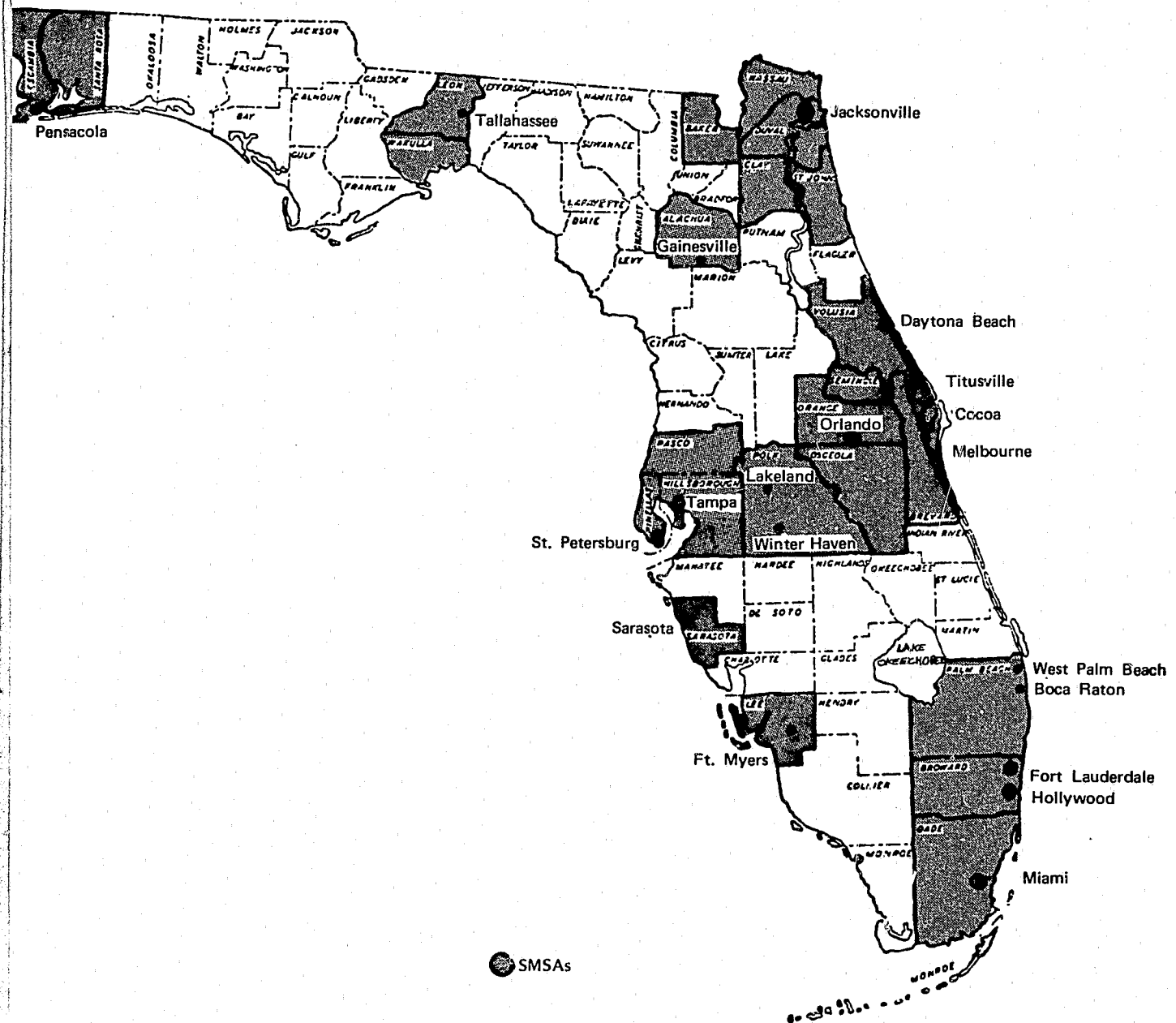

Narcotic Drug Law and Gambling Arrests

NARCOTIC DRUG LAW ARRESTS

Information concerning arrests for narcotic drug law violations is collected and analyzed in Florida according to specific drug categories and by sale or possession violations. Evaluation of arrest data reported for the year 1977 disclosed that 48.1 percent of all persons arrested for narcotic drug law violations were under the age of 21. 20.1 percent of all persons arrested for narcotic drug law violations were under age 18. A breakdown of arrests by type indicates that 86.6 percent were for possession violations and 13.4 percent were for sale. Analysis of individual drug categories (sale and possession together) showed that the highest percentage of all arrests, 76.9 percent, involved marijuana. The lowest percentage of arrests occurred in the methadone narcotics category, amounting to only 0.2 percent of the total reported narcotic arrests.

Reported arrests for narcotic drug law violations showed an overall numeric volume decrease of 528 arrests, or a 1.9 percent decrease over the year 1976.

GAMBLING ARRESTS

Arrests for gambling offenses during the year 1977 amounted to 0.6 percent of all reported arrests for Part I and Part II offenses. 90.2 percent of those persons arrested for gambling offenses were males. Persons under the age of 18 made up only 1.7 percent of all gambling arrests. The age category 25 to 29 made up 13.9 percent of all gambling arrests.

Total reported arrests for gambling offenses during the year 1977 decreased 13.1 percent over the year 1976.

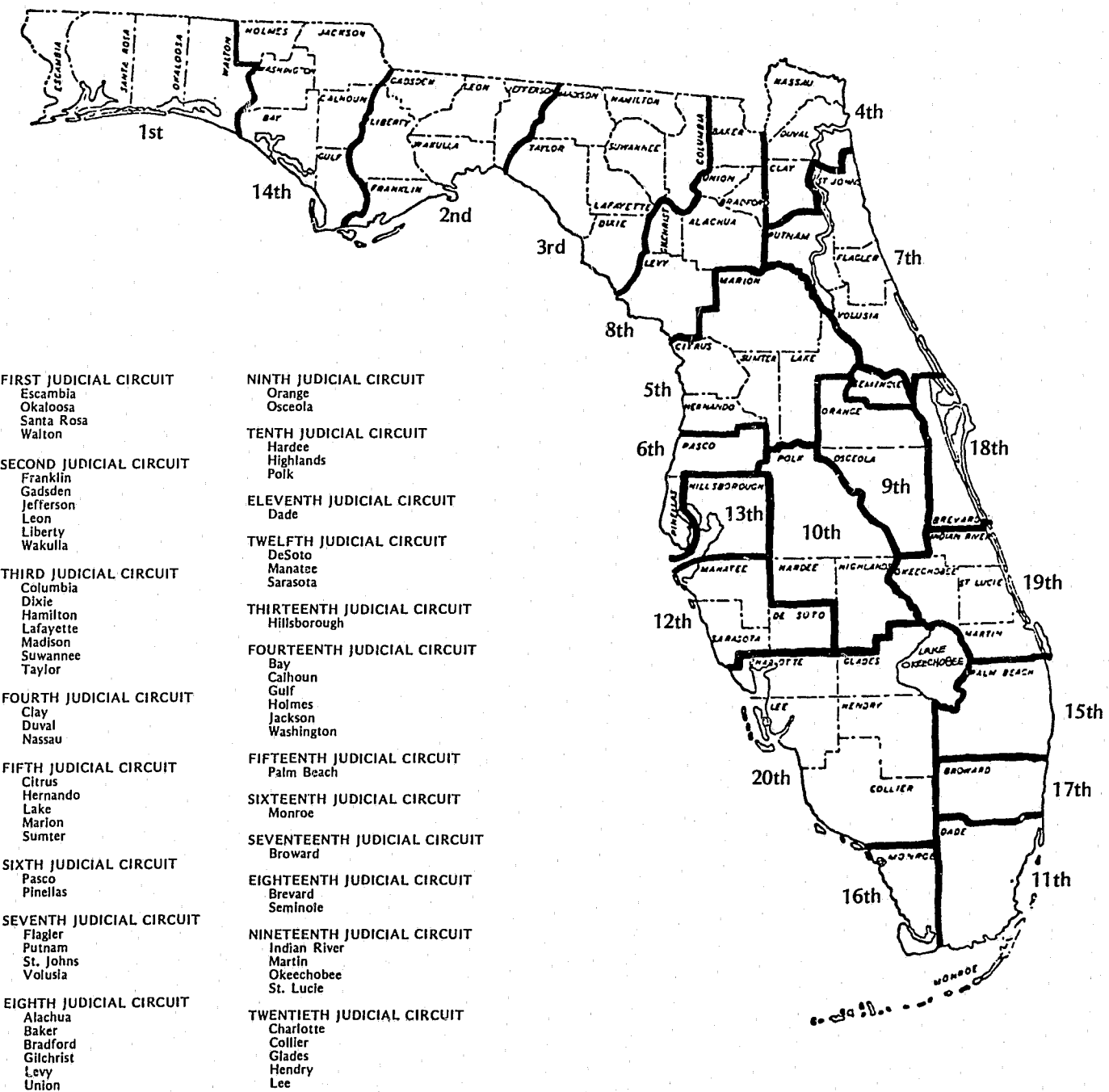

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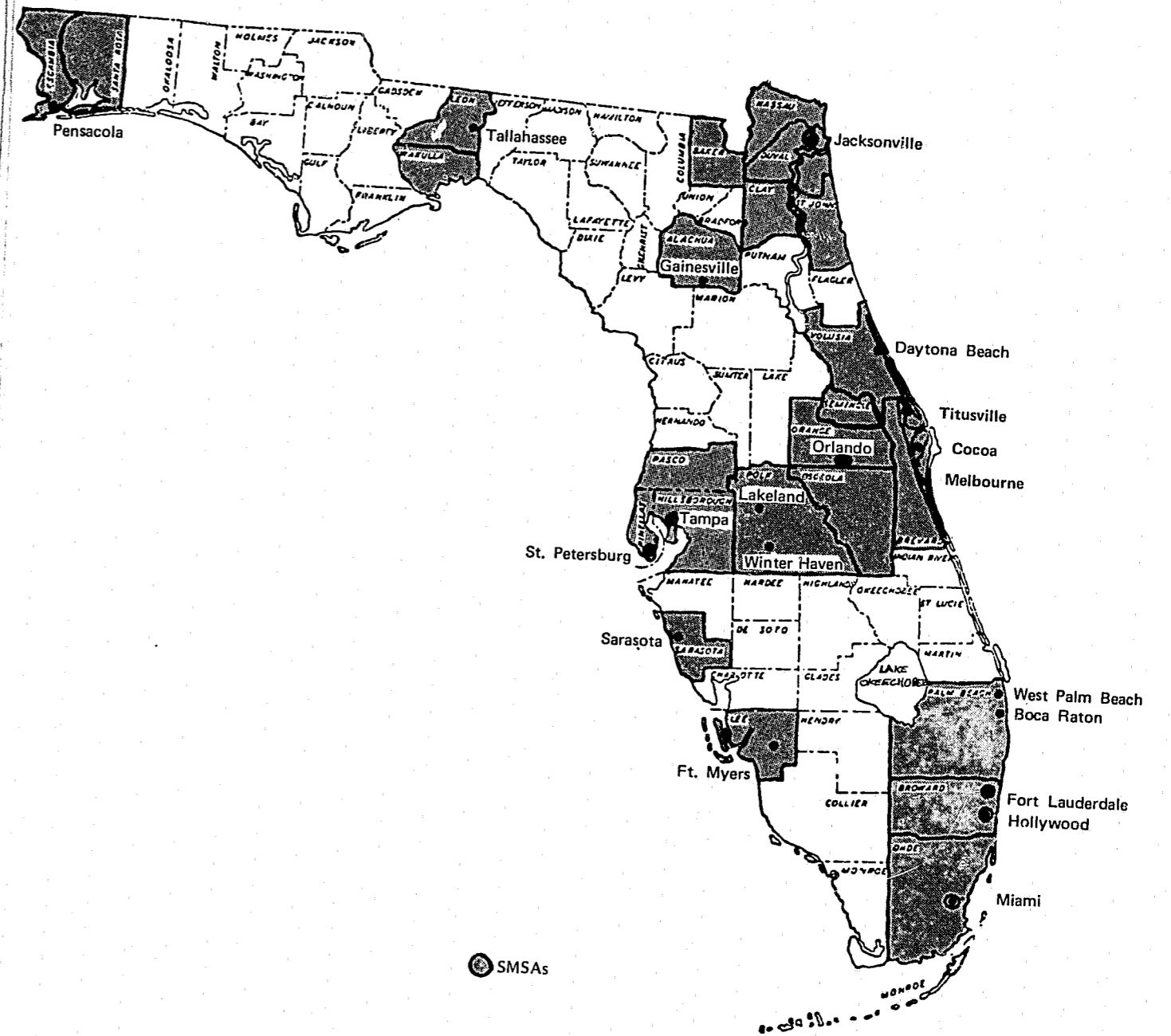

LAW ENFORCEMENT PERSONNEL KILLED OR ASSAULTED

The Florida Uniform Crime Reporting Program requires the monthly compilation of statistical information relating to law enforcement officers killed in the line of duty and the number of assaults made on law enforcement officers.

The killing or assault of a law enforcement officer is an increasingly serious problem faced by the law enforcement administrator and should be of the gravest concern to the public at large. Such acts directly affect the functioning of proper law enforcement operations and thus reduce the ability of our law enforcement agencies to combat crime and maintain law and order. It is a deplorable situation when those persons who have chosen a career in law enforcement must assume the risk of being killed or assaulted by a member of the society they have sworn to protect.

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS KILLED

Four law enforcement officers were killed in the line of duty in Florida during 1977. This was three less than were killed in 1976. From 1963 through 1977, there have been fifty-four officers killed in the line of duty in Florida. All except one of the offenses have been cleared by arrest or by exceptional means.

On July 9, 1977, a patrolman with the Carrabelle Police Department was killed with a .308 automatic rifle as he stepped from his patrol car to answer a domestic quarrel. The offender committed suicide.

On July 13, 1977, a Clearwater Police Officer was killed after he stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation. The offender attempted to flee from the scene and the officer jumped on the back of the truck. Both the officer and the offender were killed when the offender lost control of the vehicle.

On August 4, 1977, a Florida Highway Patrol Trooper was killed with a .38 caliber revolver after he stopped a suspicious vehicle for a traffic violation. The offender was apprehended, convicted and given a life imprisonment sentence.

On December 29, 1977, a Seminole County Special Deputy was killed as he walked into a drug store during a robbery attempt in Longwood. The off duty officer was picking up a prescription when he surprised the offenders and was shot by a small caliber handgun. The two offenders have not been apprehended as of this time.

Two of the officer/victims were killed from a range of less than 6 feet. One was killed from approximately thirty-five feet and one was killed in an automobile accident. Three of the deaths occurred without any type of action alerting the officers to immediate danger.

Two of the officers had less than one year of law enforcement experience. The other two officers had three years and twenty-six years of law enforcement experience. Their ages were 22, 24, 28 and 57. The offenders ages were 49, 18 and 30.

The times of occurrences were: 3:25 PM, 10:03 PM, 2:58 PM, and 5:35 PM.

ASSAULTS ON LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

The attitude of disrespect for law enforcement officials and the failure of citizens to come to the aid of the officers being attacked as they attempt to perform their lawful duties is one of the serious problems facing law enforcement today. A total of 4,365 assaults on state, county and municipal law enforcement officers in Florida were reported during the year 1977. This represents a 2.7 percent increase over the 4,251 assaults reported for the year 1976. While every assault does not result in personal injury to the officer involved, many of them did result in physical harm to the officer and loss of duty time in many cases. During 1977, 1,576 or 36.1 percent of these assaults resulted in personal injury to some extent, while 1976 showed a 35.8 percent physical injury rate.

LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEE DATA

The Florida Uniform Crime Reporting Program, in addition to collecting basic offense and arrest information, provides for the annual compilation of statistical information relating to county and municipal law enforcement employees.

Specific information concerning the number of law enforcement employees reflects that there are 24,404 full-time sworn and civilian employees as of October 31, 1977, excluding the 3,286 state law enforcement employees and campus police employees. This reflects an increase of 3.9 percent over the 23,477 reported as of October 31, 1976.

LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEE RATES

The rate of law enforcement employees per 1,000 population in any given community is influenced by a number of factors, much the same as the crime rate. Employee rates differ among agencies since, in particular, there is a wide variation in the responsibilities and level of activity within the various law enforcement agencies. The determination of law enforcement strength for a given county or municipality is based on factors such as population density, size and character of the community, geographic location, and other conditions which exist in the area generating the need for law enforcement services. The factor relative stability of population, for instance, is particularly evident in Florida, with its numerous resort areas having high mobile and seasonal populations. Obviously, the need for law enforcement services in such areas is different from that of locales with a relatively fixed population.

In 1977, the average number of full-time law enforcement employees (both police and sheriff employees), including civilian personnel, amounted to 2.8 employees for each 1,000 inhabitants of the State. This represents a slight increase over the 1976 rate. The rate based on sworn personnel only (excluding civilian employees) amounted to 2.0 per 1,000 population, which is a decrease from the 2.1 per 1,000 population in 1976. The reader is reminded that the employee rates, expressed here and within the various charts, should not be construed as representing recommended ratios for Florida law enforcement agencies. These rates do not take into account the previously mentioned factors and merely represent an average based on county and municipal totals. This rate does not include the state law enforcement or campus police employees.

COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENTS

As of October 31, 1977, there were 10,043 persons (sworn and civilian) employed full time in Florida's 66 countywide law enforcement agencies (Office of the Sheriff—Jacksonville is included in the municipal figures). Of these, 7,166 were sworn sheriffs and deputies amounting to a rate of 1.9 sworn personnel per 1,000 population, reflecting a decrease of 1.5 percent from the number of sworn officers in 1976. The 1977 civilian employees constitute a 0.8 rate of employees per 1,000 estimated population. The computation of the personnel ratios is based on the estimated population of the unincorporated areas of the counties and not on the entire county estimate. This does not include the state law enforcement or campus police employees.

In an attempt at comparisons of employment levels of individual sheriff's departments with other agencies, consideration must be given to certain functions that are peculiar to a sheriff's department. In addition to their active role in criminal matters, they may serve civil process, administer major jail facilities and furnish a bailiff staff for the courts. These functions are usually performed by sworn personnel, thereby presenting a misleading picture of the actual enforcement strength of the department.

MUNICIPAL POLICE DEPARTMENTS

Of the 14,361 full-time employees (sworn and civilian) employed by 281 municipal police departments in Florida as of October 31, 1977, 10,624 were sworn personnel. This amounts to a rate of 2.2 sworn personnel per 1,000 estimated inhabitants. The number of municipal sworn employees decreased 0.8 percent from 1976, and the rate remained the same. The 3,737 civilian employees constituted a 0.8 rate of employees per 1,000 population. This does not include the state law enforcement and campus police employees.

SEX OF LAW ENFORCEMENT EMPLOYEES

The year 1972 represented the first year that information was collected on a statewide basis concerning the sex of sworn and civilian full-time employees. Male-female breakdowns are now re-

quired on both civilian and sworn employees as well as the total law enforcement employees. As of October 31, 1977, males constituted 79.4 percent of all employees while there existed 20.6 percent full-time female employees. Of the sworn personnel, 93.8 percent were male and 6.2 percent

female employees. These sworn rates differed markedly from the staff function rates as males made up 40.7 percent of the civilian employees while 59.3 percent were females. This does not include the state law enforcement and campus police employees.

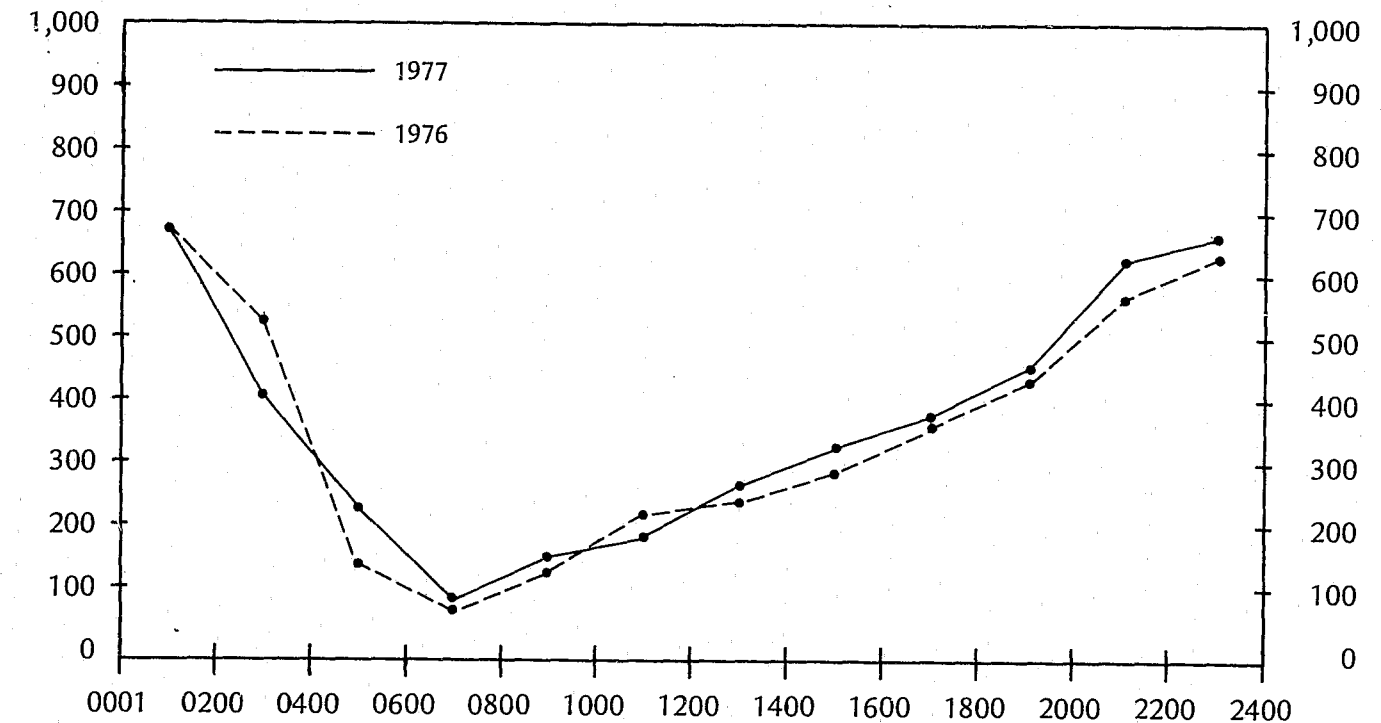

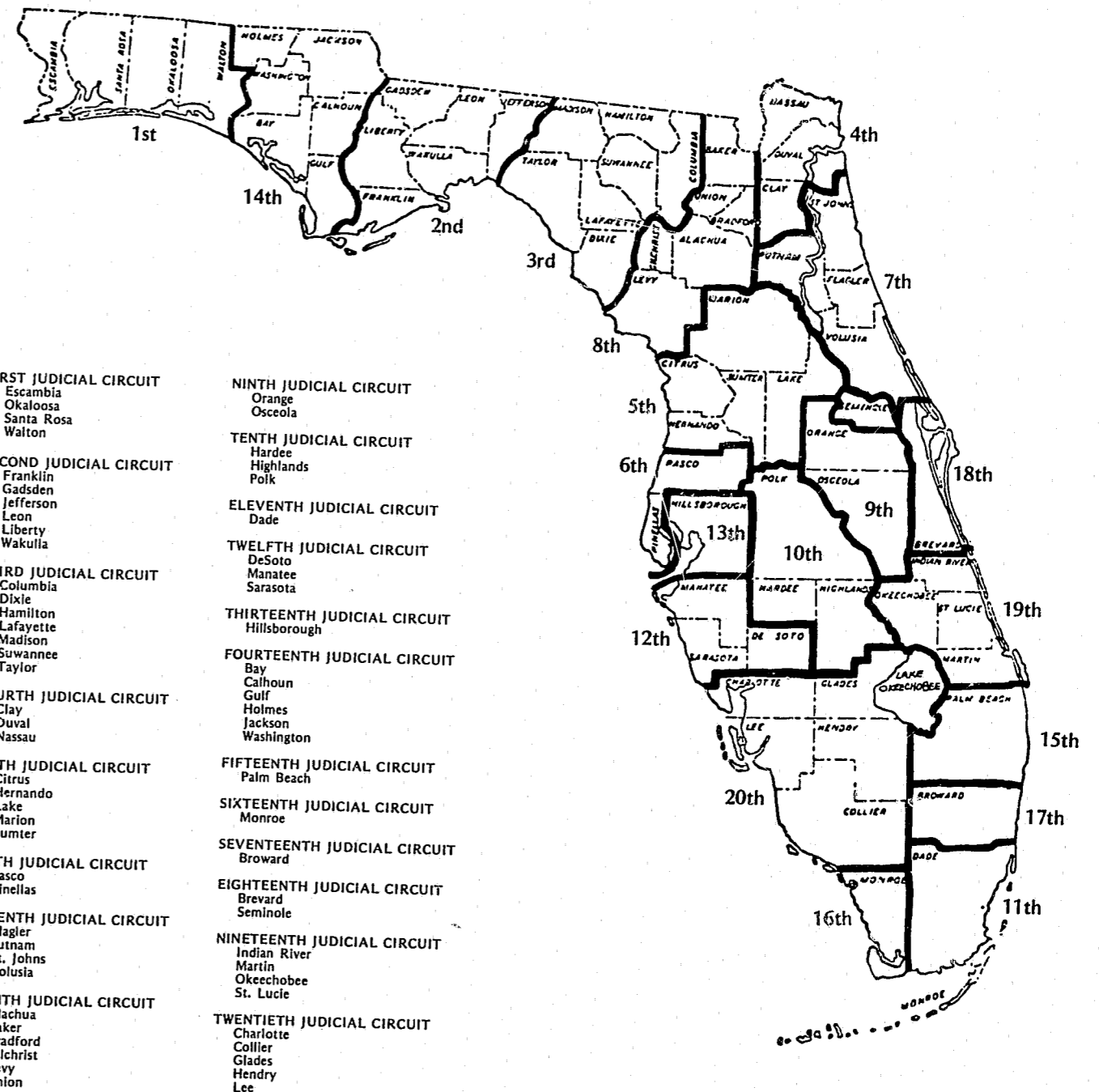

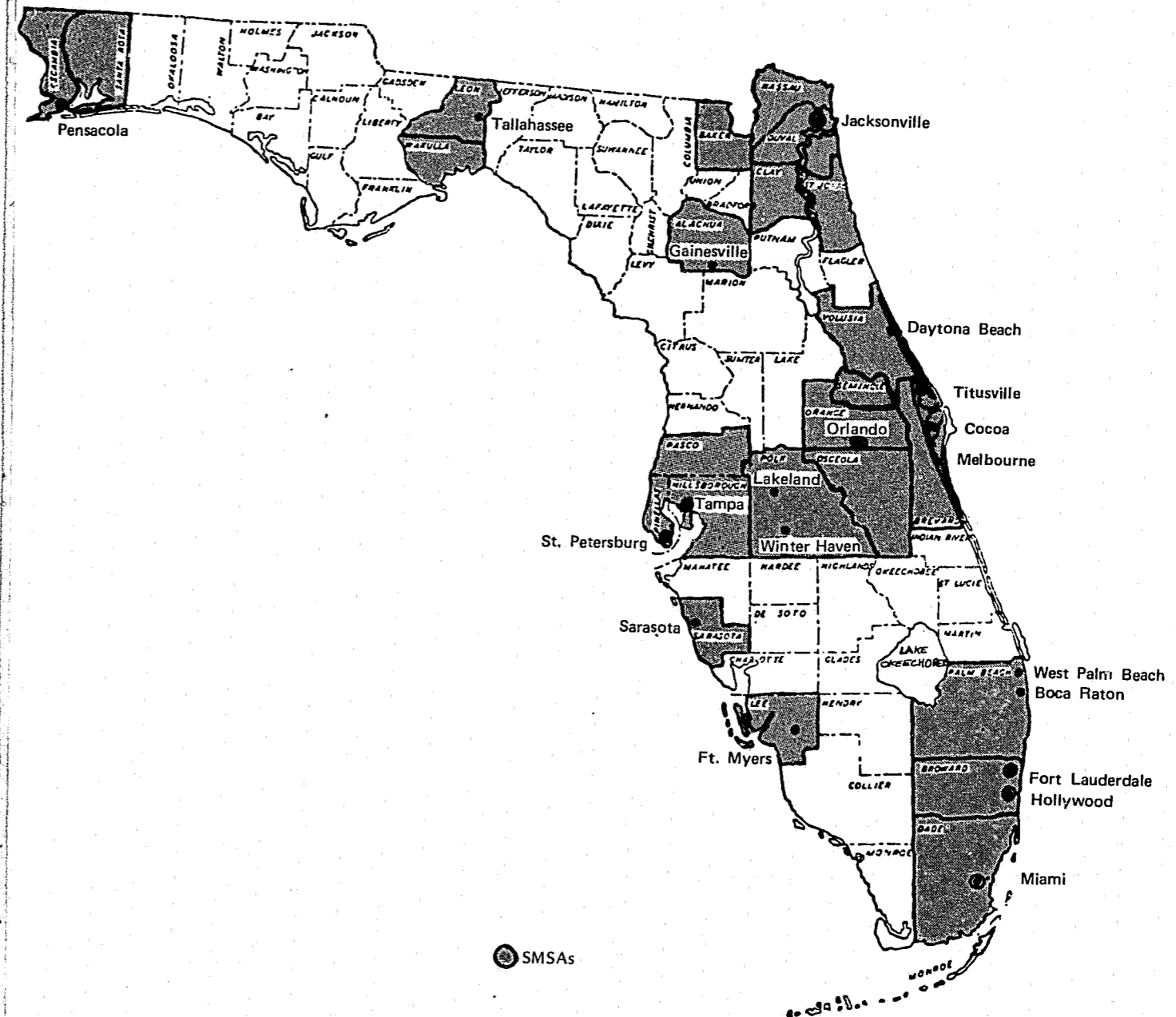

Glossary of Terms

GLOSSARY OF TERMS

ADULT—For Florida Uniform Crime Reports purposes, a person age 18 or above.

ARREST RATE—The number of arrests reported for Part I and Part II offenses for each unit of population, generally per 100,000. Arrest rates are computed in the same manner as crime rates.

CLEARED BY ARREST—For crime reporting purposes, an offense is cleared by arrest or solved when at least one person is (1) arrested, (2) charged with the commission of the offense and (3) turned over to court for prosecution.

CRIME FACTORS—Conditions which affect the amount and type of crime that occurs in a geographical area. (See page 6 for list of Crime Factors.)

CRIME INDEX—The sum total of seven major offenses used to measure the extent, fluctuation and distribution of crime in a given geographical area. Crime classifications used in the Index are: Murder, Forcible Rape, Robbery, Aggravated Assault, Breaking and Entering—Burglary, Larceny and Motor Vehicle Theft. Each of these offenses is referred to as an "Index Offense."

CRIME RATE—The number of Index Offenses reported for each unit of population, generally per 100,000. Crime rates are computed for communities with varying populations by dividing the number of Index Crimes by the population and multiplying the answer by 100,000. (Example: 500 Index Offenses—10,000 population \times 100,000 = 5,000 Crime Rate.)

EXCEPTIONAL CLEARANCE—A crime solution or clearance recorded when some element beyond law enforcement control precludes the placing of formal charges against an offender.

JUVENILE—For Florida Uniform Crime Reports purposes, a person under the age of 18.

NONRESIDENT OUT OF COUNTY, ARRESTED—An arrested person who resides within the State of Florida, but outside the county in which the arrest report is made.

NONRESIDENT OUT OF STATE, ARRESTED—An arrested person who resides outside the State of Florida, but committed crime(s) in the State of Florida.

NONVIOLENT CRIME—Consists of the Index Offenses of breaking and entering—burglary, larceny and motor vehicle theft.

PART I OFFENSES—The first of two main categories of crime classes composing a universal crime classification system established for crime reporting purposes. Part I offenses are by their nature more serious and/or occur most frequently. The tabulation of Part I offenses provides a count of "offenses known." (See page 5 for a listing of these offenses.)

PART II OFFENSES—The second of two main categories of crime classes composing a universal crime classification system established for crime reporting purposes. Part II offenses are generally less serious in nature and/or occur less frequently. Tabulations of Part II offenses are limited to arrest information only.

VIOLENT CRIME—Consists of the Index Offenses of murder, forcible rape, robbery and aggravated assault.

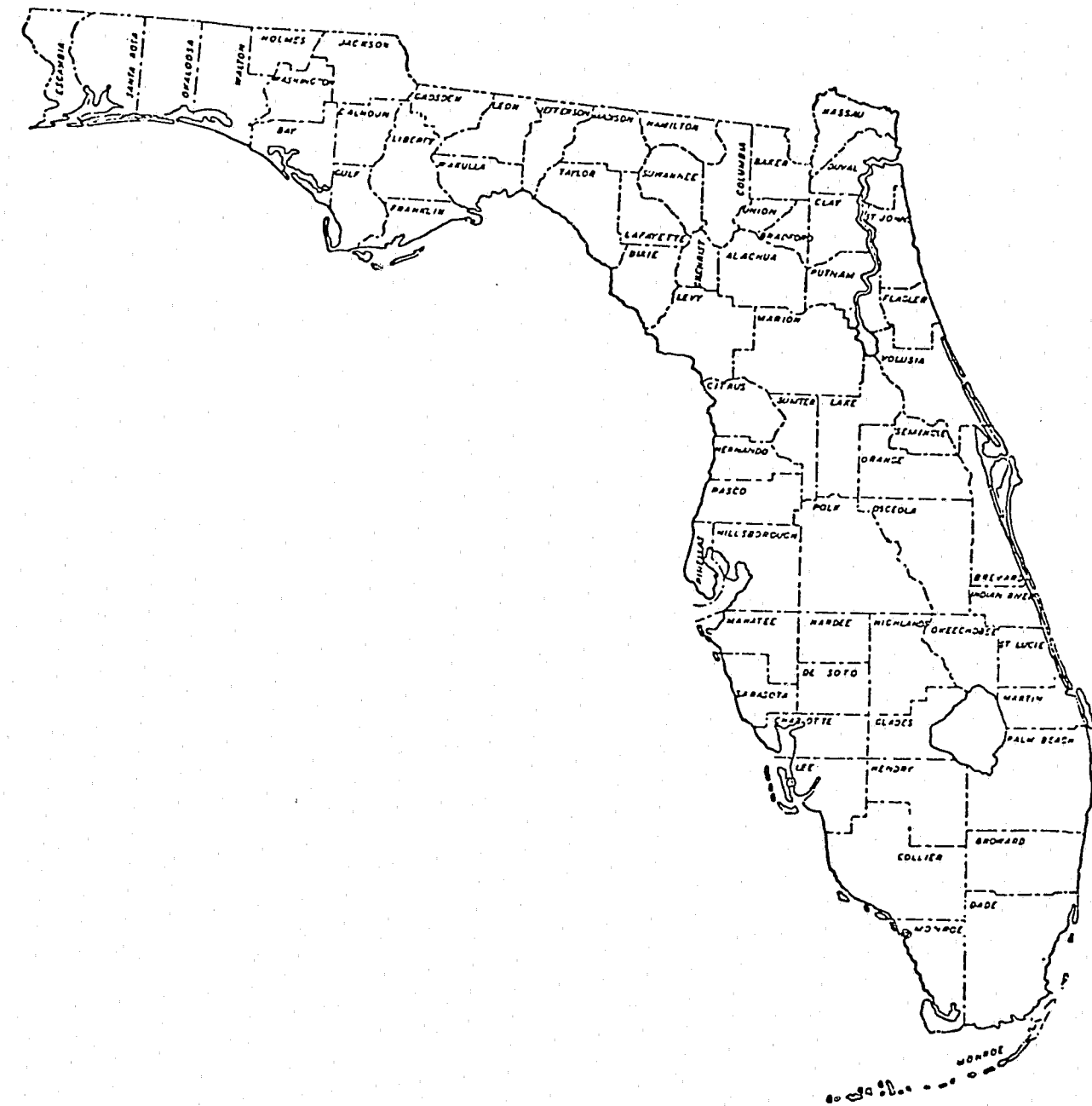
