

ABSTRACT

Recent interest in overcrowding and rising prison populations has fostered an interest in looking at trends in court commitments. While there is large annual variation, there has been no significant increase in commitments over the past ten years. Certain characteristics of the offender population have changed, however. There are proportionately more sex offenders and less drug offenders in recent years. Sentence length has increased for Walpole and Concord commitments. Level of education shifted upwards during the decade. Age at incarceration and prior incarceration history did not change.

Introduction

Recent concern about overcrowded facilities and rising prison populations has prompted a look into the recent past to see what changes have occurred in the population of offenders that might have an impact on total population. This report reviews court commitments from 1970 to 1979 to see what impact this primary source of population might have on total population.

Total population in the Massachusetts Department of Correction went through several changes from 1970 to 1979. From 1970 to 1972 the custody population was about 2400. During 1972 it dropped to 2000 and remained there until 1974. The population climbed to 2700 during 1975 and 1976. Since 1976 the population increased more slowly to 2900. Figure 1 shows these changes in population.

There are two ways that court commitments might affect prison population. First, if the number of commitments is changing this would certainly have an impact on population. Second, even if the number of commitments is stable, other characteristics of the offender population may be changing in ways that affect population. Sentencing patterns, seriousness of offense and other background characteristics may change, resulting in overall population pressures.

This report will address each of these two factors. The number of annual commitments will be analyzed for trends and compared with actual population and capacity of facilities. Certain characteristics of offenders will then be explored for trends: offense, sentence, prior incarcerations, age at commitment and education. Other factors can affect prison populations as well (parole policy, good-conduct time) but will not be addressed here.

Daniel's Test for trends will be the statistical technique used to detect significance.¹ This is a non-parametric test that is useful in detecting trends with a small number of cases (N=10). For the size of this sample a test statistic (D) of 72 or less indicates statistically significant increase at the .05 level. A test statistic (D) of 258 or more indicates a statistically significant decrease at the .05 level. In most cases proportions rather than actual numbers were rank ordered.

Total Number of Commitments

There is a large amount of annual variation in the number of court commitments to the Department of Correction. Commitments appear to be cyclical in nature; for the past ten years commitments increased for two consecutive years and then decreased for two years. There is no indication of a trend towards increasing number of commitments (D=96). Figure 2 shows changes in the total number of commitments.

There have been large variations in the number of persons committed to each of the three committing institutions. Commitments ranged from 48 to 185 at Framingham, from 286 to 603 at Concord and from 389 to 618 at Walpole. There has been no statistically significant trend in commitments at any of the committing institutions (Framingham, D=112; Concord D=160; Walpole D=100). Figure 3 shows changes in the number of commitments at each committing institution.

Offense Categories

There has been a change in the distribution of offenses of new court commitments. Over the last ten years there was a significant increase in the proportion of sex offenders, from 7 percent in 1970 to 11 percent in 1979, and a decrease in the proportion of drug offenders, from 13 percent in 1970 to 6 percent in 1979. There was no significant trend in the proportion of person, property, and other offenses. Table I shows data on offense categories of new court commitments.

The distribution of offenses changed for each committing institution. For Walpole commitments, there is presently a larger proportion sex offenders, and a smaller proportion of drug offenders than earlier in the decade. For Concord commitments, there is a larger proportion of person and sex offenders and a smaller proportion of property and drug offenders. For Framingham there was an increase in person offenders and also an increase in property offenders; with a decrease in the proportion of drug offenders. Framingham had a large decrease in the proportion of offenders in the "other" offenses category. The decriminalization of drunkenness offenses in 1972 had some impact on the distribution of offenses. In 1978 the first sex offenders were committed to Framingham.

Sentence Length

There was an increase in sentence length for both Walpole and Concord commitments during this ten year period. In 1970 the median minimum Walpole sentence was 3 to 6 years; in 1979 the median fell in the range of 6 to 10 years. In 1970 94 percent of all Concord commitments were for a maximum term of 2 to 6 years; by 1979 that category accounted for only 21 percent of all commitments with most offenders receiving maximum sentences of more than 6 years. There was a decrease in the length of sentences given to Framingham commitments. In 1970 43 percent of commitments had a sentence length of less than one year; in 1979 70 percent of Framingham commitments were in this category (see Table 3).

Prior Incarcerations

There has been little change in the number of prior incarcerations of the people received as court commitments. Annually about 45 percent are received for whom this is their first commitment of any kind. Twenty-five percent have at least one prior juvenile incarceration and 24 percent at least one prior incarceration in a state or federal facility.

There were few directional trends for any of the committing institutions in the prior correctional experience of any of the offender groups received. As would be expected Walpole receives the smallest proportion of first offenders and a larger proportion of those with prior adult correctional experience. Walpole had a decrease in the proportion of commitments received with prior state or federal incarcerations. Concord commitments showed no trends in any of these areas. Framingham commitments had a trend towards increasing proportions of offenders with prior state incarcerations.

Age at Incarceration

There was no clear change in the age of offenders being committed to the department from 1970 to 1979. There was a significant decrease in the proportion of offenders under 18 being committed and an increase in offenders in the 25 to 29 age group. Both of these trends, while statistically significant, were not large and do not show any great change in the age distribution of the population. The modal age group in every year was the 21 to 24 year old group.

After controlling for committing institution, Concord is the only institution that shows a decrease in commitments under 18 and an increase in commitments aged 25 to 29. There was no significant changes in the distribution of age groups for Walpole commitments. Framingham commitments showed a decrease in the proportion of offenders over 40 years old and an increase in the proportion of offenders in the 25 to 29 year old age group. Again while these trends in age distribution are statistically significant, the size of that change is very small.

Last Grade Completed

From 1970 to 1979 there was a shift towards more education in the population of court commitments. This is evidenced by a significant decrease in the proportion of offenders having only a grade school education and a significant increase in the proportion of offenders having a GED or high school diploma. The modal educational level remains 9 to 11. This shift in educational attainment was realized at all three committing institutions (see Tables 8 & 9).

Summary


Court commitments showed great annual variation during the period 1970 to 1979. There was no indication of any linear trend towards increasing or decreasing court commitments during this time. The number of court commitments alone can not explain changes in custody population, in particular the increase in population from 1975 to the present.

Some characteristics of the offender population may explain some of the rise in population. In particular sentencing patterns for Walpole and Concord commitments show clear trends toward longer sentences. Any further changes in sentencing practices such as mandatory sentences may have similar results on the total population. Offense may also have an impact on population. There was an increase in sex offenders and a decrease in drug offenders. If the former group are limited in their parole eligibility this will affect population.

There is no indication that the department is getting more serious offenders; that is offenders with a more extensive history of involvement with corrections. The age distribution of offenders also shows little systematic change. The changes that were noted were toward a somewhat older offender group.

Educational level increased during the past ten years. What relation this fact may have on prison populations remains to be shown. This increase is likely a reflection of a general increase in the educational attainment of the total population as well as an increased use of the G.E.D. examination.

JANUARY 1970 to DECEMBER 1979





