

TIMOTHY JOSEPH MAHONEY (1919-1978) JUDGE OF THE SUPERIOR COURT 1960-1978

Timothy Joseph Mahoney, known as Joe by those who knew him, was born in Salt Lake City, Utah on November 13, 1919, the son of Bartholomew and Josephine Mahoney, who immigrated to this country from the County of Cork, Ireland. Joe Mahoney was one of 10 children born to Bartholomew and Josephine. At the time the Mahoney's arrived in Superior, Arizona, Joe was 5 years of age.

Joe went through grammar school and high school in Superior. In 1941 he graduated with a Bachelor's Degree in Education from what is now Arizona State University. Joe taught school in Benson and Casa Grande, Arizona. Shortly after World War II began he enlisted in the United States Navy. He was wounded in action, decorated for valor in combat and discharged with the rank of Lt. Commander.

Following his military service, Joe enrolled in the University of Arizona and received his law degree in 1948. He returned to Superior and entered the private practice of law. In 1950, the then County Attorney of Pinal County, F. Preston Sult, asked Joe to come to the office with him as a Deputy County Attorney, and Joe remained as Deputy County Attorney, Chief Deputy County Attorney and County Attorney until 1960. In 1960, he was appointed Judge of the Superior Court and was re-elected without opposition every election, with his latest term expiring in 1980. He served as Presiding Judge of the Superior Court from 1965 until his unfortunate death in 1978. Joe was a deeply religious man, a devoted husband and father and truly loved his fellow man. He had an abiding faith in the goodness of children and by his own choosing, served as the County's Juvenile Court Judge. Joe was a member of various organizations, among them, the Lions Club, the Knights of Columbus and Hohokam Country Club.

Joe served his community as prosecutor and Judge for 28 years. Members of the Pinal County Bar Association showed their affection and respect for him by having a plaque mounted under his picture in the foyer of the Pinal County Courthouse which is inscribed as follows:

IN MEMORY OF THE HONORABLE T.J. MAHONEY (1919-1978)

IN REMEMBRANCE OF A WELL-LIKED AND FINE JUDGE, LAWYER, AND MOST IMPORTANTLY, A FINE MAN.

T.J. FELT IT BETTER TO DIE ON ONE'S FEET THAN TO LIVE ON HIS KNEES, AND HE TRULY LIVED THAT MOTTO.

WE ALL RECALL HIS SAYING THAT HIS COURT WAS A "COURT OF JUSTICE, NOT A COURT OF LAW."

AND IT IS THIS SPIRIT OF FAIRNESS BY WHICH WE WILL REMEMBER HIM.



INTRODUCTION

The 1978 Annual Judicial Report is the result of the cooperation and help of all the members of the Arizona judicial system. Without the assistance of all judges and their staffs, this report would not be possible. On behalf of the Arizona Supreme Court, I express my gratitude for their support in preparing this report.

This report is particularly significant because it represents the Supreme Court's first step toward a more complete caseload information system for the entire judicial branch of government in Arizona. While improvements in the reporting system are still required, this report more accurately reflects the workload of the Arizona Courts than any previously published report.

The importance of accurate caseload data cannot be over-emphasized. The monthly reports required of every court are vital to the identification of possible judicial management problems. The reports provide a mechanism by which the judicial branch can account to the public for its work and can also be helpful to the other branches of government in their policy, legislative and funding determinations.

The Arizona Supreme Court has administrative supervision over all the courts of the state and maintenance of accurate information regarding the operation of the courts statewide is absolutely necessary to the supervisory decisions that this court is called upon to make. This is true not only in the areas of judicial caseload data, but also in the areas of probation caseloads, financial resources, and court

improvement projects. It should also be stated that caseload statistics not only represent the work of judges but of entire court staffs who share in the effort to deliver judicial services to the public, a public which more and more turns to the courts for resolution of disputes.

While caseload information is extremely important, statistics alone cannot completely portray the judicial system either from the viewpoint of judges or litigants involved in the court process. On the statistical report, a jury trial involving millions of dollars which lasts for two months will appear to equate to a jury trial that takes two days to complete. The trauma of a marriage dissolution or the joy of an adoption proceeding will never be reflected in a statistical report.

The ultimate standard for the judicial process is not the number of cases disposed of, but rather the quality and impartiality of the judicial determination. That high quality, however, can be adversely affected when the judiciary lacks information about its present caseloads. Without this type of information, potential problems such as an overloaded system cannot be documented nor can the judiciary be adequately prepared to address the challenges of the future.

I wish to thank Noel K. Dessaint, Administrative Director of the Courts, William L. McDonald, Deputy Administrative Director and the Director's staff for their efforts in compiling this excellent report.

ADMINISTRATIVE DIRECTOR'S SUMMARY REPORT

The Administrative Director's Office assists the Chief Justice and the Supreme Court with their administrative responsibilities. These administrative responsibilities include preparation of state funded court budgets and financial management of funds appropriated to the Supreme Court. The office also serves as a contact point for inquiries and requests for information from the public, the courts, the Legislature and other government agencies both in and out of state.

In 1978 the Arizona Legislature passed three bills which directly impacted on the Administrative Office: State Aid to Probation Services; Foster Care Review Boards; and the establishment of continuing education for Justices of the Peace and Magistrates. These laws went into effect in September and October, 1978. To implement these programs, ten additional personnel were employed. More experience with the programs will be required to accurately assess what the proper personnel complement should be to satisfy these added responsibilities.

The caseload information system for all courts in Arizona was completely revised for 1978 and the resultant case activity statistics are contained in this report. The information system is a manual reporting system and it includes Appellate Courts, 14 Superior Courts, 84 Justice of the Peace Courts and 71 Municipal Courts. For the most part, each court manually compiles the month's activity and forwards the report each month to the Administrative Office. The reports are checked for internal accuracy. The reliability of the information reported, however, rests with the many clerks and administrative staffs who conscientiously prepare these reports. While vast improvements have been made in the reporting system, it is not as complete or as uniform as it could be. This results from the difficulty encountered in coordinating the many diverse courts in a large geographical

area like Arizona. Efforts will be continued by this office to improve the system from year to year in order to meet the Supreme Court's requirements. This report represents, however, a major step toward identification of the case activity of the Judicial Branch of Government in Arizona.

Pursuant to the Chief Justice's directive to retrieve and report caseload data for the Superior Court since statehood, judicial workload growth since 1912 is contained in this annual report for Greenlee and Graham counties. The original goal for 1978 also included a historical report for the Superior Court of Gila County. This was not possible, but the Gila Superior Court data will be included in the 1979 annual report. We also plan to include the Superior Courts of Mohave and Yavapai counties in the 1979 report.

In the last two years the Administrator's Office has experienced a significant amount of change both in function and increased workload, particularly in the areas of statistical compilation and financial responsibility. Statistical reporting has increased from approximately 100 monthly reports in 1976 to about 172 such reports in 1978 each month. The reporting format has also been significantly expanded. In 1976-77, appropriated funds administered by the Supreme Court totaled \$2,193,900. In 1978-79, the appropriated funds were \$4,248,780. The secretarial, accounting and statistical staff have handled these changes well and their performance is much appreciated.

This annual report, in addition to the case statistics, also contains information about the Judiciary which I hope will provide an understanding of the Judicial Branch of Government to all who are interested in the court system.

THE JUDICIAL BRANCH OF GOVERNMENT

"The judicial power shall be vested in an integrated judicial department consisting of a supreme court, such intermediate appellate courts as may be provided by law, a superior court, such courts inferior to the superior court as may be provided by law, and justice courts."

Arizona Constitution, Article VI, Sec. 1

THE SUPREME COURT

The Arizona Supreme Court consists of five justices. The regular term of office is six years. The Supreme Court has administrative supervision over all the courts of the state and the Chief Justice has the authority to exercise that supervision. The jurisdiction of the Court is provided in Article VI, Section 5 of the Arizona Constitution and includes appellate jurisdiction, the issuance of extraordinary writs and the power to make rules relative to all procedural matters in any court. Decisions of the Court of Appeals may be reviewed at the discretion of the Supreme Court when a litigant files a Petition for Review.

In addition to law clerks and secretarial and clerical staff, the Court appoints the Administrative Director of the Courts, the Clerk of the Supreme Court and a central staff of attorneys. All employees serve at the pleasure of the Court.

COURT OF APPEALS

The Court of Appeals consists of two divisions. Division 1, with nine judges, is located in Phoenix; and Division 2, with three judges, presides in Tucson. The Court has appellate jurisdiction to determine all matters properly appealed from the Superior Court. In criminal cases, however, where the sentence of death or life imprisonment has actually been imposed, the appeal is directly to the Arizona Supreme Court.

The geographical jurisdiction of Division 1 covers appeals from the Superior Courts in the counties of Maricopa, Yuma, Coconino, Yavapai, Mohave, Navajo and Apache. Division 1 also has statewide responsibility for reviewing decisions of the Industrial Commission.

Division 2 receives its cases from the Superior Courts in the counties of Pima, Pinal, Cochise, Santa Cruz, Greenlee, Graham and Gila.

SUPERIOR COURT

At the close of 1978, the Superior Court consisted of 76 judges sitting in 14 counties. The Superior Court is a trial court of general jurisdiction and is empowered to hear cases of equity and law which involve title to or possession of real property; civil cases where the claim for relief amounts to \$1,000 or more; felony prosecutions and misdemeanors not otherwise provided for by law; probate matters and cases involving dissolution or annulment of marriage. The Superior Court has concurrent jurisdiction with the Justice of the Peace Court over civil claims between \$500 and \$1,000.

Court commissioners may be appointed by the presiding judge of the Superior Court in counties with three or more judges to perform such duties as may be provided by law or Supreme Court rules. Commissioners usually determine matters where a default has been entered against a party and may also preside at the initial appearance of a defendant charged with a crime.

Each county has a Superior Court Clerk who is elected at the general election. The responsibilities of the Clerk's office are diversified and include the maintenance of official court case files, certification of documents, collection of fees and issuance of summonses, subpoenas and marriage licenses.

Probation departments are also operated under the supervision of the Superior Court.

JUSTICE OF THE PEACE AND MUNICIPAL COURTS

Statewide there are 84 Justices of the Peace sitting in the same number of precincts. These judges are elected at the general election by the voters in the precinct and the regular term of office is four years.

Municipal Courts are mandated by state law in each incorporated city or town. There are 71 such courts and 92 municipal judges. Municipal judges are appointed by city or town councils.

These courts have jurisdiction to hear class 1, 2 and 3 misdemeanor cases. The Justice of the Peace may also conduct preliminary examinations on felony complaints. Municipal Courts are empowered to hear matters arising out of violations of city or town ordinances. Virtually all traffic violation cases are filed in the Justice of the Peace or Municipal Courts.

The Justice of the Peace Courts also have civil jurisdiction over lawsuits involving less than \$1,000.

JUDICIAL PLANNING COMMITTEE

The Arizona Supreme Court established the State Judicial Planning Committee by court order on December 27, 1976, pursuant to the Federal Crime Control and Safe Streets Act. The purpose of the Committee is to prepare an annual or multi-year plan which addresses the needs of the judiciary and provides a guideline for the improvement of the judicial system. The Committee also reviews all grant applications for LEAA funds related to courts.

The Committee met during 1978 to establish priority goals and objectives for the court system to be included in Arizona's 1979 Comprehensive Plan for Criminal Justice. The following statement of the Committee's goals and objectives is designed to help provide direction for court improvement projects and for the expenditure of federal, state and local funds available for assistance to the judiciary.

- Goal 1: Reduce court congestion and delay.
 - Objective 1.1: Continue to improve the processing of court cases.
 - Objective 1.2: Study the effects and use of pretrial services to reduce court delay and congestion.
- Goal 2: Development of a comprehensive state plan on operation of the court system for recommendation to the Supreme Court.
- Objective 2.1: Establish a plan for improving the planning, operation, and administration of the courts on a statewide basis.
- Goal 3: Provide initial and in-service education programs for all judges and support personnel.
 - Objective 3.1: Establish a requirement that all judges attend courses on judicial education.
 - Objective 3.2: Provide for initial, comprehensive training and orientation programs for all new judges of every court.
 - Objective 3.3: Provide for periodic continuing judicial education programs for all judges of every court.
 - Objective 3.4: Provide in-service training and education for increasing the level of professional excellence of all supporting court personnel.
 - Objective 3.5: Obtain expertise to instruct in an Arizona training environment.

- Objective 3.6: Encourage programs at the Arizona institutions of higher learning.
- Objective 3.7: Establish a formal training program for all levels of the judiciary to be coordinated and administered by the Arizona Supreme Court.
- Goal 4: Seek the consolidation of justice of the peace and city magistrate courts in a court of record.
 - Objective 4.1: Encourage the legislature to consolidate these courts with substantially increased civil and criminal jurisdiction by legislative action and by Constitutional referendum to the people, and encourage passage of such referendum.
 - Objective 4.2: Promote flexibility for the management and administration of the court and its supporting personnel, including probation services, in such legislation.
- Goal 5: Extend needed support services to courts of limited jurisdiction from the courts of general jurisdiction.
 - Objective 5.1: Develop methods and procedures as well as obtaining resources for extending probation services and services for perfecting and reproducing the record to courts of limited jurisdiction.
 - Objective 5.2: Develop uniform forms, methods and procedures for application in the courts of limited jurisdiction.

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- Goal 6: Improve the organizational and legal structure of the court system.
 - Objective 6.1: Study, develop and implement programs, legislation and court rules for court structure improvement and alternatives to court jurisdiction.
- Objective 6.2: Develop methods for re-aligning staff for increased efficiency.
- Goal 7: Improve the operation of the appellate and trial courts through innovative applied technology for case processing and management.
 - Objective 7.1: Utilize data processing techniques for the transcription of court proceedings.
 - Objective 7.2: Utilize video techniques to court processes.
 - Objective 7.3: Obtain necessary office equipment for efficient clerical work.

- Objective 7.4: Apply data processing techniques for calendar, court management, and legal research.
- Goal 8: Construction and improvement of needed court facilities.
 - Objective 8.1: Construction of new court facilities.
 - Objective 8.2: Renovation of existing court facilities.
- Goal 9: Improvement of juvenile court case processing.
 - Objective 9.1: Develop alternatives for processing status and delinquent offenders in the juvenile court.
 - Objective 9.2: Provide additional support personnel and facilities for expanded juvenile court services.

Many of the above-stated goals will continue to have priority ranking from year to year. The Planning Committee expects in 1979 to become more actively involved in surveying and analyzing the needs and problems of all of the courts in the state. The results of this effort will greatly influence the development of future judicial plans prepared by the Committee.

JUDICIAL EDUCATION

"Judges should maintain and improve their professional competence through continuing professional education. Court systems should operate or support judges' participation in training and education, including programs of orientation for new judges and refresher education for experienced judges in developments in the law and in technique in judicial and administrative functions..."

Standards for Court Organization, 1.25, American Bar Association.

Continuing judicial education for Arizona judges at all levels is a goal supported by the Supreme Court. It is also an established priority of the Arizona State Judicial Planning Committee. Professional excellence in the administration of justice is greatly aided when judges have available to them educational seminars and conferences which enhance their expertise and help keep them abreast of current developments in the law.

The 1978 Annual Judicial Conference for Superior Court and Appellate Court Judges was devoted to the following topics:

- 1. Sentencing under the new criminal code which became effective October 1, 1978.
- 2. Juvenile court procedures.
- 3. Appellate impact decisions.
- 4. Television in the courtroom.
- 5. State financing of courts.
- 6. American Bar Association standards on judicial discipline and the operation of the Arizona Commission on Judicial Qualifications.

The 1978 Annual Conference for Justices of the Peace and Municipal Judges was devoted entirely to instruction regarding the new criminal code.

The Southwestern Judicial Conference was also hosted by the Arizona Supreme Court in April, 1978. This conference is attended by appellate and general jurisdiction judges from Arizona, Nevada, Utah and New Mexico. The location of the conference rotates among the four states. The National Judicial College located in Reno, Nevada, participated in the formation of the program and selection of faculty. The conference focused on new trends in criminal law, judicial liability and immunity, professional malpractice cases, jury-witness utilization and management and appellate advocacy.

In addition to the annual conferences, the Supreme Court utilized educational funds for judges to attend State Bar continuing education programs, national sponsored programs, a special two-day seminar on the new criminal code and three evidence seminars held for Justices of the Peace and Municipal Judges.

The Supreme Court also devoted a portion of its LEAA grant in 1978 to assist judges at every level with the education costs associated with attending national programs.

The Legislature in 1978 passed a law which became effective on October 1, 1978 regarding judicial education for Justices of the Peace and Municipal Court judges in the courts of limited jurisdiction. A.R.S. §12-112 provides:

"The supreme court shall establish a program of continuing education for justices of the peace and magistrates. The program shall include such courses of study as the supreme court deems necessary or desirable."

The Legislature appropriated \$100,000 to the Supreme Court for this educational effort. The Supreme Court will add to its administrative staff a full-time person to organize and hold in-state educational programs and to coordinate the financial assistance necessary to enable judges to attend nationally sponsored schools and seminars.

The Arizona Supreme Court is appreciative of the Legislature's recognition of the need for continuing education, particularly for the many non-lawyer judges in the state who serve in the courts of limited jurisdiction.

FOSTER CARE REVIEW BOARDS

Unique legislation was enacted in 1978 establishing a foster care review board system under the administrative supervision of the Supreme Court (A.R.O. §§8-515.01 to 8-519). The law requires that each presiding juvenile court judge appoint local citizen review boards on the basis of one board for each 100 children or fraction thereof in foster care in each county.

The local boards will review the case of each child adjudicated dependent and in foster care for six months or more and subsequent reviews will be held at least every six months thereafter. Existing law was also amended to require the Department of Economic Security or appropriate child welfare agency to prepare a plan for the permanent placement of a child prior to such initial placement in a regular or special foster home. This plan must be filed with the juvenile court. The responsibilities of the local review boards are:

 Review at least once every six months the case of each dependent foster child who has resided in foster care for a period of more than six months to determine what efforts have been made by the Department of Economic Security (division) and the agency with whom the child has been placed to carry out the plan for the permanent placement.

- 2. Submit to the Juvenile Court the Board's recommendations and findings regarding the efforts and progress made to carry out the placement plan together with any other recommendations it chooses to make regarding the child.
- 3. Encourage and facilitate the timely return of all dependent foster children to their natural parents or, if the Board finds that grounds exist, encourage the appropriate agency to initiate such procedures as would make the child eligible for adoption, followed by a maximum effort by the agency to place the child for adoption.
- 4. Encourage the division and all agencies involved in placing children in foster care to exert all possible efforts to make arrangements for long-term foster care for children for whom return to natural parents or adoption is determined to be unfeasible or impossible.

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- 5. Promote and encourage the division and all agencies involved in foster-care to maximize stability and family continuity for children in foster care by discouraging unnecessary changes in the placement of foster children and by recruiting foster parents who may be suitable and eligible as adoptive parents.
- Assist the division and agencies in informing natural parents, foster parents and other interested parties of their rights and responsibilities with respect to any dependent child in foster care.

7. Attend training programs.

The recommendations of review boards are advisory only. The juvenile court judge maintains responsibility for judicial determinations regarding each child.

In addition to the local review boards, one state review board will be appointed composed of five members appointed by the Supreme Court along with local review board chairmen. In the counties where there are multiple boards, the juvenile court judge will appoint one local chairman for each three boards. The State board shall review and coordinate the activities of the local boards and make recommendations to the Supreme Court, the Governor and the Legislature each year regarding foster care statutes, policies and procedures.

All board appointments are required to be made by early March, 1979. Because of an estimated 2,500 to 3,000 dependent children in foster care, 30 local boards with five members each will be appointed. With 12 boards in Maricopa County, 5 boards in Pima County, 2 boards in Pinal County and 1 board in each of the other counties, there will be a total of 150 local board members and 23 state board members. Review board members are volunteers and do not receive compensation. They are entitled to reimbursement for mileage and subsistence.

With this legislation, \$170,380 was appropriated to the Supreme Court to implement the system. These funds did not become available until September 4, 1978. Responsibility for general supervision of the program and administration of the funds were assigned to the Administrative Director of the Courts.

The latter months of 1978 were devoted primarily to the tasks of selecting Supreme Court staff to assist in the administration of the program, securing office facilities and equipment, developing initial administrative procedures, coordinating functions with the juvenile courts and the Department of Economic Security whose cooperation is vital to the successful accomplishment of the Legislature's goals as set forth in the law. The effort involved in coordinating the court system and the child welfare system on a statewide basis for the purposes of foster care review has been and will continue in 1979 to be a rather monumental assignment.

David K. Byers was selected as the review board coordinator who, under the supervision of the Administrative Director, will manage the review board system on a day-to-day basis. In addition, five staff assistants and clerical personnel were authorized and included in the Legislature's initial appropriation for this program. The Supreme Court's foster care review board office is located at 1812 W. Monroe, Suite 201 in Phoenix. Additional office facilities for 1979 have been donated by the Pima County Juvenile Court Center in Tucson for one staff assistant.

It is anticipated that the early months of 1979 will be devoted to the identification of children to be reviewed, training of board members and the commencement of actual board reviews. Since this program involves 30 boards and approximately 3,000 children all over the state, it has already become evident that additional staff will be necessary for the Supreme Court to successfully carry out the legislative mandates. Additional funds will be requested from the Legislature for fiscal year 1979-80. After a full year of operation and actual experience with the program a firm assessment can then be made as to the financial support necessary to administer the foster care review board program.

One early tangible benefit of the system has been the establishment of one statewide reporting format that serves as the case narrative, placement plan, review documents and court report. This should eliminate duplication of four other reports and enable the Department of Economic Security to gather consistent information statewide on adjuditionated dependent children in foster care.

STATE AID FOR PROBATION SERVICES

Arizona Revised Statutes \$12-261 through \$12-266, enacted by the Legislature, became effective on October 1, 1978. These new laws established a program of state financial aid for the probation departments of the Superior Courts in each county. The sum of \$350,000 was appropriated to the Supreme Court for distribution to those Superior Courts wishing to participate in the program during its initial year of existence. The program at the state level is coordinated through the Supreme Court's administrative office under the supervision of the Administrative Director and a portion of the appropriation was designated for administration.

Each participating county is entitled to a base amount of \$10,000, with the remainder distributed pursuant to the percentage of population in each of the participating counties. The funds must be used for probation supervision of first-time adult felony offenders and first-time juveniles adjudicated delinquent of an offense that would be a felony if committed by an adult.

The Supreme Court was required to formulate guidelines for the administration of the program. All

plans of the probation departments for use of the funds must be submitted to and approved by the Supreme Court.

Nine probation departments are participating in the state aid program and are eligible to receive the following sums of money for the supervision of firsttime offenders:

The last three months of 1978 were devoted primarily to the formulation of the local probation plans and the establishment of the initial administrative procedures necessary for the distribution of funds. The availability of these funds will assist probation departments in expanding their probation services.

FAMILY COUNSELING PROGRAMS

State law provides for the establishment of, and financial assistance for, family counseling programs in the juvenile divisions of the Superior Court (A.R.S. §§8-261 to 8-265). Family counseling services are utilized by the various juvenile courts to strengthen family relationships and to prevent delinquent or incorrigible behavior.

State funds appropriated to the Supreme Court are distributed each year to the various juvenile courts. Each court is entitled to a base amount of \$5,000 and the remainder is allocated according to the juvenile population in each county.

The total appropriation in recent years has been \$250,000 which has been allocated to each county as follows:

MEDICAL LIABILITY REVIEW PANELS

Pursuant to A.R.S. §12-567, medical liability review panels are appointed by the presiding judge of the Superior Court to review lawsuits alleging medical malpractice. The panels consist of one Superior Court judge who serves as chairman, one attorney and one physician. The panel determines whether the evidence presented to supports a finding in favor of the plaintiff or dant, but regardless of the determination either party may proceed with litigation.

The Supreme Court administers the state funds appropriated to it for the purpose of reimbursing counties for the expense and compensation of the panel members other than the chairman. In fiscal year 1977-78, \$7,004 was expended for the medical liability review panels. For that period, the expenditures covered fifty-four panels appointed to review medical malpractice cases: 27 in Maricopa County, 26 in Pima County and 1 in Santa Cruz County.

STATE GRAND JURY

The impanelment of state grand juries is authorized by state law upon the written application of the Attorney General to the Chief Justice of the Arizona Supreme Court. The presentation of evidence to the state grand jury is made by the Attorney General or his designee and that office is responsible for the prosecution of indictments returned by the grand jury.

The Supreme Court is charged by law with the responsibility of reimbursing counties for the costs and expenses of the grand jury and for the costs and expenses incurred by a county arising out of the prosecution and trial of state grand jury indictments. During 1977-78 reimbursements totaled \$203,335.

COURT PROJECTS

PIMA COUNTY - PRE-TRIAL RELEASE

Pima County Superior Court through the assistance and support of the Arizona Supreme Court received a grant of \$248,000 from the Law Enforcement Assistance Administration. The grant entitled the **Pima County Central Intake and Pretrial Detainee Program** represents an eighteen-month project which started on November 1, 1978.

The thrust of the program is to reduce overcrowding in the Pima County Jail. The goals of the project are:

- 1. To minimize the use of pretrial detention by providing comprehensive pretrial screening immediately following arrest and booking;
- 2. To reduce jail overcrowding by providing extensive evaluations on those defendants remaining in pretrial detention for the purpose of determining whether supportive services, community resource programs, and a supervised program of release could be established as a substantive alternative to long term pretrial custody; and
- 3. To reduce the incidence of failure to appear

and pretrial crime by providing comprehensive defendant contact and notification services for all defendants released pending trial or sentencing.

The principal results to be achieved by the project are:

- Reduce jail overcrowding and certain associated costs;
- 2. Reduce pretrial detainee custody time;
- 3. Increase alternatives to incarceration in appropriate cases;
- Establish active judicial concerns for jail population levels;
- 5. Improve inmate living conditions by reducing jail population;
- 6. Establish standards and criteria for pretrial release; and
- 7. Assist the courts by providing release information concerning defendants and by maintaining contact with defendants regarding their court appearance dates.

TUCSON CITY COURT - RECORDED PROCEEDINGS

The Tucson City Court is not a court of record. Consequently, all defendants can appeal a decision of the City Court to the Pima County Superior Court and automatically receive a new trial (trial de novo).

Under A.R.S. §22-374 and Supreme Court rules, however, elimination of a trial de novo is possible when a record is made of the proceedings of the trial in the City Court or Justice of the Peace Court and a transcript of such proceedings is available for review by the Superior Court.

In 1978 the Tucson City Court received a Law Enforcement Assistance Administration grant for \$10,925 to purchase a tape recording system for recording trials. The Court installed the system in all five courtrooms.

The project had the following objectives:

- 1. To reduce the number of appeals filed in the Pima County Superior Court for cases which have been first tried in the Tucson City Court;
- 2. To reduce expenditures and time involved in the trial de novo appeal process; and
- 3. To improve the administration of the criminal justice system in the City of Tucson and Pima County.

On June 26, 1978, the Court began recording all trials, including evidentiary and dispositional hearings relating to probation revocations. Noteworthy in the success of this project was the equipment's simplicity of operation and accuracy of recording. As a result, the Court was able to obtain good transcriptions with a minimum of effort and delay.

MARICOPA COUNTY SUPERIOR COURT CIVIL TRIAL DELAY REDUCTION PROJECT

The National Center for State Courts in cooperation with the National Conference of Metropolitan Courts completed in 1978 the first phase of a nation-wide project examining pretrial delay in major metropolitan trial courts. In regard to civil cases, the National Center researched tort cases in twenty-one trial courts across the country including the Superior Court of Maricopa County. Based on the National Center's statistical sampling, the Maricopa County Superior Court ranked third in the median number of days from filing of the complaint to the date the case

was closed, without regard to the method of disposition — 308 days. It ranked sixth in the median number of days from the filing of the complaint to the commencement of jury trial — 607 days. By way of comparison, trial courts surveyed in other states showed the following: median number of days for termination of tort cases without regard to the method of disposition — 811 days; median number of days from filing of the complaint to jury trial — 1,231 days.

In the second phase of the National Center's project to test techniques and procedures for improving civil case processing, the Superior Court of Maricopa County has agreed to participate along with seven other major metropolitan courts in the country in an experiment aimed at reducing trial court delay in civil cases. The project is expected to last for approximately one year and will commence in early 1979. This Civil Delay Reduction Project which has been approved by the Supreme Court will implement a civil case management system in four experimental divisions of the Superior Court. The objectives of the case management system are:

- 1. To reduce the total case processing time of civil cases in the Superior Court.
- 2. To provide more intensive court management of civil cases.
- 3. To set reduced time parameters on certain stages of civil case processing.
- 4. To provide a firm trial date after the filing of a certificate of readiness.

To achieve these objectives in the four experimental divisions, the certificate of readiness must be filed within nine months from the filing of the complaint instead of twelve months; a firm trial date will be set within 90 days from the filing of the certificate of readiness; continuance of the trial date will not be readily granted; and in most cases when a continuance is granted it will only be for a maximum of 30 days.

The plan for this project was developed during 1978 with staff from the National Center for State Courts along with a committee of judges, lawyers and administrators appointed by Judge Robert C. Broomfield, the presiding judge of the Maricopa County Superior Court. In addition to this project, the committee will also serve to offer other suggestions and proposals for consideration to improve the administration of justice in the Superior Court.

COMMISSION ON JUDICIAL QUALIFICATIONS

The Arizona Commission on Judicial Qualifications was established in 1970 to review and investigate, when indicated, complaints against Justices of the Peace, Superior Court Judges and Appellate Judges. The Commission has no disciplinary jurisdiction over city court judges.

Any litigant aggrieved by a judge's legal ruling or decision must pursue whatever normal appeal rights may be available to correct the alleged legal error. The Commission cannot be used as a substitute for the appellate process.

The Commission is empowered to investigate the following matters only:

- 1. The disability of a judge that seriously interferes with the performance of his duties and is or is likely to become permanent.
- 2. Action by a judge that constitutes wilful misconduct in office.
- 3. Action by a judge that constitutes a wilful and persistent failure to perform his duties.
- 4. Action by a judge that constitutes habitual intemperance.
- 5. Conduct by a judge that is prejudicial to the administration of justice that brings the judicial office into disrepute.

The Commission does not have the authority to remove a judge from office. It can recommend to the Supreme Court that such action be taken after holding a formal evidentiary hearing for the purpose of making findings of fact and formulating its recommendation. The activities of the Commission are confidential until such time as formal recommendations are filed with the Clerk of the Supreme Court.

In the past, preliminary investigations have been conducted by members of the Commission. The Commission has no staff to assist it. Since the Commission members are judges, lawyers and nonlawyers with other occupations, action taken on a complaint may be postponed until the initial investigation can be completed. The Commission has, however, requested that the Arizona Legislature increase its budget in fiscal year 1979-80 from \$10,000 to \$15,000 for the purpose of hiring investigators on a case-by-case basis in order to speed up the current process.

Because the Commission has no staff, the Administrative Director of the Courts serves in the capacity of Executive Secretary to the Commission. The Administrative Director performs the following functions:

- 1. Provides information on the Commission to persons who may wish to file a complaint.
- 2. Receives written complaints for distribution to Commission members.
- 3. Maintains the files of the Commission.
- 4. Administers the Commission's budget.

During 1978, 25 informational packets were distributed to persons contemplating the filing of a complaint against a judge. The Commission received 10 complaints. At the close of 1978, the Commission had 6 matters still under review.

ARIZONA JUDICIAL EXPENDITURES

The table and charts below reflect the state, county and local government expenditures made in 1977-78 to support the Arizona Judiciary. The figures do not include federal fund expenditures and are not assumed to be the total operating costs of the courts, as in some cases certain overhead, administrative and indirect costs are absorbed by the state, county and/or local governments. Such costs might include: building space, utilities, pooled clerical support, etc.


The State of Arizona and local governments each provided for approximately 10% of the cost of operating Arizona's courts in 1977-78, while approximately 80% of the cost was borne by the counties. Superior Court expenditures accounted for the largest share of the Judiciary's outlays (73.2%). The lower courts, Justices of the Peace courts and municipal courts accounted for 19.9% of total expenditures, while the Appellate Courts and other state judicial activities represented 6.9% of the total funds expended.

STATE FUNDED JUDICIAL EXPENDITURES

State expenditures to support the Arizona Judiciary are limited to the Supreme Court, Court of Appeals, Superior Court, Commission on Judicial Qualifications and Commission on Appellate and Trial Court Appointments. State funding of Superior Court expenditures is limited to the payment of one-half of the regular judges' salaries and one-half of the salaries for retired judges and judges pro-tempore.

State judicial expenditure data is presented in the table below for the fiscal years 1976-77 and 1977-78. Expenditures to operate the Arizona Judiciary increased in 1977-78. Overall, however, state judicial expenditures still represent a minute share of state government expenditures, accounting for slightly more than half a cent of the state tax dollar expended in 1977-78. Based on average statewide population figures, state judicial expenditures resulted in \$1.85 per capita tax cost in 1977-78.

CASELOAD STATISTICS

INTRODUCTION

On January 1, 1978 revised statistical reporting forms were implemented at all levels of Arizona's courts to hopefully provide more detailed caseload statistics as well as establish uniformity in the manner caseload data are reported. In working with the revised monthly statistical reports being submitted, it would appear that major progress has been made in achieving the above-stated objectives.

The statistical data presented in the following sections are taken from the monthly statistical reports submitted by each court in the state to the Arizona Supreme Court. Recognition is due the staffs of these courts who are responsible for completing the reports. Obviously, more time is now required to complete the revised reporting forms; however, the additional statistical information being generated and the uniformity in reporting that has occurred are results that make the additional effort worthwhile.

Significant changes in the statistical data reported for 1978 include:

- Inclusion of beginning and ending 1978 pending caseloads for virtually all courts;
- Aging of some pending caseloads for Superior, Justice and Municipal courts;
- Expanded statistical reporting for Superior Court and Justice Court caseload data; and
- Reporting of Municipal Court statistics for the first time.

In late 1977 the Supreme Court ordered every court in the state to conduct an inventory of their pending caseloads as of the end of 1977. Based on this effort and the revised statistical reporting forms implemented in 1978, the pending caseload figures

contained in the following sections are considered quite accurate.

Appellate Court statistical data are presented on pages 17 through 28 of this report. These statistics are presented in much the same format as before, as only minor revisions were made to the appellate reporting forms.

Superior Court caseload data are included on pages 29 through 65. The reporting format for these statistics has been completely revamped to allow for the reporting of additional statistical information now being collected. Some definitions of statistical categories have been incorporated into the narrative part of the Superior Court statistical section.

Justice of the Peace caseload statistics on a precinct-by-precinct basis may be found on pages 66 through 112. Statistical reporting for these courts has been greatly expanded as a result of the revised monthly statistical reports. Some statistical category definitions have been included for a better understanding of the data being reported.

Municipal Court statistics are reported for the first time in this report on pages 113 through 135. Prior to 1978 Municipal Courts were not required to submit statistical reports to the Supreme Court. Again, some definitions of statistical categories have been included to facilitate a better understanding of the data presented.

These general notes are intended only as an overview of the overall caseload data presented in the following sections. Particular attention should be paid to the narrative comments at the beginning of each section and the footnotes applicable to various statistics.

SUPREME COURT STATISTICS

As in prior years, the Supreme Court disposed of more cases than were filed in 1978 (1,016 filings, 1,123 terminations). This result was offset, however. by the fact that the Court transferred to itself 163 cases from the Court of Appeals. These transfers resulted in an increase of 48 cases in the Supreme Court's ending pending caseload for 1978. Over the past four years the Court has transferred an average of 120 cases per year to itself from the Court of Appeals. In addition, the Supreme Court receives most of the special actions that would normally be filed in Division 1. These steps have been taken to help Division 1 of the Court of Appeals combat its increasing caseload backlog. While this assistance has been possible in recent years, it is questionable just how long the Supreme Court will be able to continue this practice and still maintain what would be considered an "acceptable" caseload backlog for the Supreme Court. Legislation will be introduced in the 1979 Legislature which, if approved, would add a fourth

panel of judges to Division 1 of the Court of Appeals as of July 1, 1980.

Filing and termination activity of the Court has increased significantly over the past five years, with filings increasing by 42% and terminations by 48%. Petitions for Review continue to represent the largest caseload activity of the Court, accounting for 56.7% of total filings and 58.3% of total terminations during 1978. While the number of petitions for review filed has increased by 119% over the past five years, the percentage of petitions granted in relationship to petitions filed has decreased from 12.9% in 1974 to 8.2% in 1978.

The following tables and graph reflect the Supreme Court's 1978 caseload activity; yearly summary case activity of the Court for the years 1970 through 1978; and by case type filing and termination activity for the years 1974 through 1978.



COURT OF APPEALS DIVISION 1 STATISTICS

At first glance, the overall caseload statistical activity within Division 1 during 1978 appears quite positive, as the court was able to reduce its pending caseload for the first time since its creation in 1965. A closer look at the individual statistics, however, reveals that this decrease was only possible because the Supreme Court transferred to itself 159 cases from Division 1. Had this not occurred, Division 1's ending pending caseload for 1978 would stand at 1,310 cases, an increase of 8.2% over 1977, rather than the actual pending caseload of 1,151 cases.

Overall, filing and termination activity significantly increased in 1978 with filings increasing by 9.7% and terminations by 20.3% over 1977. Civil appeals continued to show the largest filing activity increase, up 20.2% over 1977 filings, and 67.1% since 1974. Over the five-year period, 1974-78, civil appeals accounted for 29.9% of Division 1's filings. In 1978, civil appeals represented 33.6% of the court's filing activity. This increase is of major concern to the court and is one of the primary reasons for the escalating backlog of cases within Division 1. A general concensus of opinion among some of the appellate judges contacted is that civil appeals, due to their complexity, generally require three times the time and effort required to conclude one criminal appeal. Increases in civil appeal filings, therefore, affect the workload of the court to a much greater extent than the raw statistics indicate.

Excluding those cases transferred to the Supreme Court, overall terminations increased by 20.3% over 1977. Civil and Industrial Commission case terminations accounted for the majority of the termination increase, with civil terminations up 20.9% and Industrial Commission terminations up by 51.9%. As can be seen in Table V and Graph II, civil terminations, including the 52 cases transferred to the Supreme Court, did not keep pace with civil filings; the result being a 25 case increase in the civil pending caseload at the end of 1978.

Tables IV, V and VI and the associated graphs reflect the filing and termination activity of Division 1

for the past ten years. As can be seen, a significant number of cases have been transferred to the Supreme Court over the past five years, primarily to assist Division 1 in handling its burgeoning caseload. While the Supreme Court has been able to provide this assistance in recent years, it is questionable just how long this practice can be continued given its own increasing workload requirements.

Many factors can be cited as contributing to the pending caseload problems of Division 1. As previously mentioned, civil appeals represent the most difficult type of case in terms of time and effort required by the court. Civil filings are continually increasing in both the number of filings and their percentage of the total filing activity.

For the period 1975 through 1978, civil and criminal appeals have comprised 83.3% of Division 1's total filing activity. For that same period, Maricopa County accounted for 88.1% of the civil and criminal appeals filed. From this it is easy to see that Maricopa County accounts for the origination of the major portion of Division 1's caseload. This is of concern since Maricopa County has added two Superior Court judgeships in each of the past several years, and indications are that this will continue in order to accommodate the county's population growth.

To meet these increasing caseload requirements and to attempt reduction of the burdensome pending caseload, legislation will be introduced in the 1979 legislative session to expand the Court of Appeals. The legislation, if passed, provides for the creation of a fourth panel of judges within Division 1, effective July 1, 1980.

The following tables and graphs reflect Division 1's 1978 caseload activity (Table I); filing and termination activity by case type for the years 1974 through 1978 (Tables II and III); total filing and termination activity for 1969 through 1978 (Table IV and Graph I); civil filing and termination activity for 1969 through 1978 (Table V and Graph II); and criminal filing and termination activity for 1969 through 1978 (Table VI and Graph III).



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COURT OF APPEALS DIVISION 2 STATISTICS

Filings and terminations within Division 2 virtually mirrored one another in 1978 (716 filings, 702 terminations). For the second consecutive year, the court was able to maintain its pending caseload at virtually the same level (see Graph I). Civil filings accounted for the largest filing activity increase in 1978, increasing by 17.3% over 1977. Civil terminations actually decreased by 3.6% compared to civil terminations in 1977, but still exceeded new civil filings, thus avoiding any further increase in the civil ending pending caseload for 1978.

The following tables and graph depict Division 2's 1978 caseload activity, (Table I); filing and termination activity by case type for the years 1974 through 1978, (Tables II and III); and summary filing and termination activity for 1969 through 1978, (Table IV and Graph I).



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SUPERIOR COURT STATISTICS

The caseload statistics contained on the following pages are based on the statistical data reported monthly by each county Superior Court to the Arizona Supreme Court. The statistics are presented on both an individual county basis and a statewide summary basis — by county and by case type. Virtually all the Superior Court caseload statistics reported herein are complete. Some statistical information was not reported, however, and such omissions have been footnoted on the applicable tables to that effect.

Revised statistical reporting forms were implemented January 1, 1978 for Superior Court caseload reporting. This has resulted in the availability of detailed caseload data, and has established a greater uniformity in the manner caseload statistics are reported.

Because of the reporting form revisions and the format used to present 1978 caseload data in this

report, statistical comparisons with data presented in the 1977 Annual Report and the Arizona Courts Summary Report are not possible for some case categories. Prior to this report, for example, prejudgment and post-judgment petitions and orders were included, in most instances, with the Domestic Relations case statistics reported. For 1978, these statistics are reported separately. Juvenile statistics reported in both the Summary Report and the 1977 Annual Report, for most counties, included both dependency and delinquency cases. Juvenile statistics reported in this report represent only dependency cases, since delinquency statistics are not presently required in the monthly reports. Efforts are being made to provide this information in the future. In the previous two reports, Mental Health cases were included as a case category within both the individual county tables and the statewide summary tables. For 1978, Mental Health case activity has been removed from the various tables and reported separately, but only to the extent of the number of hearings held. Prior to this report, misdemeanor, lower court appeals and unclassified criminal cases were consolidated into one category labeled "misdemeanor". These statistics are reported as separate categories on the individual county tables.

Some beginning pending figures for 1978 do not agree with ending 1977 pending figures reported in the 1977 Annual Report. These differences are due to the reporting changes discussed in the previous paragraph and some pending adjustments made during the year as a result of caseload inventories. Pending differences are footnoted on the individual county tables, where applicable.

Court sentencing and revoked probation statistics on a by county and a summary basis are reported for the first time in this report. The data reported is taken from the monthly reports submitted by each Superior Court. The data is intended to reflect the number and type of defendant dispositions resulting from a judgment of guilt in a criminal case. This report is intended to reflect only the most serious sentence given when more than one type of sentence is imposed on a defendant in a criminal case. Some of the statistical data reported may differ with information of various county probation departments. This appears to be due to definitional differences and differences in the manner in which sentencing and revoked probation statistics are maintained. An effort will be made to resolve these differences during 1979.

STATISTICAL DEFINITIONS

The revised reporting format used in presenting 1978 Superior Court caseload statistics expands both the amount and detail of the data being reported. Certain definitions and explanations are included to offer the reader a more precise understanding of what the statistical data represents. Criminal statistics reflect the number of defendants named in complaints, informations and/or indictments.

Case Categories

- CIVIL Tort Motor Vehicle, Tort Non-Motor, Medical Malpractice, Contract, Eminent Domain, Lower Court Civil Appeals and Non-Classified Civil cases.
- DOMESTIC RELATIONS Paternity, Maternity, Dissolution, Annulment, Legal Separation, County Attorney Petitions to Establish Support, and other custody proceedings.

- PROBATE Estate Probate, Trust Administration, Guardianship and Conservatorship cases.
- ADOPTION Petitions for the adoption of a minor.
- IUVENILE DEPENDENCY Petitions to declare a juvenile a dependent or neglected child.
- FELONY Defendants in criminal cases who are charged with a felony. Criminal statistics in this report represent numbers of defendants not cases.
- MISDEMEANOR Defendants in criminal cases who are charged with a misdemeanor offense.
- UNCLASSIFIED Defendants in criminal cases that are charged with an offense which does not come under any of the other criminal case categories listed, e.g. peace bond complaints.
- LOWER COURT APPEAL The number of civil cases appealed; or defendants in criminal cases who appeal a decision rendered in a city court or a justice of the peace court.
- TRIAL DE NOVO A new trial as a result of a lower court appeal in which the entire case is retried.
- ON THE RECORD An appeal of a lower court decision, in which legal issues are reviewed by inspection and examination of the record of the lower court proceedings.

Case Activity

- CASES TRANSFERRED IN The number of cases, or defendants in criminal cases, transferred in from Superior Courts of other counties. Cases in which a motion for new trial has been granted or a remand from an appellate court has been ordered are also included in this category, as well as statistical adjustments to correct discovered inaccuracies.
- WITH PLEA The number of defendants in criminal cases who enter a plea of guilty or nolo contendere prior to the commencement of a trial.
- TRIAL IN PROCESS The number of cases (defendants in criminal cases) terminated during, but prior to, the completion of a trial. For purposes of this report, a trial commences when the first witness is sworn.

- COURTTRIAL The number of cases (defendants in criminal cases) terminated following the completion of a trial without a jury.
- IURY TRIAL The number of cases (defendants in criminal cases) terminated following the completion of a jury trial.
- AFFIRMED Superior Court ruling on a lower court appeal on the record in which the decision of the lower court is upheld.
- REVERSED Superior Court ruling on a lower court appeal on the record in which the decision of

the lower court is reversed.

- ARBITRATION The number of civil cases terminated by arbitration, pursuant to Arizona Revised Statutes §12-133. Arbitration cases that are appealed to the court are not included in this termination category.
- MEDICAL MALPRACTICE PANELS The number of civil medical malpractice cases concluded by medical liability review panels. Cases in which the parties proceed with court litigation are not included in this category.

JUSTICE OF THE PEACE COURT STATISTICS

The caseload statistics contained on the following pages are based on the monthly statistical reports submitted to the Supreme Court by the Justice Courts. The monthly statistical report forms were revised January 1, 1978. This revision has provided the Supreme Court with more complete caseload information regarding the Justice of the Peace court system than has ever been available before. Caseload data for some courts, however, is still not complete. Precincts with incomplete statistical data have been footnoted to that effect on the individual precinct tables and are not included in the county or statewide summary tables. A concerted effort will be made during 1979 to eliminate these statistical omissions for future reporting purposes.

The Justice of the Peace Court system consisted of 84 precincts in 1978. Individual precinct statistics are reported in the following statistical section, except for Phoenix and Tucson precincts which are included as consolidated reports.

STATISTICAL DEFINITIONS

The following definitions are included to afford the reader a better understanding of what the statistical data reported represents. Civil statistics are reported on a case basis. Misdemeanor and preliminary hearing data represents the number of defendants named in complaints.

Case Categories

- CIVIL Lawsuit in which the claim is less than \$1,000; forcible entry and detainer actions (recovery of leased or rented property) providing the rental value does not exceed \$500 per month and the damages sought are less than \$1,000.
- MISDEMEANOR TRAFFIC Includes traffic violations contained in Title 28 of the Arizona Revised Statutes including driving while intoxicated, reckless driving, and other moving violations.
- MISDEMEANOR NON-TRAFFIC All other misdemeanors where the law provides for punishment that does not exceed 6 months incarceration and/or a fine up to \$1,000.
- PRELIMINARY HEARINGS A hearing to determine

whether or not the defendant should be held for trial in the Superior Court on a felony complaint.

Case Activity

- TRANSFERRED IN The number of defendants, or cases, transferred in from other Justice of the Peace precincts. Also includes statistical adjustments to correct discovered inaccuracies.
- WITHOUT TRIAL The number of cases terminated without a trial, including: dismissals by the judge, summary judgments, and dismissals by the plaintiff or by stipulation of the parties involved.
- PLEA AND/OR BOND FORFEITURE The number of defendants in cases terminated after the acceptance of a guilty or nolo contendere plea to the original charge, and the number of defendants who forfeit a posted bond.
- OUT OF JURISDICTION For statistical reporting purposes only, includes the number of defendants believed to be physically outside the court's jurisdiction and no warrant has been issued for their arrest.
- GRAND JURY The number of defendants in felony indictments issued by a grand jury prior to the preliminary examination after the filing of a complaint in Justice Court.
- EXAM WAIVED The number of defendants who waive their right to a preliminary hearing and as a result are held for trial in the Superior Court.
- HELD FOR SUPERIOR COURT The number of defendants bound over to Superior Court for trial as a result of a preliminary hearing.
- PLEA AGREEMENT The number of defendants held for trial in Justice Court when the offense charged is reduced from a felony to a misdemeanor as the result of a plea a ement to a lesser charge.
- DEFENDANT DISCHARGED The number of felony defendants dismissed either upon motion of the prosecution or as the result of a preliminary hearing.

MUNICIPAL COURT STATISTICS

In conjunction with the revision of the monthly statistical reporting forms for the appellate, superior and justice courts, the Supreme Court entered an order requiring all Municipal Courts to submit monthly case activity reports to the Supreme Court commencing in January, 1978. The statistics contained on the following pages are taken from these monthly submissions and mark the first time that Municipal Court statistics have been available on a statewide basis to the Supreme Court.

Caseload data for some courts is still not complete. Courts with incomplete or missing data have been footnoted to that effect on the appropriate individual court tables and have not been included in the county or statewide summary tables. Efforts are currently being made to eliminate these statistical omissions for 1979.

Statistical Definitions

The following statistical definitions are included to provide a better understanding of what the caseload data reported represents. The statistical data reflects the number of defendants named in complaints.

Case Categories

MISDEMEANOR - TRAFFIC — Includes traffic violations contained in Title 28 of the Arizona Re-

vised Statutes, including driving while intoxicated, reckless driving, and other moving violations.

MISDEMEANOR - NON-TRAFFIC — All other misdemeanors where the law provides for punishment that does not exceed 6 months incarceration and/or a fine up to \$1,000.

Case Activity

TRANSFERRED IN — The number of defendants, or cases, transferred in from other Municipal Courts. Also includes statistical adjustments to correct discovered inaccuracies,

PLEA AND/OR BOND FORFEITURE — The number of defendants in cases terminated after the acceptance of a guilty or **nolo contendere** plea to the original charge, and the number of defendants who forfeit a posted bond.

OUT OF JURISDICTION — For statistical reporting purposes only, includes the number of defendants believed to be physically outside the court's jurisdiction and no warrant has been issued for their arrest.

Graham County was formed in 1881 by the Arizona Territorial Legislature. The southern part of the county was acquired from Mexico in 1853 as part of the Gadsden Purchase. Safford was established as the county seat in 1881. Josh Bailey, who is known as the father of Safford, was also its first justice of the peace in 1874. The area is well known for its farming and ranching industry and the county has also depended on neighboring mining operations as a supplement to its economy.

A.G. McAlister was the first judge elected to the Superior Court in Graham County and served from 1912 to 1920. In 1921, Governor Campbell appointed William R. Chambers as Judge of the Superior Court. The following year he was elected to a full term and served until 1926. Judge Chambers was born in Illinois in 1873 and received his law degree from the University of Michigan in 1896. He moved to Arizona in 1907 where he served as the Clerk of the District Court for four years and later engaged in the practice of law in Safford. Judge Chambers was active in advancing the educational interests of the community and was influential in securing the construction of the high school building.

E.L. Spriggs was elected Superior Court Judge and began his term in 1927. Judge Spriggs died in office in 1928. Governor Campbell appointed Lee N. Stratton to replace Judge Spriggs. Judge Stratton was elected to two terms after his appointment and served until his retirement in 1938. Judge Stratton was born in 1864 across the street from the Alamo in San Antonio, Texas. In 1900 he moved to Solomons-ville in Graham county. He was elected as district attorney in 1900 and re-elected in 1906. During this time Stratton prosecuted and obtained the conviction of the notorious outlaw, Blackjack Chacon. Judge Stratton had only one case reversed by the State Supreme Court when he called a cow and a calf two head of cattle in one of his decisions.

Jesse A. Udall succeeded Judge Stratton in 1939. Judge Udall was born June 24, 1893 in Eagar, Arizona. In 1913 he came to Thatcher to complete his last year of high school and then attended the Gila Academy (now Eastern Arizona Junior College). He was inducted into the Army in 1918 and was stationed in France during World War I. Judge Udall

received his law degree from the University of Arizona in 1924. His professional career was distinguished by public service. He served as Graham County Attorney from 1925 to 1927 and in the State House of Representatives from 1931 to 1935.

During the last year of his initial term as Superior Court Judge, 1942, he was recalled to active duty. He served in the U.S. Army Judge Advocate Department and was discharged in 1946 with rank of Lt. Colonel. In 1953 Jesse Udall was appointed to the Superior Court in Graham County by Governor Pyle and served until 1958 when he was called to be President of the California Mission of the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter Day Saints. In 1960, Judge Udall was appointed to the Arizona Supreme Court to complete the term of his brother, Levi S. Udall, who died in office. Justice Jesse Udall served on the Arizona Supreme Court until his retirement in 1972.

When Judge Udall was called into active duty in 1942, Governor Osborn appointed J.D. Merrill to complete the term of Superior Court Judge through 1942. Benjamin Blake was thereafter elected to the office and served as Graham County's Superior Court Judge until 1953 when he retired due to ill health.

Benjamin Blake was born June 24, 1890, in Center Creek, Utah and moved to Arizona at age 17. He attended the Gila Academy in Thatcher and later received his law degree from the University of Arizona in 1925. Judge Blake engaged in the private practice of law in Safford; served as Graham County Attorney from 1933 to 1937; and served in the Arizona State Senate from 1939 to 1942.

In 1958 when Judge Udall resigned, Governor McFarland appointed Ruskin Lines to the Superior Court and he has been re-elected each term since then. Judge Lines was born September 20, 1918, in Pima, Arizona. His parents came to Arizona as early pioneer settlers in the 1880's. Judge Lines received his law degree from the University of Arizona in 1940 and then served with the Federal Bureau of Investigation until 1952. He served as Graham County Attorney from 1953 until his appointment to the bench in 1958. Judge Lines has participated in cases in 13 of the 14 counties and has been asked to sit on cases in the Court of Appeals and Arizona Supreme Court.



Greenlee County, the youngest of the Arizona counties, was created from the eastern part of Graham County by the Arizona Territorial Legislature on March 10, 1909. The county was named after Mason Greenlee, a pioneer mining man in the area.

The three major communities in the county are Clifton, Morenci and Duncan. Clifton and Morenci were established in the late 1800's as mining com-

munities, together with the old town of Metcalf. Initially the area had several copper producers. Henry Lesinsky was one of the early producers of copper. Later the Detroit Copper Company, the Arizona Copper Company, the Shannon Copper Company and other mines were all purchased by the Phelps Dodge Corporation, which is presently mining the Open Pit Mine at Morenci and in 1972 the Metcalf mine was opened.

The Courthouse was built in 1911 and since has undergone continuous remodeling and renovation. In early 1979 the county will complete a new corrections building and a new courthouse is scheduled for completion within the next ten years.

From 1912 until 1926 Frank Bray Laine served as the first Superior Court Judge. Judge Laine came to Greenlee County from California where his father, Thomas Laine, was a member of the Constitutional Convention and one of the authors of the constitution of that state. Judge Laine was born in San Jose, California and studied law in his father's office. He graduated from the University of Pacific. Judge Laine had a good reputation for dispensing justice in the early Arizona days.

In 1927, David W. Ling became the Superior Court Judge. Judge Ling was brought to Prescott, Arizona, as an infant. He graduated from the University of Southern California Law School in 1913. He also served as Greenlee County Attorney prior to becoming judge. In 1936 Judge Ling was named U.S. Federal District Judge for the State of Arizona and served in that position until his retirement in August, 1964. Judge Ling had a reputation as a person endowed with an outstanding judicial mind and had earned a reputation that ranks him among the outstanding jurists of this state.

Upon Judge Ling's appointment to the Federal bench, Thomas E. Allyn became the Superior Court Judge and served until his death in 1949. Judge Allyn was born in Indiana and moved to Arkansas at an early age where he taught school for seventeen years. He studied law by correspondence and was admitted to the Arkansas Bar in 1911. He continued teaching until 1916 when he entered the practice of law at Marked Tree, Arkansas. He later moved to Clifton, Arizona, where he practiced law. His widow, Gussie, still lives in Clifton, Arizona and recently celebrated her 86th birthday. Judge Allyn was known as a very compassionate judge who had deep feelings for people. One of the most difficult cases that Judge Allyn had was the murder case involving the defendant, James G. Rawlings, in which he imposed the death penalty, but was very affected by having to do so.

Upon Judge Allyn's death, James Boyce Scott was appointed Judge and served only one year until

1950, when he was defeated by Porter Murry. Judge Scott was the first Greenlee County Judge who was a native of Greenlee County and who was a graduate of the University of Arizona Law School. Judge Scott served as a representative from Greenlee County in the Arizona State Legislature and was County Attorney of Greenlee County.

In 1950 Porter Murry became the fifth Superior Court Judge of Greenlee County and served in this capacity through 1970. Judge Murry attended the Rolla Missouri School of Mines and was working near Payson, Arizona where he was involved in an industrial accident. After a long illness, he attended the Univeristy of Arizona Law School and practiced law in Clifton, Arizona. He also served as Greenlee County Attorney prior to his election as Judge, Judge Murry soon acquired a reputation as an able, impartial and learned judge. Judge Murry sat on cases in all counties in Arizona, as well as on the Arizona Supreme Court. Judge Murry's reputation became such that during the period he served as judge, he was given many controversial cases and earned a reputation as one of the best trial judges in the history of the State. After his retirement in 1970, Judge Murry moved to Phoenix, Arizona where he continues to sit as a retired judge in several cases.

Upon Judge Murry's retirement, Lloyd Fernandez was elected Superior Court Judge. He previously served as Greenlee County Attorney. Judge Fernandez is a native of Greenlee County and a first generation American whose parents came to the Clifton-Morenci area from their native Spain in 1914. He attended Arizona State University and later graduated from the University of Arizona Law School. He, like Judge Murry, has been called upon to try cases in all fourteen counties of the State of Arizona.

Perhaps one of the best known attorneys in Greenlee County was H. Earl Rogge, who practiced law in Greenlee County for over fifty years and served as Greenlee County Attorney. Mr. Rogge was very colorful and independent in his practice of law throughout his years in Greenlee County and he practiced until his death in 1977 at the age of 85 years. His son, H. Earl Rogge, Jr., also practiced law in Greenlee County and served as Greenlee County Attorney. At present, William A. Coffeen is the County Attorney for Greenlee County.

APPENDIX IV ARIZONA CONSTITUTION

ARTICLE VI JUDICIAL DEPARTMENT

Sec. 1. Judicial power; courts

The judicial power shall be vested in an integrated judicial department consisting of a Supreme Court, such intermediate appellate courts as may be provided by law, a superior court, such courts inferior to the superior court as may be provided by law, and justice courts.

Sec. 2. Supreme court; composition; divisions; decisions, transaction of business

The Supreme Court shall consist of not less than five justices. The number of justices may be increased or decreased by law, but the court shall at all times be constituted of at least five justices.

The Supreme Court shall sit in accordance with rules adopted by it, either in banc or in divisions of not less than three justices, but the court shall not declare any law unconstitutional except when sitting in banc. The decisions of the court shall be in writing and the grounds stated.

The court shall be open at all times, except on nonjudicial days, for the transaction of business.

Sec. 3. Supreme court; administrative supervision; chief justice

The Supreme Court shall have administrative supervision over all the courts of the state. The chief justice shall be elected by the justices of the Supreme Court from one of their number for a term of five years, and may be reelected for like terms. The vice chief justice shall be elected by the justices of the Supreme Court from one of their number for a term determined by the court. A member of the court may resign the office of chief justice or vice chief justice without resigning from the court.

The chief justice, or in his absence or incapacity, the vice chief justice, shall exercise the court's administrative supervision over all the courts of the state. He may assign judges of intermediate appellate courts, superior courts, or courts inferior to the superior court to serve in other courts or counties, mendment initiated by the people; approved at regular election Nov. 5, 1974; effective Dec. 5, 1974.

Sec. 4. Supreme court; term of office

Justices of the Supreme Court shall hold office for a regular term of six years except as provided by this article. Amendment initiated by the people; approved at regular election Nov. 5, 1974; effective Dec. 5, 1974.

Sec. 5. Supreme court; jurisdiction; writ; rules; habeas corpus

The Supreme Court shall have:

- 1. Original jurisdiction of habeas corpus, and quo warranto, mandamus, injunction and other extraordinary writs to state officers.
- 2. Original and exclusive jurisdiction to hear and determine causes between counties concerning disputed boundaries and surveys thereof or concerning claims of one county against another.
- 3. Appellate jurisdiction in all actions and proceedings except civil and criminal actions originating in courts not of record, unless the action involves the validity of a tax, impost, assessment, toll, statute or municipal ordinance.
- Power to issue injunctions and writs of mandamus, review, prohibition, habeas corpus, certiorari, and all other writs necessary and proper to the complete exercise of its appellate and revisory jurisdiction.
- 5. Power to make rules relative to all procedural matters in any court.
- 6. Such other jurisdiction as may be provided by law.

Each justice of the Supreme Court may issue writs of habeas corpus to any part of the state upon petition by or on behalf of a person held in actual custody, and may make such writs returnable before himself, the Supreme Court, appellate court or superior court, or judge thereof.

Sec. 6. Supreme Court; qualifications of justices

A justice of the Supreme Court shall be a person of good moral character and admitted to the practice of law in and a resident of the State of Arizona for ten years next preceding his taking office.

Sec. 7. Supreme court; clerk and assistants; administrative director and staff

The Supreme Court shall appoint a clerk of the court and assistants thereto who shall serve at its pleasure, and who shall receive such compensation as may be provided by law.

The Supreme Court shall appoint an administrative director and staff to serve at its pleasure to assist the chief justice in discharging his administrative duties. The director and staff shall receive such compensation as may be provided by law.

Sec. 8. Supreme court; publication of opinions

Provision shall be made by law for the speedy publication of the opinions of the Supreme Court, and they shall be free for publication by any person.

Sec. 9. Intermediate appellate courts

The jurisdiction, powers, duties and composition of any intermediate appellate court shall be as provided by law.

Sec. 10. Superior court; number of judges

There shall be in each county at least one judge of the superior court. There shall be in each county such additional judges as may be provided by law, but not exceeding one judge for each thirty thousand inhabitants or majority fraction thereof. The number of inhabitants in a county for purposes of this section may be determined by census enumeration or by such other method as may be provided by law.

Sec. 11. Superior court; presiding judges; duties

There shall be in each county a presiding judge of the superior court. In each county in which there are two or more judges, the Supreme Court shall appoint one of such judges presiding judge. Presiding judges shall exercise administrative supervision over the superior court and judges thereof in their counties, and shall have such other duties as may be provided by law or by rules of the Supreme Court.

Sec. 12. Superior court; term of office

Judges of the superior court in counties having a population of less than one hundred fifty thousand persons according to the United States census shall be elected by the qualified electors of their counties at the general election. They shall hold office for a regular term of four years except as provided by this section from and after the first Monday in January next succeeding their election, and until their successors are elected and qualify. The names of all candidates for judge of the superior court in such counties shall be placed on the regular ballot without partisan or other designation except the division and title of the office.

The governor shall fill any vacancy in such counties by appointing a person to serve until the election and qualification of a successor. At the next succeeding general election following the appointment of a person to fill a vacancy, a judge shall be elected to serve for the remainder of the unexpired term.

Judges of the superior court in counties having a population of one hundred fifty thousand persons or more according to the United States census shall hold office for a regular term of four years except as provided by this article. Amendment initiated by the people; approved at regular election Nov. 5, 1974, effective Dec. 5, 1974.

Sec. 13. Superior court; composition; salaries; judgments and proceedings; process

The superior courts provided for in this article shall constitute a single court, composed of all the duly elected or appointed judges in each of the counties of the state. The legislature may classify counties for the purpose of fixing salaries of judges or officers of the court.

The judgments, decrees, orders and proceedings of any session of the superior court held by one or more judges shall have the same force and effect as if all the judges of the court had presided.

The process of the court shall extend to all parts of the state. Added, election Nov. 8, 1960.

Sec. 14. Superior court; original jurisdiction

The superior court shall have original jurisdiction of:

- 1. Cases and proceedings in which exclusive jurisdiction is not vested by law in another court.
- 2. Cases of equity and at law vinich involve the title to or possession of real property, or the legality of any tax, impost, assessment, toll or municipal ordinance.
- 3. Other cases in which the demand or value of property in controversy amounts to one thousand dollars or more, exclusive of interest and costs.
- 4. Criminal cases amounting to felony, and cases of misdemeanor not otherwise provided for by law.
- 5. Actions of forcible entry and detainer.
- 6. Proceedings in insolvency.
- 7. Actions to prevent or abate nuisance.
- 8. Matters of probate.
- 9. Divorce and for annulment of marriage.
- 10. Naturalization and the issuance of papers therefor.
- 11. Special cases and proceedings not otherwise provided for, and such other jurisdiction as may be provided by law. Amendment referred by the Legislature; approved at regular election Nov. 7, 1972; effective Dec. 1, 1972.

Sec. 15. Superior court; proceedings affecting children

The superior court shall have exclusive original jurisdiction in all proceedings and matters affecting dependent, neglected, incorrigible or delinquent children, or children accused of crime, under the age of eighteen years. The judges shall hold examinations in chambers for all such children concerning whom proceedings are brought, in advance of any criminal prosecution of such children, and may, in their discretion, suspend criminal

prosecution of such children. The powers of the judges to control such children shall be as provided by law.

Sec. 16. Superior court; appellate jurisdiction

The superior court shall have appellate jurisdiction in cases arising in justice and other courts inferior to the superior court as may be provided by law.

Sec. 17. Superior court; conduct of business; trial juries; jury trial; grand juries

The superior court shall be open at all times, except on nonjudicial days, for the determination of non-jury civil cases and the transaction of business. For the determination of civil causes and matters in which a jury demand has been entered, and for the trial of criminal causes, a trial jury shall be drawn and summoned from the body of the county, as provided by law. The right of jury trial as provided by this constitution shall remain inviolate, but trial by jury may be waived by the parties in any civil cause or by the parties with the consent of the court in any criminal cause. Grand juries shall be drawn and summoned only by order of the superior court.

Sec. 18. Superior court; writs

The superior court or any judge thereof may issue writs of mandamus, quo warranto, review, certiorari, prohibition, and writs of habeas corpus on petition by or on behalf of a person held in actual custody within the county. Injunctions, attachments, and writs of prohibition and habeas corpus may be issued and served on legal holidays and non-judicial days.

Sec. 19. Superior court; service of judge in another county

A judge of the superior court shall serve in another county at the direction of the chief justice of the Supreme Court or may serve in another county at the request of the presiding judge of the superior court thereof.

Sec. 20. Retirement and service of retired justices and judges

The legislature shall prescribe by law a plan of retirement for justices and judges of courts of record, including the basis and amount of retirement pay, and requiring except as provided in section 35 of this article, that justices and judges of courts of record be retired upon reaching the age of seventy. Any retired justice or judge of any court of record who is drawing retirement pay may serve as a justice or judge of any court. When serving outside his county of residence, any such retired justice or judge shall receive his necessary traveling and subsistence expenses. A retired judge who is temporarily called back to the active duties of a judge is entitled to receive the same compen-

sation and expenses as other like active judges less any amount received for such period in retirement benefits. Amendment initiated by the people; approved at regular election Nov. 5, 1974; effective Dec. 5, 1974.

Sec. 21. Superior court; speedy decisions

Every matter submitted to a judge of the superior court for his decision shall be decided within sixty days from the date of submission thereof. The Supreme Court shall by rule provide for the speedy disposition of all matters not decided within such period.

Sec. 22. Superior and other courts; qualifications of judges

Judges of the superior court, intermediate appellate courts or courts inferior to the superior court having jurisdiction in civil cases of one thousand dollars or more, exclusive of interest and costs, established by law under the provisions of section 1 of this article, shall be at least thirty years of age, of good moral character and admitted to the practice of law in and a resident of the state for five years next preceding their taking office. Amendment referred by the Legislature; approved at regular election Nov. 7, 1972; effective Dec. 1, 1972.

Sec. 23. Superior court; clerk

There shall be in each county a clerk of the superior court. The clerk shall be elected by the qualified electors of his county at the general election and shall hold office for a term of four years from and after the first Monday in January next succeeding his election. The clerk shall have such powers and perform such duties as may be provided by law or by rule of the Supreme Court or superior court. He shall receive such compensation as may be provided by law.

Sec. 24. Superior court; court commissioners, masters and referees

Judges of the superior court may appoint court commissioners, masters and referees in their respective counties, who shall have such powers and perform such duties as may be provided by law or by rule of the Supreme Court. Court commissioners, masters and referees shall receive such compensation as may be provided by law.

Sec. 25. Style of process; conduct of prosecutions in name of state

The style of process shall be "The State of Arizona", and prosecutions shall be conducted in the name of the state and by its authority.

Sec. 26. Oath of office

Each justice, judge and justice of the peace shall, before entering upon the duties of his office, take and subscribe an oath that h

Constitution of the United States and the Constitution of the State of Arizona, and that he will faithfully and impartially discharge the duties of his office to the best of his ability.

The oath of all judges of courts inferior to the superior court and the oath of justices of the peace shall be filed in the office of the county recorder, and the oath of all other justices and judges shall be filed in the office of the Secretary of State.

Sec. 27. Charge to juries; reversal of causes for technical error

Judges shall not charge juries with respect to matters of fact, nor comment thereon, but shall declare the law. No cause shall be reversed for technical error in pleadings or proceedings when upon the whole case it shall appear that substantial justice has been done.

Sec. 28. Justices and judges; dual office holdings; political activity; practice of law

Justices and judges of courts of record shall not be eligible for any other public office or for any other public employment during their term of office, except that they may assume another judicial office, and upon qualifying therefor, the office formerly held shall become vacant. No justice or judge of any court of record shall practice law during his continuance in office, nor shall he hold any office in a political party or actively take part in any political campaign other than his own for his reelection or retention in office. Any justice or judge who files nomination papers for an elective office, other than for judge of the superior court or a court of record inferior to the superior court in a county having a population of less than one hundred fifty thousand persons according to the United States census, forfeits his judicial office. Amendment initiated by the people; approved at regular election Nov. 5, 1974; effective Dec. 5, 1974.

Sec. 29. Repealed, election Nov. 3, 1970

Sec. 30. Courts of record

The Supreme Court, the Court of Appeals and the superior court shall be courts of record. Other courts of record may be established by law, but justice courts shall not be courts of record.

All justices and judges of courts of record, except for judges of the superior court and other courts of record inferior to the superior court in counties having a population of less than one hundred fifty thousand persons according to the United States census, shall be appointed in the manner provided in section 37 of this article. Amendment initiated by the people; approved at regular election Nov. 5, 1974; effective Dec. 5, 1974.

Sec. 31. Judges pro tempore

The legislature may provide for the appointment of members of the bar having the qualifications provided in section 22 of the article as judges pro tempore of courts inferior to the Supreme Court. When serving, any such person shall have all the judicial powers of a regular elected judge of the court to which he is appointed. A person so appointed shall receive such compensation as may be provided by law. The population limitation of section 10 of this article shall not apply to the appointment of judges pro tempore of the superior court.

Sec. 32. Justices of the peace and inferior courts; jurisdiction, powers and duties; terms of office; salaries

The number of justices of the peace to be elected in precincts shall be as provided by law. Justices of the peace may be police justices of incorporated cities and towns.

The jurisdiction, powers and duties of courts inferior to the superior court and of justice courts, and the terms of office of judges of such courts and justices of the peace shall be as provided by law. The legislature may classify counties and precincts for the purpose of fixing salaries of judges of courts inferior to the superior court and of justices of the peace.

The civil jurisdiction of courts inferior to the superior court and of justice courts shall not exceed the sum of two thousand five hundred dollars, exclusive of interest and costs. Criminal jurisdiction shall be limited to misdemeanors. The jurisdiction of such courts shall not encroach upon the jurisdiction of courts of record but may be made concurrent therewith, subject to the limitations provided in this section.

Sec. 33. Change by legislature in number of justices or judges; reduction of salary during term of office

No change made by the legislature in the number of justices or judges shall work the removal of any justice or judge from office. The salary of any justice or judge shall not be reduced during the term of office for which he was elected or appointed.

Sec. 34. Absence of judicial officer from state

Any judicial officer except a retired justice or judge who absents himself from the state for more than sixty consecutive days shall be deemed to have forfeited his office, but the Governor may extend the leave of absence for such time as reasonable necessity therefor exists.

Sec. 35. Continuance in office; continued existence of offices; application of prior statute and rules

All justices, judges, justices of the peace and officers of any court who are holding office as such by election or appointment at the time of the adoption of this section shall serve or continue in office for the respective terms for which they are so elected or for their respective unexpired terms, and until their successors are elected or appointed and qualify or they are retained in office pursuant to section 38 of this article; provided, however, that any justice or judge elected at the general election at which this section is adopted shall serve for the term for which he is so elected. The continued existence of any office heretofore legally established or held shall not be abolished or repealed by the adoption of this article. The statutes and rules relating to the authority, jurisdiction, practice and procedure of courts, judicial officers and offices in force at the time of the adoption of this article and not inconsistent herewith, shall, so far as applicable, apply to and govern such courts, judicial officers and offices until amended or repealed. Amendment initiated by the people; approved at regular election Nov. 5, 1974; effective Dec. 5,

Sec. 36. Commissions on appellate and trial court appointments and terms, appointments and vacancies on such commissions

A. There shall be a nonpartisan commission on appellate court appointments which shall be composed of the chief justice of the Supreme Court, who shall be chairman, three attorney members, who shall be nominated by the Board of Governors of the State Bar of Arizona and appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the Senate in the manner prescribed by law, and five nonattorney members who shall be appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the Senate in the manner prescribed by law. Amendment referred by the Legislature; approved at the regular election Nov. 2, 1976; effective Nov. 22, 1976.

Attorney members of the commission shall have resided in the state and shall have been admitted to practice before the Supreme Court for not less than five years. Not more than two attorney members shall be members of the same political party and not more than one attorney member shall be a resident of any one county. Nonattorney members shall have resided in the state for not less than five years and shall not be judges, retired judges or admitted to practice before the Supreme Court. Not more than three nonattorney members shall be members of the same political party. Not more than one nonattorney member shall be a resident of any one county. None of the attorney or nonattorney members of the commission shall hold

any governmental office, elective or appointive, for profit, and no attorney member shall be eligible for appointment to any judicial office of the state until one year after he ceases to be a member. Attorney members of the commission shall serve staggered four-year terms, and nonattorney members shall serve staggered four-year terms, except that initial appointments for attorney members shall consist of one appointment for a two-year term, one appointment for a three-year term, and one appointment for a four-year term, and except that initial appointments for nonattorney members shall consist of two appointments for a one-year term, one appointment for a two-year term, one appointment for a three-year term and one appointment for a four-year term. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired terms in the same manner as the original appointments.

B. There shall be a nonpartisan commission on trial court appointments for each county having a population of one hundred fifty thousand persons or more according to the United States census which shall be composed of the chief justice of the Supreme Court, who shall be chairman, three attorney members, who shall be nominated by the Board of Governors of the State Bar of Arizona and appointed by the governor with the advice and consent of the Senate in the manner prescribed by law, and five nonattorney members, who shall be appointed by the governor and with the advice and consent of the Senate in the manner prescribed by law. Amendment referred by the Legislature; approved at the regular election Nov. 2, 1976; effective Nov. 22, 1976.

Attorney members of such commission shall have resided in the state and shall have been admitted to practice before the Supreme Court for not less than five years, and shall be residents of the county from which appointed. Nonattorney members shall have resided in the state for not less than five years and shall not be judges, retired judges or admitted to practice before the Supreme Court and shall be residents of the county from which appointed. On each of such commissions not more than two attorney members and not more than three nonattorney members shall be members of the same political party. None of the attorney or nonattorney members of any such commission shall hold any governmental office, elective or appointive, for profit, and no attorney member shall be eligible for appointment to any judicial office of the state until one year after he ceases to be a member. Attorney members shall serve staggered four-year terms, and nonattorney members shall serve staggered four-year terms, except that initial appointments for attorney members shall consist of one appointment for a two-year term, one appointment for a three-year term, and one appointment for a four-year term

appointments for nonattorney members shall consist of two appointments for a one-year term, one appointment for a two-year term, one appointment for a three-year term and one appointment for a four-year term. Vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired terms in the same manner as the original appointments.

- C. No person other than the chief justice shall serve at the same time as a member of more than one of such commissions.
- D. The chairman of such commissions shall cast votes only in the event of ties. In the event of the absence or incapacity of any such chairman the Supreme Court shall appoint a justice thereof to serve in his place and stead.
- E. Prior to making recommendations to the governor as hereinafter provided, the one of such commissions having jurisdiction shall conduct such investigation and hold such hearings, either public or executive, as it deems advisable. Final decisions as to recommendations shall be made on the basis of merit alone without regard to political affiliation. Voting shall be by secret, written ballot. The expenses of meetings of such commissions and the attendance of members thereof for travel and subsistence shall be paid from the general fund of the state as state officers are paid, upon claims approved by the chairman. Amendment initiated by the people; approved at regular election Nov. 5, 1974; effective Dec. 5, 1974.

Sec. 37. Judicial vacancies and appointments; initial terms; residence; age

Within sixty days from the occurrence of a vacancy in the office of a justice or judge of any court of record, except for vacancies occurring in the office of a judge of the superior court or a judge of a court of record inferior to the superior court in a county having a population of less than one hundred fifty thousand persons according to the United States census, the commission on appellate court appointments, if the vacancy is in the Supreme Court or an intermediate appellate court of record, or the commission on trial court appointments for the county in which the vacancy occurs, if the vacancy is in the superior court or a court of record inferior to the superior court, shall submit to the governor the names of not less than three persons nominated by it to fill such vacancy, no more than two of whom shall be members of the same political party unless there are more than four such nominees, in which event not more than sixty percentum of such nominees shall be members of the same political party.

A vacancy in the office of a justice or a judge of such court of record shall be filled by appointment by the governor on the basis of merit alone without regard to political affiliation from one of the nominees whose names shall be submitted to him as hereinabove provided. If the governor shall not appoint one of such nominees to fill such vacancy within sixty days after their names are submitted to the governor by such commission, the chief justice of the Supreme Court forthwith shall appoint on the basis of merit alone without regard to political affiliation one of such nominees to fill such vacancy. If such commission shall not, within sixty days after such vacancy occurs, submit the names of nominees as hereinabove provided, the governor shall have the power to appoint any qualified person to fill such vacancy at any time thereafter prior to the time the names of three or more nominees to fill such vacancy shall be submitted to the governor as hereinabove provided.

Each justice or judge so appointed shall initially hold office for a term ending sixty days following the next regular general election after the expiration of a term of two years in office. Thereafter, the terms of justices or judges of the Supreme Court and the superior court shall be as provided by this article.

A person appointed to fill a vacancy on an intermediate appellate court, a superior court, or another court of record now existing or hereafter established by law shall have been a resident of the counties or county in which that vacancy exists for at least one year prior to his appointment, in addition to possessing the other required qualifications. A nominee shall be under sixty-five years of age at the time his name is submitted to the governor. Amendment initiated by the people; approved at regular election Nov. 5, 1974; effective Dec. 5, 1974.

Sec. 38. Declaration of candidacy; form of judicial ballot, rejection and retention; failure to file declaration

A justice or judge of the Supreme Court or an intermediate appellate court shall file in the office of the secretary of state, and a judge of the superior court or other court of record including such justices or judges who are holding office as such by election or appointment at the time of the adoption of this section except for judges of the superior court and other courts of record inferior to the superior court in counties having a population of less than one hundred fifty thousand persons, according to the United States census, shall file in the office of the clerk of the board of supervisors of the county in which he regularly sits and resides, not less than sixty nor more than ninety days prior to the regular general election next preceding the expiration of his term of office, a declaration of his desire to be retained in office, and the secretary of state shall certify to the several boards of supervisors the appropriate names of the candidate or candidates appearing on such declarations filed in his office.

The name of any justice or judge whose declaration is filed as provided in this section shall be placed on the appropriate official ballot at the next regular general election under a nonpartisan designation and in substantially the following form:

Shall ______, (Name of Justice or Judge) of the _____ Court be retatined in Office? Yes _____, (Mark X after one).

If a majority of those voting on the question vote "No," then, upon the expiration of the term for which such justice or judge was serving, a vacancy shall exist, which shall be filled as provided by this article. If a majority of those voting on the question vote "Yes," such justice or judge shall remain in office for another term, subject to removal as provided by this Constitution.

The votes shall be counted and canvassed and the result declared as in the case of state and county elections, whereupon a certificate of retention or rejection of the incumbent justice or judge shall be delivered to him by the secretary of state or the clerk of the board of supervisors, as the case may be.

If a justice or judge shall fail to file a declaration of his desire to be retained in office, as required by this section, then his office shall become vacant upon expiration of the term for which such justice or judge was serving. Amendment initiated by the people; approved at regular election Nov. 5, 1974; effective Dec. 5, 1974.

Sec. 39. Retirement of justices and judges; vacancies

On attaining the age of seventy years a justice or judge of a court of record shall retire and his judicial office shall be vacant, except as otherwise provided in section 35 of this article. In addition to becoming vacant as provided in this section, the office of a justice or judge of any court of record becomes vacant upon his death or his voluntary retirement pursuant to statute or his voluntary resignation, and also, as provided in section 38 of this article, upon the expiration of his term next following a general election at which a majority of those voting on the question of his retention vote in the negative or for which general election he is required, but fails, to file a declaration of his desire to be retained in office.

This section is alternative to and cumulative with the methods of removal of judges and justices provided in parts 1 and 2 of Article 8 and Article 6.1 of this Constitution. Amendment initiated by the people; approved at regular election Nov. 5, 1974; effective Dec. 5, 1974.

Sec. 40. Option for counties with less than-one hundred fifty thousand persons

Notwithstanding any provision of this article to the contrary, any county having a population of less than one hundred fifty thousand persons, according to the United States census, may choose to select its judges of the superior court or of courts of record inferior to the superior court as if it had a population of one hundred fifty thousand or more persons. Such choice shall be determined by vote of the qualified electors of such county voting on the question at an election called for such purpose by resolution of the board of supervisors of such county. If such qualified electors approve, the provisions of sections 12, 28, 30 and 35 through 39 shall apply as if such county had a population of one hundred fifty thousand persons or more. Amendment initiated by the people; approved at regular election Nov. 5, 1974: effective Dec. 5, 1974.

ARTICLE VI.I

COMMISSION ON JUDICIAL QUALIFICATIONS

Sec. 1. Composition; appointment; term; vacancies

A commission on judicial qualifications is created to be composed of nine persons consisting of two judges of the court of appeals, two judges of the superior court and one justice of the peace, who shall be appointed by the supreme court, two members of the state bar of Arizona, who shall be appointed by the governing body of such bar association, and two citizens who are not judges, retired judges nor members of the state bar of Arizona, who shall be appointed by the governor subject to confirmation by the senate in the manner prescribed by law.

Terms of members of the commission shall be four years, except that if a member ceases to hold the position that qualified him for appointment his membership on the commission terminates. An appointment to fill a vacancy for an unexpired term shall be made for the remainder of the term by the appointing power of the original appointment. Amendment referred by the Legislature; approved at the regular election Nov. 2, 1976; effective Nov. 22, 1976.

Sec. 2. Disqualification of judge

A judge is disqualified from acting as a judge, without loss of salary, while there is pending an indictment or an information charging him in the United States with a crime punishable as a felony under Arizona or federal law, or a recommendation to the supreme court by the commission on judicial qualifications for his removal or retirement.

Sec. 3. Suspension or removal of judge

On recommendation of the commission on judicial qualifications, or on its own motion, the supreme court may suspend a judge from office without salary when, in the United States, he pleads guilty or no contest or is found guilty of a crime punishable as a felony under Arizona or federal law or of any other crime that involves moral turpitude under such law. If his conviction is reversed the suspension terminates, and he shall be paid his salary for the period of suspension. If he is suspended and his conviction becomes final the supreme court shall remove him from office.

Sec. 4. Retirement of judge

On recommendation of the commission on judicial qualifications, the supreme court may retire a judge for disability that seriously interferes with the performance of his duties and is or is likely to become permanent, and may censure or remove a judge for action by him that constitutes wilful misconduct in office, wilful and persistent failure to perform his duties, habitual intemperance or

conduct prejudicial to the administration of justice that brings the judicial office into disrepute.

A judge retired by the supreme court shall be considered to have retired voluntarily. A judge removed by the supreme court is ineligible for judicial office in this state.

Sec. 5. Definitions and rules implementing article

The term "judge" as used in this constitutional amendment shall apply to all justices of the peace, judges of the superior court, judges of the court of appeals and justices of the supreme court. The supreme court shall make rules implementing this article and providing for confidentiality of proceedings. A judge who is a member of the commission or supreme court shall not participate as a member in any proceedings hereunder involving his own censure, removal or involuntary retirement.

Sec. 6. Article self-executing

The provisions of this article shall be self-executing.

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
