Residents in Wisconsin Juvenile Correctional Institutions on December 31, 1981 With Five-Year Trends for 1977-1981

This bulletin describes the residents in Wisconsin juvenile correctional institutions on December 31, 1981. Male juveniles were housed at Ethan Allen School and Lincoln Hills School. Female juveniles were housed at Lincoln Hills School, the only coeducational institution.

The number of juvenile residents declined 3.8 percent from 495 in 1980 to 476 at year-end 1981. (The total of 476 is lower than the total of 495 which was the lowest December 31 total since 1959, when there were 593 juvenile residents.) The decline is attributable primarily to the revised Children's Code, which went into effect in November, 1978. Under the revised Code, juveniles can be placed in Division of Corrections custody only if adjudged delinquent for an act which would be punishable by a sentence of six months or more if committed by an adult, and only if found to be a danger to the public and in need of restrictive custodial treatment.) The number of boys dropped 4.6 percent, from 460 to 439, while the number of girls rose 5.7 percent, from 35 to 37.

Whites, including 3.2 percent of Hispanic origin, comprised 67.9 percent of the male juvenile population, up from 63.2 percent a year ago. The proportion of Blacks declined from 29.3 percent to 27.6 percent and the proportion of Native Americans (Indian) from 7.4 percent to 4.6 percent.

Percentage comparisons for female juveniles are inappropriate because of the small number of residents. At year-end 1981, 28 of the 37 female residents were White, 5 were Black, and 4 were Native American. Of 35 in residence a year earlier, 24 were White, 8 were Black, and 2 were Native American.

Median age for boys resident on December 31, 1981, remained the same at 16.5 years. The median age for girls increased from 16.1 years to 16.4 years.

The percentage of boys who had been institutionalized less than three months as of December 31 increased from the previous year, from 35.9 percent to 36.9 percent. The proportion of boys with lengths of stay six months or more increased 4.8 percentage points to 39.6 percent. However, there was a decrease of 5.8 percent in the proportion of those with three to six-months lengths of stay.

The proportion of girls who had been institutionalized less than three months fell 11.1 percentage points to 46.0 percent and the proportion institutionalized six months or more fell 7.3 percentage points to 27.0 percent. The proportion whose length of stay was three to six months rose to 27.0 percent.

Among juvenile males resident on December 31, 1981, the proportion of those who had been admitted as new commitments rose to 83.4 percent from 78.9 percent in 1980 and the proportion of returns from aftercare decreased to 13.3 percent from 17.8 percent in 1980. The percentage of females who had been admitted as new commitments increased from 88.6 percent in 1980 to 89.2 percent in 1981 and the percentage returned from aftercare increased from 8.6 percent in 1980 to 10.8 percent in 1981. The proportion of juveniles who had been returned pending a revocation hearing declined to 3.2 percent for boys and zero percent for girls.

Juvenile residents on December 31, 1981, were committed by 54 of Wisconsin's 72 counties. Milwaukee County committed 41.2 percent of the juvenile male residents and 16.2 percent of the female residents compared with 38.7 percent of the boys and 28.6 percent of the girls resident at year-end 1980.

Juvenile girls were committed by 20 counties. Milwaukee County committed 6 of the 37 residents, while Dane, Kenosha, Rock, and Waukesha Counties committed 3 each. No other county committed more than 2 of the female residents.
