

## I. INTRODUCTION

The Maryland Legislature, during the 1982 session, appropriated \$100,000 as planning money for the possible development of a maximum security institution for juveniles. Associated with this appropriation was a request to the Governor that he study the feasibility of the development of such a facility, and report his findings back to the legislature during the 1983 Legislative Session.

As an initial phase of this study, the Juvenile Services Administration conducted a phone survey of the fifty states and the District of Columbia, to determine trends in usage of maximum security facilities nationwide. Responses were received from all states except Connecticut, who was unwilling to give information over the phone. A letter was sent requesting the needed information, but a response has not been received to date.

Individual Fact Sheets on each state plus the District of Columbia are included in Section II. Section III is a Summary and Conclusions of the survey.

The staffing pattern may include psychiatrists, psychologists, and additional youth counselors and group supervisors. In the education program, the staff/ward ratio is 1 staff member to 15 wards, but in the special treatment programs, additional teachers may be assigned to the living unit. The findings of the Youth Authority study, released in October, 1967, disclosed there was no statistical evidence of a differential effect on recidivism rates for youthful offenders released from camp programs versus youthful offenders released from institutional programs, when the selection of wards was controlled. A study in 1979 shows that the recidivism rate for those released from nonsecure "camps" is lower than that for those released from more secure institutions. However, this data must be interpreted with caution. The difference in rates can be attributed solely to the fact that the better risk wards experience the camp program.

#### ARIZONA

Classifies juveniles according to property vs. person offenses. Crimes against property average 30 days; crimes against persons 7-8 months on average. One 26 bed unit that uses a psychiatric approach; primarily for emotionally disturbed delinquents, average stay 14-16 months. Transfer through use of I level classification system.

#### CONNECTICUT

Adult facilities take youth 16 and over.

#### DELAWARE

Dual classification system - one based on treatment, one on security. Juveniles committing offenses that would be waived in Maryland, committed to juvenile institution; between 18 and 21, transferred to adult institution, if sentence requires length of stay that goes beyond 18th-21st birthday.

#### FLORIDA

Sensing devices on fences around two training schools; use blood hounds to search for AWOLS.

#### IDAHO

In sec re un 7, 4 beds reserved for Part I Offenders, 21 for adjudicated delinquents. Average stay for Part I - 1 year, remainder - 6 months.

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While they don't have maximum security units, they have what they call "closed beds" units where all programming is inside the unit. Length of stay normally 30 days or less. Are a few due to their crimes or behavior in institutions who stay up to six months. Total of 150 closed beds throughout institutional system. Some of these youth have opportunity to go outside, some do not.

Everything for juveniles fall under Department of Human Resources; institutions under Department of Corrections. No continuity of services and lot of conflict between institutions and aftercare.

One 15-20 bed unit for treatment, one for discipline. One 13 bed unit for females. Minimum length of stay for treatment is 6 weeks. Have reality therapy program that is several years old, and the AWOLS have reduced from 350 the first year to 220 this past year.

The 50 bed maximum security facility has both detention and commitment programs. Staff ratio: 2 staff per child. Six to twelve month length of stay in two units, 2 years in Kennedy School (15 beds); short term treatment, 28-60 day length of stay.

In maximum security institutions, 70% over 18 years old.

Maximus secu ity institutions capacities are: 55, 85, 29, 18, 40, 80, and 20. Two additional institutions according to survey.

#### ILLINOIS

32 beds of the maximum security facility are reserved for emotionally disturbed delinquents; average length of stay - 11 months. All youngsters under 18, are transferred to adult facility after 18 if length of sentence requires it. Adult facilities do not include youths under 18.

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#### TOWA

In process of deinstitutionalization. They are doing a lot of waivers of serious offenses for juveniles under 16.

Mandated by legislation to build a maximum security institution.

SUMMARY AND CONCLUSIONS

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Of the 48 states and District of Columbia surveyed, 10 had a separate maximum security institution for juveniles. In addition, 3 states that did not consider their institution maximum security, did have perimeter fencing. In addition, 21 states had maximum security units on the grounds of their training school which handled long-term treatment for aggressive juveniles. Many of the states including those noted also had disciplinary units similar to what we have in Maryland.

Six states are presently planning to build new secure institutions ranging in size from 15 to 30 beds, and one state is planning to build a 120 bed fenced-in facility, but not considered maximum security. One state is planning to build a 20 bed secure unit, and another state is planning to replace a 20 bed unit with a 25 bed unit.

It should be noted that most states with secure facilities or units have central commitment to the agency with transfer provisions to the secure unit or facilities as opposed to direct commitment to the secure facility by the Court.

Of the 48 states and D.C. surveyed, 34 responses indicated some form of long term secure treatment for juveniles, and 8 states are presently expanding the number of secure beds or building new secure beds. Most of the secure units or facilities are limited to 50 or less beds.

In conclusion, it is recommended that if Maryland intends to build a maximum secure facility, the following be considered:

- 1. The facility should be limited to 50 beds or less and each unit should house 20 or less students.
- 2. Minimum length of stay in a secure facility should be one (1) year.
- 3. Children should be centrally committed to the agency rather than to the facility, and the agency should make the decision as to which youngsters should be placed in the secure unit or facility.
- 4. If the secure unit or facility is built, a classification system should be developed by the agency in order to determine which youngsters are placed in this secure unit or facility.
