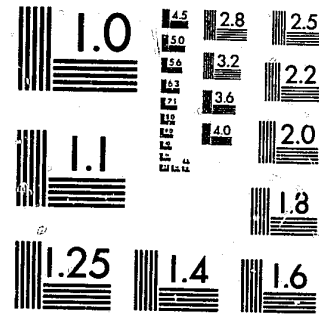

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INTRODUCTION

VOLUME IV: DIRECTORY OF JUSTICE SYSTEM AGENCIES AND PROGRAMS

The Virginia Criminal Justice System represents an amalgam of different interests, agencies, and missions varying greatly in complexity, size, and sophistication. Extending from Federal through local service units, the system in total contains many private as well as public agencies and personnel, each tailoring its mission to a specific clientele within the system.

Volume IV: Directory of Justice System Agencies and Programs provides ready indexing of the many elements comprising the total spectrum of criminal justice activity in Virginia. The entire enterprise is seen to consist of thousands of persons attending a multitude of criminal justice services and programs, such as training, Crime Prevention, Career Criminal, Community Diversion, Victim/Witness Assistance, Victim Compensation, Pre- and Post-Incarceration Services, Alcohol Safety and Rehabilitation, Substance Abuse, Crisis Intervention, a vast array of juvenile programs, and so forth.

While not all jurisdictions maintain the same level of service, a directory of departments, programs, and services makes contact available to localities desiring to initiate some new type of program with a particular locality which has already had the experience in implementing something similar.

It is within this context that the DCJS can serve as a focal point for the cooperative exchange of information designed to enhance the level of service provided by the entire Virginia criminal justice community.
