

#### INTRODUCTION

The 1981 Annual Drug Report of the Alaska State Troopers reflects change and growth in Narcotic Enforcement throughout the State of Alaska. A new Narcotic Enforcement Unit began work in Southeast Alaska and existing units were beefed up.

This report is a summary of several Narcotic Enforcement Activities throughout the State and reflects arrests and seizures by two (2) major Law Enforcement groups.

One group is comprised of full-time Narcotic Enforcement units described as follows:

- Anchorage Metro made up of both Alaska State Troopers and Anchorage City Police Officers supervised by a City Police Lieutenant.
- Fairbanks Metro made up of Alaska State Troopers and Fairbanks City Police Officers supervised by a Trooper Sergeant.
- Anchorage Airport Detail made up of State Troopers and a Drug Detection Dog.
- Southcentral Area Narcotics Unit. Known as "S.C.A.N.", headed by a Trooper Sergeant based in Soldotna with support from the various local Police agencies on the Kenai Peninsula, Kodiak, Cordova and Valdez.
- Southeast Alaska Narcotic Enforcement Team. Known as "S.E.A.N.E.T.", headed by a Trooper Sergeant in Juneau and supported by all Southeast Alaska Police agencies. This new unit was made possible by Legislative funding of the Trooper Budget to provide the full-time Trooper Sergeant's position in Juneau to coordinate the Southeast Drug Enforcement efforts.

These five (5) units are coordinated through a Statewide coordinator in the Trooper Criminal Investigation Bureau in Anchorage. This office provides buy funds and undercover agents to the five (5) units.

The second major group whose arrests and seizures are reflected in this Annual Report are all other Police agency personnel and uniformed Troopers in Detachments around the State.

State and local agencies continue to work closely with the Federal Drug Enforcement Agency. The DEA is especially helpful in cases involving conspiracy to import narcotics and when attempting to go after suppliers in the lower states and Hawaii.

The Coast Guard, Customs, FBI and the military all cooperate in cases of mutual interest with State and local agencies.

#### SUMMARY OF DRUG ENFORCEMENT DURING 1981

Drug Enforcement throughout Alaska during 1981 continued to be a mutual effort by State and local agencies using funds provided to the Troopers by the Legislature specifically for Drug Enforcement.

The Troopers received increased funding for Drug Enforcement during 1981 and these funds were used to expand enforcement efforts Statewide rather than limit efforts to Fairbanks, Anchorage and Juneau. Below is a list of communities where Drug Enforcement investigations were opened using undercover agents and State funds in cooperation with local Police or resident Troopers.

There is an addition to this report this year in the form of a chart showing Department of Public Safety Laboratory Test activity for 1980-1981 (See Fig. 3). It is significant there was an 84.6% increase in total laboratory tests made on drug items in 1981 over 1980. There was a 77% increase in actual

number of items submitted. This laboratory performs tests for all Police agencies throughout the State, including the Troopers and is a good barometer of the increase in enforcement activity as well as a reflection of the increasing drug usage noticed by Narcotic Investigators throughout the State.

The Statewide coordinator spent \$243,353.87 in contractural services money during calendar year 1980 and \$444,089.68 during 1981. These funds provide the buy money and undercover agents used by all agencies in the State and are indicative of increased enforcement efforts and increased funding provided by the Legislature.

The new S.E.A.N.E.T. Unit began work during 1981 and it should be noted in the statistical portion of this report that there is a great increase in arrests and seizures over past years.

## SUMMARY CONCLUSION

There has been a determined effort by local agencies, State Troopers, the administration, the Legislature and the courts to curb and to the extent possible, control the illegal sale and possession of narcotics and dangerous drugs in Alaska.

#### DATA COLLECTION

Statistics and data pertaining to statewide drug enforcement is a compilation of the FBI's Uniform Crime Report (UCR) information collected and compiled by the Office of Criminal Justice Assistance within the State Department of Law, from the Alaska Court System, the Department of Public Safety Statewide and most local police departments.

All local Alaska police departments enforce drug laws as do the Alaska State Troopers and the federal law enforcement agencies in Alaska. However, not all of these agencies report information to the UCR program which is compiled by the Office of Criminal Justice Assistance. Twenty (20) of the twenty-six (26) local police departments plus the Alaska State Troopers contributed data for 1981. Some smaller local police departments did not participate in the UCR data system. It should be noted that these agencies experience very few drug problems which do not involve state drug enforcement Units or one of the large police departments. The state drug enforcement units or Alaska State Troopers are usually contacted on any significant Alaska drug cases which involve federal law enforcement officers. A comprehensive report of drug activity in Alaska is thus available by a critical review and assimilation of the data reported by the agencies participating in the UCR program.

The continuing goal of the Department of Public Safety in creating the Annual Report is to establish a comprehensive report of the drug enforcement program in Alaska.

#### STATISTICAL OVERVIEW

This 1981 Drug Report for Alaska is the result of a dedicated effort to consolidate the complex reporting data involved in drug statistics. Drug trafficking and distribution are world-wide activities involving numerous persons. Drug Enforcement for the same reason is, and must continue to be a cooperative effort often involving many different agencies. The results

detailed in the enclosed figures and tables are designed to be readily discernible by those reviewing the report. However, it should be noted that many police agencies and departments may be involved with an arrest or seizure listed in any particular region or agency. The main thrust of the organization of this report is to illustrate the primary area or jurisdiction in which a seizure or arrest occurred. In addition, the drug arrests or seizures which resulted from a cooperative effort of: Drug Enforcement Units, Police Departments, Federal Agencies and State Troopers, were tabulated under the Drug Enforcement Unit involved. This methodology was designed to eliminate duplication of information and in no way detracts from the dedicated efforts by the agencies involved.

It should be apparent that the true measurement of drug activity and investigative results is not readily available by simply adding the statistics furnished by the different enforcement agencies. This report has screened out duplicative information to the extent possible and efforts continue to further refine drug reporting in Alaska.

The following tables and graphs use certain common terms, which are explained, as follows:

NUMBER OF ARRESTS - Actual number of individuals arrested, cited or summoned for drug violations during the period specified.

OFFENSE CHARGE - The basic charges used to describe the drug offense. The general charge categories are detailed below:

SALE/NARCOTICS - Possession for sale or criminal activity relating to sale of opium, heroin, morphine, cocaine, codeine or related drugs.

SALE/MARIJUANA - Possession for sale or criminal activity relating to sale of hashish, marijuana or other related drugs.

SALE/SYNTHETIC NARCOTICS - Possession for sale or criminal activity relating to sale of methadone, demerol or related drugs.

SALE/DANGEROUS DRUGS - Possession for sale or criminal activity relating to sale of barbiturates, amphetamines, henzebrine, hallucinogens, tranquilizers, LSD or related drugs.

<u>USE/NARCOTICS</u> - Possession for use, furnish, transport, manufacture, cultivate or obtain unlawfully: opium, heroin, morphine, cocaine, codeine or related drugs.

<u>USE/MARIJUANA</u> - Possession for use, furnish, transport, manufacture, cultivate or obtain unlawfully: hashish, marijuana or other related drugs.

<u>USE/SYNTHETIC NARCOTICS</u> - Possession for use, furnish, transport, manufacture, cultivate or obtain unlawfully: methadone, demerol or other related drugs.

<u>USE/DANGEROUS DRUGS</u> - Possession for use, furnish, transport, manufacture, cultivate, obtain unlawfully: barbiturates, amphetamines, benzedrine, hallucinogens, tranquilizer, LSD or other related drugs.

NUMBER OF ARRESTS UNDER 18 - Juvenile drug offenders arrested up to, but not including 18 years old at time of offense.

NUMBER OF ARRESTS 18 OR OVER - Drug offenders 18 years or older at time of offense.

TOTAL DRUG CASES OPENED - Number of drug-related offenses or cases reported for the period specified.

PERCENTAGE (%) CHANGE COMPARED TO PREVIOUS YEAR - This percentage figure compares the current year value against the previous year and can be either positive (+) if increasing, or negative (-) if decreasing. The formula for this percentage comparison is:

% Change for = (<u>Current Yr. Value</u>) - (<u>Previous Yr. Value</u>) x 100 Current Year (<u>Previous Year Value</u>) <u>DRUG SEIZURE</u> - Amount of drugs seized during the reporting period. The standard reporting units used for seizure of drugs is as follows:

- a. <u>HEROIN</u> Weight in grams with a relative purity specified. (100% maximum)
- b. <u>COCAINE</u> Weight in grams with a relative purity specified. (100% maximum)
- c. <u>HASHISH</u> Weight in grams.
- d. MARIJUANA Weight in pounds or ounces.
- e. PHARMACEUTICAL DRUGS Dosage unit for specified drug.

DRUG VALUE - The street value of the specified drug seized. This value is determined as a state-wide value based on the volume of the drug on the illicit state market during the period specified. It should be noted that a drug purchased in large quantities which is relatively pure will have a street value far in excess of the initial price paid for the drug.

For computation purposes, the breakdown prices that determine street value are as follows:

Marijuana – Per Ounce	\$ 80.00
LSD - Per Tablet	5.00
Amphetamines – Per Hundred	300.00
Heroin - Per Gram (assumed 4% pure)	150.00
Cocaine - Per Gram (assumed 30% pure)	
Hashish - Per Gram	125.00 10.00

The information contained in Figure 11 is indicative of the number of persons arrested for drug violations for 1981 compared to the total number of persons in the Alaska Court System for drug offenses.

This table is organized on a regional basis for comparison purposes. It should be noted that the total number of individuals in the court system includes some figures from previous year arrests for these offenses. Significant factors to be noted in Figure 11 are the volume of narcotic, dangerous and synthetic drug violators in the Judicial System and the large percentage of arrests which result in court activity.




