### INTRODUCTION

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
The report presents data on the major crime classifications, Violent and Property, for the state and the counties. It compares 1982 to the previous 5 years in terms of rates, adjusting for population and

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




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### 1982 Statewide Crime Summary

- The 35 reported murders in 1982 were 5° less than 1981 and are below the 5 year average (1977-1981) of 38 per year.
- 188 reported rape offenses are the highest ever recorded. The 1982 Rape total is far above the 1977-1981 average of 147 per year.
- Robberies declined from 838 in 1981 to 734 in 1982. Robbery is at its lowest level since 1973, and is below the 1977-1981 average of 824 per year.
- There was no significant change in the number of Robbery offenses involving the use of Deadly Weapons (firearm or knife) over the past 7 years.
- Aggravated Assault Aggravated Assaults totaled 2,081 in 1982, up from 1,987 in 1981. 1982 was the second highest year for assaults (1979 Highest). The 5 year average preceeding 1982 was 1,717 per year.
  - There was no significant change in the number of assault offenses involving a firearm, however offenses involving knives have increased.
  - The total number of violent offenses has remained stable from 1981 to 1982. (3,034 in 1981 vs. 3,038 in 1982).
  - This stability has resulted in a slightly lower Violent Crime Rate (crime per 100,000 population) due to the projected population increase.\*
  - Delaware's Violent Crime Rate for 1982 continues to be below the national level.
  - Burglary offenses fell from 9,612 in 1981 to 8,825 in 1982. Burglary offenses are at the lowest point since 1974, and are far below the 5 year average (1977-1981) of 9,418 per annum.
  - Larceny offenses have dropped for the first time since 1977, from 24,686 in 1981 to 23,984 in 1982. Larceny remains slightly higher than the 1977-1981 average of 23,131. (During the 77-81 period Larceny increased at a rate of 646 per year). Delaware has one of the highest Larceny rates in the Nation (7th in 1981)

. Motor Vehicle Theft - 2,489 Motor Vehicles were reported stolen in 1982 compared to 2,556 in 1981. The 1982 level is the lowest since 1972 and is below the 1977-1981 5 year average of 2,736 per year.

> - The total of property offenses had declined slightly in 1982 (35,298) from 1981 (36,854). This is the first decline since 1977. (The decline is due primarily to the decline in Larceny). Offenses for 1982 were equivalent to the 5 year average of 35,285. (During the 77-81 time span Property Crime increased by approximately 592 offenses per year).


- The Property Crime rate declined from 6127.8 offenses per 100,000 population in 1981 to 5815.7 in 1982, due to both a reduction in crime and an increase in the projected population.

- Delaware's property crime rates continue to be greater than the nations.

- The total number of arrests made for Index offenses remained stable (7,735 in 1981; 7,681 in 1982.) Adult arrests rose by 335 in 1982 while Juvenile arrests fell by 389.

- The arrest rate for Index offenses fell from 1394.7 arrests per 100,000 population in 1981 to 1266 in 1982.


- The incarceration rate, the number of sentenced prisoners per 100,000 population, rose in 1982 from 233.8 in 1981 to 288.5





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
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



The figure shows the magnitude of the crime problem and the relative response to crime by arrests and one sanction element,



Firearm use in Delaware was down 3.0% for Robberies and Aggravated Assault over 1981 but remains higher than the 5 year

Knife or Cutting Instrument use is most heavily seen in the crime of Assault. In Robbery and Assault use of a knife has increased by 2.2% and continues a general trend of growth in this type of offense. The 461 offenses' recorded in 1982 is considerably greater than the 1977-1981 average of 379 per year.

The use of Other Dangerous Instruments in Assault and Robbery has increased heavily, continuing a six year trend. The 962 offenses in 1982 are far greater than the 5 year (1977-1981) average of 650





in 1982, a 4.7 percent decrease from the amount in 1981.



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
### Robbery

Robbery as a whole fell by 10.8% in 1982. While the distribution of Robbery types did not change in 1982, the amount stolen in Highway and Commercial incidents rose by 8.7% and 23.2% respectively. Residential losses declined by 65.7%, 1981 however was an unusually

While there has been a 22.8% decline in Burglary losses in 1982 there has been no significant shift in the distribution of Burglary



### Larceny


Larceny represents the largest single category of crime in Delaware, 62.8% of all crime index offenses in 1982. There were no significant changes in the distribution of larceny types in

### Type of Property Stolen/Recovered

The distribution of property stolen has remained stable with the exception of jewelry and precious metals which dropped from 18 to 11% of total property stolen. Approximately 24% of all stolen property was recovered in 1982. However, motor vehicles accounted for 68.4% of all recovered property (down from 79.1% last year).
