

<u>Definitions As Used In This Volume</u>

ADOPTION, GUARDIANSHIP -- This includes all adoptions and guardianships including regular adoptions, guardianship with right to adoption and guardianship with right to consent to long-term case short of adoption. Guardianships of incompetents are reported in "Other - General Equity."

<u>ADULT</u> -- A person who is 18 years old or older charged with an offense relating to juveniles to be heard in Juvenile Court.

APPEAL -- The resorting to a higher court to reverse or correct a decision of a tribunal below. This includes appeals to the circuit court, the Court of Appeals, and the Court of Special Appeals.

Appeals to the circuit courts include:

- 1. Record The judge's review of a written or electronic recording of the proceedings in the District Court.
- 2. De Novo The retrial of an entire case initially tried in the District Court.
- 3. Administrative Agency Appeals from decisions rendered by administrative agencies. For example:

County Commissioner
Department of Taxation and Assessments
Employment Security
Liquor License Commissioners
State Comptroller (Sales Tax, etc.)
State Motor Vehicle Authority
Supervisors of Elections
Tax Court
Workmen's Compensation Commission
Zoning Appeals
Any other administrative body from which an appeal is authorized.

APPLICATION FOR LEAVE TO APPEAL -- Procedural method by which a petitioner seeks leave of the Court of Special Appeals to grant an appeal. When granted, the matter addressed is transferred to the direct appeal docket of the Court for customary briefing and argument. Maryland Statutes and Rules of Procedure permit applications in matters dealing with post conviction, inmate grievances and denial of or grant of excessive bail in habeas corpus proceedings.

<u>CASE</u> -- A matter having a unique docket number; includes original and reopened (post judgment) matters. (Note: In fiscal 1982, reopened matters only include those cases which had a hearing.)

<u>CASELOAD</u> -- The total number of cases filed or pending with a court during a specific period of time. Cases may include all categories of matters (law, equity, juvenile, and criminal).

C.I.N.A. -- Child in Need of Assistance -- Refers to a child who needs the assistance of the court because:

- 1. The child is mentally handicapped or
- 2. Is not receiving ordinary and proper care and attention and
- 3. The parents, guardian or custodian are unable or unwilling to give proper care and attention.

C.I.N.S. -- Child in Need of Supervision -- Refers to a child who requires guidance, treatment or rehabilitation because of habitual truancy, ungovernableness or behavior that would endanger himself or others. Also included in this category is the commission of an offense applicable only to children.

<u>CONDEMNATION</u> -- The process by which property of a private owner is taken for public use without the owner's consent but upon the award and payment of just compensation.

CONTESTED CONFESSED JUDGMENT -- Contesting by a debtor of a judgment entered for a creditor immediately upon filing of a written statement by the creditor to the court.

CONTRACTS -- A case involving a dispute over an oral or written agreement between two or more parties.

Breaches of verbal or written contracts Landlord/tenant appeals from District Court Some attachments and removals Some claims for summary judgments

<u>DELINQUENCY</u> -- Commission of an act by a juvenile which would be a crime if committed by an adult.

DISPOSITION -- Entry of final judgment in a case.

DISTRICT COURT - CONTESTED -- Only applies to civil, a case that has gone to trial and both parties (plaintiff and defendant) appear.

<u>DISTRICT COURT CRIMINAL CASE</u> -- Single defendant charged per single incident. It may include multiple charges arising from the same incident.

DISTRICT COURT FILING -- The initiation of a civil action or case in the District Court. District Court criminal and motor vehicle cases are reported as "processed" rather than as "filed."

DIVORCE, NULLITY -- A proceeding to dissolve a marriage. Original filings under this category include divorce a vinculo matrimonii, divorce a mensa et thoro, and annulment. A reopened case under this category includes hearings held after final decree or other termination in the original case. A reopened case may involve review of matters other than the divorce itself as long as the original case was a divorce. (Examples of the latter may be a contempt proceeding for nonpayment of support, noncompliance with custody agreement, modification of support, custody, etc.)

DOCKET -- Formal record of court proceedings.

EQUITY HEARING -- See "Trials."

FILING -- Formal commencement of a judicial proceeding by submitting the necessary papers pertaining to it. Original filing under one docket number and subsequent reopenings (post judgment) under the same number are counted as separate filings. (Note: In fiscal 1982, reopened filings include only those reopened cases which had a hearing.)

FISCAL YEAR -- The period of time from July 1 of one year through June 30 of the next. For example: July 1, 1982 to June 30, 1983.

HEARINGS

<u>Criminal or Law</u> -- Any activity occurring in the courtroom or in the judges' chambers on the record and/or in the presence of a clerk is considered a hearing (except motions to continue or trials). Electronic recording equipment, for definition purposes, is the equivalent to the presence of a court reporter.

Examples of Hearings in Criminal

Arraignment
Demurrer
Motion to quash
Motion to dismiss
Motion for change of venue
Discovery motions
Motion to suppress
Motion to sever

Examples of Hearings in Law

Motion to compel an answer to an interrogatory
Motion ne recipiatur
Motion for judgment by default
Demurrer
Motion for summary judgment
Motion to vacate, open, or modify confession of judgment

Equity -- A presentation either before a judge or before a master empowered to make recommendations, on the record or in the presence of a clerk or court reporter, for purposes other than continuance or final determination of the facts of the case. Electronic recording equipment, for definition purposes, is the equivalent to the presence of a court reporter.

Examples of Hearings in Equity

Preliminary motions presented in court, except motions for continuance

Determination of alimony pendente lite, temporary custody, etc., in a divorce case

Contempt or modification hearings

<u>Juvenile</u> -- A presentation before a judge, master, or examiner on the record in the presence of a clerk or court reporter. Electronic recording equipment, for definition purposes, is the equivalent to the presence of a court reporter.

Examples of Hearings in Juvenile

Preliminary motions presented in court Arraignment or preliminary inquiry Detention (if after filing of petition) Merits or adjudication Disposition Restitution Waiver Review Violation of probation

INDICTMENT -- The product of a grand jury proceeding against an individual.

INFORMATION -- Written accusation of a crime prepared by the State's Attorney's Office.

<u>JURY TRIAL PRAYER - MOTOR VEHICLE</u> -- A request for trial by jury in the circuit court for a charge normally heard in the District Court. A jury trial prayed for a motor vehicle case carries a sentence of more than six months.

<u>JURY TRIAL PRAYER - OTHER (CRIMINAL)</u> -- A request for a trial by jury in the circuit court for charges normally heard in the District Court, <u>except</u> traffic charges or nonsupport.

MISCELLANEOUS DOCKET -- Established for and maintained primarily as a method of recording and identifying those preliminary proceedings or collateral matters before the Court of Appeals other than direct appeals.

MOTOR TORTS -- Personal injury and property damage cases resulting from automobile accidents. (This does not include consent cases.)

MOTOR VEHICLE APPEALS -- An appeal of a District Court verdict in a traffic charge.

NOLLE PROSEQUI -- A formal entry upon the record by the plaintiff in a civil suit, or the State's Attorney in a criminal case, to no longer prosecute the case.

NONSUPPORT -- A criminal case involving the charge of nonsupport.

ORIGINAL FILING -- See "Filing."

OTHER APPEALS (CRIMINAL) -- An appeal of a District Court verdict except one arising from a traffic charge or nonsupport.

OTHER DOMESTIC RELATIONS -- Matters related to the family other than divorce, guardianship, adoption or paternity. Examples of this category include support, custody, and U.R.E.S.A. cases.

OTHER GENERAL EQUITY -- This category includes, among other things, injunctions, change of name, foreclosure, and guardianship of incompetent persons.

OTHER LAW -- This category includes:

Conversion Attachments on original process
Detinue Mandamus
Ejectment Replevin
Issues from Orphans' Court Trespass

OTHER TORTS -- Personal injury and property damage cases resulting from:

Assault and battery - an unlawful force to inflict bodily injury upon another.

Certain attachments.

Consent tort.

False imprisonment - the plaintiff is confined within boundaries fixed by the defendant for some period of time.

Libel and slander - a defamation of character.

Malicious prosecution - without just cause an injury was done to somebody through the means of a legal court proceeding.

Negligence - any conduct falling below the standards established by law for the protection of others from unreasonable risk of harm.

Miscellaneous.

PATERNITY -- A suit to determine fatherhood responsibility of a child born out of wedlock. A reopened case under this category may involve matters other than the finding of paternity suit. Examples of the latter include reopening the paternity action after having been stetted,

contempt proceeding for nonpayment of child support and modification proceedings to change amount or terms of the decree.

PENDING CASE -- Case in which no final disposition has occurred.

<u>POST CONVICTION</u> -- Proceeding instituted to set aside a conviction or to correct a sentence that was unlawfully imposed.

REOPENED FILING -- The first hearing held on a case after a final judgment on the original matter has been entered.

STET -- Proceedings are stayed; one of the ways a case may be terminated.

TERMINATION -- Same as "Disposition."

TRIALS

CRIMINAL

<u>Court Trial</u> -- A contested hearing on the facts of the case to decide the guilt or innocence of the defendant where one or more witnesses has been sworn.

<u>Jury Trial</u> -- A contested hearing on the facts of the case to decide the guilt or innocence of the defendant, where the jury has been sworn.

EQUITY

Court Trial -- A hearing on the merits of the case either before a judge or before a master empowered to make recommendations, to present evidence for the final disposition, where testimony is given by one or more persons.

Jury Trial -- A contested hearing on the facts of the case to decide in favor of either party where a jury has been sworn.

LAW

Court Trial -- A contested hearing (excluding preliminary motion) on the facts of the case to decide in favor of either party where testimony is given by one or more persons.

Jury Trial -- A contested hearing on the facts of the case to decide in favor of either party where the jury has been sworn.

UNREPORTED CATEGORY -- A filing counted for case type (law, equity, criminal, or juvenile) but not for category within the case type.

THE COURT OF APPEALS

THE COURT OF APPEALS

Matters filed for the September 1982 docket formed the incoming workload of the Court of Appeals for fiscal year 1983. Filings received from March 1 through February 28 were entered on the September Term docket for argument during the period from the second Monday in September through the end of the following June. In this report, filings are counted by Term, March 1 through February 28, and dispositions by fiscal year, July 1 through June 30.

For the September 1982 Term, 877 filings came into the Court. These included: 648 petitions for certiorari; 164 regular cases; 34 attorney discipline proceedings; and 31 miscellaneous appeals, of which 3 were character committee proceedings regarding candidates for the bar and 2 were certified questions of law from the United States District Court. Dispositions for fiscal year 1983 totaled 819, including: 627 petitions for certiorari; 137 regular cases; 32 attorney discipline proceedings; 17 miscellaneous appeals; 3 character committee proceedings; and 3 certified questions of law from Federal courts. In addition to hearing attorney discipline cases, during fiscal 1983, the Court of Appeals admitted 981 persons to the practice of law, including 155 attorneys from other jurisdictions.

Petitioners requested the Court of Appeals to decide their cases through filing petitions for certiorari. The Court determined the cases having issues appropriate for review by the State's highest court, and granted certiorari in those cases. Cases decided by the Court of Special Appeals may be reviewed by certiorari. For District Court

appeals, after the circuit court has heard the initial appeal, the Court of Appeals takes petitions directly. During fiscal year 1983, the Court of Appeals granted 120 (19.1 percent) of the 627 petitions disposed. Although slightly more than half (52 percent) of the petitions disposed concerned criminal cases, less than half (42.5 percent) of the petitions granted concerned criminal cases.

Once certiorari was granted, cases were placed on the regular docket. On its own motion, the Court of Appeals can also add cases to its regular docket from cases pending in the Court of Special Appeals. The Court identifies cases suitable for its consideration from a monthly review of appellants' briefs in the intermediate court. For the 1982 Term, 164 cases were docketed. Of these, 77 were criminal cases and 87 were civil (law, equity, or juvenile). Geographically, 59 cases (36 percent) came from Baltimore City, 63 (38.4 percent) came from the four large suburban counties, and the remaining 42 (25.6 percent) came from the other counties. Of the large counties, the most cases, 23, came from Baltimore County, followed closely by Montgomery County, sending 21 cases. Considerably fewer appeals were from Prince George's County, sending 11, and Anne Arundel County, sending 8. The contributions of the appellate circuits ranked in approximate order of the large counties in them.

The Court of Appeals disposed of 137 cases on the regular docket during fiscal 1983. Of these, 81 were from the 1982 Term, 51 from the 1981 Term, and 5 from the 1983 Term. Pending before the Court as of the end of fiscal 1983 were an equal number, indicating that the Court kept fully current. From the 1982 docket, 83 cases were pending, of which

only 2 remained to be argued at the end of the fiscal year. In addition, 8 cases remained from the 1981 docket; and 46 cases were filed recently on the 1983 docket to be heard during the September 1983 Term. Cases on the 1982 docket that went to argument before June 30, 1983, took an average of 4.1 months from docketing to reach the argument stage. Cases on the 1982 docket decided by June 30, 1983, took an average of 3.1 months between argument and decision. The Court filed a total of 113 majority opinions in fiscal 1983, 12 of which were per curiam. It also filed 16 dissenting opinions, 2 concurring opinions, and 6 dissenting in part and concurring in part.

Of the 137 dispositions, 55 (40.2 percent) concerned criminal cases, 49 (35.8 percent) concerned law cases, 29 (21.2 percent) decided equity cases, and only 4 (2.9 percent) regarded juvenile cases. As to type of disposition, 50 affirmed the lower court, 42 reversed, and 16 vacated and remanded to the lower court. Eight cases each were either dismissed without opinion or remanded without affirmance or dismissal, 6 decisions were affirmed in part and reversed in part, 3 each were either dismissed with opinions or dismissed prior to argument or submission, and 1 was transferred to the Court of Special Appeals. Overall, the balance was about equal between cases affirmed or dismissed and cases reversed or remanded.



REGULAR DOCKET







THE COURT OF SPECIAL APPEALS

THE COURT OF SPECIAL APPEALS

As in the Court of Appeals, matters filed in the Court of Special Appeals for the September 1982 docket formed the incoming workload of the Court of Special Appeals for fiscal year 1983. Filings received from March 1 through February 28 were entered on the September Term docket for argument during the period from the second Monday in September through the end of the following June. In this report, filings are counted by Term, March 1 through February 28, and dispositions by fiscal year, July 1 through June 30.

Continuing the upward climb in caseload over the past decade, the Court of Special Appeals received 1,968 cases on the regular docket for the September 1982 Term. The majority of filings, 1,107 (56.3 percent), were criminal cases; and these accounted for all the increase. The 861 civil cases (43.8 percent of the total) showed a decline of a few cases from last year. In the civil area, the Court uses the procedure of the prehearing conference to identify cases suitable for resolution by the parties. Of 1,071 information reports received during the 1982 Term, identifying the noting of appeals in the circuit courts, the Court assigned 374 (34.9 percent) for prehearing conference. For more than one-third of the cases identified, the burden on the regular docket workload was reduced following the assignment. Directly, 77 cases were dismissed or settled before, at, or as a result of the conference. Issues were limited in another 21 cases, and 4 cases proceeded with expedited appeals. A further 39 cases were dismissed or remanded after the prehearing conference. By clarifying the issues and bringing the

parties together, the prehearing conference procedure saves effort for the Court and appeal costs for the litigants.

Geographically, Baltimore City contributed the largest number of appeals, 620 (31.5 percent). The large counties sent 872 appeals (44.8 percent). Of these, Prince George's County sent the most, 275 (14.0 percent), closely followed by Montgomery County, with 252 (12.8 percent). Baltimore County contributed 180 (9.1 percent), and Anne Arundel County sent 165 (8.4 percent). The proportionate contribution from each appellate circuit followed closely that of the large counties. The circuit court cases tried generated appeals at the rate of 11 percent, calculated as the ratio of 1982 Term regular docket appeals to fiscal year 1982 trials.

Of the 1,808 cases on the regular docket disposed by the Court of Special Appeals during fiscal year 1983, 1,447 (80.0 percent) were from the 1982 Term docket. A further 297 cases (16.4 percent) from the 1981 docket were concluded as well, plus 64 cases (3.5 percent) from the 1983 docket. On June 30, 1983, of the 867 cases pending, the majority, 545 (62.9 percent), were from the 1983 docket in the ordinary course of being scheduled for the current term. Only 316 cases (36.4 percent of all pending) remained undecided from the 1982 Term. These generally were cases argued at the end of the fiscal year awaiting completion of opinions. Only 6 cases (0.7 percent of the pendings) remained from the 1981 docket. These figures depict the Court successfully keeping current with its large caseload. Of the cases from the 1982 docket, those argued or disposed before argument as of June 30, 1983, did so in


an average of 5.7 months. Those decided by June 30, 1983, were decided in an average of 1.1 months from argument.

Nearly two-thirds of the dispositions of the Court of Special Appeals were affirmances of the lower courts. These numbered 1,136 (62.8 percent). While 950 (52.5 percent), barely half, of the disposed cases were criminal matters, 735 (64.7 percent), nearly two-thirds, of the affirmances were for criminal case decisions. Of the 40 juvenile dispositions, 30 (75 percent) were affirmances. Dismissals accounted for 270 (14.9) percent of all dispositions. Virtually all, 256, of these were from law and equity cases. The combined total of affirmances and dismissals in law and equity was similar to that in criminal and juvenile, even though the proportion of direct affirmances was different. The proportion of direct reversals, including full and partial reversals, was similar across the case types. While 61 cases (3.4 percent) were transferred to the Court of Appeals, only 19 (2.0 percent) of criminal appeals were transferred.

In addition to the regular appeals, the Court of Special Appeals also disposed of 128 cases on the post-conviction and miscellaneous dockets during fiscal year 1983. Of 96 post-conviction dispositions, the Court denied applications for leave to appeal in 55 cases, granted 15, remanded 14, and dismissed 12. Of 10 Inmate Grievance Commission cases, the Court denied 9 and dismissed 1 application for leave to appeal. Of 22 other dispositions from the miscellaneous docket, including habeas corpus/bail cases and motions for stays of execution of orders pending appeal, 15 were denied, 5 granted, and 1 each dismissed and remanded.



THE CIRCUIT COURTS

THE CIRCUIT COURTS

FILINGS

Law, equity, juvenile, and criminal case filings amounted to 151,941 in fiscal 1983. This figure also includes 3,643 juvenile causes heard at the District Court level in Montgomery County. With respect to total circuit court caseload, 42.8 percent of the filings were in equity, 22.3 percent in criminal, 19.9 percent in juvenile, and 15.0 percent in the law category.

The fiscal 1983 filings of 151,941 increased statistically by 7.0 percent over the 141,958 filings recorded in fiscal 1982. Increases were registered in all four major functional areas. Criminal filings increased the greatest, up 10.7 percent over the previous fiscal year (33,862 in fy 83 compared to 30,575 in fy 82) followed by equity, up 8.7 percent (65,003 in fy 83 as opposed to 59,781 in fy 82); and law, up 4.6 percent (22,915 in fy 83, 21,852 in fy 82). Juvenile recorded only a slight increase of 1.3 percent (30,161 in fy 83 compared to 29,750 in fy 82).

Several reasons may be cited for these statistical increases. Most significant is the fact that reopened cases are no longer counted from the hearing stage; rather, they are now reported from the date of the filing of the reopened petition. This means that more total filings will result since a number of reopened cases never reach the hearing stage. This system of counting is more reflective of total workload and goes back to a system which was established prior to fiscal 1982. Reopened petitions are more frequently found in domestic relations cases

and this may be one reason why equity case filings rose 8.7 percent in fiscal 1983.

In terms of criminal case filings, just about all of the 3,000 or more additional filings witnessed this year are attributable to one case category -- jury trial prayers. During the 1981 session of the General Assembly, a law was passed, known as the Gerstung Law, which was aimed at reducing the number of requests for a jury trial filed in the District Court and thus requiring transfer of cases to the circuit court (Chapter 608, Acts of 1981). Prior to the initiation of this Act, approximately 12,000 requests were filed in the circuit courts yearly. One year later jury trial prayers had diminished to about half (approximately 6,500 yearly) directly as a result of this bill passage. In fiscal 1983, however, a steady climb in the number of requests has been noticed to the point that we are nearing pre-Chapter 608 levels. About 10,000 requests for jury trials were made in fiscal 1983, thus suggesting that the impact of Gerstung legislation may have somewhat lessened in its second year of implementation.

In fiscal 1983, 18,979 law cases filed in the five major jurisdictions of Baltimore County, Anne Arundel County, Montgomery County, Prince George's County, and Baltimore City accounted for 82.8 percent of the 22,915 State's total law caseload. This represents a 6.9 percent increase from the 17,752 filings recorded for these jurisdictions in fiscal 1982. The other 19 counties recorded 3,936 law cases; only 17.1 percent of the total law filings and representing a 0.4 percent decrease over the 4,100 cases counted last year. Increased law filings were predominantly noted in the metropolitan areas of Maryland: Baltimore

County (up 15.4 percent), Anne Arundel County (up 9.8 percent), Montgomery County (up 8.4 percent), Baltimore City (up 4.0 percent), and Prince George's County (up 2.2 percent).

Equity case filings in the four major jurisdictions and Baltimore City accounted for 45,782 cases or 70.4 percent of the State filings recorded at 65,003. The figures in the major jurisdictions rose by 6.7 percent over the 42,894 cases filed in fiscal 1982. The other 19 counties consumed only 29.6 percent of the total caseload in fiscal 1983, which amounted to 19,221 cases. This represents a growth of 13.8 percent over the 16,887 cases recorded last year. Growing rates of change were calculated for Montgomery County (45.8 percent), Anne Arundel County (19.6 percent), Baltimore County (14.2 percent), and Prince George's County (4.8 percent). Baltimore City was the only major jurisdiction which showed a decrease in equity filings, with an 8.8 percent lower rate.

The Circuit Court for Montgomery County reported that, in exercising jurisdiction formerly held by an orphans' court, it conducted 61 hearings and signed 1,875 orders during fiscal 1983. The Circuit Court for Harford County exercises the same jurisdiction and recorded 25 hearings and signed 410 orders.

Criminal case filings statewide totaled 33,862 in fiscal 1983. The 26,247 criminal filings for the four major jurisdictions and Baltimore City represent an 11.4 percent increase as compared to the 23,553 filings recorded last year. Metropolitan areas continue to consume the large majority of the State's criminal caseload (77.5 percent) compared to the amount of cases filed in the other 19 counties (22.5 percent).

The other 19 counties recorded 7,615 criminal cases compared to 7,022 cases recorded last year, resulting in an 8.4 percent increase. In the metropolitan areas, four of the five major jurisdictions saw criminal case filing increases: Montgomery County (37.4 percent), Prince George's County (25.3 percent), Baltimore County (17.9 percent), and Baltimore City (0.8 percent). Only Anne Arundel County recorded a slight drop in criminal filings in fiscal 1983 with a 2.5 percent rate of designation.

Applications for review of criminal sentences amounted to 226, of which 18 were withdrawn by the applicants. There were 235 applications in 1981-82 and 183 applications in 1980-81. This year the original sentence was decreased in 7 instances and unchanged in 193. No sentences were increased. Since the inception of the procedure to review criminal sentences in 1966, 4,597 applications have been filed.

There were 30,161 juvenile causes recorded statewide in fiscal 1983. This includes the 3,643 causes filed in the District Court for Montgomery County. The four major jurisdictions and Baltimore City were responsible for 25,064 filings or 83.1 percent of the total juvenile caseload; a 1.4 percent increase over last year's figure of 24,697. The other 19 counties recorded 5,097 juvenile filings or 16.9 percent of the total State caseload; an increase of 0.8 percent over last year's figure of 5,053. The following increases and decreases were noted in the metropolitan areas of the State: Anne Arundel County (up 21.4 percent), Montgomery County (up 11.4 percent), Baltimore City (down 0.9 percent), Prince George's County (down 3.5 percent), and Baltimore County (down 6.3 percent).

TERMINATIONS

Terminations reported totaled 126,548 in fiscal 1983 for the four major categories of law, equity, criminal, and juvenile. This figure includes 3,593 juvenile terminations heard at the District Court level in Montgomery County. There were 128,411 case terminations reported in fiscal 1982. Terminations represented 83.2 percent of filings in fiscal 1983.

This year the 15,260 law cases terminated in the five major jurisdictions of Baltimore County, Anne Arundel County, Montgomery County, Prince George's County, and Baltimore City accounted for 78.6 percent of the State's 19,409 law terminations. This represents a 6.2 percent increment over the 15,260 cases terminated for these jurisdictions in fiscal 1982. The other 19 counties terminated 4,149 law cases; only 21.4 percent of the total law terminations. This shows an 8.0 percent decline over the 4,510 cases terminated last year. Statewide, the 19,409 law terminations rose by 3.1 percent over last year's figure of 18,810. In the metropolitan areas, Montgomery County and Baltimore County, terminations rose by 44.0 percent and 32.5 percent. Three jurisdictions, Anne Arundel County, Baltimore City, and Prince George's County, declined in law terminations over the previous fiscal year by 10.7 percent, 11.1 percent, and 8.0 percent, respectively.

Case terminations in the equity category totaled 52,030 statewide, a slight decrease of 0.2 percent over the 52,170 cases terminated last year. The four major jurisdictions and Baltimore City were responsible for 65.4 percent of the terminations or 34,038 cases. This again shows a slight decline of 1.5 percent over the 34,558 terminated last year.

The other 19 counties disposed of 17,992 cases or the remaining 34.6 percent of the equity cases terminated in the State. These terminations amounted to a 2.1 percent increase over the 17,612 equity cases terminated the previous year. Increases in the metropolitan areas of the State were as follows: Montgomery County (74.9 percent), Prince George's County (21.8 percent), and Baltimore County (7.5 percent). Anne Arundel County and Baltimore City declined 4.4 percent and 44.7 percent, respectively.

The number of criminal terminations in the State amounted to 28,729 in fiscal 1983; a 0.6 percent drop over the 28,923 dispositions recorded last year. Baltimore City and the four major jurisdictions disposed of 21,881 cases; 76.1 percent of the total and an increase of 8.1 percent over the 20,230 terminated in fiscal 1982. Nineteen other counties disposed of 6,848 criminal cases this year compared to 8,693 cases last year, resulting in a decrease of 26.9 percent. The total share of the State's criminal terminations by the 19 other counties was 23.9 percent. Accelerations were registered in Montgomery County (25.2 percent), Prince George's County (14.1 percent), Baltimore City (11.5 percent), and Baltimore County (3.9 percent). Anne Arundel County decreased by 14.4 percent.

There were 26,380 juvenile causes terminated statewide in fiscal 1983 which represents a modest decline of 7.4 percent when compared to the 28,508 terminations reported last year. This year's figure includes the 3,593 juvenile causes terminated at the District Court level in Montgomery County. Baltimore City and the four major jurisdictions account for 82.3 percent, or 21,701, of the total State dispositions.

Last year 23,596 causes were terminated by these same jurisdictions, representing 82.8 percent of the total. The other 19 counties terminated 4,679 juvenile causes this year as compared to 4,912 last year; a difference of 4.7 percent. These counties were responsible for a small 17.7 percent of the State's juvenile terminations. Metropolitan jurisdictions reported higher and lower rates of change in fiscal 1983: Anne Arundel County (up 27.6 percent), Montgomery County (up 4.6 percent), Baltimore City (down 18.2 percent), Baltimore County (down 14.4 percent), and Prince George's County (down 7.5 percent).

TRIALS

In fiscal 1983 there were 19,009 dispositions of law cases statewide, of which 2,164 were dispositions by trial and accounted for 11.3 percent of the total. The majority of these trials were court trials, 1,129 or 52.1 percent, compared to the number of jury trials, 1,035 or 37.9 percent. The law jury trial to disposition ratio was lowest in Somerset County at 0.0 percent and highest in Washington County at 10.7 percent. Four metropolitan counties and Baltimore City were responsible for 741, or 71.6 percent, of all law jury trials. The other 19 counties held 294 law jury trials, making up 28.4 percent of the total.

Court trials in law were held in 1,129 cases in Maryland. Anne Arundel County, Baltimore County, Montgomery County, Prince George's County, and Baltimore City heard 808, or 71.6 percent, of the total court law trials, while the other 19 counties heard 321, or 28.4 percent, of the cases. The law court trial to disposition ratio was

highest in Calvert County at 20.4 percent and lowest in Somerset County at 0.0 percent.

The circuit courts reported 28,729 criminal terminations for the fiscal year. There were 7,860 cases (27.3 percent) disposed of by trial. Most trials (5,637 or 71.7 percent) were court trials compared to the number of jury trials (2,223 or 28.3 percent). The majority of jury trials (1,663) were held in the four largest counties and Baltimore City, contributing 73.5 percent to the total 2,223 jury trials held in the State. The other 19 counties contributed to 26.5 percent of the total and recorded 560 jury trials. The criminal jury trial to disposition ratio was lowest in Baltimore County at 1.2 percent and highest in Garrett County at 20.1 percent.

The four largest jurisdictions and Baltimore City were responsible for 3,315, or 58.8 percent, of the total 5,637 criminal court trials. Nineteen other counties held 2,322, or 41.2 percent, of the criminal court trials. The criminal court trial to disposition ratio was lowest in Prince George's County at 0.7 percent and highest in Carroll County at 108.3 percent.

IN THE CIRCUIT COURTS



CIVIL CASES FILED*





'There are two reasons for the decrease in the number of criminal jury trials prayed in 1981-82. Baltimore City changed its counting procedures from individual charges to cases in July 1981 so that now cases represent incidents rather than charges. Secondly, a new law (Ch. 608, Acts of 1981) went into effect on July 1, 1981, and its aim is to reduce the number of jury trials prayers to the circuit courts. This law has been popularly referred to as the "Gerstung Law."

THE DISTRICT COURT

THE DISTRICT COURT

The District Court processed 725,861 motor vehicle cases, 128,185 criminal cases, and 522,800 civil cases in fiscal 1983. The District Court for Montgomery County also reported an additional 3,643 juvenile filings.

Statewide, 193,885 motor vehicle cases went to trial, with the remaining 498,377 being disposed of without trial by payment or forfeiture. Baltimore County recorded the most motor vehicle trials, 49,129, followed by Baltimore City with 31,011 and Montgomery County with 23,424. Kent County registered the smallest number of motor vehicle trials, 328.

Over 39 percent of the District Court criminal caseload was processed in Baltimore City. The four largest counties accounted for 39 percent (52,481 cases) of the criminal workload, with Prince George's having the highest activity, followed by Baltimore, Anne Arundel, and Montgomery Counties. The smallest caseload in the criminal area was noted in Kent County, where 471 cases were terminated.

Filings in the civil area increased by 2.6 percent from 1981-82 to 1982-83. Baltimore City, as usual, accounted for the majority of civil filings, 195,403, followed by Prince George's and Baltimore Counties with 123,951 and 76,815, respectively. Somerset County recorded the smallest number of civil actions, 697.

Statistical charts reflecting the workload of the District Court follow.
