PREFACE

The information in the following report was compiled by the Virginia Department of Corrections, Research and Reporting Unit. The report was prepared by Cynthia Jones, Statistician, and reviewed by Helen S. Hinshaw, Reporting Supervisor. Typesetting and graphs were done by Sharon S. O'Keefe, Graphic Artist. Copies of similar reports on felons paroled and discharged are available for fiscal years 1976 through 1981.

This report includes data on discharges, discretionary parolees, and mandatory parolees. Effective July 1, 1979, legislative action (Code of Virginia, § 53–251.3) required that every person sentenced and committed to any State correctional institution be mandatorily discharged on parole by the Virginia Parole Board when six months remain on the person's sentence. Each person shall have served a minimum of three months of his sentence prior to such a "discharge on parole," Such persons who are so discharged on parole (mandatory parolees) are subject to a minimum of six months supervision,



Felons Paroled and Discharged from the Virginia State Correctional System Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 1982

DISCHARGES

A total of 190 felons were discharged during fiscal year 1982. This represents 54 or 22.1% fewer discharges than the 244 discharges in fiscal year 1981. Of the 190 discharges, 73 or 38.4% were first releases, 104 or 54.7% were discharged after having been returned as mandatory parole violators, and 13 or 6.8% were discretionary parole violators. In total, there were 117 (61.6%) felons discharged who were violators. This is an increase from the 46.3% violators discharged during fiscal year 1981.

First releases served an average of seven months, while violator releases served an average of 39 months. Compared to fiscal year 1981, first releases served three months less, while violator releases served seven months more in fiscal year 1982. All discharges for fiscal year 1982 served an average of 27 months, seven months longer than the fiscal year 1981 discharges served. The longest time served was 14 years, one month.

Over half (112 or 59.0%) of the discharges had committed Offenses Against Property, while 25 or 13.2% had committed Offenses Against Persons. There were 100 (52.6%) felons discharged who had sentences of two years or less, 55 or 29.0% who had sentences of three to five years, and 35 or 18.4% who had sentences of over five years. The longest sentence was 20 years. This felon was discharged after having been returned as a mandatory parole violator.

DISCRETIONARY PAROLEES

There were 2,730 felons discretionarily paroled during fiscal year 1982. This is 427 or 18.5% more discretionary parolees than the 2,303 released in fiscal year 1981. Of the 2,730 discretionary parolees, 2,528 or 92.6% were first releases, 193 or 7.1% were discretionary parole violators, and 9 or 0.3% were mandatory parole violators. In total, there were 202 or 7.4% violators discretionarily paroled during fiscal year 1982.

The average time served by the violators was 84 months, while first releases served an average of 36 months. Fiscal year 1981 first releases served an average of 40 months, while violator releases served 85 months. On the average, all felons discretionarily paroled during fiscal year 1982 served three months less than the felons who were discretionarily paroled during fiscal year 1981. The longest time served was 33 years, 6 months.

Of the 2,730 felons discretionarily paroled, 1,074 or 39.3% had committed Offenses Against Persons, and 1,260 or 46.2% had committed Offenses Against Property. There were 210 (7.7%) parolees who had terms of sentence of two years or less. A total of 1,796 or 65.8% had sentences of less than ten years. There were 28 (1.0%) felons with life sentences who were paroled. During fiscal year 1981, 162 (7.0%) of the felons discretionarily paroled had sentences of two years or less, 1,401 (60.8%) had sentences of less than ten years, and 13 (0.6%) had life sentences.

MANDATORY PAROLEES

A total of 1,713 felons were mandatorily paroled during fiscal year 1982. This represents an increase of 313 or 22.4% from the 1,400 felons mandatorily paroled during fiscal year 1981. Of these, 1,468 or 85.7% were first releases, 189 or 11.0% were discretionary parole violators, and 56 or 3.3% were mandatory parole violators. In total, there were 245 or 14.3% violators mandatorily paroled.

First releases served an average of 16 months, while violators served an average of 49 months. All mandatory parolees served an average of 20 months – 2 months less than the 22 months served by fiscal year 1981 mandatory parolees. The longest time served was 26 years, 2 months.


Of the 1,713 mandatory parolees, 336 or 19.6% committed Offenses Against Persons and 953 or 55.6% committed Offenses Against Property. There were 980 (57.2%) parolees who had sentences of two years or less and 1,637 (95.6%) who had sentences of less than ten years.

TOTAL PAROLES AND DISCHARGES

There were 4,633 felons paroled or discharged during fiscal year 1982. This is 686 or 17.4% more releases than the 3,947 felons paroled and discharged during fiscal year 1981. Of the 4,633 releases for fiscal year 1982, 4,069 or 87.8% were first releases, while 564 or 12.2% were violator releases. The average time served by all parolees and discharges was 32 months – two months less than the 34 months served by fiscal year 1981 releases.


OTHER OUTGOING RELEASES

In addition to the 4,633 felons paroled and discharged during fiscal year 1982, there were two felons pardoned, four released by court order, and 15 felons who died. In total, there were 4,654 felons released during fiscal year 1982.

FISCAL YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 1982








