

SUMMARY OF CRIME ANALYSIS

A series of salient observations may be made herein as a result of the Crime Analysis undertaken by the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council.

The number of reported Part I (major) crimes decreased 9.8% from 1981 to 1982, and was the lowest total since 1975.

Reported burglaries decreased 21.6% and robberies 7.5% from 1981 to 1982.

The strong-arm (without the use of a weapon) technique of street robbery has increased, while gasoline station robberies utilizing handguns have retreated from the levels in evidence last year.

Clearance rates have increased for the crimes of robbery, assault and larceny while remaining constant for burglary. The overall clearance rate for Part I crimes has increased from 12.9% to 14%.

The number of reported incidents of all crime decreased 6.2%.

The overall number of persons arrested increased by 4.3% and the number of persons arrested over the age of 25 increased by 13.4%.

In 1982 the total number of criminal offenses per 100,000 decreased by 3.4% when compared to 1981. This decrease is greater than the decrease in population (.8%) for Nassau County.

The number of Part I property crimes is decreasing faster than that of the violent crimes. At the same time we take notice that the ratio of violent to property crime has increased for the sixth consecutive year.

Assault is the only major crime to evidence an increase in 1981-1982. (8.6%).

\*The data which is the subject of our analysis was provided by the New York State Division of Criminal Justice Services, the F.B.I.'s Uniform Crime Reporting System and the Nassau County Police Department.

As is demonstrated in TABLE I; the reported total of 49,243 incidents of Part I crimes is the lowest report of incidents since 1975. (48,179).

AN EXAMINATION OF THE FIVE YEAR TREND IN PART I CRIMES

As is demonstrated in Table I; reported incidence of Part I Offenses in 1982 decreased 9.8% from the 1981 total and is the lowest in six years (1975-48,179). While the total number of Part I Offenses has decreased, examination of the violent to property crime ratio had increased from .0437 to .0651. This is an increase of 49% in the proportion of violent crimes to property crimes over the five year time span.

CLEARANCE RATE PART I OFFENSES

An offense is "cleared by arrest", or solved for crime reporting purposes, when at least one person is arrested, charged with the commission of the offense and remanded to the courts for prosecution. Table III examines incidence and clearance rates for Part I crimes in Nassau County for 1981 and 1982.

SECTION II IMPACT CRIME

As shown in Table 1 the total reported incidence of robbery decreased by 7.5% in 1982.

BURGLARY:

Burglary demonstrated a significant (21%) decrease in 1982. Residential burglaries continue to be the primary form of burglary in Nassau County comprising 69.6% of the total for burglaries reported in 1982. Of the 9,621 (79.3%) of the burglaries where the time of burglary could be ascertained 38.7% occurred in the day time, while 61.3% occurred at night. Residential burglaries were slightly more likely to occur during the day (51%) while non-residential burglaries occurred at night (93%).

From the above chart we note that residential as opposed to non-residential burglary targets have higher rates of attempted burglaries, and lower rates of forcible entry. These factors may lead to the inference that a residential burglar is more easily discouraged by secure premises and more are likely to respond to a perceived opportunity for breaking in than the non-residential burglar.



- > 25




IMPACT CRIMES 1981-Burglary-Robbery

Section III

PART II INCIDENTS

In 1982 the incidence of Part II crimes decreased by approximately .8% from the 1981 level. Although the overall rate of Part II crimes has remained stable there have been significant increases in incidents of prostitution (+72.5%), Public Disorder (+102%) and Driving while intoxicated (23.4%) and significant decreases in Arson (33.9%) Dangerous Weapons (49.6%) and Criminal Mischief (11.2%). See Table XII

Such incidents of Prostitution, Public Disorder and Driving While Intoxicated are generally incident/arrests. The increase of such incident/arrests are generally the result of Police focus in these areas, i.e., Driving While Intoxicated.

Section IV

A. Incidence of Crime Type by Community

Table VIII provides a record of criminal incidence by the community of occurrence. In order to compile the number of criminal incidents per community and then compare that analysis with the appropriate geographical/demographical locale it is necessary to utilize three complete sets of source documents. The communities are those as identified by the Nassau Police Departments' location codes and are delineated as Incorporated Villages and Unincorporated statistical areas. The population data was arrived at from a LILCO estimates for Jan. 1, 1982 which in turn is based upon the April 1, 1980 census. The number of criminal incidence per community have been extrapolated from the Uniform Crime Reports of both the Independent Police Departments and the Nassau County Police Department.

Inconsistencies evident in the comparison of the above source documents do not obscure the essential validity for their use. In some cases communities or areas may exist for the Nassau County Police Department crime reporting procedures but not have separate data for census purposes. When this occurred, several reports were analyzed and combined to obtain a "best fit" and these communities were then marked with footnotes.

We note in this analysis that in approaching the community by community analysis there are several factors that tend to detract from the absolute reliability of such comparison. Two of these factors are: differences in definition or interpretation of what criminal incident occurred as recorded by different Police Departments and differences in community boundaries as defined by the NCPD and the U.S. Census Bureau.

TOTAL CRIMINAL INCIDENTS

While there are some areas that have offense levels that are much higher than the County norm, generally, crime in Nassau remains a dispersed phenomenon. Indicative of this is the fact that the communities with the highest concentrations of population consistently have the highest number of reported (see Table IX) crimes. The decrease in the number of criminal incidents in the County for 1982 is reflected in decreases in the reported incidents in nine of the ten communities with the greatest number of crimes. Further evidence of the apparent stability of these large communities in relation to the county is that they are the same communities, in slightly different order, as last year, and, nine of the ten communities have been on this list since 1979 (the first year of CJCC Analysis).

INCIDENTS per 1,000 PEOPLE

Our analysis shows that communities scoring high in the number of crime incidents per 1,000 residents tend to be the location of large shopping areas with a considerable transient population.

As is shown, So. Valley Stream, Lawrence, and Manhasset, have registered significant increases this year while unincorporated Great Neck has decreased from the unusually high level of last year.

#### SECTION V

#### ARRESTS

The total number of persons arrested in Nassau County (22,112) in 1982 represented an increase of 4.3% from the 1981 total. The percentage of these arrests that were for the Part I crimes was approximately one-third (31.7). The most prevalent Part I crimes leading to arrest were Larceny (58.2% in 1982, 53.6% in 1981) and Burglary (19.9% in 1982, 27.6% in 1981). While arrests for the violent crimes were 19% of the total arrest for Part I Crimes, the incidence of violent crimes accounted for 6% of the reported incidents of Part I crimes.

Study of the above table shows that there is a continuing trend toward an increasing age of arrestees. Arrests of those of the age of 25 and over, as in 1981, are increasing, while the arrests of those under the age of 24 years is decreasing.

We note that in 1982, 11,884 (54% of the total) persons under the age of 25 were arrested, whereas in 1978 this figure was 11,483 (62%).

This indicates that, while the number of persons under the age of 25 who are being arrested has remained constant, those persons arrested over the age of 25 has increased 44.3%. A further ramification of this trend is the fact that the two Part I crimes which had the highest per-

centage of persons over the age of 25 (Larceny and Assault) are also the only Part I crimes that did not evidence decreases in the reported incidence of these crimes for 1982.

COMMUNITY OF ARRESTEE RESIDENCE

A separate analysis of community of arrestee's residence was completed for 1982. Data for arrests made by the Nassau County Police Department was prepared by that department, while data for arrests made by local police departments was "abstracted" by the Criminal Justice Coordinating Council from the FBI Uniform Crime Reports. The UCR'S as presently filed by independent police departments do not include information as to the residence of arrestees. For the purpose of this report we are considering all arrestees apprehended by independent police departments as residing in those communities in which they were apprehended. This will tend to increase the apparent number of arrestees residing in communities with independent police departments.
