

INTRODUCTION

Community service sentence programs are like members of the human race. While each has its' own character, each also shares common needs and functions. This 1982 Index of Member Program Activities demonstrates these individualities and commonalities. Program individuality is undoubtably one reason for program success in California. Sanction use, and program structure, are adaptable to local need. However, the benefits of certain commonalities should be more closely examined by those responsible for program development and management. Data reporting by CLASP's Program Statistics Standard would benefit programs locally as well as statewide. Locally, this data is necessary to determine program cost-effectiveness, to varify program activities, and to make programs comparable for evaluation purposes. If maintained statewide, this data would provide credible evidence of sanction benefits not available elsewhere.

Thirty-seven programs of ninety-four in existance in California contributed to this Index. We thank them for their help, and commend them for their efforts. It is important to note that this information, along with the results of fifteen on-sile program assessments, forms the basis for several Standards and Guidelines such as the aforementioned Program Statistics Standard. These Standards and Guidelines were developed by Resource Center staff under the direction of the CLASP Board of Directors.

CLASP began the Resource Center in March, 1982 under a one year grant from the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, U.S. Department of Transportation. NHTSA recognized California's need to asimilate information, and the value of that information, including our experiences with drunk drivers, to other states. The purpose of the Resource Center is to increase program's effective service delivery by coordinating program activities, and by providing information, technical assistance, and training to program staff and other involved parties. During the first year, 170 such requests for assistance were filled. Responses were made by written materials, telephone contact, and personal consultation. A monthly newsletter 'Alternative Sentences' and directories of adult and juvenile programs were published and distributed. A Training Conference was held in conjunction with CLASP's Annual Meeting; 83 program staff and others attended. The Resource Center is now funded through June, 1985 by the State of California's Office of Traffic Safety.

CLASP is a statewide, non-profit consortium of community service sentence programs, also known as alternative sentence, court referral, and public service programs. These programs administer community service sentences imposed by the courts; they interview, place, monitor, and report on participating offenders. Work is performed for both public, and private non-profit agencies; and offenders are placed both individually, and on work crews. This concept originated in Alameda County, California, in 1966. The purpose of CLASP is to promote the effective use of community service as a sanction. No other organization like it exists in the United States.
