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vised release based upon administrative action of correction officials, 285; third, those who were paroled from a state prison or similar institution outside the District of Columbia and who were transferred, because of a change in residence, to the jurisdiction of the D. C. Board of Parole, 112. The total as of 10 February 1967, was 768.

The sex and race distribution of the group is described in Table 1. As is indicated, the largest group is composed of Negro males, 83.4 percent, although the parolees from other states do include a substantial number of White males, 23.3 percent.

The age distribution of the group is described in Table 2. Relatively, this is a mature group with a median age of 36.2 years. This would compare, for example, with the age distribution of a group of 7992 persons arrested on suspicion of serious offenses in the District of Columbia between January 1963 and July 1965, who had a median age of 32.3 years. The parolees from D. C. with a median age of 27.5 years. As is noted in another section of the report, this group had a substantially shorter period of confinement than the D. C. group.

exceeded only by Chicago.<sup>2</sup> For the remaining two categories of offenses on the Table--offenses involving narcotics and "other offenses"--the larger group was the 73, or 18.0 percent of the "good time" releasee offenses which involved narcotics. Most of those convicted of these offenses are not eligible for parole because of statutory provisions.

Time Under Supervision: The period of time served prior to release for each group and for all releasees is presented as Table 5. As the Table indicates, the median length of the period of confinement for the entire group is 67.8 months. As was noted above, the median period of confinement for those parolees from other states, 27.5 months, is substantially less than the period of the two groups released from the D. C. correctional units. For these two groups, the median lengths of the periods served—7.18 months for "good time" releasees and 67.8 months for parolees—are not substantially different, being more than five and one—half years for both groups.

The length of the period during which the releasees had been under supervision since release, as of 1 February 1967, is presented as Table 6. As is indicated, the longest median

and 59 Tracts in which there were five or more, including eight Tracts with nine releasees, and eight with 12 releasees. There were 28 in Tract 27, including six in Shaw House, a kind of half-way house for parolees. There were 12 releasees in Census Tract 96, including 11 who were patients in Saint Elizabeth's (mental) Hospital.

As was noted above, there were 768 releasees in the study group. Of these there were 697 who lived in the District of Columbia. Of the remainder there were 47 who lived in nearby Maryland, 17 who lived in Virginia, and one who lived in West Virginia. The current addresses of six could not be located.

As was noted above, the primary purpose of this study is to aid in the location of satellite supervisory centers for the D. C. Board of Parole. As a first step, the District has been divided into a number of sub-districts, and these alternative plans are considered below. Presumably one of the sub-centers would be located in each of these areas.

## Plan A






FIGURE 2: PLAN A

The division designated as Plan A is indicated in Figure 2.

As is evident on the Figure, this arrangement provides for a division of the releasees into three groups of almost equal size, a consideration of some relevance in the establishment of the satellite centers. However, these areas are not of

## Plan D

The division designated as Plan D is indicated in Figure 5. As is evident in the Figure, this is also a division into four areas. This plan is patterned on that developed by the Department of Public Health of the District of Columbia for the planning and administration of programs in the field of public health, including mental health. The Department has prepared reports and analysis of social data based upon this general division of the District. However, this allocation is not considered suitable for the purpose at hand. As will be noted in the Figure, only 21 of the releasees are in Area A and 122 in Area D, with heavy concentration in Areas B and C, that is, in the central portion of the city.

Releasee Guilty of Offenses Involving Narcotics: Of the total group of 768 releasees, there were 91 who had been guilty of offenses involving narcotics, including importation, possession and sale. Presumably a part of these, as well as others convicted of other offenses, were also narcotics users, but information on addiction was not gathered as part of this research.

Of the 91 releasees, there were 72 who were released on


